MATCH PREVIEW

A return to Popondetta Park could be the driving force that inspires Mt Druitt to victory when they host Marconi Stallions on Saturday.

Plenty of goals could be on the menu if the Stallions are in the mood for it come Saturday night which means Mt Druitt defence could be in for a busy night.

Sydney United 58 3 v Mt Druitt Town Rangers FC 1 at Sydney United Sports Centre

A sensational Peter Simonoski hat-trick has lifted Sydney United 58 back into the winners circle as they defeated National Premier Leagues NSW Men's newcomers Mt Druitt 3-1 at Sydney United Sports Centre on Monday.

It was the perfect response from United 58 after last week's drubbing at the hands of Marconi with Simonoski's display exactly the performance coach Miro Vlastelica would've had in mind when he signed the striker in the off-season.

The former Wolves front man opened the scoring midway through the first half before giving the Edensor Park based side a 2-0 buffer at the interval.

Mt Druitt hit back early in the second-half but despite their efforts to get back into the game they couldn't stop United 58 and Simonoski who wrapped up the win and his hat-trick 10 minutes from the final whistle.

The result keeps Sydney United 58 on track with the rest of the top five and settles the ship after a few bad results in recent weeks.

Marconi Stallions 3 v Sutherland Sharks 1 at Marconi Stadium

Marconi Stallions showed their clinical edge as they put on a flowing attacking performance to beat a gallant Sutherland Sharks 3-1 at Marconi Stadium on Easter Saturday.

The home side kept the attacking rolling after their five-star performance last weekend where they demolished neighbours Sydney United 58.

Mitch Mallia capped off a wonderful all-round performance with a second half strike, while Mirjan Pavlovic and Brandon Vella made it three straight for the Stallions.

For Sutherland the defeat was their fifth of the season and stretches their winless run to six games.

The Rangers will be keen to back up their 3-1 win at Sydney United Sports Centre with a similar result this Saturday.



PROJECT CHARLIE: POPONDETTA FOOTBALL PRECINCT WITH SYNTHETIC FIELD

In May 2016 Blacktown Mayor Stephen Bali announced a Blacktown City Budget that included an impressive \$5Million budget for the Football precinct at Popondetta Park, the home of Mount Druitt Town Rangers, and as we prepared for our 50th Anniversary it appeared the timing could not have been better.

Central to this announcement was not only the passion, desire, belief of our club but that of decades of handson work of a former administrator, our long time patron, and Popondetta Pk regular Cr. Charlie Lowles. Charlie affectionately known as the 'Mayor of MtDruitt' was a long time Mayor and Deputy Mayor of Blacktown and Councillor across many decades.



His love of Blacktown and in particular Mount Druitt is unrivaled, in football his love of Mount Druitt Town Rangers FC was only equalled by that of his love of Everton!

Charlie lived 'around the corner', almost in sight of the Popondetta Grandstand and always took an active interest in the development of our players, teams and club. He shared our pride in not only winning promotion through the grades but the introduction of a Football NSW Program for Girl's/Women's, Futsal and Rangers focus on disAbility / Inclusive Football for Special Needs.

Charlie shared our desire to provide the best pathways and facilities possible for the Youth of the Western Sydney, again his focus was always on the youth of Blacktown. Cr Lowles took pride in the development of the once barren Popondetta Park, over many years he oversaw the construction of netball courts, carparks,

our Football grandstand, amenity blocks and ultimately the adjoining Emerton Leisure Centre renamed Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre shortly after his passing in late 2016.

Hence 'Project Charlie' as our working name for the \$5M allocation. Central to the Football precinct is the inclusion



of a Synthetic field. We have worked with Council on where it is best placed, and what facilities it requires



to meet FNSW expectations - our 'wish list' for the next 50 years. Projects this size meet challenges and while we have hoped it would be ready for this our 50th Season) for now we will have to enjoy these Project Charlie concept diagrams courtesy of ARC Studios Architecture. - SP
