1ST GRADE MATCH PREVIEW

Perennial Premiership contenders Blacktown City have gone under the radar so far this season, but a win against Wollongong Wolves at Lily Homes Stadium on Sunday could be the result which makes other sides take notice.

Blacktown led the competition in the opening weeks but a three game run without a win meant they fell to third place.

Crittenden's side has rediscovered their winning ways and have won all their matches since to take them five points behind Sydney Olympic.

Their opponents this week Wollongong are sixth on the ladder and were last week narrow victors against Marconi Stallions.

Blacktown City is a side never to be written off with stars across all three lines. Mitch Mallia has taken his game to another level this season and has been a key difference maker in the Blacktown attack. The return of Danny Choi has

also given City another wrinkle in their attack which also boasts the talented Devante Clut and Joey Gibbs.

Former J-League striker Yuzo Tashiro found the net once again and will be the main target in attack for the Wolves. He will have plenty of pressure against a resurgent Blacktown defence.

Blacktown is firing on all cylinders and playing some impressive football. They will be short odd favourites against Wollongong but the Wolves do have the talent across the board to snatch a result.

It is sure to be an exciting contest.

Sutherland Sharks 1 – Blacktown City 2 at Seymour Shaw

Blacktown City has held off a fast finishing Sutherland Sharks to claim a 2-1 win in their National Premier Leagues NSW Round 11 clash at Seymour Shaw on Saturday night.

Despite taking a 2-0 lead with only 20 minutes left to play, Blacktown were forced to scrap for the win in the dying stages in a match with truly lit up in an exciting second stanza.

Joey Gibbs opened the scoring for City after only twelve minutes before Danny Choi doubled the visitors lead in the 67th minute with the Sharks looking unable to match it with Mark Crittenden's well oiled side.

However, The home side found a second wind as Blair Brown pulled one back for Sutherland late on to give Blacktown a jittery final few minutes.

The final flurry proved too little too late and City's backs against the wall defence helped close out what should've been a much more straight forward victory for the Seven Hills based club.

Wollongong Wolves 1 – Marconi Stallions 0 at WIN Stadium

Wollongong Wolves have shaken off a luckless month of football to record a 1-0 win over Marconi Stallions at WIN Stadium on Sunday afternoon.

The victory was the Wolves first in their last six attempts, coming courtesy of Yuzo Tashiro's early header which proved to be the decider in what was a tense battle.

With more frugality in front of goal Tashiro may well have gone home with the match ball, yet the early header was enough to see them past Marconi who had Theo Kofinas dismissed late on for a second yellow card.

The match marked Luke Wilkshire's first home game for the Wolves since 1997, with the former Socceroo slotting into a holding midfield role within a new-look 3-5-2 formation for Jacob Timpano's side.

Both teams went into the clash missing key men with the industrious Nick Montgomery out with a rib injury for Wolves while the suspended Sean O'Connell was missing for Marconi.

The match featured a tense midfield battle throughout, occasionally opening up for flurries of chances at each end as both sides went in search of much needed points.

A wounded Blacktown City side will accept nothing less than three points and a big performance when they host Wollongong Wolves at Lily's Football Centre on Sunday afternoon.

John Carnevale's outfit were handsomely beaten 3-0 by premiership rivals Sutherland last week and with the gap between the competition leaders extended to six points Blacktown know the margin for error is diminishing by the week.

They'll want to lift themselves back into the premiership discussion with a commanding display at home over a finals rival in Wollongong, who have run into an inconsistent patch of form in the last month with just two wins from five, but have proven tricky opponents over the course of the year.

The Wolves also boast one of the competition's standout attackers in Tory Musumeci, who has netted nine goals in 11 appearances for Wollongong and accounts for over half of the side's goals scored this season.
