Manly United held off a gallant Sydney FC side to secure a priceless 1-0 victory at Cromer Park last Wednesday evening in a crucial Round 18 clash.

A Brendan Cholakian header inside the opening half an hour proved decisive in what was a tight tactical battle.

The visitors had their opportunities, but were denied by a couple of trademark Dylan Mitchell saves.

It was the victory the defending Champions were craving, having failed to secure maximum returns on their previous six outings.

However they were made to work for it by a stubborn Sydney FC outfit, who had only returned from the Free Trade Port International Football Tournament in Haikou City, China last Tuesday.

The win boosted Manly United's Club Championship points which is sure to come in handy come end of the season.

Rockdale City Suns 1 – Sydney Olympic FC 0 at Ilinden Sports Centre

A 77th minute Alec Urosevski strike has helped Rockdale City Suns stun league leaders Sydney Olympic at Ilinden Sports Centre on Sunday.

Urosevski's goal came late in the game, sending Rockdale fans into raptures after what had been a relentless battle between the two teams.

Olympic had their chances as the second half came to life after a first half devoid of true opportunities but couldn't find the back of the net.

Rockdale shot stopper Ante Covic wound back the years with a star performance to keep his side in the game before Urosevski hit the winner with 13 minutes left on the clock.

It was an important win for the Suns against their rivals, keeping their finals hopes alive and knocking Olympic from the top spot on the ladder.

ENGLISH OFFICIALS TO HIT THE NPL NSW MEN'S COMPETITION

Overseas talent is nothing new on the fields of New South Wales football, but in Round 20 of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition there will be a different kind of elite foreign talent.

Former English Premier League referees Michael Salisbury and David Webb will be officiating two of Round 20's top-tier NPL NSW Men's matches with Manly United taking on Wollongong Wolves and Blacktown City hosting Rockdale City Suns penned in as the matches the duo will take over.

Salisbury will take charge of the clash at Cromer Park while Webb will oversee the big encounter at Lilys Football Stadium.

They will also be officiating in the NPL Victorian Premier League as part of their Australian visit.

One of Salisbury's major achievements as an official was getting his first taste of officiating at Wembley Stadium in May 2010 when he was appointed onto the National League play-off final as an assistant for the match between Oxford United v York City.

As a result from his performances as an assistant referee, he was then promoted into the professional game with his first appointment coming at Macclesfield Town.

After his time in the English lower leagues, Salisbury was then promoted into the English Premier League for the 2014/15 season and was an assistant referee for two seasons as well as achieving a position on the FIFA International list in 2016.

One of his finest moments was ironically his final appointment before being promoted onto the EFL National Group of Referees where he was an assistant referee in the 2016 FA Cup Final between Manchester United and Crystal Palace.

Webb also comes with some quality pedigree.

After beginning his journey as a referee in 1999, he progressed through non-league football in the North East of England before being promoted to the EFL Assistant Referees list and the National League referees in 2008/09

The last nine years has seen Webb referee in the Championship, League 1 and League 2 matches as well as major English Cup competitions.

Reflecting on his career, his major highlight thus far was officiating in the recent League 2 Play-Off Final at Wembley Stadium in front of 52,000 fans when Coventry City took on Exeter City.

This isn't the first time English Premier League referees have graced our football pitches in Sydney.

In 2016, Englishmen Stuart Atwell and Peter Bankes both officiated in the NPL NSW Men's competition kick starting the relationship between our elite competition and the English game.

U20'S MATCH PREVIEW

Sydney FC return to Lambert Park on Saturday afternoon looking to kick back into top gear after a disappointing 0-0 draw at Bonnyrigg White Eagles in Round 16.

Giancarlo Italiano's men put seven past Sydney United 58 two weeks ago but could only manage a point at Bonnyrigg Sports Club, though Sutherland's defeat to United meant Sydney FC's slip-up went unpunished by the competition leaders. Blacktown City sit just a point behind in third with a game in hand, meaning there's little room for error against APIA Leichhardt.

Sydney FC face an APIA side buoyed by a 2-0 win over Rockdale City Suns, and looking to ignite a late charge up the table. APIA have struggled for consistency this year but will be confident of rattling their opponents on the weekend after a convincing win on Sunday afternoon.

Certainly, Franco Consentino's men will be eager to make amends for their 3-2 defeat to Sydney FC in Round 6, even if the reverse fixture has come too late in the season for last season's Grand Finalists.
