Today we are up against Rockdale who have been on a bit of a roll results wise for the past 4 or 5 weeks. I believe that if we bring our recent form, we should be able to maintain our lead at the top of the table.

In my view, our home crowds have been a little disappointing. I question whether this region is really ready for an A-League team when we can't get people out supporting their own young talented players who are sitting top of the table and playing the most entertaining football in the league.

The team from Ilinden Park, Rockdale venture to WIN Stadium for the Round 10 encounter with the Wollongong Wolves in their NPL NSW Men's assignment tonight. In the matches played to date between the two clubs, there have been a total of fifty-five goals scored at an average of 2.6 goals per game.

## THE OPPOSITION TODAY - ROCKDALE CITY SUNS

Rockdale City Suns have strengthened their side in 2019 with the addition of goalkeeper David Bradascevic, returning to the club from Bonnyrigg White Eagles, Leigh Egger and Sasa Macura, a defender and a midfielder from Manly United, Joshua Da Silva, an attacker from Sutherland Sharks together with Panni Nikas, from Sydney United 58 and a midfielder, together with Matthew Lecce, a Suns junior who has returned from Western Sydney Wanderers and Parramatta FC. Departures include Ante Covic, Harris Gaitatzis, Blake Ricciuto and Paul Reid (retired). After Round 5 coach Reid parted company with the club and Nick Porreca was appointed in the interim.

Rockdale City Suns in 2018 qualified for the FFA Cup Round Of 32 for the second time beating Glebe Wanderers, Bankstown United, Sydney United 58 and Blacktown City. Their opponents were Sydney FC, the holders of the 2017 Cup. Rockdale shocked by going to an early lead through Harris Gaitatzis and though the Suns scored again through Toufic Alameddine, they eventually went out of the competition 4-2 with a spirited showing. The Suns were Ante Covic, Brayden Sorge, Michael Neill, Blake Ricciuto, Daniel Petkovski, Idriss El Hafine, Alameddine, Patrick Savor, Alec Urosevski, Aleksander Canak and Gaitatzis with Paul Reid the coach. Reid Jonathan Grozdanovski and Steven Hesketh replaced Savor, Neill and Urosevski.

In 2018 Mens 1 competition, Rockdale achieved nine wins and four draws and suffered nine defeats earning thirty-one points. The team scored 39 goals and conceded 43. The goals per game average was 1.7 and the goals per game conceded was 1.95. The top scorer was Urosevski with nine goals and a strike rate of 0.4 with nine other players sharing in the achievement of goals. Five nil scores eventuated and this was the third highest score in the competition but better than five other clubs. The biggest winning margin was three in 3-0 and 4-1 in Rounds 10 and 13, with the biggest defeat being 0-5 in Round 5 by APIA. In Rounds 1-11 nineteen and twenty-six goals were scored and conceded

and in Rounds 12-22 twenty and seventeen goals was the outcome. The defence in the second half of the season improved. The quickest goal was by Sorge in Round 14 in the first minute of play. Players who were selected in the 'Team Of The Week' were Urosevski with four, Ricciuto (2), Bai Antoniou (2), Gaitatzis (2), with Petkovski, Jordan Figon, Covic, Neill, Canak, Savor and Grozdanovski with one each. Multi scorers in a single match were Figon, Gaitatzis and Grozdanovski with a brace each. The best sequence without loss during 2018 was four, Rounds 17-20, win, win, win and draw.

In the last five years of the competition, Rockdale has finished in 5th, 6th, 4th and 3rd positions with a 5th place in 2018. It was slight drop but still a qualification for the finals.

## THE MATCH – UP

The top scorer for each club is Thomas James (WW) and Alec Urosevski (RCS) with a tally of twelve and two goals respectively with each team scoring twenty-two and eight. The scorer of the team's previous goal is Nick Littler (WW) and Sasa Macura (RCS), both in Round 9.

Rockdale has ten wins to the Wolves eight in their match-ups since the 2004/05 season while Rockdale has kept the Wolves scoreless in five matches while the converse is also five.



The respective goal difference for each is plus thirteen (WW) and minus 4 (RCS)

In the previous round Rockdale defeated Manly United 2-1 while the Wolves accounted for Blacktown City by four goals to nil.

Rockdale occupies fourth position with sixteen points while the Wolves remain in the pole position on twenty-one points.

The result sequence in the previous five games is RCS - loss, win, win, win and win, WW - win, draw, win, draw and win.

## PLAYERS TO WATCH

The Wolves' left sided defender/midfield player Guy Knight is a player that impresses and he moves up and back throughout the matches he plays. He positions intuitively for both attacks and defensively and is an exciting player to pay attention to. He sets up his supports when he is in an attacking mode, he reads the play well and is ever vigilant in cutting out crosses and intervening in oppositions passing movements. He has a strong left foot and has gone close to scoring on occasions.

Alec Urosevski is a player who has a penchant for scoring goals and is quite prolific in this regard. He is a quick player with close ball skills and is ever dangerous and in the past he has scored against the Wolves. He will aspire to do this again to assist his team.

## BLAST FROM THE PAST

It was in Round 8 2010, that the teams met at WIN Stadium. The teams were as follows, Wolves - Brody Crane, Alex Mansueto, Greg Valic, Tynan Diaz, Nick McInerney, Lisandro Berbis ©, Tayfun Buyukopru, Andres Gomez, Jason Trifiro, Andrew Paine, Mark Picciolini, Andrew Keep and Ken Chun and Adrian Karakolevski replaced Diaz, Gomez and Paine.

Suns - Ben McNamara, Paul Dee, Mark Bariamis, Robert De Meglio, Stefan Donevski, Sam Awad, Marino Musumeci, Askin Oygur, Steven Bozinovski, Adem Kir and Dominic Hudap. Pece Zaikovski, Baturay Akin and George Lagoudakis subbed on for Donevski, Musumeci and Kir.

Rockdale had much of the running in the early part of first half. Musumeci and Donevski were providing danger to the Wolves' defence and Trifiro

and Gomez endeavoured to spark the ponderous Wolves into action. Thirty-four minutes through, the stalemate was broken. Musumeci moved around Mansueto on the corner of the box. With the outside of his right foot struck the ball to fly past the diving Crane.

Two minutes on, the Wolves restored parity. Diaz burst down the right before whisking a cross in. Picciolini got his head to ball to project it home.

Following half time, the Suns took scant time to go ahead once more. Doneski danced through the defence to try to bring Crane undone. However, Doneski met his match with Crane saving. Lagoudakis then whipped in a cross, which Awad Headed in at the far post for the winning goal. The Wolves missed later when a Mansueto header from a Diaz corner kick, a Chun shot went was fumbled by the 'Keeper and Karakolevski failed to get a touch on the rebound to steer the ball into the goal. Rockdale looked to add to their tally with a scorching Doneski shot that was tipped onto the cross bar by Crane to deny. However, Rockdale deserved the win. Coach Morgan said 'we were flat today. We dwelled on the ball a little too much'. Valic stated -'I've played three games now. And it's a step up from where I came from (IPL). . Two lapses of concentration and we conceded two goals....'

## SELECTED WOLVES PAST PLAYER OF NOTE - MICHAEL ROBINSON

Robinson concluded the 2018 season as the club's 'Player Of The Year' (with this being a well deserved accolade), and achieved over a hundred games for

the club, consisting of ninety-six league games and seven cup roles with one finals appearance, a total of one hundred and four.

Being a club junior, he has played in two stints at the club in a senior capacity from 2012 to 2014 and 2017 to 2018, a total of five seasons. Prior and in between, he played for Sutherland Sharks and Bonnyrigg White Eagles. With the Wolves, he scored three goals, two in 2012 and one in 2014.

He was a complete defender who possessed a long pass with accuracy, one of which set up a goal in the 2018 Round 18 Rockdale City Suns encounter. At times, he has brought the ball out of defence in long raids up field to get his team on the front foot. He read the play well and was composed under pressure in most situations, he was perceptive in his interventions and his aerial ability was paramount in thwarting attacks in the box.

Robinson's initial game was in Round 1 Bonnyrigg White Eagles game in 2012 at Crehan Park, Cringila with his final game coming in the 2018 Round 22 win over Marconi at Marconi Stadium, Bossley Park Post match after playing against his former team the White Eagles in a 3-2 close defeat, Robinson stated

'Very disappointing result, especially with a bit of a lapse in concentration to concede the third goal. We will learn from that... I was pleased with my performance and hope to get better every week like everyone else... I had a good time at Bonnyrigg last year. Our 'keeper Daniel Collison had a great game.'

During his Wolves stints, he was selected in the Mens 1 'Team Of The Week' on no less than nine occasions and bearing in mind that in one year the 'Team Of The Week' did not operate. In 2018, he was selected on two occasions. He has played in big games for the club, a Round of 32 FFA Cup and one Finals appearance in 2012. He has been a standout for the club.

## **SELECTED ROCKDALE PAST PLAYER OF NOTE - STEVEN HESKETH**

Hesketh concluded his tenure as a defender at Rockdale at the end of the 2018 season and at the time he was Vice-Captain of the team. He began his tenure at the club in 2014 and racked up one hundred and fifty appearance for the club with one goal to his credit. He originally came east from West Australia where he played with Stirling Lions before a two-club stint in Indonesia. Hume City in Melbourne

was his next port of call before landing at the Suns. His only goal for the Suns was scored against the Wolves in Round 15 of the 2014 season when he headed in a Taj Minniecon corner kick at the near post a minute shy of the hour. Hesketh came on a replacement in the teams 4-2 loss in the 2018 Round Of 32 FFA Cup fixture after taking an early lead. Hesketh was a solid defender, an uncompromising tackler and possessed a strong clearance and was a staunch clubman.

## **SELECTED REPRESENTATIVE OF BOTH CLUBS - MIKE GRBEVSKI**

Grbevski, a defensive player, turned out for the Suns in the 1992 season and later with the Wolves, making nine appearances in the 1993/94 NSL season. He was a replacement in his first appearance in Round 5 versus Adelaide City with his initial starting appearance being in Round 12 against West Adelaide. His final appearance was as a substitute in Round 26. Following his playing days, he went on to manage the Suns in 2008.

# 'HOLD ON'

## PART 2

The award of a penalty kick puts pressure on the player who is taking the spot kick with the custodians being the ones charged with preventing the conversion, along with the supporters of the custodian's team probably thinking to themselves to save it and 'hold on'. These are some such saves since 1981 that the Wollongong Wolves' custodians have achieved to thwart the attempt on their domain, following on from the companion article 'Hold On' dealing with penalty saves from 2004/05 season and published in 2018.

### DANIEL COLLISON

Four minutes in to this 2012 Round 18 match, defender Nick Littler had cleaned up an attacking raid and won the ball as a consequence. However, another Marconi zipped in to rob Littler with his response ultimately being adjudged by the referee to have inconvenienced in a dangerous fashion. The Marconi captain Nahuel Arrarte stepped up to face the Wolves' custodian, Daniel Collison. Arrarte shot and the ever-alert Collison dived to his right and kept the ball from entering the goal with a top save. Collison stated in a post match interview – 'it was a busy night for me. Marconi had obviously done their homework on the style of game we play. They pressed high on us and forced us to play a different style of game...I believe it was our best win.... It has been a very good year for myself and I'm happy with my form at the moment.' Coach Trevor Morgan stated - 'credit to our 'keeper, we kept a clean sheet.'

In the 2012 Elimination Final where the fourth placed team played the fifth placed one, it was Blacktown City versus the Wolves at Crehan Park, Cringila with an unusual 1.30 kick off. On five minutes, a penalty kick was given to Blacktown. Travis Major moved to the spot after winning the referee's decision. The ball was powerfully hit but Collison dived to stop and grab at his second attempt to deny.

### MIKE HOLLIFIELD

At Brandon Park versus St. George in the 1989 Round 18 clash, the incumbent goalkeeper for the Wolves was Warwick Young and he clashed with a Saints player to prevent him from scoring prior to half time. When play resumed Young sporting a bandage around his knee inconvenienced a striker and this time he was red carded for his effort. However, Hollifield, a left sided defender,

stepped into the breach even though he had not played in this position at any time prior. He gloved up and took his position between the sticks. Scott Ollerenshaw shot from the spot. Hollifield guessed correctly by diving to his right to deny the striker to keep the game scoreless. He made a save in general play in addition to maintain a clean sheet. Despite his heroics in this match, he returned to the outfield for his next outing.

### TONY PEZZANO

It was in Round 17, 1990/91 at Brandon Park that Pezzano kept a clean sheet by preventing the conversion of a spot kick by the Heidelberg United designated penalty taker.

### LES POGLIACOMI

It was in the 1999/00 season Grand Final at Subiaco Oval in Perth when Pogliacomi saved three penalties in the shoot out. The custodian saved the sixth Perth Glory penalty by diving to his left and getting a hand to the ball to guide it around the post. This was his first match saving effort. He saved the subsequent one by diving to his left to keep out the low shot. His third save was the Perth ninth penalty. Pogliacomi threw himself to his right to grab the ball. The shoot out at Subiaco was complete and the Wolves were now champions. Pogliacomi had saved the day.

These shot stoppers, Daniel Collison, Mike Hollifield, Tony Pezzano and Les Pogliacomi had without doubt, been to the fore to save it and 'hold on' in the face of mounting pressure.

# LEFT OF CENTRE

A defender/midfielder of the Wollongong Wolves has played in a position 'left of centre' for a period of ten years with the Wollongong Wolves. His great contribution to the team has been an enormous benefit for the Wollongong Wolves club in all its permutations up until the end of the 2018 season and again in 2019. This player is none other than Chris Price. He has plied his trade in two stints with his second tenure being from 2013 to 2019, after his first playing in the 2004/05 season before being followed by a great many more games in the 2006, 2007 and 2008 seasons. So far he has amassed over one hundred league games for the club, being in a select number who have achieved this accolade.

His attributes include being strong in the tackle and gets in front of shots, anticipates in preventing the opposition from shooting and has technically sound footwork, shielding the ball well with his body. He wins headers and in doing so he defends aerial passes, crosses and set pieces with aplomb, he defuses attacks with timely interventions. His passing ability is incisive and possesses a strong clearing kick when required. He attacks with fervour and has a strong shot especially with his left foot and has converted many opportunities that were presented to him. He is very mobile player.

Price has achieved two championships in his career, one with the Wolves in 2008, together with one with the Sutherland Sharks in 2009. He also represented the red and whites in the 2007 Tiger Turf Cup (Waratah Cup) winning team and in the FFA Cup Round of 32 in 2014 and 2016, in addition to playing in the Final Series in the 2015 season and being the team captain for many years. In addition, he was a member of the Sharks winning Waratah Cup side in 2009 and in 2012.

The defender played his junior football with Milton Panthers before making his initial start for the Wolves in the 2004/05 season Round 21 versus Marconi Stallions replacing Peter Gaffney in the fifty-ninth minute. He played two further Cup games, firstly as a replacement in the earlier Paramatta Eagles encounter and again with a start in the Cup Final against St. George.

The 2006 season saw him consolidating his position at the club, making fourteen starts with one appearance from the bench with a further two cup outing. He was on the scorer's list in Round 13, hitting his effort against Marconi Stallions. Price,



on receipt of a Ballamodou Conde pass, projected the ball with his left foot down the middle of the unoccupied Marconi goal as the custodian and a defender converged. He stated - 'I was pleased with my goal and the way the team played.'

In the Cup run of 2007, Price played in all five cup games with two starts and three off the bench. He goaled in the fifty-seventh minute in the Greenisland FC initial Cup game. Teammate Wayne Heath had a penalty kick after Daniel Pisani was bundled over. Heath's effort struck the custodian and rebounded off the cross bar. Price reacted quickly to pounce on the loose ball and slot it home. Earlier, in the match he had provided an assist, with his cross flying in for Chimoabi Nwaogazi to head in. In the league, Price did not play until Round 11 with a total of two starts and four from the bench.

Fourteen starts and four as a substitute on field role with a six goal tally was the order of the achievements in the 2008 league, with one solitary cup appearance. His first goal was versus APIA Leichhardt in Round 3 as a substitute. 'It was good to get some game time and come up with a goal. I am happy about that'. It was scored in the eighty-fifth minute when he directed his header into the goal. He scored again in Rounds 12, 15 and 20 against Penrith-Nepean United, Macarthur Rams, and Blacktown City before achieving a brace in the Round 21 Marconi encounter. He stated following his brace - 'It was good to get the goals. John (coach

Turner) fired up the boys at half time. We were playing the long ball and the tall defence was eating it up. Their early goal in the second half did not help matters.' For his first, he scored with the instep of his unnatural right foot, meeting a headed on pass from the original Tynan Diaz cross. Eight minutes later, he projected a Diaz cross in with his header striking pay dirt. The Grand Final was the culmination of the Wolves successful season and was played at Penrith's CUA Stadium. On the hour mark, Mitchell Long was impeded and a penalty kick ensued. Price stepped up to take responsibility and his sterling effort zoomed high into the net for his team's third goal.

From 2009 to 2012 Price was at the Sutherland Sharks and at this club, he scored a total of sixteen league goals with his highest haul of five being achieved in 2011. In the 2012 Waratah Cup final versus APIA Leichhardt played at Cromer Park, Dee Why, Price scored his team's first goal in the seventh minute repeating his effort of scoring in a final from 2008. Blake Powell had burst into space on the left side after eluding his attendant marker before cutting a pass to Price, which subsequently ran onto the ball to ultimately guide it intuitively past the custodian. In the Major Semi-final of 2009 versus Sydney United, Price scored Sutherland's third and winning goal to see off the opposition threat in the ninety-third minute for his side to progress to the Grand Final.

In 2013 Price played only three games for the Wolves in his return and was injured in the Round 3 clash with Sydney United 58, sustaining a season defining injury, a major disappointment for the player. He did not re-appear until the next season but assisted the team with his support and mentoring.

It was a successful cup run in 2014 with Price playing in the semi-final in his second match, scoring a goal in the process, a consolation goal in the five-goal result. In the sixty-second minute, he headed home. Correspondingly in the league, he made fifteen starts and with four substitutes entries. In Round 21 versus Marconi Stallions he achieved a hat trick of goals, scoring in the seventy-third, eighty-third and eighty-ninth minutes. His coach, Nahuel Arrarte commented post match, - 'He had a lot of confidence coming into the game. He has trained really well, showed a lot of character.' For his initial effort, Price received an enterprising Matthew



Bailey pass, and following his collection of the ball he moved beyond to elude the advancing custodian to then propel the ball into the unoccupied goal. A square Peter Simonoski ball found the rampaging left midfield positioned Price and he had a relative easy task into converting. Price brought up his treble when he received a pass from Jordan Murray who had previously shot, only for the goalkeeper to inadvertently return the ball. Murray then spied the unmarked Price who had ghosted in. With a steely presence of mind, Price slotted the ball home. In a post match interview he stated - 'It is always nice (to score) and it doesn't happen very often. Like I said last week, it is good to get game time and I could have scored five I reckon! I will take a lot of confidence out of the game.'

In 2015, following a second season loss in Round 2 to Blacktown City, he stated following proceedings, 'Unfortunately it's a loss two weeks in a row. It is very difficult playing the champion side of last season. The performance today was much better than last week. The boys put in an effort though lapses of concentration cost us. It was not through lack of trying though, the boys are working real hard. We got one straight back after their one after half time, we will try to re-group. Unfortunately, we haven't started the way we wanted. It is important that we get points on the board.' Twenty league appearances comprised his tally with four cup games and a finals outing. A cup goal was scored in the 10-1 result versus Yagoona Lions FC. on the 29th April.

The following year Price scored the quickest goal (and his only one) of the season for his club. It eventuated in the first sixty seconds of the 2016 Round 1 match with the opposition being Hakoah Sydney City East. A Kota Kawase long ball looked to find Nicolas Bernal. However, Bernal could not

reach it and Hakoah had some trouble in clearing the ball effectively. It somehow reached Price who was about thirty-five metres out from goal. He hit the ball with aplomb and power with his left foot. His effort flew into the goal like an Exocet missile, lodging into the top left hand corner of the goal. - 'I did not know it would go in. I found myself in a position and decided to have a crack and strike it on target. It worked out in the end. I'll take it...we showed a lot of character, we faced a lot of adversity. We went behind but the boys stuck in there. There were a couple of great things from some of the boys. There wasn't the consistency that we would have liked and we have a few errors to work on. It was the first game, at home before a good crowd and three points, we will take that.' Coach Jacob Timpano stated - 'we got off to a flyer with Pricey's goal.' Price was named in the 'Team Of The Week' from his exploits in this game. At home to Blacktown Spartans in Round 4, Price ventured purposefully in the penalty area to subsequently produced a thunderbolt of a shot that banged into the custodian during the first half. In Round 8 a Nicolas Bernal goal was scored from a Price cross. Twenty-one league appearances and one from the bench together with an FFA Cup Round Of 32 match was Price's tally in 2016. Against Sydney FC, Price used his head to cut out a Rhyan Grant cross and had a chance at the other end with another header, but could not get

the desired outcome.

Twenty league matches with one goal were his statistics for 2017. A strike on fifty minutes in the Round 12 Parramatta Eagles game from a low diving header from a Yuzo Tashiro cross was Price's scoring achievement. After a share of the spoils with Manly United in Round 3, Price stated - 'I think we started fairly well and we got the lead but it is disappointing in the end to concede. This was our first game at home and that is always nice with a great crowd. We were a bit flat having not trained that much in the last three weeks due to the rain. It was a tight contest and pretty even game.' At Ilinden Park Rockdale for the penultimate round Price displayed his keen intercept style by heading away the vastly experienced Rockdale captain Paul Reid's angled ball into the area. In the final encounter of the season the Wolves saved the best for last with Sydney FC handing that team a six goal mauling. Price overlapped many times to assist the attacks and had header on target earlier in proceedings that unfortunately did not eventuate on the scoresheet.

In 2018, Price played nineteen league matches with one cup appearance. In the Round 2 match played against Rockdale City Suns in unseasonal heat wave conditions with the temperature gauge nudging the high thirties, Price assisted his team with incisive overlapping and sterling defence. - 'Conditions

were hot but we completed the match well to win.' After a loss to his former club at Seymour Shaw Park, Miranda, and he stated - 'they wanted it more than us tonight. We didn't start well. It was totally the opposite of what we really try to do. We were not winning the fifty/fifty balls and every second ball they won. It was a credit to them that they put themselves around... It was a quality goal from them from a set piece. We have to put this behind us and regroup.' Against Manly United his shot in the last ten minutes looked to be on song only for the fingertips of the custodian denied his great opportunity. In the Marconi Stallions Round 11 match, he displayed his attacking prowess with his header smacking against the Stallions' crossbar. Coach Jacob Timpano commented - 'Our back three, Robbo, Darcy and Pricey defended outstandingly.' With a defeat by the ultimate Premiers Sydney Olympic, the left defender commented - 'they were very clinical and that's the difference between them and us and today wasn't our best performance by far. Last week we dominated and didn't take our chances but we should have won the game. Today was not a strong game from us. It is tight competition and you have to turn up. They deserved it, they took their chances.'

## At Ilinden Park, Rockdale

For the 2019 campaign Price has played in one FFA Cup match, the Round 4 clash with Dunbar Rovers and has been an unused substitute in the league matches up until Round 7. He made his initial start

against Hakoah Sydney City East at Hensley Athletic Field and in this match he was to the fore with his long throw ins, making precision passes as he moved up field and out of defence and attacked down the left sideline with relish. Under pressure near his goal line with an attacker on his back sniping, Price kept the ball in play with close skill and ultimately managed with speed to get around the marker and get his pass up field. He certainly was an asset on this day.

Chris Price has amassed precisely one hundred and sixty four appearances for the Wolves in all competitions (up until Round 7 2019). The one hundred and forty-three tally of league games has moved Price up the ladder to tenth position on the Wolves All Time Highest League Games Total.

This 'left of centre' player has made a huge contribution to the Wolves and has been a leading player for many years. He has been the captain for some years and led the team with dignity. Playing highlights must include his first game, scoring in a Grand Final and representing in Cup finals and in addition playing in the FFA Cup Round Of 32.

# EXIT STAGE RIGHT

At various stages of Cup campaigns the club has made an 'exit stage right' from the competition with these exits from the previous five seasons and two from the early years being the ones in question.

In 2018, the team accounted for Kellyville Kolts in the Round 5 and in Round 6 GHFA Spirit was the opposition in the game played at J. J. Kelly Park, Coniston. The team was Luke Kairies, Taylor McDonald, Darcy Madden, James Baldacchino, Brendan Griffin, Peter Simonoski (Capt.), Joshua Macdonald, Coaimhim Fowler, Ryan Ensor, Steve Hayes, and Yuzo Tashiro. Ethan Kambisios, Takuya Nozawa and Tory Musumeci replaced Griffin, Fowler and Hayes. As the Wolves moved forward in an effort to impose their experience on the lesser division team, the Spirit players were rushing to the ball players in an attempt to put them off and closed them down, with this tactic working to a great extent. The Wolves were making some early inroads and the break through came in the seventh minute. In the minutes prior, Peter Simonoski who was captain for this match, tried a shot but the custodian caught it, and a Ryan Ensor long ball came into the box with the defence coping. However, Quivi Fowler, in possession of the ball to the left of centre, took a touch and let fly with a left footed shot from outside the penalty area that zoomed into the goal and gave the goalkeeper no chance in stopping it.

Hayes intercepted an attack with a header later in proceedings, and a head clash occurred holding up the action for some time. Both players resumed their stations. Hayes mopped up on halfway and sent a back pass to Kairies. Simonoski went down the middle in an enterprising run but his subsequent effort was not on target.

The Spirit players were defending stoutly and were keeping their defensive shape. Twenty minutes later after Fowler strike, a penalty kick was awarded after the referee saw an infringement as many players were in the box. Jacob Harris converted to restore parity. On the half hour mark, Spirit forged ahead. In a crowded area Ahmed Sweedan managed to get the ball over the line.

Three minutes later, the Wolves tried to get it back to even Stevens. However, Fowler had to contend with a bouncing ball and he could not get enough power on it to project the ball into the goal. Emilio Monos produced a shot, which swung wide of the post, and the custodian took a high ball sent in by Taylor



McDonald. Scant time later, Spirit received their second penalty kick following another seemingly indiscretion. Harris took to spot in order to bring up his brace if he could convert again. Kairies was having none of this though. As Harris shot, Kairies picked the direction and fully stretched, kept it out with a tremendous save.

The Wolves went oh so close when substitute Takuya Nozawa produced a goal bound effort that beat the custodian but could not beat the crossbar and later a Tashiro header flashed by the goal frame. Ensor showed persistence in tracking an attacker and ultimately winning out the battle for the ball before Madden anticipated stopping Young on his forward stride out.

With five minutes of the match remaining Nozawa launched his effort straight at the 'keeper in an attempt to force the game into extra time. Spirit looked to add another when Ireland broke through and as was to pull the trigger a tackle came in. The ball deflected over to save the Wolves blushes. Frustrations were running high with the Wolves, a high yellow card count showing this. The Wolves were not at their best in this game and Spirit served it up to complete the job, a giant killing act. Coach Jacob Timpano stated - 'it was not good enough. The boys had enough opportunities to win the game and the guys out there were good enough to do this. It was cup football and some players have made my

He hit it, with Pasfield diving the correct way to keep his domain safe. At half time it was all even with nil scores. However it was in the second half that the A-League team forged ahead with the initial strike in the sixty-seventh minute. Four minutes later, the score was doubled. The Wolves went closest when Joshua Macdonald let fly with his effort that managed to strike the far post. However, Sydney hit their straps and added a third goal in the 90+1 minute to emerged the winners, with the Wolves exiting the competition at this high stage.

The team was Justin Pasfield, Hayden Morton, James Baldacchino, Chris Price, Brendan Griffin, Joshua Macdonald, Patrick Antelmi, David Stojic, Hristijan Tanoski and Brett Wilson. Stave Hayes, Ben Tosi and Stephan Dimoski replaced Baldacchino, Tanoski and Tosi. The Wolves conceded a goal fourteen minutes in and despite chances from both sides only one separated the two sides at the half time break. Sutherland went further ahead in the fifty-third and sixth-fifth minute with a brace to their striker with nary in reply for the Wolves who were comprehensively outplayed and bundled out of the cup at this first attempt.

The 2016 team had a successful cup run with a 2-0 over Lindfield, 2-0 over Kemblawarra, 2-1 over Bulli, before a 1-0 win with Wagga Wagga to qualify for the FFA Cup Round of 32 versus A-League team, Sydney FC. Justin Pasfield, Chris Price, Kota Kawase,

Four games were played in the 2015 cup run with a 3-2 a.e.t win against Mt Druitt Rangers, a 3-1 over Spirit FC, a 10 -1 result with Yagoona before playing fellow Mens 1 team in Sydney Olympic. This Round 7 match, which qualified the winner with the Round Of 32 appearance was played at Lambert Park and Sydney Olympic went as winners with a comprehensive 3-0 victory.

The Wolves in 2014 began their cup commitments with a 6-0 victory over Hurstville Zagreb, a 1-1 and four penalties to three over Sutherland Sharks to qualify for the FFA Cup Round Of 32 fixture against the A-League club Central Coast Mariners. The Wolves team was Daniel Collison, Jack Keating, Michael Robinson, James Baldacchino, Darcy Madden, Zac Mackenzie, Matthew Bailey (Capt.), Chris Price, Peter Simonoski, Joseph Lavalle and Sam Matthews. Ben Zucco, Mitchell Del Turco and Jordan Murray replaced Bailey, Price and Lavalle respectively. At WIN Stadium the Wolves went close following a Bailey corner kick, the ball was shouldered on by Madden only for Baldacchino to pop the ball over. The Mariners goaled in the thirteenth minute and nearly doubled

their advantage only for Robinson to clear off the line. The custodian thwarted a Price shot on target. Following a pass from Murray, a lunging Nick Montgomery kept out Matthews's shot. There was no increase in the scoring with the Mariners ending the Wolves cup run at this stage of the competition.

With a win on penalties 5-3 over Manly United, Bonnyrigg White Eagles was the next team in line in the 2013 Waratah Cup. The Team personnel were Daniel Collison, Michael Robinson, Chris Nathaniel, Joseph Lavalley, Peter Simonoski, Ricky Zucco, Sam Chapple, Mitchell Del Turco, Sam Matthews, Zac Mackenzie, and Steve Hayes. Dusan Kolonja, Jams Baldacchino and Lee Gilroy subbed on for Simonoski, Zucco and Hayes. Played in heavy rain at Terrey Reserve, Albion Park the conditions were greasy but the game never the less was played at a quick pace. With much back and forth movement the first remained scoreless. Matthews had the home team's first attempt and Zucco followed suit but no joy was to be had. The game breaker eventuated in the seventy-second minute when a White Eagle corner kick finally reached the striker and in a crowded area he goaled to see off the Wolves in Round 5.

In 1984 the team went out at the first hurdle in the NSL Cup, with the opposition being Newcastle Rosebuds. The match was played at Marconi Stadium and Peter Kotamanidis scored immediately prior to the half time break by producing a powerful shot from thirty metres out that zoomed into the goal. However, Newcastle reigned supreme with two goals for their deeds to continue on their cup journey. The Wolves were Ron Tilsed, David Green, Phil Kerr, Steve Ristevski, Ray Vlietstra, Peter Willis, Peter Beggs, Alex Bundalo, Glen Fontana, Kotamanidis and Scott Dickson. G. Dickson and Tony Corridini replaced Beggs and Bundalo.

Also in 1984, the team bowed out of the Ampol Cup in the quarter final losing 2-1 to APIA Leichhardt. Glen Fontana hit the Wolves' goal with a twenty metre lob in extra time. The Wolves' centre back pairing was Ray Vlietstra and Zivko Hristovski.

Marconi was the team that played the Wolves out of the 1983 Ampol Cup with the team being Jim Preston, Peter Willis, Ray Vlietstra, John Fleming, Steve Pollard, Larry Gaffney, Alan Waldron, Phil Kerr, Roy Cotton, Jock Morlando and Glen Fontana. Marconi went into the lead ten minutes in but



the Wolves shot was cleared off the line with the custodian beaten. The Wolves equalized after Fontana had delivered a pass to Kerr who made a thirty metre run to crash in his effort. The Stallions went ahead for the second time in proceedings on seventy minutes to bundle the Wolves out of the Cup.

It was in the 1995/96 season in the second leg that the Wolves exited the Johnny Walker Cup. Taking a 3-2 score line into the match the Wolves had the advantage playing on home soil but the opponents Sydney Olympic managed a 3-0 victory to knock the Wolves out with a 5-3 aggregate score line. The team line-up was Brett Hughes, Martin Bourke, Michael O'Shea, Lupcho Naumovski, Ian Pollari, George Jolevski, Matthew Dihm, Robbie Middleby, Tony Perenich, Mario Jermen and Matthew Horsley. Angelo Petratos, Colin Luff and Paul Beltrame replaced Naumovski, Dihm and Jermen. Middleby and Perinich had chances and Beltrame tested the custodian with twenty-five minute drive. Olympic scored three minutes after the half an hour mark initially and scored again seven minutes later. Eight minutes from the final whistle they hit their third. Nick Theodorakopoulos was the coach.

Cup games are interesting affairs and results do not always go to plan and an 'exit stage right' has eventuated in these games and will do so again in the future.
