MATCH PREVIEW

The grand final hopes of Blacktown City and Sydney United 58 go on the line this Wednesday as the two sides fight for finals survival in the minor semi-final at Lily Homes Stadium.

Blacktown City and Sydney United 58 have plenty of recent history with the two sides facing off in some massive fixtures over the past five seasons.

This year Blacktown City's third place finish was one spot higher than Sydney United, but head-to-head it has been the Miro Vlastelica United 58 who have had the advantage.

The two sides have faced each other three times this campaign with United 58 winning two.

However, The last meeting was a 4-2 win for Blacktown City at Sydney United Sports Centre in June.

Blacktown City went down to APIA Leichhardt Tigers 5-3 on penalties during Saturday night's preliminary semi-final after the match ended 1-1 at the end of extra-time.

City performed well in the match which made the defeat sting that little bit more – a lack of firepower has been the issue for Blacktown but they are hoping that good fortune will smile on them at home.

The short turnaround may force a few changes from Mark Crittenden but one thing which should stay the same is the defence.

Grant Lynch was a stand out performer from Crittenden's side and will once again be a big part, while inspirational captain Matt Lewis's experience and speed will also be a big part of the game plan.

Joey Gibbs may have missed a penalty in the shootout against APIA, but it was his poacher's finish in the dying seconds of the game which got them to penalties in the first place.

His goal scoring will be vital.

He will be coming up against a Sydney United 58 defence featuring a player he knows all to well in Yianni Fragogiannis from the defenders time at

Lilv Homes Stadium.

Now he will partner Tomislav Uskok at the heart of the United 58 back line which kept a high powered Marconi attack scoreless in Saturday's 2-0 elimination final win.

Another former Blacktown player who could comeback to haunt the City faithful is Patrick Antelmi.

The striker came off the bench to score the winning goals in extra-time last week and has a knack for big goals in big games.

Tarik Maia should retain his place in the starting line-up with Glen Trifiro unlikely to return for the season after sustaining an injury in the final game of the regular season.

With so much riding on this match both sides will leave nothing in the tank to avoid finals elimination.

Blacktown City will be the favourites but only in account of the fact they are the home side.

Both teams have an innate ability to find the back of the net in the dying seconds so expect this thrilling contest to go right down to the wire.
