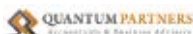

1ST GRADE MATCH PREVIEW

Hakoah Sydney City East will be looking to heap back to back defeats on Wollongong Wolves when the two sides face off at Hensley Athletic field on Sunday.

Hakoah suffered a narrow 2-1 defeat to Sydney Olympic in Round 4 and Gavin Rae's side will be inspired to return to the winners circle against the Wolves.

Returning last week after being called up to represent New Zealand is attacking weapon Andre De Jong and he will once again be the key to the Hakoah forward line.

His speed and creativity can unlock opposition sides almost at will making De Jong a player Wollongong will not be able to sleep on.

The Wolves come into the game off the back of a humiliating 3-0 defeat to rivals Sutherland Sharks, their first defeat of the campaign.

It was a night of wasted opportunity for Wollongong but surely a night Jacob Timpano's players learnt from.

As always it is the Wolves high profile Japanese duo of Takuya Nozawa and Yuzo Tashiro who will be the main attacking threat, while Nick Montgomery's experience further back is key in the side's chance creation and ball retention.

Hakoah can be tricky customers if they are underestimated so the pressure is on Wollongong to bring their best or they could be on the back end of another big scoreline.

Sydney Olympic fought their way to a hard earned 2-1 victory over Hakoah Sydney City East at Belmore Sports ground on Good Friday.

All three of the afternoon's goals came as a result of set pieces with George Timotheou and Alejandro Sanchez-Lopez scoring either side of Oliver Green's equaliser to give Olympic their third consecutive home win of the season.

Play was often scrappy throughout the match as the bobbly pitch made it difficult for both sides to generate continuity and create chances, allowing dead ball situations to take centre stage and inevitably decide the result.

With the win, Olympic continues their bright start to their 2018 National Premier Leagues NSW campaign with three victories from their opening four matches

Wollongong Wolves unbeaten start to the season has ended in emphatic fashion after they were thrashed 3-0 by Sutherland Sharks at Seymour Shaw on Saturday.

Sutherland opened the scoring with a contender for 'Goal of the Week' courtesy of a Nick Olsen thunderbolt and went into the break two ahead when Adrian Vranic hit his first of the season when scrambling the ball over the line from a great Jacob Tratt nod down.

Wollongong looked dangerous on the break, particularly down the left through Josh McDonald, Yuza Tashiro and Takuya Nozawa but paid the price for sloppy finishing.

Vranic benefitted from another Tratt effort in the 53rd minute to side-foot home his second of the night and secure a comfortable win for Grant Lee's side.
