THE OPPOSITION: MANILY UNITED

Wollongong Wolves welcome Manly United's visit to WIN Stadium for this Round 3 encounter in the PlayStation 4 NPLNSW Mens 1 competition and as well, the first home match of the 2017 season. Manly's previous coach (until Round 1 2017) was Paul Dee and in his playing days made a number of appearances for the Wolves in the 1992/93 NSL season. However, Warren Grieve, the technical director, has taken over the reins in the interim due to Dee's relocation to Melbourne with his employment. Today's match will be the 28th time that the two teams have met in the league with a further three games having come in the cup.

THE OPPOSITION TODAY - MANLY UNITED

Manly last won honours by winning the Waratah Cup in 2011 by defeating Mens 2 club Mounties Wanderers 4-0 with goals by Scott Balderson, Adam Foti, Jordan Edwards and Justin Hayward. The team was - Dylan Mitchell, Jimmy Oates, Graeme Forbes, Marc Richards, Michael Daly, Balderson, Foti, Matthew Simm, Colin Iley, Corey Gibbs and Daniel Grant. Hayward, Mitch Macedo, Robbie Cattanach and Edwards replaced Balderson, Iley, Gibbs and Grant respectively. The coach was Craig Midgley.

Manly United will be hoping further improve on their good efforts in 2016 following their third placed position with 43 points from 12 wins and 7 draws. The team scored 55 goals and conceded 27 with a goal difference of plus 28, the second best of the competition's teams. The top scorer was Dejan Pandurevic with 13 goals, one of 12 players to have goaled. The team only had two games when they did not score, which was also second best. The quickest goal was by Pandurevic in the first minute of the Round 16 Hakoah Sydney City East encounter and 3 clean sheets were achieved which was the fifth best and equalled by three other teams. The biggest winning margin of five goals was achieved twice, the first in the Round 16 6-1 victory over

Hakoah Sydney City East and the second 5-0 victory over Blacktown Spartans in Round 19. The biggest losing margin was two in the 2-0 loss in Round 1 to Sutherland Sharks. The best result sequence without losing was eleven, Rounds 12-22, win, draw, win, draw, win, win, win, win, win and draw. The worst losing sequence was one match.

New players in 2017 are Sasa Macura from Blacktown City, Dylan Macallister from Rockdale and Nicola Taneski from Sydney United 58.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

At Seymour Shaw Park in 2007 the two teams met on the artificial pitch in the Tiger Turf Cup (now Waratah Cup and FFA Cup). In this prestigious match played on the 8th July, Manly struck first in the 23rd minute through Mihaljovic after first hitting the post five minutes prior. Cattanach made a mesmerising run past the Wolves defensive pairing before slotting the ball Mihaljovic. He immediately guided the ball into the net. Later Schirripa hit the cross bar but the 1-0 score line remained until the half time break. Just after the hour mark, Aliffi was barrelled over in the penalty area and a spot kick was awarded. Aliffi hit the ball to the right of Swancott with the Wolves restoring parity. Four minutes later Manly hit the lead again. Hamad collected a Cunico pass before producing a thunderous shot, which eluded Josevski. Manly not long after was one man down following a red card to Cunico. In the seventieth minute, the Wolves equalised through Osagie Ederaro. The African scored following the custodian pushing out Chris Prices shot that emanated from a Diaz corner. and Ederaro dashed in to score. A Dustin Wells 'goal' was not awarded before Steve Hayes was felled following his elusive run and Aliffi again dispatched the ball from the spot for his number two. Manly thought they had an equaliser goal but again for a second time in the match, the goal was not awarded. The Wolves finally held on to win the Cup 3-2.

THE MATCH - UP

Manly has 14 league victories and has scored 49 goals to the Wolves 11 wins and 43 goals, with a further four games ending in a draw. Manly have 7 nil scores to the Wolves 4. Manly's best sequence without loss is three, win, win and win (2006-2007) while the Wolves best is also three games, win, win and win (2011-2012). In the Cup games, Manly has a 2-1 advantage.

To date in 2017 after two rounds, Manly has six points and sits in first position by virtue of their goal difference, having achieved two wins. The Wolves, conversely sit in sixth position on three points with one win in credit. The top scorer at the moment for each club is Patrick Antelmi with two and Brendan Cholakian and Dylan Macallister with two apiece. The result sequence for the last two matches is - Manly - win, win, Wolves - win, loss.

In each team's previous round Manly scored five to Bonnyrigg White Eagles' lesser tally of three while the Wolves succumbed to Sydney Olympic by three goals to one, with the Wolves' Japanese import Yuzo Tashiro opening his scoring debut.

Manly top date has hit eight goals in two matches and the Wolves will need to be a fine defensive frame of mind to repel their attackers such as Dylan Macallister, brace scorer from the previous week Brendan Cholakian, Nic Taneski and Scott Balderson.

The Wolves also possess an attacking line-up that will cause

problems having scored four, with Tashiro, Nicolas Bernal and Patrick Antelmi on song so far. Joshua MacDonald together with Steve Hayes and Brendan Griffin, can bob up any time to score as they indeed, have proved in the past.

Both these particular teams are in the top three of offensive sides to date and this being the Wolves initial 2017 home game the crowd will be cheering their team on and the proceedings should pique their interest.

SELECTED REPRESENTATIVES OF BOTH CLUBS - JAMES MONIE

Burly striker James Monie scored more than his fair share of goals and played for Manly in the 2004/05, '06, and '07 seasons and for the Wolves in 2009. At Manly, he scored ten goals in 2004/05 season but alas only scored once for the Wolves. He played eight games and scored in his final game and the season's final one as well. In the 21st minute versus APIA Leichhardt Tigers, teammate, James Lawrence sent the ball to Monie. In a goal scoring position, Monie managed to thread the ball past the custodian for his team's first of five goals. Monie also displayed his skills in setting up goals when he nodded the ball into

Steve Hayes' path for him to notch another goal. Following the Round 15 Sydney Olympic clash, Monie stated post match - 'It's always hard playing up front by yourself. It's good having Haysey just behind. He works so hard and it is like having another striker up there with you.... It is a habit getting points.'

Monie was the top scorer in the 2002/03 Premier League with Central Coast scoring 16 goals. He also played for Adelaide City in the 2001 NSL season and he has represented central Coast Coasties, APIA Leichhardt, Newcastle Jets in A-League, Bankstown City, Sydney Olympic, Rockdale City Suns, Blacktown City, Hamilton Olympic, Weston Workers Bears and in 2016, Avoca Beach.

WOLVES PAST PLAYER OF NOTE - GEORGE SOURIS

Souris played for the Wolves for six seasons in total and first played in the 1997/98 NSL season and won honours with the team in the his third and fourth seasons, 1999/00 and 2000/01. The

stoic central defender first stint ended with the 2001/02 season. In the 2004/05 NSW Premier League season he had one more season in the red and white after signing from Sydney Olympic. In his Wolves career he scored one goal, which came at Brandon Park in Round 10 in the 2-1 loss to Melbourne Knights on the 3rd December in the 22nd minute. He scored with a header off a corner kick. For the Wolves, Souris amassed 133 starting appearances and 4 from the bench.

The central defender was solid and tough in defence, and very effective tackler and a good distributor of the ball.

From the Wolves, Souris went on to play for Sutherland Sharks, Bulli (IPL), Sutherland Sharks, and Coniston Lions (IPL) and concluded his playing career at Sutherland Sharks again.

BALGOWNIE RANGERS FC

Balgownie Rangers Football Club is the oldest running registered soccer club in Australia.

The Club was established in 1883 after Scotsman Peter Hunter came out with his family from Scotland to Cramsville (as Balgownie was known back then). Our Club colours are black and white, although our original jerseys were all red. In these early years the Club played social games amongst themselves as there was no other clubs to play against on the South Coast until the latter part of the 1880s.

By the late 1880s and 1890s Balgownie Rangers started competing against other Illawarra and Sydney teams. One competition Balgownie Rangers played in during this time was the Gardiner Cup. The Gardiner Cup was a prestigious competition that involved teams throughout the whole colony (Sydney, Newcastle and the Illawarra) and it was a hard competition to win, Balgownie Rangers were runners up in 3 Gardiner Cup Finals in the late 1890s and early 1900s, which for a town of its size and development is a great achievement in this prestigious competition.

In the 1920's after the First World War, Balgownie Rangers were one of the strongest sides in the state with numerous players representing the South Coast, New South Wales and 4 players representing Australia (Judy Masters [who is in the Football Federation of Australia's Hall of Fame], Tom Thompson (Junior), Dave Ward and Frank Smith). The standard of soccer in Balgownie at this time was very high and it is a credit to the community that a town of its size could produce so many quality soccer players.

the Club played locally and in the early 1950s Balgownie rejoined the State League. In the 1950's the Club had another golden period whereby they won the Zinc Cup in Broken Hill in 1951 and the state wide Sydney Cup competition in 1957. Considering the Sydney Cup was against Illawarra, Sydney and Newcastle teams this was a big win for the Club.

In the 1930's and after the Second World War

In he 1950s, 1960's and 1970s the Club was still involved in the State league and still attracted a lot of interest from the local community. During thisperiod many great players played for Balgownie such as Harry Murdoch (who represented the Socceroos), Mick Duff, Alex Fraser (who represented the Socceroos in a B international), Stan Richardson, Dennis Paterson, Terry Hurley, Don Shanks, George Ramage, George Barlow and Tom McWatters. Up until 1976 Balgownie continued to play in the State League and after this point re-joined the local Illawarra competition where we remain today.

The Club in this last 30 years has won numerous trophies (listed below) and has had many great players pull on the mighty Rangers black and white colours such as Matt Horsley, Adam Hughes, Andrew Naylor, Paul Dallas, Tom McCulloch, Richard Piel, Brian Dodd, Daniel Vlietstra, Jeff North, Joshua Faulks and Glen Smede.

THE NEW BOYS IN TOWN

The Wollongong Wolves have recruited a number of players to take the place of the 2016 departures with genuine goal scorers being targeted and with two returnees also to the club. As the season progresses all will see how these players have strengthened the side and to see the benefits on the points table.

PATRICK ANTELMI

In 2016, Antelmi played with the Grand Final winning team, Blacktown City in his second year at the club and came off the bench to score his team's third goal against Sydney United 58 in the 72nd minute twelve minutes after coming on. Antelmi surged forward for 40 metres with one defender in his way. He managed to hold him off to guide the ball past the goalkeeper. Furthermore, he scored a total 6 league goals in 2016 and 8 in 2015 with two braces. He scored a further three goals in the 2016 FFA Cup and another three in the final series. He also scored for Blacktown versus the Wolves in the Round 18 clash. A lifted pass from midfield allowed Antelmi room to move and he subsequently pushed the ball over the advancing Daniel Collison for the first goal of the match.

Antelmi also has plied his trade overseas with Wigan and Leeds United in England.

For the Wolves so far, he has been impressive hitting a brace on his debut against Parramatta. In the 48th minute, Antelmi struck with a powerful low trajectory effort which was a quality strike after dragging back the ball to strike with his left foot while falling to the ground. To bring up his brace, teammate Tashiro played him in and Antelmi sped through before angling the ball past the goalkeeper into the net.

He is quick, reliable scorer who will add firepower to the Wolves this season.

HAYDEN MORTON

Hayden Morton is an experienced defender who formerly played with Sutherland, making twenty appearances in 2011 before moving on to

play with Central Coast Mariners from 2012 to 2015 making five starts. A further seventeen appearances were made for Sutherland on loan in 2012. Last season, he played fourteen times for Blacktown Spartans.

His debut for the Wolves was in Round 1 versus Parramatta. He is a very dependable defender.

YUZO TASHIRO

From his former club Cerezo Osaka, Tashiro has come to the Wolves for this 2017 season. He in the past made 115 appearances for Kashima Antlers, a team that Australian A League teams have played in the Asian Champions League on a number of occasions. He is also has represented his country Japan with three appearances in 2008.

In his Round 1 debut, Tashiro was to the fore setting up Antelmi for one of his goals and being very industrious in attack, having a header saved by the goalkeeper in one of his raids. His scoring debut came in Round 2 in the away game Sydney Olympic game. He scored in the 90th minute.

He is a renowned goal scorer who should take most of the opportunities preented.

HRISTIJAN TANOSKI

Tanoski came to the Wolves from Rockdale City Suns after playing at the Sydney club for two years. As a Youth player he was formerly with the Suns and earlier with Canberra Olympic.

With the Suns he scored three goals in 2015 with his club scoring debut in Round 6 versus Blacktown City. In the following year, he totaled four goals with one coming against the Wolves in Round 14. It eventuated in time added on prior to half time. Wolves' goalkeeper Justin Pasfield had kept out Paul Reid's thunderous effort and further had punched out a corner kick. However Rockdale's pressure kept up and the Wolves could not effectively clear the danger. Tanoski was in close proximity to the goal and he latched on to the ball and touched it home.

Tanoski first appearance with the Wolves was against Parramatta in Round 1

when he came on from the bench in the 80th minute. His initial starting role was in Round 2. He will make a sound contribution to the team giving his past exploits.

LUKE KAIRIES

Kairies is a goalkeeper who last season played a couple games for Sutherland in first grade after being promoted from the Youth team and also played with Mounties Wanders in Mens 2 competition. He has gained overseas experience playing with FC Eindhoven in Holland.

BEN TOSI

Tosi, a defender, played first grade for Blacktown Spartans in 2016 coming from the youth team. The coach Frank Cosimento at the time had no hesitation in elevating him to first grade.

He made his Wolves debut in Round 2 versus Sydney Olympic on the 19th March

STEVE HAYES

Back for his third stint with the club having first played in 2006 to 2009 and from 2013 to 2014. From 2010 - 2012 Steve Hayes was with Sydney United 58. At this particular club he was the 'NSW PL Footballer Of The Year' in 2011. From Sydney United he played in India with United Sikkim before his second stint with the Wolves in 2013 and 2014 but an early injury alas kept him out for most of 2014 season. From Wollongong, he ventured overseas once again and played with Biu Chun Rangers in Hong Kong before re-surfacing in Australia, this time at Sutherland in 2015 where he netted one goal. This came in the Round 11 APIA match as he scored in the 64th minute. His curving free kick flew into the goal beating the custodian. He played for the Sharks again in 2016.

Hayes has achieved honours with the Wolves club on two occasions, being in the team that annexed the 2007 Tiger Turf Cup Final (now Waratah Cup) and the 2008 NSW PL Championship.

He has captained the Wolves at



times in the past and always gives his all. He is dynamic on the field and a displays a never say die attitude.

MICHAEL ROBINSON

Michael Robinson last played for the Wolves in 2015 having signed in 2012. He is also a club junior from 2002/03 to 2003/04.

In 2016 he played again with Bonnyrigg White Eagles after having played at the western Sydney club in 2011 after turning out for Sutherland from 2008 -2010.

Not a prolific scorer by any means, however Robinson pops up from time to time and again registers on the goal scorer's list. In fact, his debut Premier League goal was with the Wolves in 2012 against Sydney United 58 with his shot evading a crowded area. In 2016 he scored one goal with Bonnyrigg, in the 4-2 win against Hakoah Sydney City East in Round 10 emanating in the 38th minute. Robinson met a cross from the right side of goal, heading the ball towards the goal. It took a slight deflection but went in never the less.

Robinson is a defender who can with aplomb play higher up the field. He can instigate attacking movements, time tackles well, and bring the ball the field with dexterity, and all with a high work rate.

The above-mentioned players are new in 2017 and will aid a hoped for resurgence for the Wolves.




