1ST GRADE MATCH PREVIEW

Three competition points are desperately needed by Marconi Stallions and they will be hoping to add them to their tally on Saturday with a win against Bonnyrigg White Eagles.

The Stallions come into the game after being held to a 2-2 draw with local rivals Sydney United 58 in a hard fought encounter.

Bonnyrigg will be brimming with confidence after upsetting league leaders Sydney Olympic 1-0 in arguably the shock result of the season.

Marko Jesic was the man for Marconi last week continuing his impressive form for Peter Tsekenis' side this season. His speed, tricky dribbling and composure in the final third makes him a dangerous player to take on. While no nonsense defender Peter Pelekanos has also proved his worth in the club's back-line after a solid display against United 58 although the club is expecting to have the experienced Theo Kofinas back into the side.

The White Eagles will lean on captain Ray Miller once again this round with the veteran midfielder's experience a game changer in big matches. He along with his chargers, in particular another familiar face with the return from injury in the shape of Tynan Diaz, Brian Brown's men will be up for this one you can be sure of that.

A full 90 minute from Marconi will make them a tough team to beat at home, however too many times this season they have failed to perform for the entirety of the match.

Bonnyrigg need to recreate the dogged defence and desperation of their win against Olympic. Mistakes and poor defending have been their Achilles Heel so far this campaign.

Both teams are very evenly matched and with finals still a potential reality their won't be any excuses for a poor showing in what is set to be a tough encounter.

Sydney United 58 FC 2 – Marconi Stallions 2 at Sydney United Sports Ground

A stunning first-half fightback has helped Sydney United 58 recover from two goals down and snatch a 2-2 draw from Marconi Stallions at Sydney United Sports Centre on Saturday night.

The intense local derby sprung into life in the opening minutes as Marconi quickly raced into a commanding position with early goals from Sean Rooney and Brandon Vella.

A cunning goal from Chris Payne then sparked a stunning revival which was completed by a stunning free kick from Panny Nikas on the half hour mark.

The hosts were then reduced to ten men after 60 minutes when Nick Stavroulakis saw red for a challenge on Peter Pelekanos.

The closing half hour was riddled with half chances yet neither side could muster a decider as the local derby ended with shared spoils.



Bonnyrigg White Eagles have stunned league leaders Sydney Olympic with a shock 1-0 upset at Bonnyrigg Sports Ground on Saturday.

A 77th minute strike by Bonnyrigg fan favourite Tynan Diaz in his first game back after a two month injury layoff helped snatch the surprise win and inflict Olympic's first defeat in 10 weeks.

Olympic struggled to get into gear on a difficult Bonnyrigg pitch and the home side took full advantage.

Both sides had their fair share of chances but it was the fast finishing White Eagles who had too much momentum to stop.

The result opens the door for APIA Leichhardt Tigers to cut Olympic's three point lead at the top of the standings while it has also brought Bonnyrigg back into finals contention.

FFA CUP ROUND OF 32



Five NPL NSW Men's top tier clubs qualify for Round of 32.

Five clubs from NSW have booked their spot in the FFA Cup Round of 32 on Wednesday night.

APIA Leichhardt Tigers, Marconi Stallions, Bonnyrigg White Eagles, Hakoah Sydney City East and Rockdale City Suns all made it through to the national stage.

APIA ran out 3-0 winners over a hapless Sydney Olympic to secure back-to-back Round of 32 berths.

Marconi and Bonnyrigg faced tougher opposition, despite playing sides in lower divisions.

Hills United put up a solid fight against Bonnyrigg, while GHFA Spirit showed, well, plenty of spirit against Marconi.

However, both top-tier sides were able to show their class and advance with 2-1 wins.

Hakoah also played weaker opposition in the Tarrawanna Blueys, and the South Coast side were unable to continue their fairytale run, with Hakoah sealing a 4-0 win.

All the drama was in Rockdale, however, with the Suns securing a dramatic late win.

With 10 minutes left on the clock, it looked like Blacktown were going to continue their run of reaching the Final Rounds of the FFA Cup.

But Rockdale had other ideas, levelling the scores at 2-2 in the 81st minute.

And it was not until the 91st minute that they took the lead in the match for the first time, converting a penalty to book their spot in the Round of 32.

The draw for the Round of 32 will take place on Tuesday, 26 June and will be broadcast on FOX SPORTS

U20'S MATCH PREVIEW

Marconi Stallions are in desperate need of a victory when they host Bonnyrigg White Eagles at Marconi Stadium on Saturday evening.

The 11th-placed Stallions are currently 10 points away from fifth position and have failed to convert an array of promising performances into results so far this campaign. Moreover, Marconi's struggle for goals has worsened over the past month with the side held scoreless in four of their last five fixtures.

Coming up against one of the competition's leanest defences in Bonnyrigg, the task couldn't get much harder for the Stallions. Hamish Brown's White Eagles have conceded just two goals in their last six appearances and will be searching for a victory to push them closer to a finals position.

The White Eagles trail fifth-placed Sydney FC by four points and know margin for error in the second half of the season is slim, and will consider anything less than maximum points at Marconi a setback.
