MATCH PREVIEW







It is first versus second in this Major Semi Final at WIN Stadium when the Premiers Wollongong Wolves take on APIA Leichhardt Tigers tonight at WIN Stadium, Wollongong. The team from Lambert Park qualified for this match defeating by Blacktown 5-3 on penalties after it was 0-0 at full time and 1-1 after extra time on Saturday 17th August at their home venue, Lambert Park.

THE OPPOSITION TONIGHT - APIA LEICHHARDT

APIA Leichhardt has won thirty various honours since the first in 1959, being NSW State League Runners Up with the latest being the annexing of the Waratah Cup. The Tigers in addition made the Grand Final last year and went down to Sydney Olympic to the tune of 4-1 with Themba Muata-Marlow scoring their only goal.

THE MATCH UP

As the winner of this game will be qualifying for the Grand Final, the defeated team will however get another chance. As the Wolves have experienced being defeated in this game in 2008, they will not want to go down the similar route. Last season, APIA finished second and won their first Finals match on penalties before moving on with two more qualifying wins. This game is then ever so important for both teams.

In 2019, APIA and the Wolves met twice with the Wolves being victorious on both of these occasions, winning 3-0 and 4-0, with Thomas James with five goals, and Takeru Okada and Lachlan Scott with one each. However, in these finals matches the team that can conquer its nerves will be victorious. So far in their history, these is the first meeting in a Final series match.

The total amount of goals scored by the two teams in this season's Mens 1 competition was ninety-four with the Wolves achieving fifty-two and APIA with ten fewer. Nil scores amounted to three for the Tigers and two for the Wolves. Ten players goaled for APIA with eight getting on the score sheet for the Wolves. The best sequence without loss was five for APIA, Rounds 3-7, win, win, win, draw, draw and

nine for Wollongong Rounds 1-9, win, win, draw, win, win, draw, win, draw and win.

Thomas James and Chris Payne were the last players to have scored for their clubs, James in Round 22 and Payne in the Semi Final in extra time. One player for APIA who has scored in a finals match is none other than Tynan Diaz, a player who scored for the Wolves in the 2008 Grand Final. He will be doing his best for his new team.

The Wolves sharpened their players with a hit out against Sydney FC a week ago with impressive striker Lachlan Scott being out with injury. He may be right for tonight's encounter but this was not determined at the time of writing. APIA were close to full in strength in the Preliminary Semi-Final while some players like Josh Symons succumbed to injury and it will to be determined if he can recover in time for tonight's fixture.

MATCH-UP PLAYERS

Goal scorers - Thomas James and Chris Payne

James is the top scorer of the League with twenty-two goals and Payne pushed all the way on the run home and was only one goal in arrears at the conclusion. Both these strikers scored along the Mens 1 journey a hat trick each, with James scoring three goals versus APIA in Round 2 and Payne doing likewise in Round 4 against Sydney United 58. Both strikers in addition tallied four braces each. James initially scored on his debut in Round 1 while Payne's first goal emanated from the penalty spot in Round 3 with both again scoring in Round 22. This Semi Final could see both strikers trading shots once again.

Custodians - Justin Pasfield and Ivan Necevski

Necevski and Pasfield achieved seven and eleven clean sheets respectively and the number of goals conceded by each was seventeen and twenty-eight, (not that each played could prevent all of these), with these tallies being the third lowest and lowest numbers in the competition. Each custodian has had A-League experience with the bulk of games being played at clubs Sydney FC and Central Coast Mariners in that order, even though both players were at other clubs as well. Both are experienced shot stoppers and will play a big part in this encounter for their teams. If a penalty shoot out ensues, both players have experienced in saving spot kicks. For example, Necevski last year saved a

penalty in a shootout to help his team qualify for the 2018 Grand Final and did so again in last Saturday Semi Final. Pasfield in turn, saved a penalty from Milos Ninkovic in the 2016 Round Of 32 FFA Cup clash with Sydney FC.

Midfielders - Franco Parisi and Takeru Okada

An experienced campaigner in Parisi and a new to the competition Okada have assisted their respective teams greatly in the midfield. Both have good close skill with Okada probably quicker than his counterpart. Both players scored goals with Parisi attaining four to Okada's six.

Central Defenders - Nick Littler and Themba Muata Marlow

Littler is an experienced defender having played in finals matches previously. Muata-Marlow has also had this experience in last season's Grand Final. He makes forays up field at times and he gets things going for his team as well as keeping things tidy in defence. Littler has good vision and positions to advantage and his timely interceptions are vital for his team. He also can crop up to score and has three goals to his credit in 2019.

Wingbacks - Taylor McDonald and Tynan Diaz

These overlapping fullbacks have been in instrumental in the rounds of the competition for their respective teams. Diaz has previous Finals experience being in winning Grand Final teams, Wollongong Wolves and Bonnyrigg White Eagles, while McDonald has yet to have this familiarity. However, McDonald's speed, resilience, skill and enthusiasm will stand him in good stead and he

two goals to his credit. Diaz's positional sense is paramount and his long and short passing is effective for his team together with directive crossing. His penalty conversion in the semi-Final shootout qualified his team for this contest with the Wolves.

TWO SELECTED REPRESENTATIVES OF BOTH TEAMS - ZIVKO HRISTOVSKI and MATTHEW DIHM.

Defender Dihm played for APIA in the 1991/92 NSL season making fifteen appearances with eleven starts. He was with the Wolves in the 1994/95 and 1994/95 NSL seasons making a total of thirty-two appearances.

Midfielder Hristovski played one season with APIA in between his stints at the Wolves from 1982, '83 (no matches played), '84 and '85. He made his debut in 1984 in Round 2. He turned out with APIA in 1986, playing eighteen times and scoring one goal, which was in Round 1 versus Inter Monaro. He was back at the Wolves for 1987, 1989/90 and 1990/91 NSL campaigns. He achieved eight goals for the Wolves and was a member of the 1987 Premiership and Championship winning team. One of his goals came against Blacktown City in 1989/90 Round 18. Following the impedance of Paul McFadden after he dated into the penalty area a penalty kick was given. Hristovski blasted the spot kick into the goal for the first score of the match, occurring five minutes before the half time break.


GOAL 67 - THOMAS JAMES – Round 22 v Marconi Stallions at WIN Stadium

THE FINAL COUNTDOWN

How have the Wollongong Wolves fared in matches at the conclusion of the competition rounds in the 'final countdown' of the NSW Premier League finals series? The following instances are when these finals matches were played with the personnel in the team and the game itself in summary. Five players in the current 2019 team were involved in previous finals matches. They are Justin Pasfield, Chris Price, Nick Littler, Brendan Griffin and Darcy Madden.

1987

Like the 2019 team, the 1987 team won the Premiership. Two matches were played in the finals series. The coach was John Fleming, a former player at the club.

Game 1 - Semi Final v Canberra Griffins at Judy Masters Oval, Balgownie. 12th September at 7.00 p.m.

Team - Warwick Young, David Skeen, Jock Morlando, Scott Dickson, Mike Hollifield, Bryan Cokely, Robert Giraldi, Jeff Ainsworth Capt.), Pat Brodnik, Randall Easthorpe and Rade Stefanovski.

This game had only one goal in it with the league's top scorer, Canberra's Alan Reis, unable to score. However, it was Giraldi who posted the winner to propel his team into the Grand Final. Hollifield cleared the ball out of defence with an opposition player gaining possession. He in turn provided a back pass to his goalkeeper. However, not enough force was applied and the ball fell short of its intended recipient. Giraldi spotted this and moved in quickly. He gained control of the ball, eluded the custodian and pushed it into the unattended goal. Progression to the next stage was achieved.

Game 2 - Grand Final v Canberra Griffins at Parramatta Stadium. 27th September at 3.00 p.m.

Team - Warwick Young, Peter Kotamanidis, Cane Despotovski, Nova Bundalo, Mike Hollifield, Randall Easthorpe, Bryan Cokely, Jeff Ainsworth (Capt.) Rade Stefanovski, Pat Brodnik and Robert Giraldi.

The first goal came a minute into the match. Stefanovski was inconvenienced. His subsequent free kick was crossed in and Giraldi rose and met the ball, propelling his header into the goal. Canberra put the Wolves' defence under pressure with makeshift defenders Bundalo and Easthorpe playing at the back. The lead was held until the

thirty-fifth minute before Canberra restored parity. Following the half time break, Ainsworth sent a clearing header to where Brodnik was positioned further up field. Twenty-five metres out from goal, he let fly. The ball zoomed in beating the custodian. Chances abounded from then on but 2-1 score line did not change. The Wolves had won the double Premiership and Championship.

2008

Game 1 - Preliminary Final v Sydney Olympic at WIN Stadium, Wollongong. Friday 15th August. 7.30 p.m.

The coach in this season was John Turner and the team finished in second place in the standings on goal difference alone.

Team - Justin Pasfield, (Ben Blake Capt.), Alfredo Estevez, Chris Price, Tynan Diaz, Matthew Bailey, Steve Hayes, Michael Hawrysiuk, Ballamodou Conde, Ilija Prenzoski, and Mitchell Long. Samet Kaynak replaced Conde.

The home team went ahead after thirteen minutes. Prenzoski ran onto a Conde through pass and the striker determinedly ran towards the goal from the right side before ramming home his shot. This advantage was kept for the rest of the half. It was in the seventy-first minute that Olympic pulled back with a looping header that eluded the flying Pasfield. Two minutes later Olympic went ahead when a striker got onto a Wolves' clearance and struck with a powerful shot. However, this lead only lasted for eight minutes. Bailey rose to head a Hawrysiuk floated pass into the goal on ninety minutes giving Olympic any time to salvage the game. The Wolves progressed. Hawrysiuk -'it was a top game.' Bailey -I think it (his goal) was perfect timing.' Prenzoski we sort of dropped our heads after they went up 2-1. We pulled it back and got the winner.'

Game 2 - Major Semi Final v Sutherland Sharks at Seymour Shaw Park, Miranda. Sunday 24th August at 3.00 p.m.

Team - Michael Turnbull, Ben Blake (Capt.), Danial Cummins, Alfredo Estevez, Chris Price, Tynan Diaz, Matthew Bailey, Steve Hayes, Michael Hawrysiuk, Ilija Prenzoski, and Mitchell Long. Ballamodou Conde and Samet Kaynak replaced Estevez and Price.

Sutherland went to the lead in the tenth minute. Turnbull pulled off a point blank save in the second half and a minute later, Bailey brought it back to even Stevens. Despite further chances at the end of ninety minutes it remained all square. Now it was extra time. The game breaker emanated in the one hundred and fifteenth minute. Substitute Kaynak progressed inward from the right side, eluding defenders on the way. Turner—we had plans to wear them down but we did plan to go a goal down.' Turnbull - 'We did enough to deserve the win.' Prenzoski-'Once again I was at the right place at the right time.'

Game 3 - Grand Final v Sutherland Sharks at CUA Stadium, Penrith. 7th September at 3.00 p.m. Crowd 4.365.

Team-Justin Pasfield, Ben Blake (Capt.), Ballamodou Conde, Chris Price, Tynan Diaz, Matthew Bailey, Steve Hayes, Michael Hawrysiuk, Ilija Prenzoski, and Mitchell Long. Alfredo Estevez and Samet Kaynak replaced Conde and Long.

Sutherland again went to an early lead, this time in the eighth minute. Pasfield had saved a Shark's shot but unfortunately could not hold. Another player got on the end of the loose ball and made it count. Twenty minutes later a long Hawrysiuk throw was headed on with Price and Conde involved before Bailey headed home. Ten minutes on Diaz scored his first goal of the season and what a match to deliver. Diaz propelled his curving free kick from outside the box into the top corner of the goal. At half the Wolves led 2-1.

Fifteen minutes into the second half, the Wolves struck again. Long was impeded in the box and a penalty kick was given. Price struck the ensuing spot kick with his left foot. His powerfully hit shot flew high into the net, beating the custodian. In time added on Sutherland pulled one back and a minute later Kaynak. The ball was cleared by the Wolves' defence and Prenzoski headed on. Kaynak gained possession and set sail for the goal. The custodian advanced off his line. Kavnak feigned then rounded him before with composure, slotting the ball into the empty goal. The Wolves had won the Championship. Hayes was the 'Player Of The Match'. Turner -'We felt hard done after losing the league title. We did not want to come from behind again.' Kaynak - 'I was a little nervous taking on the goalkeeper.' Diaz - 'I couldn't have scored a better

2012

In this year, the team concluded the season in fourth position and Richard Lloyd was a stand-in for the absent Trevor Morgan in the coaching role.

Game 1 - Elimination Semi-Final v Blacktown City at Crehan Park, Cringila. Saturday 8th September at 1.30 p.m.

Team - Daniel Collison, Jack Keating, Jacob Timpano, (Capt.) Michael Robinson, Samuel Jacob, Nick Littler, Chris Nathaniel, John Martinoski, Sasho Petrovski, Peter Simonoski, and Ricky Zucco. Mark Picciolini and Fabien lacovelli replaced Timpano and Martinoski respectively.

Blacktown went out to a two-goal lead in the first half in hot blustery conditions and held sway at half time. During the first half a drinks break happened on twenty-nine minutes Robinson and Timpano had a mountain of work to do as Blacktown kept up sustained pressure. Shots from Zucco, Littler and Simonoski failed to bring up the desired outcome. Collison repelled some offensive maneouvres. Three minutes following the resumption of play, Zucco scored in the forty-eight minute. Zucco gained a loose ball and his left footed shot from ten metres torpedoed into the goal to the right of goalkeeper, Brody Crane, a former Wolves' captain. Blacktown was the team that progressed. Lloyd -'I was disappointed with the result but we gave it a good crack today.' Timpano -'it was just a battle and Blacktown came out on top. Playing at 1.30 was a bit of a curve ball.' Crane - 'the Wolves have been a good side all year.'

2015

It was a fifth place finish in the competition for qualification and Jacob Timpano was the coach.

Game 1 - Elimination Semi-Final v Sydney Olympic at Lambert Park, Leichhardt. Sunday 23rd August at 2.30 p.m.

Tom Manos, Chris Price (Capt.), Brendan Griffin, James Baldacchino, Peter Simonoski, Jordan Murray, Sam Matthews, Darcy Madden, Ben Zucco, Zac Mackenzie, James O'Rourke. Brett Wilson and Joseph Lavalle replaced Griffin and Zucco respectively.

Two goals in each half brought the Wolves undone. Desperate defending from Madden and O'Rourke kept the score from increasing and Murray and Simonoski were well marshalled by the Olympic backline. Matthews went close to scoring only for his rocket of a shot was cleared off the line in the second half and a Wilson effort was blocked at the last minute. Timpano - 'We couldn't really cope with the quick ball movement. I am proud of the boys.' Manos -'It was frustrating game really. The best thing about it is that Olympic gave us a bit of credit.'

These 'final countdown' matches in 1987, 2008, 2012 and 2015 have been won and lost. Let's hope that the 2019 team can emulate the deeds of the 1987 team that went before.

The top striker of the competition, James scored from the spot in the eighty- first minute for his side's winner in the final round of the competition. However, he played impressively as usual with his flicks and back heels aiding his team in attacks and possession. He never shirks the physical play and is on the end of much of this but he keeps on with the job in a persistent and profitable manner. He was quick on the acceleration and kept the ball under pressure with deft touch. James produced a number of shots in this encounter to signal his danger to the opposition with one shot only kept out a lunging foot of the custodian.

Central defender Djordjevic did a host of defensive work in the heart of the back line versus Marconi as his team wanted to finish the season on a high after annexing the Premiership the week before. He was to the fore in a match where defence played a huge part.
