MATCH PREVIEW

NPL NSW Mens newcomers, North Shore Mariners venture to the Illawarra region for today's Round 2 fixture in the competition against the Wollongong Wolves, with this promising to be a curious contest.

Coach Joe Haywood has added a number of experienced players for the team entry into the first flight. Included are Panni Nikas from Rockdale City Suns, plus Keanu Ismic, Charlie Cox, Emmanuel Peters, Daniel Dias and Charlie Cox.

The North Shore Mariners were formerly known as Northbridge FC and entered the Football NSW State League third tier in 2011 and in 2013 won the Division One Premiership, but ultimately were defeated in the Grand Final, losing to Balmain FC in extra time. The club finished 2019 season on top of the Mens 2 standings in both the league and the club championship thereby sealing promotion to Mens 1.

The team, in the 2019 Mens 2 competition won seventeen matches from twenty-six games played (with a win rate of 0.63) and drew four for their fifty-five points, being two points clear of the runners-up. Five losses were sustained overall. Mitchell Smith was the top scorer and with sixteen others contributed to the goal scoring. The best result was a 6-2 victory over Mounties Wanderers in Round 2 with the least impressive result being a 4-2 loss to the same team in Round 15. The best result sequence was ten, Rounds 5-14, win, win, win, win, draw, draw, win, win, win and draw with the losing sequence being two games. The team had one match when they neglected to score and that was in Round 22 versus Bonnyrigg White Eagles.

In Mens 2 for the last three seasons, North Shore has finished in 5th, 3rd and 1st positions, certainly an upward trajectory. Now in Mens 1, the club will need to maintain and lift the standards and will no doubt be capable of implementing this.

THE MATCH-UP

At this stage of the competition, the top scorers for each team are Emmanuel Peters (NSM) and Lachlan Scott and Bul Juach with one goal apiece. The scorer

of the teams' latest goal was Peters and Juach.

North Shore has nil wins to the Wolves one at this early stage of the competition.

In the previous round North Shore had a 1-1 draw with APIA Leichhardt. Wollongong Wolves defeated Sydney Olympic 2-1.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

Emmanuel Peters (NSM) is a goal scorer who has scored a fair amount and after his effort in the previous week will be eager to repeat the effort.

Lachlan Scott (WW), who also featured on the score sheet in Round 1 does his fair of defending at crucial times by heading away at corner kicks in contrast to his quick and slick attacking moves.

SELECTED TOP SCORER FOR NORTH SHORE - MITCHELL SMITH AND TOM BENTHAM

With eighteen goals to his credit in 2019, Smith was his team's top scorer with a goal per game ratio of 0.69. He also scored in the Elimination Final. Jesse Piriz had played a long pass over the opponents, Mounties Wanderers' defensive line before Smith gained possession. He shielded the ball from two defenders before scoring his nineteenth goal by directing a low shot past the custodian on twenty-eight minutes. Smith, in addition, was the club top scorer in the previous season (2017) with a sixteen goal achievement.

English striker Bentham was the top scorer in 2014 and played two seasons with the club. In 2015, he scored six goals from six appearances.

TWO SELECTED TOP SCORERS FOR WOLVES - THOMAS JAMES and SASHO PETROVSKI

James scored a season high twenty-two goals to become the club and competition top scorer in 2019 with a goal per game ratio of 1.04. He beat Sasho Petrovski's previous record season haul of twenty-one goals. He was a multi scorer in a single match on five occasions with a treble in Round 2, and four braces in Rounds 4, 7, 13 and 15. His initial goal in Round 1 was achieved at Butler Oval. Positioned at the far post he slotted home Takeru Okada's left field cross with a defender in attendance. His final season goal was from the penalty spot. Harry Callahan had taken possession of a Brendan Griffin pass on the edge of the penalty area. He turned and moved

inside only to be impeded by a Marconi defender. James directed the ensuing spot kick with power and precision to the left side of the goal. The striker added four more in the 2019 FFA NPL Finals

Striker Petrovski, the all time Wolves top scorer in all competitions, scored his twenty-one goal tally to top the count and set the record in the 2000/01 NSL season. His goal per game record for this season was 0.75. His multi game strikes numbered five, three hat tricks in Rounds 21, 24 and 30 and two braces in Rounds 16 and 19. His initial strike was against

Parramatta Power in Round 6. He stole in between two defenders to head in Scott Chipperfield's in swinging cross from the left side. His final goal of the season was in Round 30. Petrovski scored the sixth of his teams goals versus Adelaide City after the good lead up play with a well-placed effort with seven minutes of the match remaining. He went on to score three more goals in the successful finals campaign.

BRING IT ON HOME - 2019

Third Instalment

These are the additional circumstances behind the goals scored in the final four games of 2019. The previous sixty-seven goals and their circumstances were published in two of the final match day programs of last season.

GOAL 68 - STEFAN DIMOSKI - NSW PL PRELIMINARY FINAL V SYDNEY UNITED 58 AT WIN STADIUM, WOLLONGONG

A Guy Knight free kick saw the ball traversing out to the right side to where Nikola Djordjevic was positioned, then onto to Nick Littler and Taylor McDonald. McDonald brought the ball under control before lifting the ball into the centre. Dimoski headed the ball under pressure of a defender. The ball went upwards and as it came down, the striker connected with his right foot to propel the ball powerfully into the goal. It emanated two minutes before half time with the Wolves taking the lead. 'We came out strongly in the second half and they had two lucky goals. Yes, It was my second.'

GOAL 69 - LACHLAN SCOTT - FFA NPL ELIMINATION FINAL V CANBERRA OLYMPIC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

In the thirty-sixth minute Scott, on receipt of a Harry Callahan pass, dragged the ball back then turned to achieve pay dirt with the ball flying into the Canberra goal. Nikola Djordjevic, Chris Price, Thomas, James and Guy Knight were all involved in the lead-up.

GOAL 70 - THOMAS JAMES - FFA NPL ELIMINATION FINAL V CANBERRA OLYMPIC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

Chris Price received the ball from Nikola Djordjevic. He moved to Brendan Griffin who returned the ball to Price. The wingback then projected a high ball towards Thomas James positioned on the right. A defender and James vied for the ball with the Canberra player getting the touch. However, the ball fortuitously fell into Lachlan Scott's path. He moved forward but was cut down and a penalty kick ensued. James took the following spot kick and drove it home in the forty-second minute.

GOAL 71 - JAMES STOJCEVSKI - FFA NPL ELIMINATION FINAL V CANBERRA OLYMPIC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

Harry Callahan gained possession and moved it on to Brendan Griffin. He crossed to the far post where



James was waiting in earnest. With one touch, he played the ball to James Stojcevski who had the easiest of conversions. He was in the right place at the right time.

GOAL 72 - NICK LITTLER - FFA NPL ELIMINATION FINAL V CANBERRA OLYMPIC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

A James Stojcevski free kick was swung in. Nick Littler chested the ball down with it subsequently running across the goal face. Lachlan Scott gained control and eluded two players before delivering his pass to Littler. He had no trouble in scoring from close vicinity to put his team further ahead.

GOAL 73 - STEFAN DIMOSKI - FFA NPL ELIMINATION FINALS V CANBERRA OLYMPIC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

Liam Wille produced a shot that unfortunately hit his teammate Stefan Dimoski after both players had vied for the ball. The ball went across the goal with Dimoski chasing it. He gained control before rifling it home in the eighty-eighth minute.

GOAL 74 - THOMAS JAMES - FFA NPL SEMI-FINAL 2 V PERTH SC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

Following on from the good work of Guy Knight, James Stojcevski and Harry Callahan, Thomas James' leg was thrown out to control a looping ball. He moved quickly in between two defenders before shooting when he entered the penalty area. The ball took a deflection off the chasing defender but the custodian came off his line to make a save but he could not hold. However, James followed through and with his second attempt from an acute angle, made no mistake as the ball zoomed into the goal.

GOAL 75 - TAKERU OKADA - FFA NPL SEMI-FINAL 2 V PERTH SC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

Darcy Madden put a high ball through to Thomas James who worked a short pass to Takeru Okada. His left footed effort from a sharp angle flew into the goal. Taylor McDonald and Brendan Griffin aided and abetted in the early stages leading up to this outcome.

GOAL 76 - THOMAS JAMES - FFA NPL GRAND

FINAL V LIONS FC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

Lachlan Scott got his pass away to Harry Callahan and he consequently burst forward. When he was inside the penalty area, a defender impeded the midfielder. Thomas James stepped up for the resultant spot kick and projected the ball high into the goal to restore parity in the fifty-second minute.

GOAL 77 - TAKERU OKADA - FFA NPL GRAND FINAL V LIONS FC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

With ten minutes on the clock in regulation time, Okada scored. The Brisbane custodian had kept out a Lachlan Scott shot but he could not keep it under his grasp. The ball then fell into Okada's path and he proceeded to tuck the ball home.

GOAL 78 - BUL JUACH - NPL FFA GRAND FINAL V LIONS FC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

In extra time, in the one hundred and ninth minute, Bul Juach headed home a Taylor McDonald cross with aplomb. This emanated from a long McDonald throw in earlier, with Nick Littler, Nikola Djordjevic and James Stojcevski also involved in the preliminary play. This was Juach's first goal at this level, other than his cup goals. 'I have been waiting for it for a long time. And finally it came. I don't score with many headers.'

GOAL 79 - THOMAS JAMES NPL GRAND FINAL V LIONS FC AT ALBERT BUTLER MEMORIAL PARK

Thomas James, on one hundred and sixteen minutes, got the better of a defender by riding a tackle before converting his opportunity with consummate skill. 'It was nice to score two today for the team.'

This completes the list of all the goal achievers of 2019 in this historic season for the club. Well done to Thomas James, Stefan Dimoski, Lachlan Scott, James Stojcevski, Nick Littler, Takeru Okada and Bul Juach for these goals, numbers 68 to 79.

At the conclusion of the 2019 season at the NSW Premier Leagues' Gold Dinner Presentation, three Wolves personnel were honoured for their performances and achievements during the season with that also saying a lot about the club and the 2019 success story. As all manner of football people and dignitaries were in attendance on the night, all had their 'eye on the prize' as the winners were announced.

The 'Coach Of The Year' award went to Luke Wilkshire. This was his first season as coach as he transitioned from a player in 2018 to coach in 2019 and what a season it turned out to be. The team stayed on top of the standings from Rounds 1-22, the entire competition rounds, and a great feat in itself. This was a tremendous performance and is a rare achievement. Wilkshire marshalled his troops and got the most and best out of every one of his charges. He had expectations and the players rose to meet these challenges. He was a taskmaster and his players respected him. To be acknowledged in your first season of coaching, is a huge compliment to Luke Wilkshire for his vast football knowledge, man management skills and his measure as a coach with the way he imparts his vision for the team. 'It is always nice to get recognized for your hard work and what we achieved. It is nice. A lot of people can take credit for that, especially my wife. The club support from Tory, Susan and Chris Sheppard and my family, my brother-in-law and the boys have all put in and done what I have asked of them and this is a reflection of this.'

The NSW NPL Mens 1 'Player Of The Year' and 'Top Scorer of the Year' were the two awards that were achieved by Thomas James, all this in his first season at the club and in this higher credentialed competition than he played previously. After the Round 1 victory over Manly United, in my post match interview, James stated after scoring his initial goal - 'This will one for the highlights reel for my grand kids in the future.' Now after scoring twenty-two goals in the league competition and winning these prizes, his highlights reel will certainly now need to be extended. An additional one would also need to be added with his well enacted penalty kick in the NPL Elimination match plus his two goals in the FFA

NPL Final. On his scoring journey, he scored multiple times in a single match with a treble and five braces in the league. As well as scoring this high tally, he set up a number of goal scoring opportunities with many being converted with his acceleration, quick change of direction, flicks and back heels, together with a high competitiveness. Following the NPL Final on 5th October, James stated - 'I did know that I was going to win that award (Player Of The Year. It was a surprise. Personnel accolades are great but it is all about the team.'

The 2019 'Goal Of The Year' recipient was none other than Nikola Djordjevic. The central defender scored his spectacular winning goal in the Round 8 Sutherland Sharks match at Seymour Shaw Park. It was in the thirty-fourth minute when a James Stojcevski short corner kick went to Takeru Okada. He returned the ball before Stojcevski launched it into the middle of the penalty area. With a Sharks defender in close attendance, Djordjevic hurled himself into the air. His right footed scorpion kick connected, sending the ball looping inside near the top corner of the goal.' I was lucky. I saw the ball coming across and I stuck my leg out. The ball hit the outside of my heel to guide it the right way I guess.' Following the NPL Finals match versus Canberra Olympic, he stated about his win. - 'It was surprising. You don't expect it. There were two goals I scored and one wins this. My team, the club and now the competition recognized the goal. It was definitely pleasing.'

These have been huge accolades for Thomas James, Luke Wilkshire and Nikola Djordjevic and by association the Wollongong Wolves, as indeed during 2019 all had their 'eye on the prize' and duly delivered in spades.

A TRIBUTE TO CLAUDIO CELLINI

This is the first opportunity for a match day programme tribute to Claudio Cellini, a skilful player in his Wolves playing days in the early to mid 1990s. The former midfielder passed away after fighting a brain disease for some time on 14th December 2019. He was aged fifty-four.

Cellini played a total of fifty league games in the National Soccer League for the Wolves, consisting of forty-four starts and six replacement on field roles, together with a goal tally of seven goals.

His debut for the club was in the 1990/91 season in the Round 3 home clash with St.George on the Sunday 7th October 1990. It was a victory by one goal at Brandon Park. In the subsequent season, he scored a brace for his first club goals against Brisbane Strikers in Round 7. The first was a powerful drive on forty-second minutes and the second, four minutes later, came from a near post header. In addition, he scored the quickest goal of the season for his club. This emanated in the fifth minute of Round 19 Melbourne Knights fixture in 1991/92 season. The Knights custodian parried a David Skeen's shot from twenty-five metres onto the underside of the cross bar. The ball fortuitously fell to Cellini's feet and he was able to push it home at a saturated ground. The team ultimately made the Final Series at the

conclusion of the league in this season. However, the team was defeated by Adelaide City at the first hurdle.

In addition, he was the Golden Boot winner in season 1991/92 with five goals for his tally and this will be a perpetual memory, as his name will live on in the club's history and football records.

The final goal Cellini scored was in the 1994/95 season in the home match with the adversary being Adelaide City. He scored in the seventy-seventh minute. The custodian parried a Vaughn Coveny shot, and this allowed Cellini to follow up and score. Earlier, he had set up the earlier goal for Coveny to also score.

In all, Cellini played four seasons with the club in two stints of two years duration each with two other seasons in between. He was an energetic, ball playing midfielder, was comfortable and strong on the ball when pressurized, had good vision for playing crisp passes, with skilful ball control to beat defenders.

He is very good in the air, comes off his line with precision, is agile and is a quick thinker and mover and positions to the utmost benefit of his team.

Formerly with the Wolves having played in first grade in 2017 and 2018, the midfielder has returned to the club for the 2020 season. The midfielder played two games as a replacement in the league and the same number in the cup in 2018. 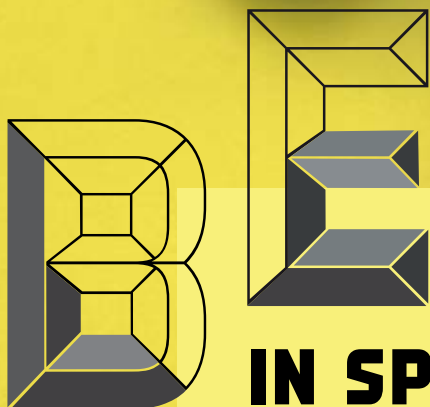

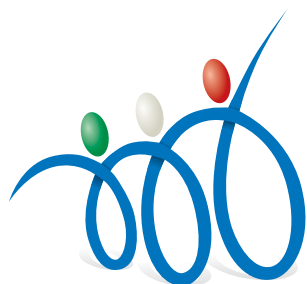
