The pressure will be on APIA Leichhardt to get back on track when they host Western Sydney Wanderers at Lambert Park on Friday.

Two defeats from their first two matches of the rebooted season has APIA languishing at the bottom of the table.

The reigning Champions will need to find form fast if they are to keep their finals hopes alive.

Against Wollongong in round two they conceded four goals, including three in the second half in a 4-1 loss – it was a case of a lack of conditioning as APIA ran out of puff in the second stanza.

Coach John Calleja will have a lot of work to do ahead of this match with defence a high priority.

The Wanderers come into this match with confidence they can snatch three points after two strong performances to mark their ascension into the NSW top tier.

Last week they held Manly United in a 0-0 draw at Cromer Park.

Wild finishes have featured in the Wanderers first two games with the side demonstrating they are a side which will keep fighting until the final whistle.

Jarrod Carluccio, Lochlan Constable, Dean Pelekanos will be ones to watch out for as well Rory Jordan who has been signalled out by many as a player for the future.

Wollongong Wolves are back on top of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition after a huge weekend of round 2 fixtures.

There were plenty of other shock results with massive performances from Rockdale Ilinden, Mt Druitt and Sydney United 58 some of the standouts.

The heavy rain did get the better of the clash between Sydney Olympic and Sydney FC which was postponed on Sunday and will be rescheduled in the coming days.

Manly United 0 – Western Sydney Wanderers 0 at Cromer Park

Manly United's struggles in front of goals proved costly once again as they were forced to settle for a 0-0 draw against Western Sydney Wanderers at Cromer Park.

The boys from the Northern Beaches couldn't make the most of their myriad of chances early in the match and were nearly stunned in the closing stages by a fast-finishing Wanderers outfit.

Manly Captain Brendan Cholakian was the creator combining well with Marley Peterson and Dejan Pandurevic in the first half but neither could find the back of the net.

The home side maintained their control of the game after the restart with long-range efforts from Peterson and Cholakian again unable to beat the keeper.

With time running out the Wanderers went inches away from breaking Manly hearts when Stefan Nikolic fired over from only nine yards out. It proved to be the final chance of the match with

both sides disappointed to be taking only a point from the contest.

Dean Pelekanos once again showed his class in Arthur Diles' squad as did several other young promising Wanderers stars.

A whirlwind second half has helped 2019 Premiers Wollongong Wolves to a dominant 4-1 win against 2019 Champions APIA Leichhardt at Lambert Park on Friday.

Three unanswered goals in the second stanza lifted Wollongong to victory with APIA unable to match it with the Wolves as Luke Wilkshire's men proved they had plenty more left in the tank with John Calleja's side running out of steam.

Lachlan Scott opened the scoring for the Wolves after 24 minutes but APIA hit back on the cusp of halftime thanks to a sensational solo goal from Josh Symons which has already trended on social media.

The defender dribbled around four Wollongong players before his low driven shot sailed past the outstretched arms of the keeper and into the back of the net.

Sadly for the home side, that would be the last high point of the evening with the visitors finding another gear after the break.

A howitzer from Bul Juach gave the Wolves the lead in the 61st minute before Scott nabbed his second only moments later.

Juach wrapped up the victory in style for Wollongong in the dying stages with a brilliant finish into the top corner.

Mt Druitt Town Rangers 2 (Roberts 48, Coskerie 89') – Blacktown City FC 2 (Mendy 59', Jalloh 80') at Popondetta Park

A Cooper Coskerie goal in the final minute has helped Mt Druitt Town Rangers snatch a 2-2 draw

against Blacktown City at Popondetta Park on Saturday night.

It was a dramatic finish to the match which seemed to be Blacktown's for the taking after they took the lead with only nine minutes to play.

Thunder and lightning forced the match start to be delayed 45 minutes with the wild weather playing a role in a tight and hard-fought opening stanza which ended 0-0.
