THE OPPOSITION:

BONNYRIGG WHITE EAGLES

Bonnyrigg White Eagles come to town to take on the Wollongong Wolves at WIN Stadium in this Round 9 encounter in the Play Station 4 NPL NSW Mens 1 competition.

This up coming game will be the 17th time that the two teams have met in the league with another meeting being in the cup. We welcome the club to Wollongong.

THE OPPOSITION TODAY – BONNYRIGG WHITE EAGLES

The Bonnyrigg White Eagles club last won honours by winning the 2015 Championship. The team defeated Blacktown City 2-0 with goals taken by Robbie Younis and Yuta Kokado. The team consisted of James Chronopoulos, Tynan Diaz, Dylan Fox, Ray Miller, Ben Spruce, Kokado, Chris Tadrosse (Capt.), Younis, Mun Soo Gil, Nikola Zonjic, and McDonald. Adam Jenner, David Vrankovic, Alex Mansueto replaced Fox, Miller and Spruce respectively. The coach was Brian Brown.

Bonnyrigg in 2016 finished in fifth position on 30 points from 8 wins and 6 draws. The team scored 41 goals conceded 39 with a plus two-goal difference, which the fifth best in the competition. The top scorer was again Younis with 11 in tow, he being one of 11 players to have goaled with the addition of two scored by the opposition. The team had three matches in which they did not score, which was the third best in the competition along with two other teams. The quickest goal came in the 14th minute was shared by two players, Bo Hyun Chun in Round 12 and Asmir Kadric in Round 22. The solitary multi scorer in a single match was Younis with three braces. Three clean sheets were achieved which was fifth best along with three others. The best result sequence without loss was four matches - Rounds 10-13, win, draw, win and win. The worst sequence without winning was seven, Rounds 14-20, loss, draw, draw, loss, loss, draw and loss. The biggest winning margin was four goals in the Round 21 5-1 win

over Hakoah Sydney City East. The biggest losing margin was three goals achieved twice, 3-0 loss to Sutherland Sharks in Round 17 and 4-1 loss to Sydney United 58 in Round 21.

New players to the 2017 line-up include Zac Mackenzie from Wollongong Wolves and Milan Susak from Asia

BLAST FROM THE PAST

This match was played on Saturday 6th August 2011 at John Crehan Park, Cringila. It was the Round 19 clash.

This, as a fast free flowing game, saw Petrovski scoring from the spot after Picciolini had strode through and was taken out four minutes prior to the half time whistle. Bonnyrigg replied close to a half hour on through McMaster. Spruce propelled the ball to the far side to Powell. He headed it back for McMaster to do his job in the 64th. Abel put the Wolves ahead when he latched onto a good ball from Timpano. He threaded the ball through a crowded area. He nearly scored another after being set loose by Timpano again, his effort thumped across the cross bar. Bonnyrigg restored parity when an Elasi cross found Boardman to ultimately goal.

Abel stated post match –'Yeah it was a good effort, Bonnyrigg is a good side. ...Jake cut it back and I hit it. They don't come for me very often.'

McMaster's comments – 'We got there in the end. We kept ticking over and we did well to hang in there in the end'

THE MATCH-UP

At present this season Bonnyrigg White Eagles are a shadow of their former selves sitting at the foot of the table without a victory, with only one draw in credit, losing seven games and earning one point. Conversely, Wollongong Wolves sit in seventh position with four wins and a draw. Both teams have scored an identical eleven goals with seven White Eagles and four Wolves players plus an own goal contributing to the scores. The away team also has three games without scoring as opposed the Wolves' one game. Top scorers are

Yuzi Tashiro (WW) with five, and Hassan Jalloh with four.

The last five games result sequence is - Bonnyrigg - loss, loss, draw, loss and loss, Wolves - loss, win, loss, win and win.

Scores from the previous round involving the two teams were - Bonnyrigg went down to Rockdale City Suns 5-0 while the Wolves defeated Sutherland 3-0.

SELECTED REPRESENTATIVE OF BOTH CLUBS – ZAC MACKENZIE

Zac Mackenzie played for the Wolves for four seasons from 2013 to 2016 and tallied 74 league starting appearances with one from the bench, 6 starts and 2 substitute entries for the cup and one game in a finals series. He was the Wolves 'Player Of The Year' in 2014, 2015 and 2016 and that is a measure of his success.

He made his debut in Round 2 away match to Blacktown City on 23rd March 2013 and his final game was in Round 22 against Bonnyrigg White Eagles on 14th August 2016. In Round 8 in 2013 with Bonnyrigg White Eagles being the opposition he stated post match -'I'm coming along all right. I've been learning heaps from the coaches and each week I'm getting better.' He certainly did and is of now (2017) in Bonnyrigg colours.

For a tall player, Mackenzie is agile and quick turning, displaying keen anticipation, being strong in the tackle and good at directing passes and possessing close ball skills and a never say die attitude.

He played in both FFA Cup Round of 32 matches with the Central Coast Mariners in 2014 and Sydney FC in 2016 and he certainly held his own against the much vaunted opposition. After the Sydney FC match he stated -'we did quite well and then we had a ten to fifteen minute period where we lost our shape and they scored two goals and put us to bed. We had a real hot go, had a few chances which could have gone in, but we did not hold it together. We enjoyed the game a whole lot more without that (relegation) hanging over our heads.'

In 2016, he made the competitions 'Team Of The Year' as a substitute after being selected in the 2015 'Team Of The Year'.

Mackenzie originally came from Albury and played for the Western Sydney Youth team before coming to the Wolves. He left the Wolves for Sydney to continue his university degree and sign for the western Sydney team, Bonnyrigg White Eagles.

At Bonnyrigg so far in 2017, Mackenzie has played in Rounds 1-7 and has been on the scoresheet on one occasion. It was in the Round 6, 3-3 draw with Sutherland Sharks. MacKenzie in the thirty-ninth met a cross from the right side pushing the ball into the corner of the net eluding the goalkeeper's reach.

(Players comments were taken from the writer's match reports at that time.)

WOLVES' PAST PLAYER OF NOTE - TONY PERINICH

Striker Tony Perenich played for the Wolves in the National Soccer League and also in the NSW Premier League with three stints at the club in total. His initial time was in the 1995/96 season and for the next two seasons. In all, he played sixty seven times with five substitute on field roles, scoring eighteen goals at this time. Also In 1995/96, Perinich with nine goals was the Wolves egual Golden Boot winner with Mario Jermen. His first was in his debut match versus Morwell Falcons away. It came in the sixty-fourth minute on 7th November 1995. He hit a consolation goal from close range to pull a deficit of four. He was a multiple scorer in a single match on two occasions when he achieved braces, one against Newcastle Breakers in Round 10 and again in Round 21 versus the same opponents, goaling in the fifty second and seventy-eighth minutes respectively. For the first, he took advantage of a defender's mistimed clearance to rifle the ball home. Perenich was causing consternation to the opponents throughout the match and produced a powerful polished goal following Lupcho Naumovski's lead up work.

Following four seasons with Northern Spirit, Perenich was back with nine games and one goal achieved in 2001/02. His third time was in 2006 when he played five times with another from the bench with another one goal effort. This one occurred in the twelfth minute of the Round 14 Marconi match. From the half way mark, Ballamodou Conde played a lifted pass over defenders allowing Perenich to run onto. Gaining control, with the goalkeeper advancing to narrow the angle, Perenich shot. The ball powered through the legs of the custodian straight into the goal.

Perenich was a speedy character possessing skill to take players on and was sharp in the goal area.

His final game for the club was on 4th June 2006 against Parramatta at WIN Stadium.

THE WAITING

THE WOLVES' FIVE LONGEST WINLESS STREAKS

After experiencing a long winless streak in Mens 1 competition in 2016 it was back to the history files to find out about similar circumstances that previous teams of the Wolves have gone through. When a winless streak continues all and sundry associated with a club going through this, the waiting for a victory is one of the hardest things.

Following are the years in which the top five longest winless streaks occurred - 2009, 1983, 2016, 1995/96 and 2013. The number of draws in the sequences was from seven to one and the number of scoreless draws was two. In addition, teams that sustain these numbers of winless rounds invariably conclude the season closer to the foot of the point's table rather than the top.

2009

In 2009, the victory never came in the competition as the record winless streak continued for a club record of twenty matches after indeed the Round 2 single victory. The team could not garner a victory to end the situation even though reinforcements were brought in for the final five rounds. It all started in Round 3 with an away 0-1 loss to Sydney United, which was followed by 5-2, 5-1, 1-0 and 7-0 losses before a score draw gave a short respite. However the defeats continued for another seven matches with a couple being by narrow margin, a 3-2 to Bankstown being one of these before another score draw in Round 15.

Four losses continued with Wollongong being scoreless in these. However in the final three matches of the season Wollongong did in fact score. In the final match five were scored but alas, the opposition hit six. Throughout the season there were three victories that the supporters would exist on. In Round 2 the 3-2 was affirmative and the team won two Cup games 5-0 and 2-0 and went out in

extra time in another. The club was lucky not to be relegated as another team experienced financial troubles and was relegated instead.

Sequence - loss, loss, loss, loss, loss, draw, loss, l

Finishing Position: twelfth of twelve teams.

1983

Fourteen games were in this season's winless streak and it lasted from Round 8 to 21. The seven defeats and seven draws in the sequence with five draws in a row from Round 14 -18. The victory was oh so sweet when it came in Round 22 with a 2-1 win over Brisbane Lions. This was the team's second victory of the campaign. Some of the losses were close as In Round 10, losing 5-4 to Marconi and in Round 21 a 3-2 loss to Canberra City was sustained.

Sequence - loss, draw, loss, loss, loss, draw, draw, draw, draw, draw, draw, loss, draw, loss and loss.

Finishing Position: fifteenth of sixteen teams.

2016

In 2016 the winless streak of twelve looked to have relegation consequences but that was put to bed with the victory to end the sequence in Round 21 against Parramatta FC by one goal to nil.

Following a 3-1 victory over Sutherland Sharks, the Wolves drew with Sydney Olympic to begin the streak. A close 4-3 loss to Parramatta in Round 10 and two subsequent draws continued the sequence. This was followed by with a 3-0 loss and another scoreless draw. Four more defeats eventuated with a Round 12 postponed game thrown in with two close ones, a 3-2 and 2-1 defeat to Blacktown City and Sydney Olympic. However, the result in the Sydney Olympic match was overturned later

due to an unregistered Olympic player being fielded in the tie.

Sequence - draw, loss, draw, draw, loss, draw, loss loss, loss, loss, loss and loss (loss overturned to win)

Finishing Position: eleventh of twelve teams

1995/96

It was in fact two winless streaks lasting 10 matches each from Round 11 to 20 with nine losses and one draw and from Round 22 to 31 seven losses and three draws in the 1995/96 season.

A 2-0 defeat kicked off the first one followed two close 1-0 games. The opposition scored 3 goals in successive matches with one Wolves reply before six were conceded and a huge defeat. A 4-0, 3-1 and 3-1 were fairly comprehensive defeats and a 1-1 saw an improvement. It took 4-1 victory to stem the first streak with a new coach at the helm for this and two previous matches.

Two narrow defeats 1-0 and 3-2 eventuated before a 3-3 draw. Following was a 1-0, 1-1 and 2-1all narrow defeats, with further close games being 1-0, 0-0, 3-2 and 1-0 before a 2-0 victory in the penultimate season game broke the sequence.

Sequence 1 – loss, loss, loss, loss, loss, loss, loss, loss, loss and draw.

Sequence 2 – loss, loss, draw, loss, draw, loss, loss, draw, loss and loss,

Finishing Position: eleventh of twelve teams

2013

Nine rounds was the winless streak from Rounds 6 -14 with two draws amongst the seven losses. The streak followed a victory and a 4-2 loss began the streak followed up by a 1-1 draw. A 4-1 and 2-0 defeat came before a high scoring 4-4 draw was followed by 3-1 fairly comprehensive loss. A close loss 4-3, 1-0 and 4-0 happened before the streak came to an end in a big way by scoring four goals with one in reply to defeat of the opposition.

Sequence – loss, draw, loss, loss, draw, loss, loss, loss and loss.

Finishing Position: twelfth of twelve teams.

The waiting for an end to a long winless sequence is not a happy occurrence. However, the longer it does go on, the closer it is to the end.

FATHER AND SON

PART 3

Following from Robert and Dez Giraldi, Larry and Peter Gaffney and Zivko and Steven Hristovski, another father/son combination has seen the light of day in the final Round 22 of the 2016 National Premier League New South Wales Mens 1. Left sided defender Boden Allport made his starting debut versus Bonnyrigg White Eagles following on from his father, Jeff, in the late 1980s and early1990s.

Boden spent much of the 2016 season playing in the Wolves Under 20s side before getting the call up into first grade by coach Jacob Timpano.

Boden -'I was with the Wolves in the Under 13s and 14s then did other things and came back at 16 years old playing in the under 20s for three years. It was nice to play in the Cup and I wish I could have played against Sydney FC (in 2016). I have always been reminded (of his father' exploits).

Boden was also in the NSW Institute Of Sport in 2011/2012 representative team that also included Tom Manos (2015 Wolves goalkeeper) and James Baldacchino (current central defender).

Against Bonnyrigg White Eagles, Boden defended stoutly and stepped up to the plate. Post match he stated -'It was good and definitely a step up and I really enjoyed it.'

The left defender also played in the 2016 cup in the Round 3 clash with Linfield FC. In addition he was an unused substitute in two FFA Cup matches and one league game.

Leaving the Wolves, he is now at Albion Park White Eagles in the Illawarra Premier League for the 2017 season.

Jeff played his initial game in the firsts team in the 1988 National Soccer League when he came on as a substitute in the Round 24 game against Brunswick Juventus at the age of 18. He made a total of fourteen appearances with seven league starts with a further seven from the bench. In his second season he came off the bench for a solitary game in the 1989 season and made five starts and four subs appearances in 1989/90 in the first season of summer football. His final game was against Wollongong Macedonia on the 7th March 1991. Jeff had the experience of playing and training with Scottish international Alan Brazil and English internationals Paul Mariner and Trevor Francis, who were guest players in 1988. Following on from the Wolves, he plied his trade at Cringila Lions and Lysaghts before going back to Albion Park to help them back into the IPL. He concluded his playing career at Dandaloo and the beginning of his coaching career at the same club.

Jeff coached the Wolves Under 20s team for a number of years and was the first grade caretaker coach in cup games. He successfully coached Albion Park White Eagles to win the 2016 Illawarra Premier League Grand Final.

Both father and son were selected into the All Schools Australian side in 1987 and 2014 respectively.

The Allports have joined the Wolves' father and son combinations at the club. Who will be next in line?
