MATCH PREVIEW

Three wins on the trot will be the goal for Sydney FC this weekend when the host Manly United FC at Lambert Park on Saturday afternoon.

Hard fought wins against Sydney Olympic and Hakoah Sydney City East has the confidence brimming over for the Young Sky Blues.

And with the pressures of the club's A-League and Asian Champions League commitments done, NPL team coach Jimmy van Weeren will have a near full strength side at his disposal once again.

Luke Ivanovic and Joel King's return has given Sydney FC a boost while goalkeeper Thomas Heward-Belle is doing his chances of a full-time A-League call up no harm thanks to a run of incredible performances between the sticks.

Hamish Lamberton and Jerry Skotadis are another two who have been key players in recent weeks as Sydney has lifted themselves from the bottom of the ladder to only two games outside finals football.

However, this week they will need to do so without defender Liam McGing who has made the move to Sutherland Sharks. It will force a reshuffle at the back for van Weeren.

Their opponents Manly United will be desperate to bounce back after going down 4-0 at the hands of league leaders Wollongong on Sunday.

Manly has struggled for consistency this season an appeared to be on the right track before last week's heartbreaking defeat.

Expect a bit of a reshuffle from coach Paul Dee as he attempts to tighten his defence as well as get the most out of his extremely talented but under performing front line.

Sydney FC 1 v Hakoah Sydney City East 0 at Lambert Park

Sydney FC made it back-to-back victories for the first time this season with a gutsy 1-0 win against Hakoah Sydney City East tonight at Lambert Park.

The victory caps off a massive week for the club with many players doubling up after earning Asian Champions League debuts on Wednesday.

Benjamin Koop's 32nd minute strike was the difference in a hard fought contest as the Young Sky Blues claimed a valuable three points.

Hakoah did everything but put the ball into the back of the net in another frustrating display for the Eastern Suburbs side which leaves the rooted to the bottom of the table after 12 rounds.



Manly United 0 – Wollongong Wolves 4 at Cromer Park

Wollongong Wolves' stellar campaign produced another impressive scalp on Sunday afternoon as they cruised to a clinical 4-0 victory over Manly United at Cromer Park.

A determined Manly outfit could not contain another classy Thomas James performance, who despite battling illness in the lead up to the match thumped home the opening goal 24 minutes in before going on to register a hat-trick of assists.

An inspired substitution from Luke Wilkshire saw Lachlan Scott double the lead with his first touch moments after being introduced in the 54th minute, before bagging a brace half an hour later to secure the three points. Takeru Okada then backed up his own brace last time out with a stoppage time strike to cap off a quality Wollongong performance.

Manly United enjoyed extended spells of possession and threatened through set pieces, but ultimately were unable to penetrate a resolute Wollongong defensive unit.

The result ensures they remain three points clear of APIA Leichhardt Tigers on top of the NSW National Premier League Mens' table.



U20'S MATCH PREVIEW

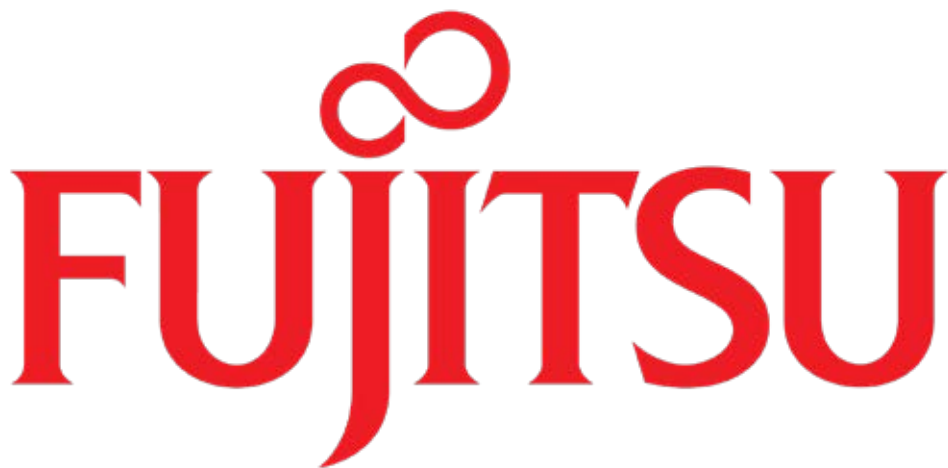
Sydney FC took full advantage of slip-ups from teams around them on the table to push clear into third place with a 2-1 win over Hakoah Sydney City East 2-1 last Saturday; goals from Thomas Fay and Harry McCarthy giving the Sky Blues their fourth win in five games.

Sydney should be confident of stretching their unbeaten run out to seven matches when they welcome Manly United to Lambert Park this

weekend, with the visitors sitting ninth on the ladder and in indifferent form.

The side from Cromer Park were beaten 2-1 by Wollongong Wolves last weekend, and haven't won a match since the first week of May.

Manly are four points off the top five places, but also sit just five points about last-placed Sydney United 58. A result at Lambert Park on Saturday afternoon could prove crucial to their season.

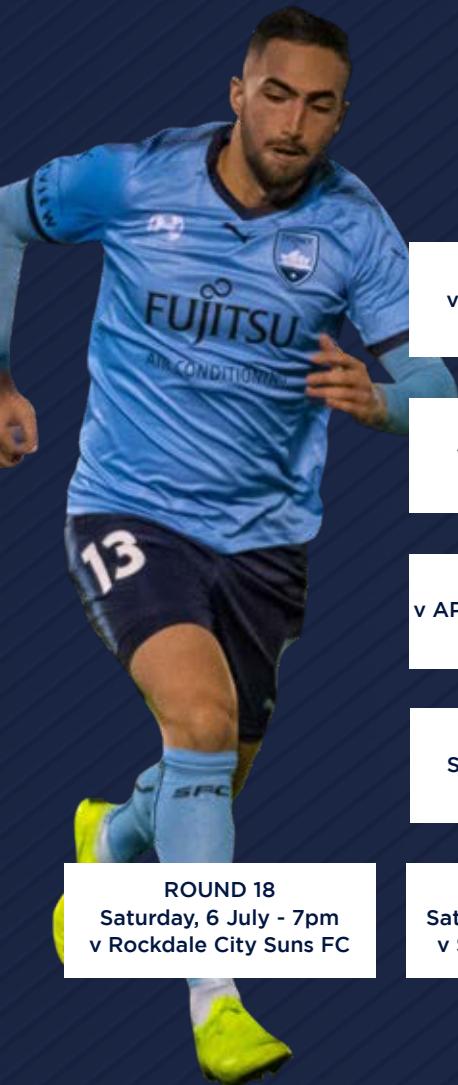
