



THE OPPOSITION:

SYDNEY UNITED 58 FC

The 2016 National Premier League Australian Premiers Sydney United 58 visit WIN Stadium for the Round 17 clash with the Wollongong Wolves. We welcome the club on this occasion, which will be the sixty-fifth such league meeting, with the present fifth placed club (SU58) playing the seventh placed club (WW).

THE OPPOSITION TODAY - SYDNEY UNITED 58

Sydney United 58 last won honours in 2016 winning the Premiership plus the NPL Championship Of Australia by beating Edgeworth Eagles 4-1. The team was Thomas Manos, Kristopher Vilmas, Masato Mochizuki, Chris Payne, Yutaro Shin, Peter Triantis, Nicholas Stavroulakis, Theo Kofinas, Glen Trifiro, Matthew Bilic and Panni Nikas. Tomislav Uskok, Robert Mileski and Nick Taneski replaced Mochizuki, Payne and Shin respectively. Mark Rudan was the coach, with the goal scorers being Trifiro with a hat trick and Nikas.

In the 2016 NPL NSW Mens 1 competition, Sydney United 58 concluded the season in first position on 54 points from 17 wins and 3 draws, with only 2 defeats. Fifty-six goals were scored by twelve players with Payne being the top scorer with twenty-two. The team scored in every match. which was the best in the competition. Ten clean sheets were achieved which also was the seasons best. The best sequence without loss was 18. Rounds 2-12, 14-20 with Round 13 in before draw, win, win, draw, win, win, win, win, win, win, draw and win. The biggest winning margin was 4-0 and 5-1 in Rounds 3 and 7 versus Sutherland Sharks and Parramatta respectively. Multiple scorers in a single match were Payne with a hat trick in Round 11, and two braces in Rounds 4 and 15. Nikas, with three braces in Rounds 5, 7 and 14. and Mileski, with a brace in Round 7.

The coach who replaced the outgoing 2016 coach, Mark Rudan for 2017 was Croatian, Davor Bajsic. However, he only lasted a couple of matches before moving on, with Rudan back at the helm

from Round 5 onwards. Newcomers to the squad in 2017 are Nick Olsen plus the return of Ante Tomic, Anthony Tomelic and Petar Markovic. Matthew Sim and Riley Woodcock have had A-League experience at Central Coast Mariners and Sydney FC respectively, have been additional signings together with Adrian Vranic. Woodcock however has since moved on and Sydney United's late season signings for Round 16 and beyond have been left defender Michael Neill from Central Coast Mariners and Sam Perre from Marconi Stallions. Panni Nikas left following the Round 15 clash with Sutherland Sharks to play in Thailand but has been re-signed after 48 hours.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

This match was played 13th October 1996 at Sydney United Sports Centre at Edensor Park. It was the first round of the 1996/97 NSL season.

Wolves: Brett Hughes, Richard Lloyd, Stephen Laybutt, Jason Connolly, Neil Harlock, Matthew Horsley, Sonny Sevin, Michael Reda, Anthony Surjan, Tony Perinich and Nick Josevski. Lupcho Naumovski, Martin Bourke and Sasho Dimoski replaced Sevin, Reda and Josevski respectively. Damir Cvetko and Velimir Kupresak replaced Gibson and Moric respectively.

The Wolves captain, Horsley, struck first in the match after seven minutes but the away team did not hold the lead for too long. Zrdilic goaled after a further two minutes had elapsed to bring the score back to even Stevens. Sevin was next to score on fifteen minutes before Sydney United equalled through Babic with eight minutes left on the clock before half time. Horsley brought up his brace in the fifty-second minute before Vrkic was red carded in the 76th minute and his team were then a man down for the duration of the match. However, despite this, United's Milicic goaled with

an unlikely equaliser with nine minutes left before the final whistle. The Wolves could not capitalize with their man advantage and so the match ended in a high scoring draw, 3-3.

THE MATCH-UP

There have been seven draws between the two sides with Sydney United on top with the most wins and goals, thirty-eight and one hundred and twelve goals to the Wolves' eighteen and seventy. Sydney United has also twelve nil scores in matches to the Wolves' twenty with the best winning margin for each being four goals, for Sydney - 5-1 in 1985, 2006, 2014 and 2015, and for the Wolves, 4-0 in 2015. The best result sequence without losing has been twelve matches for Sydney United - win, win, win, win, win, draw, draw, win, win, draw, draw, win and win (1989-1998/99), and six for the Wolves - win, win, win, draw, win and win (1999/00-2001/02). The highest number of goals in the one match was nine, the score line was 6-3 in 2012 with the Wolves winning.

In 2017 the result sequence for the last five matches are - Sydney United 58- loss, draw, win, loss and draw, Wolves - win, win, win, loss and loss.

The top scorer for each club is Panni Nikas (Sydney United) and Yuzo Tashiro (Wollongong) with ten and eight goals respectively.

Sydney United 58 have achieved twenty-seven points from eight wins and three draws, scoring thirty goals while the Wolves have scored twenty goals, achieved seven wins and one draw and being on twenty-two points. The number of nil scores in a single game this season is Sydney United 58 three to Wollongong's four.

In each team's previous matches Sydney United payed a 0-0 away draw to Bonnyrigg White Eagles and Wollongong away, was by defeated by APIA Leichhardt 2-1.

Each teams' latest goal scorer was Patrick Antelmi (WW) Round 16 and Adrian Vranic (SU58) in Round 15.

SELECTED REPRESENTATIVE OF BOTH CLUBS - TOM MANOS

Goalkeeper Tom Manos played for the Wolves in 2015 and left to sign with Sydney United for the 2016 season and beyond.

With his one season stint in Wollongong, he made his league debut in Round 3 in the 2-2 draw with Sutherland making three excellent saves to deny the attackers, and making a further nineteen appearances with an additional finals match. Following the 2-0 defeat by Sydney Olympic in the Elimination Semi-Final at Lambert Park, he stated post match - 'it was frustrating game, in the first half they came out strong and got their goal and then they sat off and allowed us to play... I stopped a few but it's always the ones that go in that are in the back of your head... The boys put in a good shift all season.' In the victory over APIA in Round 19, Manos' sweeping kicks for his strikers caused the defence consternation. In total during the season, he achieved seven clean sheets.

He played every league game with Sydney United in 2016 (22) and achieved honours, with his team winning the NSW Mens 1 Premiership and the Grand Final Of The NSW National Premier Play-Offs. In the final of this competition, he saved a penalty kick. In the Mens 1 competition, he achieved 10 clean sheets.

He was back up 'keeper for Sydney FC A-League side and played in the Youth team during 2016/17 season.

Manos is a very effective shot stopper, is very agile, has ability to send long raking kicks up field, is brave on one on ones with safe hands to the fore.

WOLVES PAST PLAYER OF NOTE - TYNAN DIAZ

Diaz was a Wolves junior and made his first team debut in the 2004/05 season. He came on as a substitute in Round 1 versus Bonnyrigg White

Eagles and made a further five sub. appearances in the league and two sub appearances in the cup. His first start in the season was against St. George in the Cup Quarter Final. He scored two goals in the match but the opposition won progression through the next round after extra time. For one of his goals, Peter Gaffney strode through the defence before laying off the ball to Diaz. Diaz eluded a defender before pushing the ball high over the custodian into the goal. He played in the 2007, 2008 and 2010 seasons. Diaz also led the team in the team song after a victory (which were many in 2008) to which coach John Turner dubbed him Disco Diaz.

Diaz scored only one goal in 2008 and he did it on the biggest stage possible, in the 2008 Grand Final. With a free kick taken on the right side of the field, he goaled in the 38th minute, His curved shot sailed into the top corner of the goal for his team to take the lead. He stated at the time –'I haven't scored all season and I've been so close. I have hit the bar and post. I couldn't have scored a better goal and it was in the Grand Final... This is one of the best days in my life. We've had it tough but this has brought us closer together and made us mentally tough.'

Diaz totalled 51 league starting appearances and 13 substitute on-field roles with the Wolves plus five cup games with three substitute appearances and a further three finals. As well was being in the 2008 Championship winning team, he was also in the 2007 winning Cup final team. In 2010, he scored six goals.41m

He was a truly effective overlapping fullback with flair, precision, skill and speed.

He also went to win a championship with Bonnyrigg White Eagles and scored a goal to rival his 2008 one in 2012. This one became the NSW Premier League 'Goal Of The Year'.

IN THE NICK OF TIME

Nick Montgomery, the English born Scotsman midfielder signed on for the Wollongong Wolves Football Club from Round 10 of the 2017 NPL New South Wales Mens 1 competition following his retirement from professional football in the A-League with the Central Coast Mariners.

He immediately made a telling contribution for the Wolves leading by example in the victory over Rockdale City Suns at WIN Stadium on May 14th. Coach Jacob Timpano stated post match that 'Monty came in to steady the ship and was there directing those around him. He is a leader and experienced and he will improve as he settles in'. His team mates stated that Nick came in today, a very good player and very experienced' (Yuzo Tashiro) and 'Nick came out for us and he added to the team' (Darcy Madden). Montgomery was instrumental in the lead-up for the first goal and anchored the midfield providing stiffening defensively, also providing passes for the attacks.

In his second match at Lambert Park versus Sydney FC Youth, Montgomery set up Joshua Macdonald for a throw at the stumps. Later. he had a go himself as he steamed forward only to fall after being tackled. However, on the way down he produced a targeted shot that unfortunately could not beat the custodian on this occasion. However, in his Round 11 home match to Parramatta FC, Montgomery duly scored his team's first goal. From just inside the box, he rifled in a low shot that traversed inside the goalkeeper's right post. In addition, his passing prowess set up the third goal. Moving up the centre and he played an insightful pass into space for Tashiro to run onto. Subsequently Tashiro provided a square pass to Antelmi who did the rest. He stated post match - 'we had a tough result against Sydney after we went one up then had a couple of injuries. Today was a fantastic performance

for the boys and we thoroughly deserved the 3-0 win. It was nice to get on the score sheet but it's not about me.'

Montgomery was born in Leeds in 1981 and played professionally with Sheffield United from 2001 onwards. He remained at this club for twelve years winning the Player of the Season in the 2009/10 season and was runner up in the clubs awards Player Of The Year earlier in 2005/06. He made his Sheffield debut against Norwich City in 21st October 2000 and his first goal came in 2001 when he goaled against Birmingham City. In the sixteenth minute, he drove home a low trajectory shot again with his right foot for his team's initial strike.

One of his goals came in the League Cup versus Tranmere Rovers. The ball brought down the left and passes were exchanged between two players, before the ball was placed enticingly for Montgomery to run onto and hit. From outside the penalty area by a couple of metres and to the right of centre, he let fly with his right foot. The ball torpedoed inside the far post at head height as the goalkeeper desperately endeavoured to prevent.

With Sheffield United, Montgomery played in all levels of competition in England from the 1st Division at the start, for four years, the Championship for two seasons, The Premier League for one year and four more seasons in the Championship, before a final season in League One. He amassed 351 league appearances with Sheffield and a total of 397 in all competitions with two goals to his credit. In addition he rose to be captain of the side as a measure of his performances.

A two game stint on loan to Millwall preceded his coming to Australia to the Central Coast Mariners in Gosford for the 2012/13 A-League season. He had previously entertained offers from the MLS in the USA and others as well, but with friends in Australia for himself and his wife, he decided to take the plunge down under.

Montgomery played a total of one hundred and sixteen league performances over five years in Australia at the Central Coast Mariners scoring three goals in the process, each two years apart, and he was a stalwart of the club. It was upwards of 130 games in all competitions. He achieved an A-League Championship medal when his team defeated Western Sydney Wanderers 2-0 in the 2012/13 Grand Final even though he was suspended for this match. Another game was the FFA Cup Round Of 32 when the Mariners played the Wolves at WIN Stadium in 2014. He was the captain on this occasion and in one instance lunged to prevent a Sam Matthews effort from going into the goal.

He originally made his Mariners debut on the 6th October 2012 with the opposition being Western Sydney Wanderers.

One of his Mariners' goals was against Newcastle Jets at Gosford in the 2016/17 campaign with Connor Pain's enticing short pass falling into Montgomery's path. He hit the ball with his right foot to send it zooming into the net inside the opposition goalkeepers left post.

An earlier goal was scored on March 22, 2015 with the opposition being Perth Glory. The ball was not cleared adequately by the Glory in a scramble with the ball instead falling at the feet of Montgomery. In the dying moments of the match with his side in arrears by one, he unleashed a powerhouse that rocketed into the top corner of the goal to effect a draw.

He took over the captaincy of the Mariners from John Hutchinson in 2015 after being vice captain for a time and his final game for the Mariners was in Round 27 on Friday 14th April at AAMI PARK versus Melbourne Victory.

In his final A-League season, he played twentytwo games, and according to the Central Coast statistics had a 75.9% passing accuracy, won



159 duels won and 153 duels lost with 51% of duels won, plus a 50% of aerial duels won and 156 recoveries.

Previously, in 2013/14, he was selected into the All Stars A-League team.

Montgomery has spent four years obtaining his coaching qualifications in preparation for life away from playing and is looking to stay in the sport when he finally retires from playing. However, maybe the Wolves can keep him on the playing field in the mean time for the remainder of this season or maybe the next?

On signing with Wolves, Montgomery reacquainted himself with two former Mariners

teammates, in Justin Pasfield and Hayden Morton.

Being an on field pitch organizer, solid in tackling, effective in the air and with good passing accuracy, Montgomery has, to date, been a huge asset for the club so far in the matches he has played.

Montgomery, indeed, has arrived in Wollongong 'in the nick of time' to assist the Wollongong Wolves.



CLEAN SHEETS

'Clean sheets' are the act of not conceding a goal in a given match and mostly goalkeepers are the ones who are credited with this statistic and they are brought to the fore in this article. However, the responsibility for clean sheets should not only rest on the goalkeeper, but in tandem with the defensive unit as a whole.

Since 2004/05 the number of clean sheets for the Wolves in the N.S.W. Premier League varies from year to year and there seemingly appears to be correlation between the number achieved is parallel to the success of the team. The highest number of clean sheets in this time frame has been eleven, which were achieved by the team in the 2008, a Championship winning year. The goalkeepers at that time were Justin Pasfield and Michael Turnbull with Pasfield playing the majority of games. This tally of eleven eclipsed all others in the Premier League during this time, while the least number was nil, occurring in 2009, with three young and inexperienced goalkeepers utilized throughout that season's competition, namely Alex Augusto, Matt Brandalise and Bryce Daenell.

The second highest number was six and that was achieved in 2012, a year in which the team also played semifinals. Daniel Collison was between the sticks in all but two games and six was his number of clean sheets. Tom Hamilton played in the other two games.

Two clean sheets only were achieved in 2006 and 2014, with three in 2004/05 and 2007, and four in 2010, 2011, 2015 and 2016. The goalkeepers in these aforementioned years were Daniel Beltrame, Scott Whalan, Nathan Denham, Stacy Alogdellis, Zlatko Josevski, Brody Crane, Daniel Collison, Thomas Hamilton, Hayden Durose, Tom Manos and Justin Pasfield.

In 1987, the first season in a NSW run competition, the total was eight with Warwick Young achieving this and the team also won this season's Premiership and Championship double.

In the National Soccer League, the highest number of clean sheets was thirteen achieved in 1991/92 a year in which the team played finals football. John Filan and Tony Pezzano were the custodians at that time.

The second highest tally of NSL clean sheets was eleven, equalling 2008 and this was achieved in 1989 with Warwick Young and George Bouhoutsos being the shot stoppers. Alas, the team that year, despite the high number of clean sheets did not qualify for the finals as a counter against the main.

Nine was the third highest total and was achieved in 1990/91 and eight was the next best, in 1982 and 1992/93.

As a way of comparison, in the back-to-back NSL Championship years (1999/2000 and 2000/01) the number was seven and five. Daniel Beltrame, Les Pogliacomi, Grant Barlow, Dean Anastasiadis and Pasfield were the custodians.

The least number in the NSL years was one, coming in 1984, with Natch Vardareff and Ron Tilsed in goal. Three was the next lowest in 1985, 1995/96, 1998/99 and 2003/04 and the incumbents at various times throughout these particular seasons were Sean Billington, Kiri Velkov, Brett Hughes, Andrew Crews, Adam Brodbeck, Beltrame and Steve Angelov.

The highest number of clean sheets accredited to goalkeepers was thirty and Brett Hughes who played from 1992/93 to 1997/98 achieved this feat from one hundred and forty-one games at a rate of 21.2%.

The second highest number was 29 and Warwick Young from 1986-1989 totalled this from ninety-one games with a ratio of 31.8%. John Filan 1991/92-1992/93 fourteen from twenty nine games and 48.2% and George Bouhoutsos 1989-1990/91 and Natch Vardareff 1981-1984 each with eleven from thirty- three and sixty-six games and 33.3% and 16.6% respectively.

To date in 2017, coming into Round 17, four clean sheets have been achieved and with four rounds left, there is scope for a few more.
