Van Weeren was able to include A-League rising stars Luke Ivanovic and Joel King in his team against Sydney FC and their addition is surely something which will only strengthen the Young Sky Blues outfit.

Hamish Lamberton has done a good job covering the striking position since the injury to Jordi Swibel and he was once again on the scoreboard after coming off the bench.

It will be a tough contest for Sydney FC against an inform Olympic team but a full 90 minute performance could be enough for them to claim an upset.






























1ST GRADE REVIEWS
