It is round two of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition with another six blockbuster fixtures set to take to the fields across Sydney.

The weekend's matches kick-off on Friday with APIA Leichhardt hosting Wollongong Wolves as the reigning champions and reigning premiers face off.

Manly United are also in action on Friday night as they look for their first win of the season against Western Sydney Wanderers, while Saturday night will feature Mt Druitt hosting Blacktown City.

Three games will take place on Sunday, Sydney United 58 against North Shore Mariners, Sydney Olympic facing off against Sydney FC and Rockdale hosting Marconi in the final match of the weekend.

APIA Leichhardt FC v Wollongong Wolves FC, 7.30pm Friday at Lambert Park

The reigning Premiers will take on the reigning league champions will do battle on Friday night as APIA Leichhardt FC host Wollongong Wolves at Lambert Park.

APIA will be desperate to return to the winner's circle after suffering defeat at the hands of rivals Marconi last week in the opening fixture of the rebooted NPL NSW Men's season.

If anyone thought teams were set to take this make shift competition lightly, they were wrong – the match against the Stallions saw how much playing the game again means to them.

Wollongong, on the other hand, will be pushing for their second win in as many games after they dispatched Mt Druitt 1-0 last round.

APIA will be without defender Paul Galimi for the clash after he was sent off against the Stallions which will force coach John Calleja into a reshuffle of his backline.

This will more than likely see the introduction of one of the club's standout defenders during the start of the NPL season before COVID-19 hit, Josh

Symons return to the starting eleven.

Attack will be another major concern for Calleja after his side's attack was largely nullified but the club hope to call back Corey Biczio to assist in that department.

Jeremy Cox scored their only goal with a stunning volley deep into injury time and he will be needed to maintain that touch in front of goal if APIA is to take home the three points.

The Luke Wilkshire coached Wolves will be also working on their finishing in front of goal ahead of this weekend's clash.

Wollongong struggled to make the most of their litany of chances against an underdone Rangers outfit.

They won't have the luxury of letting opportunities go to waste this week.

Japanese import Takeru Okada will be one to watch as well as well as frontman Bul Juach and the attacking talents of Marcus Beattie.

After such a long break both teams are still finding their feet but with the shortened season APIA and Wollongong will be desperate to take home all three points.

Manly United FC v Western Sydney Wanderers, 7.30pm Friday at Cromer Park

Manly United and Western Sydney Wanderers will be fighting for their first win of the season when the two sides go head to head at Cromer Park on Friday night.

The boys from the Northern Beaches will be hoping to get the better of the Wanderers in what is the first time the two sides have met in the NPL NSW Men's competition.

Manly were held to a scoreless draw against Rockdale City Suns in week one while the Wanderers suffered a 3-2 loss at the hands of fierce rivals Sydney FC.

Both teams showed plenty of flair going forward in their opening round matches, but Manly were unable to find the back of the net – something coach Paul Dee won't want a repeat of this time.

Defender Kieran Paull and striker Marley Peterson were United's best against Rockdale with both testing Suns keeper Tomislav Arcaba.

The Wanderers showed plenty of heart despite defeat in round one with the way they fought back from 3-0 down at half time.

Coach Arthur Diles really knows how to bring the best out of his young upcoming stars as he has vowed not to change the team's style for the entire rebooted season.

Ali Auglah and Stefan Nikolic both found the back of the net as the visitors dominated the second 45 minutes with a showing which is sure to fill the young side with plenty of confidence – look for the talents of Dean Pelekanos in midfield to also play a telling role in the Wanderers attack.

Thomas Aquilina was also dangerous in the club's first game so expect him to be in and around the action.

Manly will need to call on all their experience to get the win against a Western Sydney team with

the ability to take over a match.

Mt Druitt Town Rangers v Blacktown City FC, 7pm Saturday at Popondetta Park

Western Sydney bragging rights will go on the line as Mt Druitt Town Rangers host Blacktown City at Popondetta Park on Saturday night.

Rangers coach Franco Cosentino will be desperate for his first win in charge and to get the scalp of local rival Blacktown would be a huge confidence booster for him and his team.

In round one, Mt Druitt suffered a narrow 1-0 loss to Wollongong Wolves with their scrambling defence going a long way to keeping the reigning league champions at bay for most of the match.

The Rangers were pushed all the way by Wollongong with captain and shot-stopper Carlos Saliadarre making several key saves against a dangerous Wolves attack.

They were able to hold their heads high in what was a gritty performance as Solomon Monahan-Vaiika and Jake Mamone battled for the full ninety

Blacktown, on the other hand, were unlucky not to have taken home three competition points as they were held to a 0-0 draw against North Shore Mariners.

Mark Crittenden's side spurned a handful of scoring chances and nearly paid the price when North Shore had a goal disallowed.

New Blacktown recruit Mario Shabow was a handful for defenders but he will need to work on his finishing to make the most of his skilful dribbling and chance creation.

We will be also watching to see if skipper Matty Lewis can replicate his goalscoring form that hit home pre-COVID to lift his side while it was a good debut for keeper Shaun Catlin who kept his first clean sheet for the club in round 1.

It is set to be an exciting match and with local bragging rights on the line, it is sure to go down to the wire.

Sydney United 58 v North Shore Mariners, 3pm Sunday at Sydney United Sports Centre

A big bounce-back performance will be on the agenda for Sydney United 58 as they host North Shore Mariners at Sydney United Sports Centre on Sunday.

United 58 slumped to a 2-0 loss against traditional rivals Sydney Olympic in the opening week of fixtures and coach Zeljko Kalac will be driving his side for a much-improved showing this week around.

The Reds were stunned by a rapid Olympic attack and had little answers to stop the early onslaught as their defensive unit were really put to the test by the Blues.

United 58 have yet to adapt to the departure of key players Yianni Perkatis and Patrick Antelmi

but with such a short season it is imperative to their finals chances they fill the gap as quickly as possible.

It will be up to experienced campaigners Matt Sim, Thomas Manos and Yianni Fragogiannis to help their younger teammates find their rhythm while we may see the introduction of new recruits Jacob Poscoliero and Mirjan Pavlovic thrown into the mix.

Football is back and the opening week of the rebooted NPL NSW Men's season didn't disappoint.

It was a perfect return to action for Marconi Stallions, Sydney Olympic, Wollongong Wolves and Sydney FC who all claimed wins.

Blacktown City and North Shore Mariners shared the spoils in their clash, as did Rockdale City and Manly United.

Western Sydney Wanderers Youth were unable to get a win to start their time in the NPL NSW Men's competition but proved they will be a team to keep an eye on.

Sydney Olympic finish the week sitting on top of the table ahead of Sydney FC and Marconi Stallions.

APIA Leichhardt 1 (Cox 94') v Marconi Stallions 2 (Jesic 60' pen, Frangie 72') @ Lambert Park

Marconi Stallions have restarted their season in emphatic style with a 2-1 win against reigning champions APIA Leichhardt in a feisty encounter at Lambert Park on Friday.

A Marko Jesic penalty and a sublime finish from Anthony Frangie were enough to hold off a fast-finishing APIA side who were reduced to 10-men in the dying stages.

Neither side gave much away in the first half with chances at a premium.

Frangie had the best opportunity of the opening 45 minutes but he fired over the bar from the edge of the penalty area.

Marconi were the stronger side after the interval and were gifted the chance to open the scoring when the referee pointed to the penalty spot after he judged Paul Galimi's acrobatic clearance attempt as a handball.

Jesic was clinical from the spot to give the Stallions a 1-0 lead, which would become 2-0 only moments later when Frangie hit the back of the net with a sublime finesse finish from the edge of the penalty area.

APIA came home with a wet sail and halved the deficit in added time after a brilliant finish from Jeremy Cox.

However, the home side's chances were all but dashed when Galimi was sent off in the 96th minute with Marconi holding out for victory with a massive performance by one of its young guns Lachlan Sepping.

Blacktown City 0 v North Shore Mariners 0 @ Lily Homes Stadium

Blacktown City and North Shore Mariners were forced to share the spoils after a thrilling 0-0 draw at Lily Homes Stadium on Friday.

Neither side could find the breakthrough despite 90 minutes of end to end action with plenty of chances.

North Shore would've gone home feeling they should've taken all three points after they had a goal ruled out in the 29th minute after it was ruled Blacktown City keeper Shaun Catlin was impeded.

Blacktown had their own missed opportunity late in the first half as former Western Sydney Wanderer, Mario Shabow missed an open net after a brilliant bit of play from Leroy Jennings.

The home side had one final moment to snatch the win in the dying stages of added time but Daniel Collins headed a difficult chance over the bar from six yards out.

Manly United 0 v Rockdale City Suns 0 @ Cromer Park

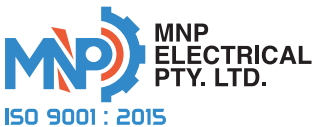
