MATCH PREVIEW

A big win last round is sure to have Manly United full of confidence as they host league leaders Wollongong Wolves at Cromer Park this Sunday.

Manly eased to a 3-0 win against Sydney United 58 in round 11 as coach Paul Dee outfoxed his opponent Miro Vlastelica to keep their chances of finals football alive.

It was a big performance from pacy winger Charles Mendy who netted his first goal in Manly colours since joining the Northern Beaches side this season.

While Brendan Cholakian netted his fourth goal in his last four matches bringing his tally to seven for the season.

The result is sure to put a smile on coach Paul Dee's face after a run of costly slip ups from the side in previous matches.

Don't expect Dee to make many, if any, changes to a winning team for this match.

Wollongong Wolves also flexed their muscles last round with an impressive 3-1 away win against Marconi Stallions.

Despite conceding the opening goal, Luke Wilkshire's squad fought back to secure another crucial three points and extend their lead at the top of the pile.

Japanese midfielder Takeru Okada finally delivered on his potential against the Stallions with a brace in a brilliant display.

Expect Wilkshire to look to players like Okada more over the second half of the campaign as opposition sides game plan around stopping Wolves league leading striker Thomas James.

James has had a baron two game spell of no goals so Manly will be fearful of the Englishman's attack.

Club stalwart Justin Pasfield has also been solid under the sticks for the side leading from the back.

Wollongong will be favourites for this match but it could be a long trip back to the South Coast if they are not prepared for a fired up Manly outfit.


Manly United FC 3 – Sydney United 0 at Cromer Park

Manly United cruised to a comfortable 3-0 victory over Sydney United 58 at Cromer Park on Sunday afternoon.

First-half strikes from flying wingers Charles Mendy and Adam Parkhouse gave the hosts some breathing space at the interval, before Brendan Cholakian sealed the deal with ten minutes to play.

A stubborn defensive effort from Paul Dee's men saw the formidable firepower in United 58's lineup restricted to half-chances for the majority of the ninety.

The result, Manly's first victory in three and United 58's first defeat in five, leaves both sides positioned narrowly inside the all-important top five at the mid-way point of the 2019 National Premier League NSW Men's season.



A brilliant brace from Japanese midfield maestro Takeru Okada has inspired Wollongong Wolves to an incredible second half comeback to defeat Marconi Stallions 3-1 at Marconi Stadium on Saturday.

With the Wolves looking down the barrel at a second defeat in as many weeks as the Stallions took a 1-0 lead, Okada netted a pair of delightful finishes along side a Darcy Madden goal to claim all three points.

However, for the Stallions it was a game of what ifs as Peter Tsekenis' side squandered their chances after taking the lead just after half time courtesy of Marko Jesic.

Jesic would go from hero to zero later in the match when he missed a penalty which would've put Marconi in the box seat to win.

The result means Wollongong stretch their lead at the top of the table while Marconi remain in the middle of the fight for a finals spot.
