



Sydney FC 3 - Parramatta FC 2 at Lambert Park



MATCHES ANNOUNCED

The 2017 Waratah Cup Finals matches have been announced after round 7 of the Westfield FFA Cup Preliminary Rounds were completed on Wednesday evening as APIA Leichhardt Tigers, Bankstown Berries, Blacktown City, Hills Brumbies, Hakoah Sydney City East and Sydney United 58 were on course to play for this season's first piece of silverware.

The live draw was completed on Friday 2nd of June as the historic NSW Cup, won by Sydney United 58 last season with a 1-0 victory over Manly United at Lambert Park, took centre stage at Football NSW's headquarters.

The Preliminary Finals to be played on Wednesday 14th of July will see current Cup holders Sydney United 58 entertain PlayStation4 National Premier Leagues 2 NSW Men's outfit Bankstown Berries while on the same evening, Hills Brumbies of the PlayStation4 National Premier Leagues 2 NSW Men's competition take on 2016 PS4 NPL NSW Men's Champions Blacktown City FC.

MATCH PREVIEW

Sydney Olympic dropped out of the top five last weekend after a third consecutive match without a win and face a tough examination of their credentials on Monday when an in-form Sydney FC visit Belmore Sports Ground.

The Sky Blues have begun to hit their stride and have not lost since round five, maintaining the league's leanest defensive record (9 goals conceded), including three clean sheets in their last five. The goals are also beginning to flow for David Zdrilic's men with John Iredale notching a hattrick against Parramatta last weekend to gain outright lead in the golden boot standings with 10.

Olympic will need to be wary of a Sydney FC growing in stature and confidence and are at risk of slipping further down the table with Hakoah Sydney City East and Rockdale poised to capitalize should the Blues fail to win again.
