The Wollongong
Wolves welcome

City Suns for their
Round 2 encounter
this afternoon at WIN
Stadium. Today will the

20th meeting since the first one back in 1987. It was 3-2 Wolves win then with the Wolves' Pat Brodnik, Jock Morlando and Randall Easthorpe and Sun's Paul Darlington and Pat Rodas, being the scorers.

Results have gone either way for the Suns and the Wolves in recent times. Which teams' turn will it be today?

THE OPPOSITION TODAY - ROCKDALE CITY SUNS

New additions to the team for 2018 that coach Paul Reid have signed include Bai Antoniou from Sydney FC Youth and Michael Neill, ex-Central Coast Mariners and Sydney United.

The Suns since their inception in 1969 have won honours. In the NSW Super League in 2009 the team achieved 46 points from 22 games from 14 wins and 4 draws to win the Premiership of that competition. The team scored and conceded 46 and 22 goals with a goal difference of plus 24. Mile Todorovski coached the team. Players used included Angelo Kosmatos, Paul Dee, Peter Apolevski, Saso Trajcevski, Adem Kir, Cameron Jones, Igor Kotevski, Kurt Crnic, Robert DiMeglio and Askin Oygur amongst others. The club also that year won promotion to the Premier League.

Since 2014, the club has concluded each season in 5th, 6th and 4th and last season in 3rd position. This is a very consistent performance in an upward trajectory and with their new artificial pitch will aid their prospects.

In 2017, Rockdale won its first game in Round 1 and were not defeated until Round 9. Achieving 42 points from 12 wins and 6 draws, the team scored and conceded 42 goals and 28 respectively with a goal difference of plus 14, which was the fourth best in the competition. The percentage of goals scored to games ratio was 1.9 and 1.27 in conceding. The top

scorer was Alec Urosevski with ten goals and nine other players made contributions with goals. Urosevski also scored the quickest goal, which eventuated in the 8th minute in Round 8 Bonnyrigg White Eagles game. The best result sequence without loss was seven matches - win, win, win, draw, win, draw and win Round 1-2, 4-8 (Round 3 was a postponed match) and the team neglected to score on five occasions, which was bettered by five teams. Multiscorers in a single match were brace achievers Urosevski with three and Jordan Figon with two.

Players that were selected into the 'Team Of The Week' were Urosevski with five selections, followed by Ante Covic (4), Blake Ricciutto (3), Jordan Figon (2), Harris Gaitatzis (1), Daniel Petkovski (1), Alek Canak (1), Patrick Savor (1), Trent McClenehan (1) and Toufic Alameddine (1). Covic, as well, was the joint recipient of the 2017 Mens 1 'Goalkeeper Of The Year' Award. He was also included in the 'Team Of The Year' along with Urosevski and Ricciutto (as a sub.).

THE MATCH-UP

Since the 2004/05 season in the NSW competition, the two teams have met on seventeen occasions with the Wolves behind in the number of wins and goals, 7 wins to 9 and 17 goals to 24. Rockdale's best score was 3-0 in 2016 with the Wolves best being 4-1 in 2011. The highest number of goal scored in a single match was five, emanating the second round of matches in 2011. The nil scores per team are

4 (WW) and 5 (RCS).

In 2018 after Round 1 the two teams occupy 4th (RCS) and 6th (WW) positions on the points' table after one round.

The top scorer who has one goal is Alex Canak (RCS) and he was scorer of the previous goal coming into this match.

In the previous match the Wolves and Blacktown played a 0-0 draw and Rockdale defeated Sutherland Sharks 1-0.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

The two experienced former A-League custodians in Ante Covic and Justin Pasfield will anchor each teams between the sticks and will be to the fore in this match. Watch as they fly through the air.

Wolves young midfielder Ryan Ensor stood out last week and will looking to do the same again. The experience Nick Montgomery was also impressive also in Round 1 and his experience will shine through. Rockdale's Canak is a consistent scorer and he will be dangerous.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

This Round 15 match in 1987 was played at Seymour Shaw Park in Miranda.

The team line-ups were as such -

Rockdale - Ian Barker, Mike Boogard, Jeff Wilson, Bill Pilovski, Darren Wilson, Pat Rodas, Vladimir Tortevski, Lou Dounis, Vince Nastoski, Tony Genovese and Alex Bottalico. Saso Spirovski replaced Genovese with Ilija Takacs being the coach.

Wolves - Warwick Young, Jock Morlando, Scott Dickson, Mike Hollifield, Brian Cokely, Jeff Ainsworth, Pat Brodnik, Peter Kotamanidis, Rade Stefanovski and Randall Easthorpe. Nova Bundalo and Zivko Hristovski substituted for Stefanovski and Kotamanidis respectively.

The Wolves hit the lead when Stefanovski provided a cross in from the right side. The ball hit the ground and bounced off Barker. Brodnik was positioned to take advantage and did so, easily prodding the ball into the goal.

A long Young clearance was subsequently headed by defender Boogard into his own net in the thirty-sixth minute. He was aiming for





goalkeeper Barker, who was positioned out of his goal. Boogard wasn't aware of this, and the custodian watched as the ball sail over the custodian into the goal. This certainly wasn't his day.

The Wolves were looking like early winners. However, in the second half Rockdale attacked with regularity with Young repelling these advances, making many important saves. However, in the seventy-third minute, Markovski delivered the ball to Bottalico who then reduced the arrears. His powerfully struck drive zoomed into the goal. Despite their second dominance, Rockdale could not add to their score and the visitors ran out the winners.

SELECTED REPRESENTATIVE OF BOTH CLUBS - BEN BLAKE

Blake, a consummate defender, played for Rockdale in 1994 in the NSW Super League making a total of fourteen starting appearances with an additional two off the bench with one goal to his credit. Following on from the Suns, he played for Blacktown City before venturing to Gombak City in Singapore. He was with the Wolves from 1999/00 for three years before leaving for Perth Glory. Without getting game time in the west he was back at the Wolves for three more NSL seasons. He subsequently had a stint with Dandaloo in the IPL in 2006 before two more return seasons at the club, but this time in NSW Premier League. He was the captain of the 2007 and 2008 sides that won the 2007 Tiger Turf Cup (Waratah

Cup) and the 2008 Championship and lead by example. Following a high scoring win over Macarthur Rams during the 2008 season, Blake stated - 'it was a good performance all round. They gifted us a couple of goals but it was pleasing to get our goal difference up.'

Blake was an inspiring captain. He was a consummate defender, good in the air, agile with a fine touch and very effective in tackles, ball control and passing ability.

WOLVES' PAST PLAYER OF NOTE - SCOTT DICKSON

Dickson was a defender who first played for the club in 1983 and played until 1987. He was a member of the Premiership and Championship winning 1987 side, though he was injured and thereby unavailable for the Grand Final. The five year Wolves player played a total of 86 league games with 84 starting appearances and two from the bench, scoring a total of six goals.

Being a solid defender who could provide enticing crosses and defence splitting passes to set up team mates for goal scoring opportunities, such examples were displayed in 1987 when Dickson headed a Rade Stefanovski cross down to Jock Morlando who duly scored in the away match over Newcastle. In another match with Kuringai, both Jeff Ainsworth and Robert Giraldi headed in a Dickson crosses. He was also strong in the tackle.

Dickson scored a total of six league goals with his initial one being scored in 1983, Round 19 on the 24th July at Ziems Park Corrimal. Four players were involved in the lead-up before Dickson ultimately struck. Later, in the same match he headed down a John Fleming free kick straight to Larry Gaffney, who proceeded to lash the ball home. Dickson's final goal was in 1977 Round 17 encounter with Blacktown City, when he headed home a Zivko Hristovski corner kick in the twelfth minute. In 1985, he was voted the Club's 'Player Of The Year'.

BALGOWNIE JUNIOR FOOTBALL CLUB

Dalgownie Junior Football Club (BJFC) was formed in 1958 and in 2018 celebrates its 60th anniversary.

From humble beginnings founded as a school soccer team, we have grown to a club with 62 teams and 600 players aged from 5 through to 18. The longevity and success of our club is due to the kids that continue to choose to play football, and the long list of volunteers who have, over 60 years, give up their time to ensure that kids get to play football each week.

From our list of volunteers, BJFC has 48 life members who have been recognised for their commitment to our club, and our most recent addition to this distinguished list is Ana Storey.

Ana has been involved with BJFC since 2005 when her children played for the club. Since 2011, when her children stopped playing, Ana has remained committed to volunteering with the Junior Club every week. Every fortnight Ana stays the entire day to also support Australia's longest

running registered soccer club, the Balgownie Rangers, in the afternoon.

Ana has always been involved in running the canteen on match days, but if that wasn't enough, Ana also took on other responsibilities in 2007 with the Ladies Auxiliary, and was an active member with the Clothing Committee and Club/Hall hiring activities. Something that's important to remember, BJFC is a large junior club with most Saturdays seeing between 40-45 matches, and a further 6-10 matches played on a Sunday. A typical weekend would see

HUNDRED CLUB



ACHIEVED OVER A HUNDRED GAMES FOR THE CLUB

Three first grade players who are in the squad in 2018 were acknowledged at the 2017 Wolves Presentation Night, having achieved over a hundred games for the club, with those players being captain Chris Price, striker Peter Simonoski and midfielder Steve Hayes. These players have played with distinction throughout their careers to date, and have joined seventeen other achievers who have logged up a hundred league games or more for the Wollongong Wolves club in either the NSL, the NSW Premier League or a combination of both. These players are listed in number of games order together with their achievements with the club. Three of these 'hundred' achievers, Price, Simonoski and Hayes, are likely to add to their tallies in the 2018 season and perhaps beyond. The tallies are up to and including Round 1 2018

MATTHEW HORSLEY - 284

Horsley played eleven seasons from 1990/91 to the 2000/01 amassing the highest number in Wolves history for the player who concluded his tenure as captain of two Championship (36 goals to his credit) and attacking and defending in equal measures as well being an inspiring leader. He was a Golden Boot winner and also a Cup final winner. In addition he was a member of the Oceania Club Champions Cup winning team.

RICHARD LLOYD - 165

Lloyd, the utility played who was at home in defence or midfield has the second most number of appearances and his influence on the team was second to none from 1989/90 to 1996/97, a tally of eight seasons. He was utilized as a utility player and he gave his all in his matches. He was the Golden Boot winner in the 1990/91season, and achieved a tally of twenty goals over his time at the club. In addition, he played in two final series with the club.

ALVIN CECCOLI - 161

The left footed wingback began in 1995/96 and made a four-season stint in the NSL with the club. He returned for the 2004/05 NSW Premier League season playing a further five

games, captaining the side in addition, before he ventured to Sydney FC. He was an adept crosser of the ball and many goals came from these efforts. He possessed a strong shot, scoring a total number of 19 goals, some from the penalty spot and overlapped down the left on infinite occasions. He is a 'Wolves Legend,' a Championship winning player on two occasions, plus a Cup final winner and an Oceania Club Champions Cup winner.

RAY VLIETSTRA - 160

Vlietstra, the central defender began in 1982 and concluded his first stint in 1986. He returned in 1988, and two of the following two seasons, 1989 and 1989/90, eight seasons in total. He was adept on the ball, strong in the tackle and a very capable player in the air, being a Premiership winning player in addition.

JOCK MORLANDO - 160

Morlando played in every game during the 1987 season showing his high endurance level. He was a consummate defender from 1981 and 1982, 1986 to 1989, 1989/90 to 1992/93, ten seasons in all with fourteen goals beside his name. He was a duel Premiership winning player and a Championship winner in addition.

BEN BLAKE -154

Blake, like Horsley, was a championshipwinning captain, annexing the 2008 NSW championship and the 2007 Tiger Turf Cup, in addition he was a member of the squad that won the 1999/00 and 2000/01 NSL championship. He was an inspiring leader in his central defender role. He was an assured player reading the play well and exact with the pass, scoring four goals, one being in the 9-4 result versus Newcastle in the 2000/01 season.

PAT BRODNIK-154

Brodnik was an elusive goal poacher with a quick turn of acceleration and an eye for goal in his eight seasons from 1985 to 1991/92. He was a Golden Boot winner and scored the most goals in a single match, six, from a total of 35. He was twice a member of a Premiership winning team as well as a Championship winner.

ROBERT STANTON -152

Stanton was twice a member of a Championship winning side playing as a central defender for the most part and in addition, a Cup final winner and an Oceania Club Champions Cup winner. He was a good reader of the game, tough tackling and good with the ball at his feet. From 1997/98 to 2002/03, he scored seven times.

DAVID GREEN - 151

Green was a right-sided defender who overlapped to good effect in seven years at the club. He began in 1983 to 1986, and from 1990/91 to 1992/93 with one goal to his credit scored in his final season. He was a finalist player.

BRETT HUGHES - 141

Hughes was a six seasons goalkeeper from 1992/93 to 1997/98 who has attained the most clean sheets of any Wolves custodian, thirty in total, one ahead of his nearest rival. He was a Cup final winner in his tenure and a player in finals series.

DAVID HUXLEY - 140

Huxley from 1997/98 to 2002/03, played six seasons in total, was a holding midfielder, strong in the tackle mobile and adept in heading. He is a 'Wolves Legend' to boot and twice a member of a Championship winning side, together with an Oceania Club Champions Cup championship. He scored three goals during his club stint.

SCOTT CHIPPERFIELD - 131

Chipperfield, a left sided player and a 'Wolves Legend, was a Golden Boot winner, having scored the most goals in the 1997/98 NSL season with a total of 50 goals. He could play as a forward or in the midfield, possessed a strong forceful shot. He was a Championship winning player on two occasions and was a Cup final winning player as well, together with an Oceania Club Champions Cup winning medal.

STUART YOUNG -130

Striker Young, a 'Wolves Legend' scored the

most league goals for the club 60 in all, and was a Golden Boot winner on three occasions. The left footed player was skilful on the ball, possessed a deadly shot and was lethal in the box. He scored in a Grand Final and was twice a Championship winning player, as well as an Oceania Club Champions Cup winner.

CHRIS PRICE - 123

Left sided wingback Price began in the 2004/05 NSW Premier League and played until the 2008 season. He returned in 2013, with 2018, being his tenth season. He has got onto the scorer's list on eleven occasions in the league and scored in the 2008 Grand Final. He was a Championship and a Cup winning player, was a captain of the club and also a member of the FFA Cup Round of 32 qualifying team.

SASHO PETROVSKI -121

A 'Wolves Legend' and the highest ever Wolves scorer in all competitions, striker Petrovski played two stints for the Wolves from 1999/00 to 200/01 and from 2011 to 2012 and he duly scored in all seasons, totaling 54 league goals in all. He had exact close skills and able to beat defenders with feigns, change of direction and acceleration and possessed a strong shot, scoring goals from close in or from long range. Petrovski was a Golden Boot winner on two occasions with a club record and also scored in a Grand Final, as well as being a Championship winner on two occasions. He was also a member of the Oceania Club Cup Championship winning team.

PETER KOTAMANIDIS - 114

A left footed midfielder with adept skill in the dribble and ease of beating players is a 'Wolves Legend'. He was on the score sheet on fourteen occasions and In addition, he was both a Premiership and Championship winning player, together with being a Golden Boot winner.

RANDALL EASTHORPE -104

A three times Golden Boot winner, Easthorpe was a goal poacher who reacted quickly in the box to score 41 times in the league, was a languid player with speed and acceleration,



being a difficult player to defend against. He was a duel Premiership winning player and also a Championship winner. He played four seasons from 1987 – 1989/90.

PETER SIMONOSKI -103

As a fifteen-year-old Simonoski made his initial first grade appearance in 2009 before his next seasons from 2011-2017. He has been a scorer of many goals being a Golden Boot winner. He has quick movement on the ball, is able to beat opposition players with his footwork and strikes the ball strongly when needed for shots. He was a member of an FFA Cup Round Of 32 qualifying team as well as being a member of a finals team.

STEVE HAYES -100

Midfielder Hayes, with a never say die attitude, is an effusive midfielder player from 2006 to 2009, 2013-2014, 2017 and 2018. He was skilled in equal measure defending or attacking and was on the score sheet in the final match game of the 2017 season for his initial season strike, which was his tenth goal for the club. He was a Championship and Cup final winning player.

DAVID CERVINSKI -100

Cervinski, the central defender was a strong tackler, good in the air and never took a backward step. A 'Wolves Legend', he began in 1999/00 and was a duel Championship winning player with the club, a Oceania Club Cup Championship winning team member, playing until the 2002/03 season, four seasons in total, popping up on the three occasions to score. A hundred league appearances was his exact number.

This is a 'who's who' of many starring players for the club and all have achieved a great deal of success through their deeds.

WOLVES' HIGHEST SCORING DRAWS

These are the home games that concluded with the Wollongong Wolves and their opponents earning a point each when usually scoring a high number of goals would ensure victory. These games were absorbing affairs for the spectators, as they anxiously willed their team to hold on to their lead or to come up with an equaliser.

Game 1. Score 4-4 v Collingwood Warriors, 1996/1997 NSL Season.

Wollongong went behind at Brandon Park in this Round 26 fixture, when Collingwood's first corner kick was not cleared effectively. As a result, the resultant shot took a wicked deflection and Collingwood was on the scoreboard after fourteen minutes. The Wolves got on equal footing through the goal effort of Scott Chipperfield, whose forceful left footed shot had the desired effect. However, the home team went into the break one goal behind after Collingwood scored once more. A curled shot snuck inside the right hand corner. Noel Spencer then netted for the Wolves, scoring his first goal for the club. The Warriors made it three on the stroke of half time when they scored from a corner once again. Matt Horsley bobbed up to get the third equalising goal in the fifty seventh minute before Collingwood regained the lead for a fourth time sixty seconds later. Sonny Sevin's goal late in the game gave the home team a valuable point, when, during the match it looked decidedly unlikely. The date was 20th April 1997.

Wollongong's line-up was Adam Brodbeck, Sebastian Sinozic, Alvin Ceccoli, Gary Van Egmond, Matthew Horsley, Sonny Sevin, Stephen Laybutt, Sasho Dimoski, Martin Bourke, Scott Chipperfield and Noel Spencer. Antony Surjan, Neil Harlock and Colin Luff replaced Spencer, Dimoski and Laybutt in the 62nd, 68th and 74th minutes. After the match played at Brandon Park, coach Nick Theodorakopoulis said the match was good and bad. This was also the final match for the Collingwood Warriors.

Game 2. Score 4 - 4 Versus APIA Leichhardt 2013 NSWPL Season.

The Wolves got off to a good start at Crehan Park with Ricky Zucco netting after eight minutes. It was a free kick from just outside the centre circle and Zucco's pearler of a goal zoomed into the goal past the hapless goalkeeper. Mitchell Del Turco got the Wolves out by two eleven minutes in, and three minutes following Zucco's effort, when present at the far post he headed downward into the goal a Martinoski corner kick. APIA responded seven minutes later then evened the score with a penalty kick. Two minutes on, Martinoski got on the scorecard himself scoring the Wolves third goal. He, in the second half following good lead up work by Zucco and Del Turco, produced a left foot shot that flew like a missile to bulge the net to take the lead once again. However, APIA got their third to equal and had the wind in their sails. However, two minutes on. Del Turco achieved his brace with his team's fourth strike. A through ball was collected allowing him to be one on one with the goalkeeper and he proceeded to shoot on target past him. The Wolves enjoyed the lead until three minutes from full time when APIA clawed back to restore parity in this 18th April 2013 encounter.

The line-up was Daniel Collison, Jack Keating, Michael Robinson, Jacob Timpano, Sam Chapple, John Martinoski, Mitchell Del Turco, Sam Matthews, Zac MacKenzie, Peter Simonoski, Ricky Zucco, Chris Nathaniel, Joseph Lavalle and Matthew Floro substituted for Timpano, Del Turco and Zucco.

Del Turco stated post match -'It was good to get two goals but a win would have been sweeter...we just died a bit in the last ten minutes.'

Game 3. Score 3 - 3 Versus Sydney Olympic 1989/90 NSL Season.

The team personnel for this Round 17, 19th February 1990 clash included George Bouhoutsos, David Ratcliffe, David Skeen, Ray Vlietstra, Zivko Hristovski, Paul McFadden, Jeff Allport, Danny Crainie, Danny Petkovic, Randall Easthorpe and Pat Brodnik. David Roberts and Derek O'Neill substituted for Allport and Petkovic.

The Wolves drew first blood at Brandon Park when McFadden's shot, from in front of the goalkeeper, skidded into the goal. Thirty-seven minutes later Olympic equalised through the first of a hat trick by Abbas Saad then went ahead. McFadden brought up his brace when he managed to slide the ball into the net. The Wolves went ahead when a Crainie cross from the left side found Brodnik. The custodian just past the hour mark blocked his shot. The ball fell to Easthorpe who duly goaled.

Game 4 Score 3-3 v Adelaide City. 1995/96 NSL Season

This was a Round 24 match played at Brandon Park against Adelaide City. It was played on the 13th March. Wollongong got off to a super start with Richard Lloyd getting one in the first minute of play. The score remained this way until a flurry of goals came just before half time. Mario Jermen put Wollongong up by two then two minutes later, Adelaide got on the scoresheet with a strike by Damian Mori. After being two up for most of the first half the Wolves were equalled by a Craig Foster effort, after which Mori got his team ahead. In the last three minutes of the game Mineo Bonetig equalled, much to the delight of home fans.

The Wolves team on that day consisted of Brett Hughes, Matthew Dihm, Mike O'Shea, Martin Bourke, Matt Horsley, Angelo Petratos, Lupcho Naumovski, Richard Lloyd, Mario Jermen, Alvin Ceccoli, and Tony Perinch. Stephen Laybutt and Mineo Bonetig replaced Jermen and Bourke in the 74th and 81st minutes. Nick Theodorakopoulis was the coach.

Game 5. Score 3-3 Versus Marconi 2003/04 NSL Season

Coached by John Turner, the team was Andrew Crews, Borislav Dragas, Adam Hughes, Michael Hawrysiuk, Shane Lyons, Nahuel Arrarte, Stuart Young, Danial Cummins, Stewart van Bentum, Ben Blake and Chimoabi Nwaogazi, Jason van Blerk and John Majuroski replaced van Bentum and Nwaogazi in the 56th and 91st minutes.

Wollongong took the lead after two minutes when Stuart Young headed home Nahuel Arrarte's corner kick. This advantage to the Wolves lasted almost to half time when Marconi equalised after confusion in the box. The Wolves went behind in the 52nd minute before the Wolves restored parity again in the 68th minute when Nwaogazi gained possession and passed to Young, who put away his second. Marconi gained the ascendancy once more in the 77th minute. After the Wolves had supplied intense pressure in seeking an equaliser, Marconi succumbed three minutes after scoring. They conceded a corner after good work by Nwaogazi. Young's header from the ensuing corner kick struck the post and rebounded straight to Nwaogazi. He made no mistake. This was played on 19th December 2003 at WIN Stadium.

Game 6. Score 3-3 Versus Perth Glory 1998/99 NSL Season.

The team for this Round 30 Brandon Park match, consisted of Daniel Beltrame, George Souris, Paul Dimech, Robert Stanton, Matt Horsley, Michael Brooks, Antony Surjan, Sasho Dimoski, Scott Chipperfield, Ray Younis and David Huxley. Esala Masi and Saso Petrovski substituted Dimoski and Younis in the 69th and 82nd minutes. Masi was sent off in the 88th minute. On the 25th April 1999 Younis scored the Wolves first goal eight minutes following Perth's first. He hit a superb volley from barely inside the penalty area in the twentieth minute. Perth went to lead once again, before Dimoski struck two minutes after the interval. Chipperfield got the Wolves ahead with a superb strike before Perth once again equalised with nine minutes from the end, to go home with a share of the spoils.

These games produced between six or eight goals and at the conclusion of each it was 'even now.'
