THE OPPOSITION:

SUTHERLAND SHARKS

Our northern neighbours Sutherland Sharks come to Albert Butler Reserve, Primbee to play the Round 19 fixture against the Wollongong Wolves. This will be the 26th league meeting between the two clubs and the 30th overall including two finals and one cup game.

THE OPPOSITION TODAY - SUTHERLAND SHARKS

The Sutherland Sharks club last won honours in 2012 when victorious in the Waratah Cup final by defeating Apia Leichardt Tigers 4-1 at Cromer Park, Dee Why. The goals scorers were Chris Price, Matthew Bailey, Blake Powell and Panni Nikas. The team was Nathan Denham, George Souris, Yanni Fragogiannis, Paul Cotte, Matthew Gordon, Price, Hussein Salameh, Bailey, Hayden Morton, Nick Stavroulakis and Powell. Simon Jaeger, Todd Halloran, Nikas and Nick Tsattalos replaced Denham, Salameh, Bailey and Powell. The coach was Robert Stanton.

In 2016 the Sharks concluded the season in 7th position on 27 points from 8 wins and 3 draws, sustaining 11 defeats. Thirty-one goals were scored with forty against with a negative nine-goal difference with four of the competition clubs having lesser statistics in this regard. Tomohiro Kajiyama scored eight goals with twelve others making their contributions. There were 3 nil scoring games by the team of which two teams bettered and 3 teams equalled and there were 8 clean sheets, the second best in the competition. The quickest goal was a 6th minute goal by Perry Moustakas in Round 17. Nick Littler was the solitary multi scorer in a single match with a brace in Round 2. The best result sequence without loss was 5 games, Round 17-21, win, win, win, draw and win. The worst sequence without winning was 5, Round 6-10, loss, loss, loss, loss and draw. The greatest losing sequence was 4, Round 6-9. The biggest winning margin was 3-0 in Round 17 and biggest losing margin was 4-0 in Round 3.

New players for 2017 signed by the then coach Carlos Villazon, include are Kevin Lopes from

Hakoah Sydney City East, Nathan Elasi from APIA and Wade Oostendorp from Mounties Wanderers. However, a coaching change was effected prior to Round 8 with Grant Lee taking over.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

In the Round 22 final round match in 2008 the two went into this game with the Premiership on the line. Sutherland only required a draw and a superior goal difference and the Wolves desperately needed a victory. This match was played at Seymour Shaw Park, Miranda on Sunday 3rd August.

Sutherland: Phil Zabaks, George Souris, Nick Stavroulakis, Pedj Bojic, Michael Katz, Michael Robinson, Jim Bakis, David Huxley, Brad Boardman, David Reid and Neil Jablonski. Matthew Hall and James Lawrence replaced Souris and Boardman. The coach was Brian Brown.

Wolves: Michael Turnbull, Ben Blake (Capt.), Danial Cummins, Chris Price, Tynan Diaz, Matthew Bailey, Steve Hayes, Michael Hawrysiuk, Ballamodou Conde, Ilija Prenzoski and Mitchell Long. Michael West and Samet Kaynak replaced Hawrysiuk and Conde. The coach was John Turner.

Early on in the match Turnbull denied Boardman by plucking the ball from his feet. Despite chances from Stavroulakis, Bojic and Huxley in the first half an hour the Sharks could not take the lead. Prenzoski, Diaz and Hawrysiuk (with an overhead kick) also could not take an advantage. However, in the 39th minute, Huxley's powerful drive made an impact when he goaled after good lead up work by Reid and Robinson and the Sharks took this lead into the sheds at half time. Conversely, The Wolves' Hayes saved one off the line and a Conde shot had hit the side netting.

In the second half, Jablonski had only Turnbull to beat but shot high and a Stavroulakis effort went narrowly wide. Wollongong restored parity two minutes after the hour when Long collected a clever flick from Prenzoski after he in turn had been set up by Conde. Long ran through and beat

Zabaks. Cummins was given a second yellow (thus a red) in time added on. At 1-1 the Premiership went to the Sharks as both teams had concluded the season on 44 points but Sutherland had a superior goal difference of plus 29 to the Wolves plus 20.

Long- 'I played well and it was tough out there. It is disappointing to lose the premiership that way but we still equalled them, but that's soccer for you... Every time I got the ball he (Bojic) was at me. He received a yellow card later for this.'

Turner - 'It was a great performance. I'm disappointed for the supporters that we did not go home as champions but I'm not disappointed with the result. We were the better team in the second half and we did not hold back.'

THE MATCH -UP

From the twenty-five league games, with the Sharks having the most wins 12 to 9 and scoring the most goals 44 to 31. The teams share the nil scores total, seven each. The best sequence without loss has been five matches for the Sharks from 2009 to 2011, win, win, win, win and win. The Wolves' best is four matches in 1987, 200, win,

win, draw and win. The Wolves best score was 4-0 in 1987 while the best for the Sharks was 5-1 in 2009 and 4-0 in 2012 and 2013.

In 2017, the result sequence for the last five matches Rounds 14-18 is -Sutherland - loss, win, loss, loss, and loss, Wollongong - win, loss, loss, win and win. The Sharks biggest win and loss has been 3-1 and 0-4 in Rounds 10 and 5 as against the Wolves' 3-0 and 0-3 in Rounds 8 and 9.

Sutherland sits in 10th position with twelve points earned from four wins, while the Wolves occupy seventh place on twenty-eight points, these coming from nine victories and one draw. The top scorer for each club is Tomohiro Kajiyama and Yuzo Tashiro with twelve and eight goals respectively. Nil score games for each team six (SS) and four (WW). Five Sharks players plus an own goal and eight Wolves players and an own goal have contributed to the goal scoring for each team.

In the teams' previous round matches Sutherland was defeated 2-0 by Bonnyrigg White Eagles and the Wolves defeated Hakoah Sydney City East 2-1 with Peter Simonoski scoring two goals.

SELECTED REPRESENTATIVE OF BOTH CLUBS - MATTHEW BAILEY

Bailey garnered honours at both the Wolves and the Sharks in his N.S.W Premier League career. He played two years for each club, the Wolves in 2008 and 2014 and in 2011-2012 at the Sharks.

As well as being in the Wolves 2008 Championship winning team the club qualified for the 2014 FFA Cup Round Of 32 which was against the Central Coast Mariners. Following this match at WIN Stadium on the 20th August, Bailey stated 'It is a little bit disappointing obviously but we have to put it in perspective. Central Coast was very well prepared and they were sharp right across the park. In the second half, we showed we could match them in some parts and we had some chances but unfortunately we could not convert. It took us some awhile to adjust to the pace of the game but credit to the boys we really dug deep. It was a good performance but not the result we wanted.' This match was the swansong for Bailey at the Wolves and he did it with his customary style, never letting his team down with his consummate display on the field.

In 2008 he scored 3 goals in 2008 in successive matches and three in the three 2008 finals matches. In the Grand Final he scored his team's first of four goals. In the 28th minute, a long Michael Hawrysiuk throw was headed on with both Chris Price and Ballamodou Conde. Bailey got his head to the ball to project it into the goal. He played a total of thirty-six league starting appearances with two off the bench. He was

also team captain for three matches in 2014 and scored 3 goals for that season.

Bailey was the top scorer in 2011 with Sutherland with eight goals to his credit and was in the Waratah Cup winning team in 2012. A total of twenty goals were scored with the Sharks with one being scored against the Wolves in 2011 in Round 11. He rose high to head home a Nick Tsattalios cross in the 52nd minute. In the Cup Final he scored his team's second goal. He tucked in a Chris Price pass and this was his last kick of the game.

Bailey was a good passer of the ball with good vision and was able to set the strikers up with his probing runs and well-directed passes.

WOLVES' PAST PLAYER OF NOTE - JIM PRESTON

Preston was a Scottish goalkeeper who emigrated from Scotland's Queens Park to Newcastle KB United in Australia's National Soccer League before coming to the Wolves. Preston was the very first shot stopper for the Wolves and he played 13 games in 1981 and 18 in 1982. In his debut versus Sydney Olympic in Round 1 at the Wollongong Showground, two great saves were made by Preston to deny Olympic as they looked likely to score. He was the custodian in the 1982 Finals series (which was the clubs first time in the finals) with two matches being played. A win to the Wolves over Heidelberg United in the semi-final came before being before the team bowed out to St. George in the final.

During his two seasons, he had a selection battle with Natch Vardareff with him losing, and then regaining his position.

He was a safe goalkeeper, good in the air, good with the punch and supported his team with his exploits. His final game was on 19th September 1982 in the aforementioned Preliminary Final versus St. George. Preston's final league game was a 3-1 victory over Brisbane City in Wollongong on 5th September 1982.

BACK FOR GOOD

MICHAEL ROBINSON

CURRENT PLAYERS INITIAL AND LATEST WOLVES' PREMIER LEAGUE GOAL.

Which of the Mens 1 League goals came first for these players of 2017 and which was the last in line? In some cases, the first Wolves goal has been the only one. Following are the circumstances behind each of these judicious strikes and the number of appearances it took to get on to the score sheet for the first goal scored in date order plus the latest strike of these players where applicable.

STEVE HAYES - 2nd April 2006 / 9th August 2009.

It was in Round 7 versus Parramatta away that midfielder Hayes got his first goal, with his team hitting four on that day. It was his fifth Wolves appearance as well. He was the recipient of a poor Parramatta defender's clearance with the ball fortuitously falling to him at the edge of the box. He seized the moment, blasting a low trajectory shot into the goal, leaving the custodian and defenders in its wake. It was in time added on that he duly goaled to complete the shut out.

Hayes' latest goal for the club was in the final round of the 2009 season away to APIA Leichhardt. With him being adjudged the best on the field, he goaled in the twenty-seventh minute after James Monie had headed the ball forward for him to pick it up, before rocketing his shot past the custodian for his team's second goal and the fourth for the match.

CHRIS PRICE - 21st May 2006 / 28th May 2017

Price's goal was the second of the match and shored up the victory for the home team in his fourteenth appearance consisting of three from the bench and eleven starts stemming from his first and only league appearance in 2005. It was Round 14 and Marconi was the opponent. In the seventy-sixth minute, a Ballamodou Conde pass found Price after he had sprinted down the left. In the ensuing moments, he

powered the ball down the centre of the empty net as the goalkeeper and another defender were converging on him. Price, in a post match interview stated 'I was pleased with the goal and the way the team played.'

In 2017, Price scored the second of three in the Round 12 match versus Parramatta FC. It came in the 50th minute when Price produced a diving low header off a Yuzo Tashiro across the face of goal pass with Price reacting near the far post.

PETER SIMONOSKI - 2nd August 2009 / 15th July 2017

At Macedonia Park (Hooka Creek Road), Berkeley, a fifteen year old Simonoski goaled after he met a chipped pass from Jamie McMaster. He pushed the ball into the goal in the sixty-third minute in this Round 21 Blacktown City match in his second substitute appearance. This debut strike was the beginning of many more.

In the seventy-ninth minute of the Hakoah Sydney City East match at Hensley Athletic Centre, Pagewood, Simonoski scored his thirty-third Wolves league goal. Following a succession of passes involving James O'Rourke, Steven Hayes, Brendan Griffin and Darcy Madden, Griffin became involved again, before gliding the ball back to Michael Robinson, located a few metres inside the Hakoah territory. He subsequently spied Simonoski and projected a high ball to him across field. Positioned at the far post side, Simonoski chested the ball down and before it hit the ground he placed his shot under the goalkeeper for the winning goal and the achievement of his brace, having earlier scored.

MICHAEL ROBINSON - 22nd April 2012 / 20th July 2014

A Round 4 Sydney United game at Edensor Park was the time and place that Robinson hit his first Premier League goal for any club. Sasho

Petrovski had floated the ball into the goal area but it came back out. It was flicked out by a defender to Jacob Timpano and he returned the ball back in. Robinson, who had worked his way up the field, was on hand. He struck, with the ball eluding a host of players, to lodge inside the goal in his fourth match.

It was away to Blacktown Spartans in Round 18 2014 that Robinson last goaled. In fact he hit two in this match. Unfortunately a ball skewed off his foot following his attempted clearance of a cross before lodging into his own net. However parity was restored by Robinson when twenty minutes later in three minutes of added time, he powered home from close vicinity to make amends and seal a draw at Blacktown Football Park.

DARCY MADDEN - 17th August 2014 / 1st May 2016

The final game of the season saw the Wolves win 5-1 with the fifth goal being sunk by Madden. In time added on following the regulation ninety minutes, Madden popped up on the left following a corner kick and managed to finish propitiously to send the team out on a high against APIA Leichhardt to finish the competition before an FFA Cup Round of 32 to come. This was in his fourteenth appearance, those consisting of thirteen starts and one from the substitutes bench.

Madden struck in the thirty-ninth minute against Sutherland Sharks at WIN Stadium in Round 8. He scored with a header from close range under pressure as the custodian came at the same time but Madden won out.

BRENDAN GRIFFIN - 11th April 2015 / 21st June 2015.

It was versus Blacktown Spartans that Griffin goaled in the 1-1 draw in Round 5 in 2015. It was the equaliser on seventy-one minutes. From the edge of the area he powered the ball into the net. This game was also his fifth match,

four starts and one from the bench.

Ten rounds later, Griffin scored again in the Sydney United 58 match with a third of the day. In the thirty-eight minute, he eluded a defender with ease before powering home in the 4-0 drubbing.

DAVID STOJIC - 21st June 2015 / 18th July 2015.

Stojic received a Brendan Griffin pass. With just the Sydney United 58 goalkeeper to beat, he propelled the ball directly in front of the goal. The 'keeper got a slight touch but not enough for the ball to deviate from its trajectory for the fourth goal of the night and the fourth for his team, scored in the fifty-second minute. This goal was scored in Stojic's fourteenth appearance consisting of thirteen starts and one off the bench.

It was in Round 18 of the same season that Stojic scored his latest goal in the forty-ninth minute. At the far post he pushed the ball into the goal, a couple of minutes after Bonnyrigg white had brought up the initial goal of the encounter.

NICOLAS BERNAL - 13th March 2016 / 15th May 2016

Bernal scored the second goal of his team's three-goal haul versus Hakoah Sydney City East in Round 1 at WIN Stadium in his debut match. Ben Zucco provided a cross that found Bernal. The Chilean striker headed in from close quarters in the eighty-first minute.

Peter Simonoski provided a pass for Bernal in the nineteenth minute and from close range, he managed to power the ball in. (Bernal had indeed scored in the Round 1 Parramatta FC game in 2017, but it though it recognised at the time, the result of the match was overturned and the goal was therefore expunged.)

JOSHUA MACDONALD - 21st May 2016 / 10th June 2017

In 2016, Macdonald made his initial strike and debut appearance for the club in the same game. This was in the Round 11 Bonnyrigg White Eagles clash. Following a break out from defence, an attacking foray hit pay dirt in the sixty-ninth minute, when Macdonald, from the inside of the penalty area, produced a confident and composed finish to earn a draw for his team.

It was in the sixty-eight minute at Cromer Park versus Manly United that Macdonald scored his latest goal. With room to spare being unmarked, he moved the ball with a touch before beating the custodian with a confident finish at the near post.

YUZO TASHIRO - 19th March 2017 / 4th June 2017

Eighty-nine minutes had elapsed before Tashiro goaled for the initial time in the red and white in his second appearance. Against Sydney Olympic at Belmore Oval in Round 2, the Japanese player provided a point blank header to restore some respect in the 3-1 loss.

Against Sydney Olympic in Round 13 at WIN Stadium, Tashiro scored in the 24th minute. Chris Price had produced a pass for Tashiro. Tashiro got the benefit of a good bounce and from inside the penalty area hit home with a strong drive.

PATRICK ANTELMi - 9th April 2017 / 25th June 2017

In Round 5, a cross came in from the right side in the ninth minute. Steve Hayes, who positioned wider on the right, played in the ball. Antelmi rose to head home under pressure with the APIA Leichhardt custodian also vying for the ball simultaneously. However, Antelmi's concentration was not compromised from the task at hand to duly score in his fifth outing. (This was in fact Antelmi's third goal on the field of play in 2017 but is the first 'legitimate' goal due to the overturned result in Round 1 for his team.)

In Round 16, Antelmi achieved his sixth legitimate goal in the 34th minute, scoring the

first goal in the match at Lambert Park. He produced a left footed shot from outside the penalty area that flew into the lower corner of the goal beating the APIA Leichhardt custodian.

NICK MONTGOMERY - 28th May 2017

Montgomery's initial goal and as well his latest for the team occurred in the sixth minute. Brett Wilson's long throw came in from the right and it hit a Parramatta player as Patrick Antelmi and two other opponents went for it. The ball fell away to Montgomery in the air. As the ball dropped to the ground, Montgomery pounced. His subsequent right footed shot from inside the box traversed into the goal to the right of the custodian. 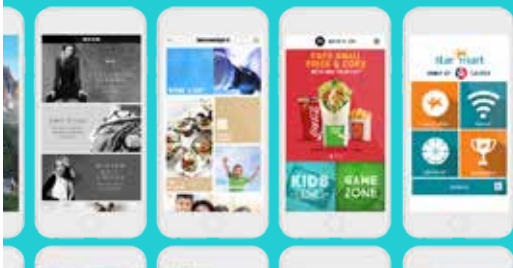
JACK LOMBO - 2nd July 2017

A Nick Montgomery free kick was floated to James O'Rourke who positioned out on the left. He let the ball bounce before he subsequently swept the ball in to hit the cross bar. Substitute Lombo reacted quickly and incisively, heading the ball in for the winner with Sydney United 58 being the opponent. This was Lombo's first appearance in 2017 and from the bench, with the striker having three and two other appearances from the bench in 2015 and 2016 respectively.

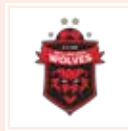

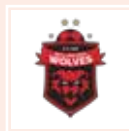

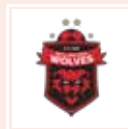

BACK FOR GOOD

MICHAEL ROBINSON

Michael Robinson, the experienced and sterling central defender and at times midfield player, re-joined the club in 2017 for his second stint and fourth season after first playing senior football with the club in 2012, following on from his earlier Wolves' junior representative days.

To date in the 2017 season, Robinson has played in seventeen matches (up to Round 18) and has been a consummate player and reliable defender.

In his first stint of three seasons for the club in 2012, 2013 and 2014, he amassed 55 league games and 3 cup games scoring a total of 3 goals. In fact, he made his Wolves debut in Round 1 against a former club (Bonnyrigg White Eagles) but was on the receiving end of 3-2 score line. He stated post match that 'a very disappointing result especially with a bit of a lapse in concentration to concede the third goal. We will learn from that. I was pleased with my performance and hope to get better every week like everyone else.' His initial Premier League goal was scored in Round 4, hit in the 35th minute. Sasho Petrovski curled the ball in from the corner and it came back out. Jacob Timpano was there to steer it back in. Robinson was subsequently perfectly placed in the vicinity to slot home through the goalmouth throng. In his second match against Manly United, he blocked a striker's shot as he motored through, displaying one aspect of his defensive qualities. Later on in the season he brought up his second goal. With a 6-3 score line versus Sydney United 58 in Round 15, Robinson goaled in the thirty-seventh minute and it was the fourth for his team. The defence did not adequately deal with a Sasho Petrovski corner. Scant time later, the ball ran out to where Robinson was positioned, twenty metres from the goal. He powered the ball into the goal, eluding all and sundry.

In 2013, after demolishing Marconi 4-1, the second victory of the season, Robinson stated at the time that 'we have been having some troubles lately with the defence but the backline has been solid tonight. Jakey was in the middle. It was great. Except for the controversial decision I reckon we could have got our first clean sheet of the season. I don't think it was a penalty. But at 4-1 you can't really complain. Every goal was great. Clinical finishing. It was a great performance - massive. The boys are buzzing now and this is the turning point in the season.'

For his final season of his first stint, Robinson again scored. This was in Round 18 away Blacktown Spartans fixture. He had unfortunately conceded an own goal in the seventy-third minute and as the match wound into injury time, his team was down 3-2. However, twenty minutes after this glitch, Robinson made amends by powering home the ball in the third minute of stoppage time from close vicinity to the goal for his team take a share of the spoils. He played the most games in this season, missing only one. In the first meeting with the Spartans and a 3-0 loss in Round 7 and a team that was on top of the table at the time, he stated - 'I think we matched them for a majority of the time. And except for the goals we would have been a lot closer. Zucco hit the bar and we had a couple of penalty shouts as well but I disagreed with the decision but it goes that way. The boys put in a massive effort and I thought we played pretty good... It was physical encounter ..There was not a big gap between us and them.'

The defender was in the selected team for the first time that the Wolves had qualified for the FFA Cup Round Of 32 when the club played the A-League club, Central Coast Mariners in 2014. He cleared off the line to deny a probable goal and intervened by heading out

crosses, and also blocked an attempted shot from an Australian international to be one of his highlights.

After junior football, Robinson in 2007 plied his trade with Port Kembla in the Illawarra Premier League before joining the Sutherland Sharks in 2008, staying at the Seymour Shaw club for a further two years. He was in the Sharks Grand Final team in 2008 Grand Final that was defeated 4-2 against the Wolves after the Sharks earlier had annexed the Premiership from the runners-up (the Wolves). However his club made grand final amends by winning in 2009 to become Champions, winning 4-1.

He subsequently played for Bonnyrigg in 2011 and 2016. In 2016, he got on the scoresheet

again, this time in Round 10 versus Hakoah Sydney City East in the 38th minute. A right cross was flighted in allowing Robinson to get his head to the ball. A slight deflection eventuated but it had enough power to land inside the post for his team's second goal and Robinson's first for the club.

Following from his 2014 stint with the Wolves, he made his way to America in 2015.

Individual honours were achieved as a measure of his ability when he was selected in the Premier League 'Team Of The Year' in both 2009 and 2010 while at the Sharks. In 2012, at the Wolves he made the 'Team Of The Week' on four occasions. In addition in 2014, he was included in the 2014 'Team Of The Year' as a substitute. He made the 'Team Of Week on no



less than four occasions. He was the Wolves' 'Man Of The Match' versus APIA Leichhardt at Lambert Park in the 0-0 draw In Round 11. Speaking post match, that one of the opposition players was 'one of the quickest players that I've ever seen in the Premier League'. However, despite this particular player's speed, Robinson was not undaunted and certainly held his own, outsprinting a prolific striker to intercept. He added 'I think we had a bit of a slow start. In the first twenty minutes we were a bit lost then we made some structural changes and we came into the game. We had a few chances and hit the post a couple of times. Getting a clean sheet is a really nice feeling for a defender.'

In the 2017 season, Robinson has only missed one match due to injury (Round 12) and kept his position with consistent performances. In the Round 13 Sydney Olympic encounter, he closed down a threatening quick explosive opponent, intervened with headers and clearances. He stated 'It's a good win, especially against Olympic, a top five club. We were under a bit of pressure in the second half but we defended well enough, except for the first ten minutes. I did a bit of a sloppy back pass but I got away with it, but sometimes that happens in football. Hopefully we can make a run at the top Five.' He was to the fore again in the Round 17 Sydney United 58 match with his coach Jacob Timpano saying that 'Robbo (and a team mate) were massive at the back'.

In his latest outing, versus Hakoah Sydney City East at Hensley Athletic Centre Pagewood in Round 18, Robinson provided the assist for the winning goal by floating a pass to Peter Simonoski on the left side. He showed his usual strong display in defence, in one instance heading out a dangerous cross.

Robinson is a tremendously adept and safe defender, effective in tackles, possessing very good vision and ability to bring the ball out of defence and sets up his supports. He has also been the captain of the team on occasions for the Wolves in various matches, never missing

a beat and leading by example with the team all the better for his presence. One such game when he captained the team was Round 22 versus APIA Leichhardt on the 17th August 2015 at WIN Stadium in the 5-1 rout.

Michael Robinson is 'back for good', indeed, in the back line for the good of the team.
