1ST GRADE MATCH PREVIEW

A huge round two victory has Hakoah Sydney City East full of confidence and they will be out to build some momentum with victory against Sutherland Sharks when they go head to head this Saturday.

Gavin Rae's side claimed the upset of the round last week with their 3-0 demolition of reigning champions Manly United but if they are to repeat that feat against Sutherland they will need to do so without star attacker Andre De Jong who has been called up for New Zealand national team duty.

Winger Anthony Frangie will be expected to take much of the load for Hakoah while the experience of Mitchell Stamatellis will also be called on at the other end of the park

Sutherland also tasted victory in round two with Grant Lee's side proving too strong for Sydney FC's young outfit.

Defensive stalwart Jacob Tratt has been one of the buys of the season so far with the former Wellington Phoenix stopper solidifying the Sharks defence.

Keisuke Hayashi has had an equally as strong impact at the other end of the park with impressive performances in the attacking third.

Hakoah's young lineup shouldn't be underestimated and in front of their fans will provide a tough challenge for the visiting Sharks.

Hakoah Sydney City East 3 – Manly United FC 0 at Hensley Athletic Field

Hakoah Sydney City East's young guns have sent a warning to the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition with a 3-0 win over last years' Champions Manly United at Hensley Athletic Park on Sunday afternoon.

The home side dominated the match at both ends of the field with the Hakoah defence continually pushing Manly to shoot from long distance.

Despite only being on the field for the first 60 minutes, Andre De Jong was a standout for the home side, scoring Hakoah's first goal and proving dangerous for the Manly defence before rushing to the airport to travel to Spain to represent New Zealand.

A late penalty to Manly's Brendan Cholakian gave Hakoah a scare but the result was never in doubt as Hakoah claimed its first win of the season, resigning Manly to its second straight loss.



Sutherland Sharks 2 – Sydney FC 1 at Seymour Shaw

Sutherland Sharks battled to their first victory of National Premier League NSW season after second half goals from Lachlan Hughes and Nick Olsen handed Grant Lee's side a 2-1 win over Sydney FC at Seymour Shaw on Saturday evening.

Hughes and Olsen each struck to give the Sharks a two-goal buffer early in the second stanza.

The visitors pulled a goal back through Hassan Jalloh midway through the half but it was who Sutherland held on for a hard-fought home triumph.

Sydney will rue both lapses that allowed Sutherland to strike and the Sky Blues' failure to capitalise on a dominant opening half display in which returning Sutherland product Jeremy Cox saw a string of opportunities go astray.



U20'S MATCH PREVIEW

Sutherland Sharks continue their title defence against Hakoah Sydney City East at Hensley Athletic Field on Saturday searching for back to back victories.

Nick Dimovski's side were big 6-1 winners against Sydney FC last Saturday and although the Sharks showed flashes of brilliance against the Sky Blues there will likely be opportunities for Hakoah to capitalise on some early season rustiness.

Hakoah arrive into the fixture following a 3-1 defeat to Sydney and 1-1 draw with Manly Unied but will have plenty of cause for optimism after being one of the only teams to remain undefeated against Sutherland in 2017.

Paul Hubbard's side held the Sharks to a 2-2 draw at Seymour Shaw and beat them 2-1 at Hensley Athletic Field late in the campaign – Hakoah frontman Connor Eldridge netted the winner in that fixture and will be looking to get off the mark for 2018 after two goalless appearances so far.
