1ST GRADE MATCH PREVIEW

It all comes down to this for Sydney Olympic with their hopes of premiership glory on the line as they host Sydney United 58 FC on Sunday.

While their fate is not entirely in their hands, Olympic will be doing everything they can to secure a historic premiership win for the club.

They come into the game on the back of a comprehensive 4-0 thrashing of Wollongong Wolves and will be more determined than before to secure all three points.

Despite a brief slump towards the back end of the season, Olympic have been the pace setters this year and will be hurting that they are not in complete control of their Premiership title chances.

United 58 have little to play for in this game but that doesn't mean they are going to take it easy against one of their biggest rivals.


It would be no surprise to see coach Miro Valstelica rest one or two of his main stars for this match and potentially blood young talent from United 58's Under 20's squad.

Wollongong Wolves 0 – Sydney Olympic 4 at Hooka Creek Park

Sydney Olympic has kept their premiership push alive with a dominant 4-0 win against Wollongong Wolves at Hooka Creek Park on Sunday.

A brace from Alejandro Sanchez-Lopez helped get the visitors over the line, with Nikolas Tsattalios and Max Burgess also getting on the scoresheet in a productive afternoon for the travelling side.

The result ensures the Abbas Saad coached side remains neck and neck with APIA Leichhardt Tigers for the Premiership and sets up a dramatic final round next week.

Sadly for Wollongong the loss means they finish yet another season outside the top five and out of contention for finals football.

A Panny Nikas strike at the death has secured all three points for Sydney United 58 in a tense 1-0 result against Manly United FC at Sydney United Sports Centre on Saturday.

U20'S MATCH PREVIEW

Sydney United 58 will look to carry a brilliant run of form into their final match of the regular season against Sydney Olympic, needing a result to ensure they challenge Wollongong and Hakoah above them for a spot in the five

United sit a point off both fourth and fifth ahead of their Round 22 clash with Olympic, following a 2-0 win over Manly United last weekend. They have a better goal difference than Hakoah and are two goals behind Wollongong, meaning a win would give them a fighting chance of beating one of the two sides above them – depending on results elsewhere, of course – while a draw could also be enough.

A 3-1 win in this fixture at Sydney United Sports Centre in May bodes well for the visitors, as does Olympic's recent record. The side from Belmore sit four goals above bottom-of-thetable Rockdale on goal difference, and will be eager to avoid the thrashing their opponents would surely like to deal out on Sunday.
