1ST GRADE MATCH PREVIEW

An inspired Manly United FC will be hoping to replicate their luck and good form from last round when they host Hakoah Sydney City East at Cromer Park on Saturday.

Manly dug deep to snatch an incredible 1-0 win away from home against APIA Leichhardt Tigers in Round 12 with the result hopefully kick starting their push for finals football.

Hakoah were also winners last week as they cruised to a 3-1 win against bottom side Sydney FC.

Manly has struggled to reach the heights of the Championship winning 2017 season but not all is lost for the boys from the Northern Beaches with 10 rounds still to be played.

Kieran Paull was the hero for Manly against APIA and it's not for the first time this season from the talented defender. When in form he is a match-up nightmare on the flanks and provide's

plenty of crosses into the box for United strikers Dylan Macallister and Nikola Taneski.

Dom Ferguson has also served the club well with a string of decent performances in midfield.

Hakoah will be without their best player this week after Kiwi attacking weapon Andre de Jong was selected by New Zealand for their tour of India.

New signing Amaury Gauthier should help fill the void and he proved last week he is no slouch himself scoring a goal on debut while young Harry Jones is a player you need to put in your notebooks as one to watch out for.

Both sides have been inconsistent this season but have flashed plenty of solid performances to be on the cusp of a finals spot.

Manly will be favourites at home yet Hakoah shouldn't be written off.

APIA Leichhardt Tigers 0 – Manly United FC 1 at Lambert Park

APIA Leichhardt has squandered a glorious chance to overtake Sydney Olympic at the top of the NPL NSW Men's ladder after suffering a surprise 1-0 defeat at the hands of Manly United at Lambert Park on Sunday.

It was an afternoon defined by missed opportunities for the home side who couldn't find a much needed goal as Manly took full advantage of the luck on their side to collect all three points.

Despite enjoying the run of play for the best part of the match, the Tigers were unable to make the most of the chances that fell their way, leaving the visitors to edge the game with a single goal from Kieren Paull in the dying moments of the first half.

Shaun Catlin put in an imperious performance in the Manly goal, earning Paul Dee's men their first win in a month.



Hakoah Sydney City East has kept their finals hopes alive with a 3-1 win against Sydney FC at Hensley Athletic Field on Sunday.

Hakoah outclassed their opponents for much of the contest and never looked like taking any less that three competition points from the contest.

The home side took a 2-0 lead into the interval thanks to clinical finishes from Harry Jones and Amaury Gauthier.

Sydney FC gave the home side a late scare when Jordan Swibel scored in 85th minute, but it proved to be nothing more than a consolation goal when Young Sky Blues defender Patrick Flottmann turned the ball into his own net in the 90th minute to ensure Hakoah the win.

The result moves Hakoah to sixth in the standings only one point outside the top five, while Sydney FC finish Round 12 at the foot of the ladder.

FFA CUP ROUND OF 32



Five NPL NSW Men's top tier clubs qualify for Round of 32.

Five clubs from NSW have booked their spot in the FFA Cup Round of 32 on Wednesday night.

APIA Leichhardt Tigers, Marconi Stallions, Bonnyrigg White Eagles, Hakoah Sydney City East and Rockdale City Suns all made it through to the national stage.

APIA ran out 3-0 winners over a hapless Sydney Olympic to secure back-to-back Round of 32 berths.

Marconi and Bonnyrigg faced tougher opposition, despite playing sides in lower divisions.

Hills United put up a solid fight against Bonnyrigg, while GHFA Spirit showed, well, plenty of spirit against Marconi.

However, both top-tier sides were able to show their class and advance with 2-1 wins.

Hakoah also played weaker opposition in the Tarrawanna Blueys, and the South Coast side were unable to continue their fairytale run, with Hakoah sealing a 4-0 win.

All the drama was in Rockdale, however, with the Suns securing a dramatic late win.

With 10 minutes left on the clock, it looked like Blacktown were going to continue their run of reaching the Final Rounds of the FFA Cup.

But Rockdale had other ideas, levelling the scores at 2-2 in the 81st minute.

And it was not until the 91st minute that they took the lead in the match for the first time, converting a penalty to book their spot in the Round of 32.

The draw for the Round of 32 will take place on Tuesday, 26 June and will be broadcast on FOX SPORTS


U20'S MATCH PREVIEW

Manly United host Hakoah Sydney City East at Cromer Park on Saturday afternoon needing a win to revive their stuttering 2018 campaign.

Adam Griffith's side currently reside in 10th position after round 12's 1-0 defeat to APIA Leichhardt Tigers and find themselves eight points off fifth place. After wins over Sydney United 58 and Wollongong Wolves in the past month, Manly have shown enough potential to stay in the race for finals football but are running out of matches to do so.

Hakoah Sydney City East will provide a great test of Manly's credentials. Hakoah are currently the competition's form side with seven wins from their last eight and underlined their championship potential with a 3-2 win over Sydney FC last weekend. Connor Eldridge grabbed a brace in that win, and if Hakoah's central striker can start replicating the goal scoring form of 2017 the Sydneysiders will only continue to improve.
