THE OPPOSITION:

ROCKDALE CITY SUNS

Rockdale City Suns come to WIN Stadium for this 2017 Round 10 encounter versus the Wollongong Wolves. The coach of the Suns is Paul Reid and he as a player is held in high regard in this neck of the woods as he scored the equalising goal for the Wolves against Perth Glory in the 1999/2000 NSL Grand Final. This will be the 18th meeting between the two clubs since the first in 1987 and we welcome Rockdale City Suns to WIN Stadium.

THE OPPOSITION TODAY - ROCKDALE CITY SUNS

Rockdale in 2013 were runners up and were finalists in 2015, as well as qualifying for the FFA Cup Round Of 16. The club kept on this upward spiral in the previous season qualifying for the 2016 finals. However, much to their chagrin were eliminated at the first hurdle.

The Suns finished the previous season in 4th position achieving 38 points from 11 wins and 5 draws, scoring 41 goals conceding 32 with a goal difference of 9. The top scorers were Dylan Macallister and Alec Urosevski on nine apiece with 8 players contributing to the scoring. Macallister scored the quickest goal in the second minute versus Blacktown Spartans in Round 5. Urosevski was also the only multi scorer in a single match when he achieved a brace against the Spartans in Round 5.

The biggest winning margin was 3 in the 3-0 Rounds 10 and 14 with the biggest losing margin was also 3 in Round 19 3-0 loss. Rockdale had five clean sheets, which was the third best in the competition equalling one other team.

The team neglected to score on only three occasions, which was third best in the league and equalled three other teams.

New players for this year include Harris Gaitatzis from Sydney Olympic, Jordan Figon from Sutherland, Brayden Sorge and Michael Loupis from Sydney Olympic and veteran goalkeeper with A-League experience at Perth Glory, Western Sydney Wanderers, Melbourne Victory and Newcastle Jets, Ante Covic. In addition, Jonathan Grozdanovski from Blacktown City has also signed.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

In Round 2 1987 the teams met at Wollongong Showground. The teams were as follows -

Wolves: Warwick Young, David Skeen, Mike Hollifield, Larry Beringer, Jock Morlando, Robert Giraldi, Bryan Cokely, Jeff Ainswiorth, Randall Easthorpe, past Brodnik, Rade Stefanovski. Leonel Arcosa replaced Stefanovski. The coach was John Fleming.

Suns: Ian Baker, Darren Wilson, G.Wilson, Mike Boogard, Vasco Mitrovski, Vladimir Tortevski, Vince Nastovski, Bill Pilovski, Bruno Beddoni, Saslo Spirovski and Pat Rodas. Paul Darlington was a substitute. Ilija Takac was the coach.

The Wolves got to an early lead as Brodnik raced through and scored. Number two was brought up 11 minutes later when Cokely was impeded in the box. Morlando duly scored from the spot. Later, Rockdale was reduced to ten men after Tortevski. was red carded for a tackle on Ainsworth. The Wolves then strode out for a third when Easthorpe goaled in the 52nd minute. The Wolves by then had thought that they were in for an easy afternoon but the Suns had other thoughts. Four minutes later, substitute Darlington's powerful drive from just outside the area pulled one back. A further six minutes down the track, Rodas added one more and it was game on, but despite the advancement made in the second half by Rockdale, it was a case of 'too little too late' and the 3-2 score line stood.

THE MATCH-UP

There has been only one draw in all the team's meetings. However, the Wolves lead Rockdale marginally in the goal scoring department, 21 goals to 20, while Rockdale has the edge in the number of wins, 8 to 7.

The Wolves have one less nil score than Rockdale,

that being a total of four. The best result sequence without loss for each team is - four games for Rockdale, win, win, win, and win. (2015-2016), and six for the Wolves - win, win, win, draw and win. (2011-2013).

In 2017, Rockdale sit in second position with twenty points from six wins and two draws while the Wolves number thirteen points and are currently in seventh position (however, with a three point deduction still pending due to fielding ineligible players in Round 1) from four wins and a draw. Rockdale and the Wolves have achieved twenty-three and eleven goals respectively.

The top scorer for each club is Jordan Figon (Rockdale) and Yuzo Tashiro (Wollongong) with nine and five goals respectively. Six Suns players have got on the scorecard as four players and an own have goaled for the Wolves. Multi scorers in a single match this year are Patrick Antelmi and Yuzo Tashiro (Wolves), plus Jordan Figon (twice) and Alec Urosevski (Rockdale).

The result sequence for the last five matches is - Rockdale - draw, win, draw win and loss, Wolveswin, loss, win, win and loss.

In each team's previous match Rockdale were defeated 4-0 by Blacktown City while the Wolves lost 3-0 to bottom placed Bonnyrigg White Eagles.

Wolves' player Hristijan Tanoski is a former Suns player from last season and he will be looking for a good display if he gains the coach's nod. Indeed last season, he scored against the Wolves.

The best result for each club in 2017 has been Rockdale 5-0 against Bonnyrigg White Eagles and Wollongong 3-0 versus Sutherland, both these games were in Round 7, and while Rockdale has one nil scoring game, the Wolves number two of these.

SELECTED REPRESENTATIVE OF BOTH CLUBS - PAUL REID

Paul Reid played four seasons with Wolves and achieved success with two Grand Final victories and a goal in his first Grand Final that took his team into extra time and ultimately win. He received a long angled pass from the left to his position on the right with barely minutes to spare. On receiving the ball he controlled it from waist height and sprinted into space eluding a defender. He confidently drove his shot under the diving custodian with his right foot into the goal. He was in the red and white from the 1998/99 season and concluded his stint in the 2001/02 season.

Reid achieved 92 starting league appearances and 8 off the bench scoring 15 goals in the process. His debut match was in Round 7 on the 22nd November at Edensor Park versus Sydney United. Reid's debut goal was in the 3-3 draw with Marconi, Round 13 on 2nd January 1999. He goaled ten minutes in, by stealing into the penalty area to let fly to hit pay dirt. Against Northern Spirit in Round 26 saw Reid's final Wolves' goal. He latched onto Stuart Young's through ball to propel it into the net to make up for an earlier chance that went narrowly over.

There were nil multi goals scored in the league but Reid scored a brace in Papua New Guinea in the Oceania Club Champions Cup. Against Food Town Warriors Reid was pulled down and a penalty lick was awarded and converted. His brace came versus Langu United in the 43rd and 74th minutes. Mennillo had set up Reid for his first.

Reid has been at Rockdale since 2013 after he finished playing at Sydney FC in the A-League and has added the coaching role since 2015. His team played in 2015 FFA Cup Round of 16 against Melbourne Victory after beating Perth SC 3-0. After fine lead-up work by Reid versus Perth, his team's midfield player scored a goal. Against the Victory the Suns went down 3-2 in a closely fought game, which is a testament to Reid's

coaching ability. Reid has got onto the score sheet three times himself with the Suns. In 2014 he scored in the 26th minute versus Blacktown City and in 2013 in Round 21 against Central Coast Mariners in the 90th minute. He scored last season 2016 in the Parramatta Round 22 match in the 66th minute. He produced a low trajectory shot, which flew into the bottom corner of the goal. He set the second goal with his cross. These three games all resulted in Rockdale victories.

Reid was and still is a player who is strong in the tackle, provides defence splitting passes for his supports from midfield, has deft skill, reads the play well and possesses a never say die attitude. He has played overseas with Bradford City and Bright And Hove Albion and came back to Australia at A-League club Adelaide United, then Melbourne Heart (now City). A short-term contact with INSEE Police United in Thailand followed before a stint with Sydney FC.

WOLVES' PAST PLAYER OF NOTE – RAY VLIETSTRA

Vlietstra played eight seasons with the Wolves from 1982 -1986 and from 1988 -1989, and 1989/90 which was his final series. As a central defender, he was safe, good in the air, strong in the tackle and able to clear and bring the ball out of defence when required. He scored his only Wolves league goal in Round 25 against St. George in the 42nd minute in 1984. He headed in from close range after meeting a John Fleming cross. He amassed 159 starting appearances and one as a replacement, making his debut on the 4th April 1982 versus Newcastle KB United at the Wollongong Showgrounds in Round 8. His final league game was in Round 22 1989/90 at Brandon Park on the 26th March 1990.

He achieved individual honours being selected in the Australia U20 Youth team in 1983 and he was a Schoolboy International for Australia in 1981.

Vlietstra in 1987 played for Sydney United in the NSL. His junior clubs were Balgownie and Figtree.

Jim Valentine is a name many young footballers in the Illawarra should be well aware of. It is thanks to the efforts and vision of Jim that many kids across the Illawarra have had the opportunity to fully enjoy the beautiful game of football.

Jim Valentine was born in Lithgow in 1915 and played in the local competition growing up. By all accounts he was quite a player and represented the NSW PSAAA Schoolboys State Football Soccer Football Team as a 15 year old in 1930.

Jim eventually left Lithgow and moved to the Illawarra, bringing his passion for football with him. Determined to continue the game he loved in his new home, Jim gathered together a group of players, predominantly from the local Coniston Public School and entered a team in the 10th Annual Gala Day held at Balgownie.

Following the enjoyment experienced by the kids at this event, Jim followed this up by placing a notice in the newspaper to hold a meeting and elect official positions for the formation of a new local team – Coniston.

Ern Leighton was the inaugural President. Jim Valentine was the club's first Secretary and Bob Leishman assumed the role of treasurer. Our beloved "Cono" was officially born.

In 1955 the club entered 3 teams into the local competition. One U12 team and two U10 teams where the first to represent. From the outset Coniston developed a strong reputation as the "friendly, family club" and this reputation continues to thrive and grow.

A mantra of "One Big Happy Family" has seen players who progress through Coniston's pathways maintain a strong passion and loyalty for the club, which was an important key to the club's early success and remains a cornerstone today maintaining the tradition and success of the very early years.

Old timers, still associated with the club, to this day recall the joy they had in the 1960s, when the senior players would manage the junior teams on Saturday mornings, which then allowed the junior players to watch their managers play in the afternoon and offer their own critiques of the senior's performance. It was this close bond between the seniors and juniors that helped foster the "One Big Family" motto.

The instantly recognisable Gold and Black colours of Coniston also were decided at its inception. Ern Leighton and Bob Leishman were both born and raised near Cessnock whose local colours were Yellow and Black. This connection with their past coupled with the obvious connection that their new



home in the Illawarra was then a thriving coal mining community where "Black Gold" was the lifeblood of the region, adopting the Gold and Black was a natural selection for these pioneers.

At various times Coniston was referred as "The Canaries" or "The Whistlers" but Rex Leighton, son of founding President Ern settled on the name Coniston Condors. And they have been known as the Condors since.

On 16th April 1955 the Club played its first match day, with the U12s losing to Bulli 6-1, U10A defeated Port Kembla 1-0. and U10B lost to Fernhill 3-0.

In 1956, the U10A won the first titles for the club-the league premiership and the Austinmer Cup knockout. This team went on to win many more premierships including U12A in 1958, U14A in 1960, U16A in 1961 and U17A in 1962. Five boys played in all these premierships - Jeff White, Ian Leishman, Tom Boon, Rex Leighton and Colin Brown.

Noel Telfer was selected for the NSW U14 team in 1960, while Rex Leighton (Capt.) and John Hoogland were selected in the NSW U17 team in 1962.

In 1963, Coniston entered its first senior team in the amateur 3rd division.

In 2014, Coniston Junior Soccer Club signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Coniston Lions Senior Club to form the Coniston Football Club (Coniston F.C.). The Club has over 400 players including 30 junior teams, an all-age womens team, two over 35's masters teams, and three teams participating in the District League. With a vision of becoming 'The Destination Club', Coniston strive to have the very best club built on a culture that ensures players and members enjoy every moment

Coniston continues to foster and develop football across our region and build on the "family" club ethos forged from its very beginning.

LOOKING BACK

1999/2000 SEASON - PART ONE

The Wolves entered this mammoth season with an opening round at home, Brandon Park, playing the previous years champions, South Melbourne, coached by Ange Postecoglu. The Wolves coach Nick Theodorakopoulos reached a milestone with the club, being recognized before proceedings, with this match being his hundredth in charge. The club was aiming for a respectable mid table finish in this season, aiming in years to come for higher honours.

A week before the league kicked off Adelaide Sharks pulled out of the competition. This meant that some teams would play each other four times in a reworked schedule.

The team that played in Round 1 was Daniel Beltrame in goal, Matthew Horsley, George Souris, Robert Stanton and Neil Harlock comprising the back four, David Huxley, Noel Spencer, Scott Chipperfield and Anthony Surjan were in midfield with Sasho Petrovski and Esala Masi up front. Paul Reid, Peter Lahanas and David Cervinski replaced Masi, Petrovski and Surjan respectively.

There was only six minutes on the clock before the home team went ahead. The Fijian international Masi raced away from his collecting a good pass and from close range beat the goalkeeper. Twenty-two minutes forward, New Zealander Harlock broke the defensive line to convert his opportunity. No more goals were forthcoming, however, the opposition pulled one back in the second half but the Wolves defence, expertly marshalled by Man Of The Match Stanton, rode out the pressure.

Away to Newcastle Breakers in Round 2 produced a 2-2 draw with Masi and Petrovski opening their goal accounts. Sasho Dimoski made his season debut coming on for Chipperfield with nine minutes left on the clock. An overhead bicycle kick was demonstrated by Petrovski to score in the 87th minute to level the scores. Masi scored a first half equaliser gaining the benefit of the Newcastle defensive lapse.

Sydney Olympic shocked the Wolves at home by winning four goals to nil, before the return match concluded in a 1-1 draw. English striker, Stuart Young made his debut and his presence felt with his first goal of many for the club. He slotted away a Surjan cross in the 78th minute.

A high scoring draw with Auckland Kingz in New Zealand eventuated with Horsley Reid and Masi netting with the Kingz equalising late in the match, in the 89th minute top be exact. Huxley and Masi were

red carded in the second half and this assisted the opposition greatly. Horsley got on the end of a cross on three minutes and Reid powered in from close proximity. Masi ran on to a long pass to beat the goalkeeper with his drive.

Petrovski hit a brace in the 3-0 defeat of Northern Spirit at home with Young adding the third. Petrovski netted in the first minute when he latched onto Chipperfield's rapidly released pass. Reid shaved the post with an effort on nineteen minutes before Petrovski chipped the advancing custodian after collecting a long pass. Young scored with a header from a Chipperfield cross. Pogliacomi was comfortable with the high and low shots and Cervinski played solidly in defence. Paul Dimech made his debut.

Another visit to New Zealand and this time the Wolves won 4-2. The Wolves gained the ascendancy scoring two goals with a four-minute period. Young sent Horsley on his way before he in turn crossed for Masi who powerfully headed home. A Young lob into box allowed Chipperfield to slot the ball into the goal. Young turned from provider into a scorer by heading in a Reid corner kick in the 70th minute. Twelve minutes later he scored again, this time from the penalty spot after Horsley was felled. The Kingz scored twice from the spot to reduce their arrears.

Gippsland Falcons came to Brandon Park for the Round 8 encounter and it was the Wolves' third win on the trot. Cervinski collected Chipperfield's corner kick five minutes in, and then powered the ball into the net. A Petrovski cross allowed Young to seemingly score except it was cleared off the line before Petrovski headed in a Chipperfield cross.


Marconi scored one and kept the Wolves scoreless and then the Melbourne Knights added another defeat by two goals to one. Souris headed in a corner kick at home on twenty-two minutes for one of rare goals to get his team ahead but the Knights added theirs in the second half. A return to the winner's list followed with a 2-1 defeat of Adelaide City. A City error in the first minute was the catalyst for Petrovski to zip in and score. Chipperfield added the other with a minute to go with his shot going underneath the diving 'keeper. Following this game Harlock was out injured for a number of and did not see action again until Round 34.

A three-goal shut out of Canberra Cosmos was played in the wet at home. Petrovski score a brace hitting his first on the guarter of an hour and in the 83rd minute. Chipperfield added the third in the 77th minute. Petrovski was the 'Man Of The Match' and Stanton and Horsley excelled.

Round 13 was a 1-1 with Brisbane Strikers at Brisbane's Suncorp Stadium. Petrovski scored the games initial goal just shy of the half hour mark before the Strikers equalised in the second half.

A seven thriller greeted the fans in the next game against the new powerbrokers Parramatta Power. Masi hit a hat trick to let the coach he was still on target. In the third minute, Ceccoli received the ball wide on the left. On the halfway, he threaded the ball to Chipperfield. He eluded a defender before provided a square pass for Masi. He consequently from close range knocked the ball into the goal. Further on, an out swinging Chipperfield corner kick located Cervinski at the far post. He produced a low trajectory header that was unfortunately whacked off the line. The ball went high. Masi rose above the throng to reach it and head home. He could have had his hat trick earlier but his effort went wide with the goal at his mercy. Chipperfield fully stretched to score with a header after meeting a flighted ball from Horsley. A long throw reached Petrovski and his resulting shot cannoned off the right post thereby finding Masi who blasted the rebound back into the net. Pogliacomi denied the Power late in the match to prevent a draw.

A 1-1 draw with South Melbourne ensued with Young scored from the penalty spot in the southern capital and the South did likewise from the spot. Carlton SC came to Brandon Park for this match that was played in light rain with five goals being scored. Wolves went into the match with four strikers Carlton scored the second and fifth goals. Ceccoli produced his customary long throw, which Chipperfield latched onto. He moved the ball to Masi to hit a shot that



rocketed past the custodian. Carlton struck back almost immediately. A clever Petrovski back heel located Young who hit a tremendous shot in. Masi got the next one. Despite hitting three, the home could have had more given the opportunities. Cervinski won the accolades for his sterling performance. Petrovski netted the only goal versus Sydney United in Round 17. He headed in a Ceccoli cross. Pogliacomi produced a clean sheet.

The return match in midweek with Sydney United produced a flurry of seven goals and the Wolves went to the 'toppermost of the poppermost' for the first time since 1988. Three minutes in, Young goaled and then again to bring up his brace eight minutes later. Masi and Horsley added the others leading 4-1 before Sydney added another. Chipperfield scored on ninety minutes. Young, Horsley and Stanton earned acclaim.

A defeat by Perth Glory brought the Wolves unbeaten run of seven games to a close. Two goals by the Glory emanated before Chipperfield pulled one back late after he beat the custodian to the ball. However, the United 'keeper saw off two one on one chances by both Chipperfield and Young in injury time. Another loss was sustained to Newcastle Breakers by 2-1 in Round 20 even though the team dominated except on the scoreboard. In the seventh minute, Chipperfield was first to an opposition back pass to ultimately beat the goalkeeper with his effort.

Sydney Olympic provided the opposition for the next two outings and both resulted in draws. It was 2-2 at Belmore Sports Ground and 1-1 at Brandon Park. Mennillo, a recent signing from the Auckland Kingz, and Ceccoli plus Mennillo again had the scoring honours. Both Menillo and Ben Blake were making their debuts, with Blake replacing Petrovski. Mennillo collected a Paul Reid free kick and his ensuing left foot did the damage, powering the ball into the goal for his first in the red and white. Ceccoli's left footed shot later zoomed past the custodian between the sticks. Young was the provided for Mennillo's next goal as he ran onto his pass to beat the 'keeper. The Wolves were unlucky not to taste victory as an earlier Young rifled into the post.

Round 23 was a welcome return to the winner's circle as the Wolves defeated Auckland Kingz by three goals to one. A Kingz player was red carded after only a minute had elapsed for his tackle on former team mate Mennillo and with a man down found it difficult but somehow scored the first goal from the penalty spot. Young

restored parity after receiving a perfect pass. Masi hit number two after he sent through by Mennillo's free kick. Young latched onto a Masi cross for the third. Youngster Paul O'Grady made his first starting appearance.

An away trip to Northern Spirit culminated in a 3-0 victory. A handball by a Spirit player gifted Young a penalty that he calmly converted. A corner kick was curled in and Cervinski at the far post was able to

head home, crashing his header into the top right corner. Reid cleared one off the line with a header to keep the Spirit at bay. Young set up Horsley with a deft pass on the right side of the goal area. Horsley left footed shot flew into the goal.

At this stage of the competition, the Wolves were in second place by one point.

SUCH A NIGHT

MOST GOALS IN A SINGLE FINALS GAME

There has been one player in the history of the Wolves who scored two goals in a finals match and such a night it was when this eventuated. These particular goals came in 1997/98 National Soccer League Finals campaign after the Wolves had concluded the season in sixth position, thereby qualifying for the NSL finals for the third occasion and the fourth such occasion. It was the do or die Elimination Final first leg versus Adelaide City on the 19th April 1998 in front of big crowd of 10,954 at Brandon Park and the player in question was playing against his former club where he was for three years prior.

This player in question also played in the Under 20s Australian team in the 1997 FIFA World Youth Championship in Malaysia being on the field for all three group games and scoring all four goals in the 4-3 victory over Argentina.

However, in 1998, it was a stalemate in the first half of the Elimination Final, as each side could not gain edge. The Wolves ultimately hit the lead in the fifty-sixth minute and striker Kosta Salapasidis scored a brace for the next two goals in a three-minute scoring spree, beginning in the eighty-third minute. The opposition had made a mistake and Anthony Surjan gained possession of the ball to pull it across the face of goal. Salapasidis speedily chimed in with a determined run to meet the ball and trundle it into the goal. Minutes later, he was involved in a scuffle with the central defender before another opposition player fouled later in proceedings. When it happened, Alvin Ceccoli's ensuing shot from a free kick was saved but not grasped. The ball ran free until Salapasidis zipped in to collect it and knock it into the goal. Alas, this was his last kick on the night as he was immediately substituted.

In the Elimination semi-final second leg played on the 26th April, that was played at Hindmarsh Stadium, Salapasidis very nearly scored when he latched onto a goalkeeper Brett Hughes' long punt and flew past the Adelaide City central defender in possession, but his subsequent shot was somehow saved by the custodian. However, not be undone, he finally got on the score sheet after being put through by Scott Chipperfield. He rounded a defender with his pace to project a thunderous shot into the top corner of the net.

For the club, Salapasidis had played eleven games in total comprising eight league games and three finals appearances. His first game was in Round 19 and he scored a total of six goals, three in the league and three in the finals.

As well his brace in the finals, he had previously scored another brace against Sydney Olympic on the 22nd February 1998 in the 22nd and 77th minutes in Round 19, and this game was also his Wolves debut. Prior to this, he had trialled for Torino in Italy but came back to Australia to play for the Wolves, on loan from Adelaide City.

His initial goal in the red and white emanated when his shot to the near post went in. For his second goal, Tony Perinich and Surjan were involved in the lead-up until Salapasidis goaled his team's third goal and winner.

However, it was the brace in the finals campaign that put the consummate striker in the domestic football headlines. It was indeed 'such a night' for Kosta Salapasidis and the Wollongong Wolves.
