










MATCH PREVIEW

Sutherland Sharks will have a firm grasp on the 2017 Premiership if the leaders can defeat Sydney FC at home on Saturday afternoon.

Nick Dimovski's side have led the competition outright since the opening round and will fancy their chances at driving home their title charge and ending the faint premiership hopes of the third-placed Sky Blues when the two heavyweights meet.

The Sharks have recovered admirably following a mid-season wobble that threatened to hamstring their campaign with four wins from their last five matches. With three rounds of the regular season remaining Sutherland hold a four-point advantage over Blacktown City and are six points ahead of Sydney FC.

The Sky Blues have proven their quality throughout the campaign but will need to steel themselves for one of the biggest meetings of the year as they search for a victory that would reignite the premiership race in a big way.
