1ST GRADE MATCH PREVIEW

There is no love lost when Sydney United 58 and Bonnyrigg White Eagles go head to head and fans can expect a gripping clash between these two heated rivals on Saturday.

Sydney United 58 suffered a shock defeat last time these two teams played each other but come into this game with four straight wins after a 3-1 defeat of Hakoah in Round 18.

Bonnyrigg also tasted victory in Round 18 as they held off Wollongong Wolves to claim a 1-0 win.

United 58 coach Miro Vlastelica has the Edensor Park based side playing the best football they have shown all season after taking over the job in May following the departure of Jason Culina.

If Vlastelica's troops continue this impressive run they are sure to be a dark horse come finals time.

Striker Chris Payne is scoring at will and his prolific form in front of goal will create plenty of problems for Bonnyrigg's inconsistent backline.

The White Eagles have had their own coaching issues with club legend Brian Brown stepping down after 10 seasons at the club as the side struggled to find the results "Bomber" had become renowned for leading the team to in previous years.

Former Brisbane Roar A-League Championship winner Milan Susak is the man to take the helm at Bonnyrigg Sports Club for the rest of the season and he will have a tough job ahead.

Susak will likely turn to Jewook Woo to help get the team out of the hole the find themselves in with his scoring feats one of few bright spots for the club.

Games between these two teams are never short of drama and you can expect plenty of that this weekend at Sydney United Sports Centre.

Sydney United 58 FC 3 – Hakoah Sydney City East 1 at Sydney United Sports Centre

A brilliant Chris Payne double has helped Sydney United 58 to a 3-1 victory against Hakoah Sydney City East at Sydney United Sports Centre on Saturday.

The win stretches The Reds winning streak to four with MIro Vlastelica's side leapfrogging Blacktown City to take third place.

Payne was in inspired form for the home side with his goals in either half, alongside a Mat Sim strike, the difference for United 58 against a determined Hakoah outfit.

The visitors netted only six minutes into the contest through Anthony Frangie, but it would prove to be only a brief moment on top for Hakoah.

Payne levelled after 26 minutes before he found the net again alongside Sim in the second half to secure the win.

Bonnyrigg White Eagles 1 - Wollongong Wolves 0 at Bonnyrigg Sports Club

The shock departure of long serving coach Brian Brown midweek proved to not hold Bonnyrigg White Eagles back as they claimed a shock 1-0 win against Wollongong Wolves on Saturday.

Interim head coach Milan Susak claimed his first win at the helm as a late first half header from Jewook Woo ensured the three points would go the way of the White Eagles.

The Wolves pushed hard to find an equaliser but paid the price for missed opportunities as they failed to find the back of the net.

It was a vital result for Bonnyrigg with the win helping them leapfrog Wollongong on the ladder to seventh spot.

ENGLISH OFFICIALS TO HIT THE NPL NSW MEN'S COMPETITION

Overseas talent is nothing new on the fields of New South Wales football, but in Round 20 of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition there will be a different kind of elite foreign talent.

Former English Premier League referees Michael Salisbury and David Webb will be officiating two of Round 20's top-tier NPL NSW Men's matches with Manly United taking on Wollongong Wolves and Blacktown City hosting Rockdale City Suns penned in as the matches the duo will take over.

Salisbury will take charge of the clash at Cromer Park while Webb will oversee the big encounter at Lilys Football Stadium.

They will also be officiating in the NPL Victorian Premier League as part of their Australian visit.

One of Salisbury's major achievements as an official was getting his first taste of officiating at Wembley Stadium in May 2010 when he was appointed onto the National League play-off final as an assistant for the match between Oxford United v York City.

As a result from his performances as an assistant referee, he was then promoted into the professional game with his first appointment coming at Macclesfield Town.

After his time in the English lower leagues, Salisbury was then promoted into the English Premier League for the 2014/15 season and was an assistant referee for two seasons as well as achieving a position on the FIFA International list in 2016.

One of his finest moments was ironically his final appointment before being promoted onto the EFL National Group of Referees where he was an assistant referee in the 2016 FA Cup Final between Manchester United and Crystal Palace.

Webb also comes with some quality pedigree.

After beginning his journey as a referee in 1999, he progressed through non-league football in the North East of England before being promoted to the EFL Assistant Referees list and the National League referees in 2008/09

The last nine years has seen Webb referee in the Championship, League 1 and League 2 matches as well as major English Cup competitions.

Reflecting on his career, his major highlight thus far was officiating in the recent League 2 Play-Off Final at Wembley Stadium in front of 52,000 fans when Coventry City took on Exeter City.

This isn't the first time English Premier League referees have graced our football pitches in Sydney.

In 2016, Englishmen Stuart Atwell and Peter Bankes both officiated in the NPL NSW Men's competition kick starting the relationship between our elite competition and the English game.


U20'S MATCH PREVIEW

Sydney United 58 kept themselves in the hunt for a place in the finals with a crucial win over Hakoah Sydney City East a fortnight ago, moving within two points of the side from Sydney's east with a goal in each half securing a 2-1 win at Sydney United Sports Centre.

Having lost just once in their previous five matches (a stunning 7-0 defeat to Sydney FC), Sydney United will be confident of carrying that good form into a match against the competition's 10th-placed side.

Bonnyrigg were down 1-0 to Wollongong Wolves at halftime when they met two weeks ago, but pegged their opponents back with a goal in the second half to take an unlikely point from fourth-placed Wolves. Despite their stuttering form Bonnyrigg also have reason to be hopeful heading into this one, having beaten Sydney United 2-0 when they met at Bonnyrigg Sports Centre in Round 8.
