## HAKOAH SYDNEY CITY EAST

For today's match, we welcome Hakoah Sydney City East to WIN Stadium for the Round 7 clash of the NPL NSW Mens 1 competition. This will be the 15th league meeting between the two sides after the initial one in 1981. This will be also be the third encounter in the NPL NSW Mens 1 competition.

## THE OPPOSITION TODAY - HAKOAH SYDNEY CITY EAST

Hakoah, as a club last won honours by winning the NSW Club Championship in 2015.

In 2016, the club finished in 10th position on 20 points four points higher than the Wolves, achieving six wins and two draws, scoring 38 goals and conceding 56 with a goal difference of minus 18, one of seven teams to have a negative goal difference. The top scorer was Kevin Lopes with seven goals and ten other players got on the score sheet as well. The team had three nil scores which equalled three other teams. The best result sequence without loss was three games - draw, win and win in Rounds 12, 14 and 15 with Round 13 being postponed. The worst losing sequence was seven, losses in Rounds 16 to 22 with one clean sheet being achieved.

A new coach is at the helm this season after Mark Robertson left the club in 2016. The new coach is Scotsman Gavin Rae, a former player of the club. As many as 13 of the previous seasons squad have left and new recruits have been added to take their place. New additions to the squad include Oliver and Jack Green from Sydney Olympic plus goalkeeper Anthony Bouzanis from Sydney FC. Gideon Sweet, Alek Lekoski, Cameron Draper, Harry Jones, Anthony Frangie, and Robert Ezekiel.

#### **BLAST FROM THE PAST**

Hakoah and the Wolves met at the Sydney Athletic Field on 30th May 1982.

Wolves: Jim Preston, Peter Willis, Arno Bertogna, Chris Dunleavy, Jeff Ainsworth, Larry Gaffney, Lee Adam, Peter Tredinnick, John Fleming, Roy Cotton and Phil O'Connor. The coach was Ken Morton.

The away team got off to a good start scoring after 12 minutes with Murray goaling. Hakoah then skipped out to a two-goal lead when Borges scored ten minutes later. However, the Wolves pegged one back by Adam and this 1-2 score line remained when the half time whistle blew.

Following the interval, Willis restored parity two minutes after his teammate Fleming was sent off. Mitchell restored his team's lead on 74 minutes and with a one-man advantage looked to have the game in the bag. However, the Wolves' top scorer goal had something left in the tank and with nine minutes to go and the match finished 3-3.

#### THE MATCH-UP

The two teams have three draws between them with Hakoah having the more victories, five to the Wolves two.

The highest scoring margins are Hakoah 5-0 in 1981 and 6-1 in 1984 and Wolves 2-0 in 1986. Each teams best result sequence is - Hakoah with eleven games, win, win, win, draw, win, win, win win, win, draw and draw. (1981-1986), and the Wolves with five - draw, draw, win, win and draw. (1985-2016)

In 2017, the results for the last five matches for Hakoah is loss, win, loss, win, and win, while the Wolves' sequence is loss, draw, loss, win and loss.

Hakoah sit in 6th position with 8 points from 2 wins and 2 draws while the Wolves have scored 6 goals,

achieved 7 points from 2 wins and one draw and are in 7th position.

The top scorers for the clubs are Alexander Lekoski (Hakoah), Andre De Jong (Hakoah) and Patrick Antelmi (Wollongong) with three goals apiece. The best result for each club in 2017 has been Hakoah versus Sutherland Sharks in Round 4-0 and the Wolves defeating Parramatta 3-1 in Round 1.

In each team's previous matches, Hakoah drew 3-3 with Bonnyrigg White Eagles with goals scored by Andre De Jong a brace and Jack Green, while the Wolves were defeated by Sydney United, 58 2-0.

## SELECTED REPRESENTATIVES OF BOTH CLUBS – PAUL KAY

Paul Kay played six games for the Wolves in 1981 and played at Hakoah Sydney City from 1983-1986, tallying 64 games and scoring five goals.

Kay's initial Wolves appearance was in Round 12 versus Brisbane City on the 10th May, 1981, with his final being in Round 26 against Brisbane City at Spencer Park in Brisbane on 17th May, 1981. He was a midfielder who was strong in the tackle and delivered enterprising passes.

Kay came to the Wolves from St.George and left the club for Charlton Athletic in England, then back in Australia with Hakoah, Blacktown City and Wollongong Macedonia where he played in 1990/91.

## WOLVES' PAST PLAYER OF NOTE - ALFREDO ESTEVEZ

Estevez was a defender or defensive midfielder who played for the Wolves in the 2008 and 2009 seasons. He achieved honours with the club by playing in the 2008 NSW PL Grand Final, coming on in the 61st minute for Ballamodou Conde.

In all, he made 28 starting appearances and 13 from the bench plus two cup appearances and 3 in the finals.

Unfortunately, he did not manage any goals but went awfully close in the 2008 Round 21 match against Marconi at Crehan Park when his powerful shot flashed narrowly wide. He stated post match, 'It's very good to get on. I've enjoyed being on a little more today. I had that chance and a header also. Everyone believed that we could win and everyone was trying to take the chances.' Coach John Turner stated 'that's our best win of the season' as the Wolves clawed back from a two-goal deficit to win 3-2.

In his games, Estevez was a solid at the back, could play himself out of trouble, timed his tackles to perfection and had good anticipation. He was adept in the air as he displayed his prowess when he won a header against the extremely tall Paul Wither against Sydney Olympic in the 2008 Semi-Final, moments after he placed well-timed tackle to dispossess a potential threat.

Estevez also played in one of the Wolves highest scoring games, a 7-0 shutout of

Macarthur Rams on 8th June, 2008, which was the Wolves equal third highest number of goals in a single match.

In 2009 season Estevez played in the majority of matches where he was a mainstay in defence, stood out doing a mountain of defending and leading by example with his experience in a mostly inexperienced team.

He was also a Portuguese-East Timorese international who played 14 times for his country and scored his initial international goal versus Laos in 2008 in his final game for his county.

Estevez is now coach of the Wolves Under 20s and formerly coached at Albion Park and Fernhill in the IPL since retiring as a player. He has inaugurated a successful Beach soccer competition in Wollongong for a number of years and continues to do so.

## **FERNHILL**

An old log, right on the corner of Douglas Road and Princes Highway Fernhill, holds a very special place in this history of football in the Illawarra.

It was on this corner, way back in 1925 that a group of Fernhill local football enthusiasts decided it was time to form their own club to represent their community and participate in the game they loved.

The first official meeting was held, in exactly the same spot, on the 17th March 1926 and the Fernhill story had begun. It was decided they would launch a fundraising drive across Fernhill and surrounds and raise the required funds necessary to establish the club.

Colours were also agreed upon and the now well recognised and respected "Red and Whites" were established. And ever since, generations of locals have progressed through the "Foxes" to establish Fernhill as one of the best known clubs across not only in the Illawarra and South Coast but right across the state.

While "The Hill" haven't won too many premierships over its 90 year history it has been at the forefront of development and growth of football in our region. Many, many players first tasted the wonders and joys of football through the mighty "Foxes" and their lifelong love of football developed directly through their experiences at Fernhill.

One of Fernhill's proudest moments occurred in 1977, when the club finally hit the big time and were invited to participate in the Illawarra

Premier League. They had managed to rise through the ranks and reach their ultimate goal. Making it to the top grade. And excellent reward for their years of hard work and commitment. The "Foxes" had made it.

For the next 22 years Fernhill were a staple in the top grade, however lack of funds and a combination of factors contributed to them losing their spot in the top tier in 1999. The proud club continued however and remain committed to providing the best possible football opportunities for all across their community. Nothing has changed from its original inspiration all those years ago.

The Home of Fernhill since 1978 has been Ray Robinson Field, Towradgi Park, where both seniors and juniors gather to play all their matches. The Foxes have always held a very strong focus on their juniors and Wollongong Wolves Football Club, first grade coach, Jacob Timpano, began his lifetime football journey on the grass at Ray Robinson Field, as a local Red and Whites, Fernhill junior. Today he steers the region's premier local representative football club but it all started for Jacob with the "Foxes".

Today Fernhill Football Club continues to compete in First Division and will forever retain a very strong position in the folklore of football in the Illawarra. As far as the powers that be at Fernhill are concerned, eventually they will return, to where they belong - in the top tier of the local competition.

Until then, and continuing after they reach this goal and forever more, they will ensure they remain focused and committed to the initial motivations that saw this great club first come into existence over 80 years ago. To promote and grow the love of football across their community and provide the best possible enjoyment and experience for the plethora of juniors, introduced to the beauties of football through this proud, great club.

The Red and White Foxes of Fernhill are an institution, proudly celebrating 21 Fernhill Soccer Club Life Members, 3 Ladies Life Members and 17 Junior Life Members.

Still proudly representing their community they have 75 seniors members, 250 juniors, 50 women's and 30 amateurs, catering for the football pursuits of anyone and everyone who wants to participate.

Fernhill, over the years have produced more than its share of top quality junior products,

many of whom have gone to do exceptionally well in higher grades of the code. This will never change.

The Foxes have built up a long standing tradition of fair play and good sportsmanship in the past 90 years and club officials remain steadfastly committed to ensuring this trend continues.

#### "GO THE HILL" Now known as "The Foxes"

One of our oldest and longest running clubs, Fernhill celebrated its 90 year anniversary last season.

As part of the celebrations in 2016 Fernhill enjoyed a prosperous campaign and were represented in each of the grand finals of their competition right here at WIN Stadium.

A significant amount has been achieved over this time and with the centenary celebrations inching closer and closer, the Red and Whites have more than earned their position as one of our greaters and most pro active pioneering football organisations.

## THE ONE AND ONLY

#### **WOLVES' PLAYERS WHO HAVE SCORED A SINGLE LEAGUE GOAL**

A number of Wolves' players have scored only a solitary league goal for the club. However, these goals were important for the team and the individual, as well as to the supporters at the time. These are the players and the circumstances behind most of these scoring efforts, with additional information of the players' history with the club.

#### Adrian Karakolevski 2010

Karakolevski scored his goal and the winning one in the Round 7 encounter at Cromer Park versus Manly United. It eventuated in the 76th minute. Ken Chun lured in two defenders to create space for Karakolevski to score from six yards out. He made seven appearances as a substitute.

#### Sean Van Rooyen 2010

Van Rooyen, a New Zealander, made nine starting appearances and came on as substitute in one other match. It was in fact in his ninth match that he scored. In the Round 20 clash with Sydney Olympic at WIN Stadium, Van Rooyen scored in the 58th minute, with his goal being the team's second goal of four with nil in reply. Samet Kaynak provided a pass after he had gained possession of the ball. He squared a pass to Van Rooyen who subsequently slotted the ball home.

#### Alex Mansueto 2010

Right sided wingback Mansueto played two seasons (2010-11) with the Wolves playing 40 League games and two Cup games. For his goal at Lily Homes Stadium, Blacktown in his first year at the club, Tayfun Buyukkopru's free kick was placed into Mansueto's path for him to head the ball into the goal. This happened in the 34th minute and was his team's third goal to win the match against Blacktown City 3-2.

#### Stepjan Paric 2011

Midfielder Paric played a single season with the club and totalled 15 starting League appearances with two substitute run ons and four appearances in the Cup. He was young at the time and was very creative from midfield. His goal emanated in Round 2 versus Parramatta Eagles. With nine minutes to go in the match, Paric robbed a defender and just outside the penalty area, he let fly with ball propelling into the back of the net. Coach Trevor Morgan said in my post match interview -Young Stepjan stole the ball. I thought he had an excellent game for a young fellow.'

#### Jamie McMaster 2009

McMaster, a striker, scored in the final round against APIA (Sydney Tigers). He scored from the spot against the team that had released him five weeks prior. Teammate Brian Vanega was brought down in the box with a penalty kick being the end result. The former Leeds United McMaster subsequently glided the ball into the net in the 67th minute. Despite his goal, the result was a 6-5 loss. In all, he played just three games.

#### James Lawrence 2009

Lawrence scored in Round 4 in his third appearance with opposition being Sydney Olympic. The midfielder managed to scramble the ball into the net in a crowded area. He played fourteen games with two substitute appearances in the league plus two Cup games.

#### James Monie 2009

Monie came to the team for just a few games in order to add some more striking power, but alas only scored one and that was in his final game for the club in Round 22 against APIA then Sydney Tigers. It was in the 21st minute that Monie struck. A James Lawrence pass found him in an excellent position and he threaded the ball past the goalkeeper. He also provided a headed ball forward for a teammate to score the second goal. Monie could hold the ball up and he was strong on the ground and in the air and possessed a powerful shot.

#### Nick Stavroulakis 2004/05

Stavroulakis scored in his final game for the Wolves in Round 7, with the Bankstown City Lions club providing the opposition. Mineo Bonetig had waltzed around defenders in a long run up field. His ensuing shot went beyond the goalkeeper into the back of the net with ten minutes left on the clock. In total, seven games were played with two substitute appearances and one Cup game. Stavroulakis was an industrious midfield player who provided intentioned passes to his supports from his midfield position.

#### Jason Van Blerk 2003/04

Van Blerk scored his goal three minutes in against Parramatta Power in Round 22. He played wide on the left side and on receiving the ball he cut in to swing the ball over the 'keeper's head. In all, he made nine appearances and three off the bench.

#### Tanju Balabanel 2003/04

Speedy player Balabanel scored his team's third goal in the Round 16, 3-2 win against South Melbourne. On ninety minutes, the team broke away with the ball being slipped to the substitute, Balabanel. He ran directly at goal, being chased by defenders. His subsequent shot took a deflection, and duly wrong footed the goalie to lodge inside the near post. He made four starting appearances and nine substitute on field roles

#### Borislav (Bobby) Dragas 2003/04

Tall central defender Dragas played 20 times and scored in the Round 19 clash with Football Kingz of New Zealand in the 78th minute. It was the only score of the match. A Nahuel Arrarte thirty-yard free kick fell a little short of the penalty area. A massed throng of defenders and attackers scrambled for the ball as the goalkeeper flew in. He failed to make a strong contact with the ball then Dragas seized on his chance. He jubilantly steered the ball into an open net.

#### Dean Heffernan 2002/03

In his 20 games for the club Heffernan, who came from Sutherland Sharks to the Wolves, scored only once. It was in the Football Kingz' game in New Zealand for Round 17. In the 51st minute, following calamitous defending, Heffernan got on the ball to project into the goal.

#### Darren McDonald 2001/02

McDonald had two stints with the club and in his first he scored one goal that emanated in the 2-2 draw with Auckland Football Kingz in Round 5 at WIN Stadium. His was the matches second one, scored after thirteen minutes. He made six appearances with a further eleven starts with two cup appearances in 2006. From his position to the right of goal, he goaled with a powerful low shot.

#### Con Anthopoulos 2001/02

Anthopoloulos made nineteen appearances in his one season. The defender scored his goal, which was his team's consolation goal, in the 4-1 defeat by South Melbourne. He struck just after the half hour mark.

#### Gerald Ouennet 1998/99

The Frenchman Quennet, who represented Tahiti in the Oceania Nations Cup in 1998, made only one starting appearance but came on five times as a replacement. He scored in the Round 26 clash with West Adelaide in the eighty-eighth minute. He had missed an earlier gilt edged opportunity but made amends with his late goal.

#### Steve Karavatakis 1998/99

Karavatakis scored an eighty-eighth minute penalty in the Round 21 4-4 draw with Adelaide City at Hindmarsh Stadium. Micheal Brooks had powered in a shot that the City central defender kept out with his hand. He was sent off for his trouble and Karavatakis duly converted. Karavatakis made five appearances from the bench.

#### George Jolevski 1995/96

Jolevski fired in from 18 metres with his shot flew past the 'keeper but it was his team's only score which West Adelaide doubled. He tallied thirteen starting appearances and three substitute on field roles.

#### Peter Murray 1994/95

Peter Murray scored one goal in 1994/95 in Round 8 v Brunswick Juventus. It was a thirty-ninth minute penalty after a defender had hand balled Adrian Cervinski's goal bound header. The striker made sixteen starting appearances and three substitute on field roles.

#### Mike Grbevski 1993/94

Grbevski scored in the seventieth minute of Round 25 versus West Adelaide at Hindmarsh Stadium. Grbevski played three times in the starting line-up and five on field substitute roles.

#### **John Danzo 1989**

Four starts and two substitute appearances was Danzo's tally in Wolves colours in 1989. He scored in the sixty-fifth minute in the 2-0 Round 11 victory over Melbourne Knights at Brandon Park. The next year he had one start and one substitute appearance.

#### Sean Ingham 1989

Ingham signed for the Wolves from Sydney United mid season and played six times. In the Blacktown City Round 15 game, he scored the only goal of the match.

#### Frank Demertzis 1987

Demertzis, with this goal, was the first scorer in the NSW Premier League competition for the club. It came in Round 1 away to Uruguayan Penrith. This was his only game.

#### Ray Farrell 1984

The opposition was Sydney Croatia and Farrell scored the first goal of the Round 6 match in the 26th minute that was played at Dapto Showground on 10th April 1984. Farrell made two starting appearances and four from the bench.

#### Alan Waldron 1982

Midfielder Waldron scored his team's third goal in the 3-1 win over Newcastle KB United in Round 22 at the International Sports Centre in Newcastle. Peter Tredinnick zoomed in from the left side to set up Waldron in the seventy-seventh minute. His first game was in Round 20 and numbered eleven matches in 1982 as a starting player in the midfield. He played again in 1983 but had two starts and one from the sideline.

#### Billy De Graaf 1981

Central defender and New Zealand international player, De Graaf amassed twenty-five starting games in 1981. He was a strong and

intimidating tackler with no quarter given. He scored in the eight minute of this Round 23 clash with South Melbourne at the Wollongong Showground on July 27th 1981.

#### Ken Morton 1981

Coach Morton, the first coach of the Wolves made a couple of appearances as a player off the bench in his first year and managed to score a goal in addition. In

the first away game to Heidelberg United in Round 2 Morton goaled in the fifty-first minute for the teams second goal. Clive Campbell produced a powerful shot that the Heidelberg goalkeeper was not able to hold and Morton was there to slot it in.

These certainly have been 'the one and only' league goals from players for the Wolves.



## VALE JASON CONNOLLY

Jason Connolly passed away on Tuesday, 11th April 2017 following a Nepean FA Cup match in an over 35s team with St. Mary's Band Club. He was 46 years old.

Connolly played in Wollongong for the Wolves for two seasons in the National Soccer League 1996/97 and 1997/98. He was a utility player playing either in midfield or defence but scored a total of five goals in the red and white colours. Achieving a total of 30 starts and 10 substitute run on appearances, he was a strong tackler and good in the air.

Making his debut at Edensor Park on 13th October 1996 Connolly's final game was on 12th April 1998 Brandon Park with the opposition being Sydney United for both games. For his first goal in Round 6, Connolly headed in an Alvin Ceccoli free kick past the Marconi goalkeeper. For his final goal in his first season, he scored a penalty in Round 24 versus Perth Glory, which was his team's only goal in the 3-1 defeat. His final goal was scored in Round 6 in the 5-1 demolition of Marconi. He knocked in an Anthony Surjan corner eight minutes into the match. Connolly earned 'Player Of The Year' points with his performance in the 0-0 draw with Marconi with his organizational qualities and this is a measure of his success as a player.

Connolly earned honours with the club being part of the victorious 1997 Waratah Cup Final team that defeated Bankstown City Lions.


