Round 5 of the National Premier Leagues competition has arrived and another massive weekend of action is on the agenda.

It's approaching the halfway point of the season and with so few games remaining every point will matter.

The action gets underway on Friday nights with two games as APIA Leichhardt host North Shore Mariners while Marconi Stallions travel to take on Blacktown City.

It's a Western Suburbs derby on Saturday night with Mt Druitt Town Rangers up against Western Sydney Wanderers.

Sunday features three games starting with a top of the table clash between Sydney Olympic and Rockdale Ilinden as well as Sydney United 58's clash with Wollongong Wolves.

Sydney FC wraps up the weekend's matches at Ilinden Sports Centre on Sunday night with a game against Manly United.

APIA Leichhardt v North Shore Mariners, 7 pm Friday at Lambert Park

APIA Leichhardt's finals hopes go on the line when they face the North Shore Mariners at Lambert Park on Friday night.

APIA have had a difficult start to the rebooted season losing three of their first four games to leave them slumped in ninth position, four places outside finals qualification.

A 1-0 defeat to Sydney FC in round four was APIA's most recent defeat.

It is sure to have coach John Calleja in a spin as to how he can get last season's Champions back to winning ways.

The club's veteran stars such as Franco Parisi, Adrian Uchino and Chris Payne, as well as captain Sean Symons, must lead from the front

to guide APIA back to the high standards the club prides itself on.

The hosts have used a couple of its youth products in recent weeks and will look towards doing that for the course of this rebooted season as senior stars such as Josh Symons, Themba Muata Marlow, Paul Galimi look set to miss out battling injuries.

The likes of Nick Azzone, Camil Abouchaaya, Vincent Fedele as well as former Sydney FC NPL youngster Patrick Scibilio will be names many NPL NSW Men's fans will see more of in weeks to come.

They come up against a North Shore Mariners side which has also struggled since the restart.

Yet to win a game of the rebooted campaign, the Mariners sit in last place with only one point to their name.

A 4-1 loss to Wollongong Wolves last week was yet another frustrating defeat for Joe Haywood's squad.

However, it's not been all bad news for the Northbridge based side with the Mariners creating plenty of chances and taking the game to Wollongong when they could've easily rolled over after conceding early on.

Lawrence Frederick was a handful against the Wolves scoring his side's only goal of the match.

It could be enough to win him a spot in the starting line-up against APIA.

APIA will throw everything at this match so expect plenty of action as they try to keep their finals hopes alive.

Blacktown City v Marconi Stallions, 7.30 pm Friday at Lily Homes Stadium

Blacktown City will hope a grudge match against rivals Marconi Stallions will help inspire

them to their best performance of the season when the two sides go head to head on Friday night.

City has struggled since the competition restart and is without a win in four games which has them slumped only one point ahead of bottom side North Shore Mariners.

The Mark Crittenden coached side has not been able to display the hard-nosed performances they are renowned for.

Last week's 1-0 loss to Rockdale was another frustrating defeat for Blacktown with the spotlight back on their goal-scoring struggles.

Attacking players Leroy Jennings, Dakota Askew, Mario Shabow, Rhett Desilva and Daniel Araujo need to provide more assistance to Charles Mendy in the goal-scoring stakes with the pacy striker's two goals equating to two-thirds of Blacktown's offensive output.

Against Marconi, Blacktown faces off against an

opponent who won't be easy to break down.

The Stallions come into this match after a 1-1 draw with Western Sydney Wanderers last week.

A goal to young gun Lachlan Sepping in the opening minutes put Marconi on the path to a big win, but they were unable to maintain their momentum as the Wanderers fought back to snatch a draw.

It is a result coach Peter Tsekenis wouldn't have been too happy with, and the pressure will be on them to bounce back against Blacktown.

But if its one thing Tsekenis knows how to do best is getting the best out of his squad.

Martin Fernandez has slowly worked his way back into the game plan with his ability to create opportunities a valuable commodity.

There is no love lost between these two sides so expect a thrilling clash which will have plenty of feeling.

Mt Druitt Town Rangers v Western Sydney Wanderers, 7 pm Saturday at Popondetta Park

Back to back wins will be on the agenda when Mt Druitt Town Rangers host Western Sydney Wanderers at Popondetta Park on Saturday night.

The Rangers found their form in round four scoring four goals in a memorable 4-3 win against Sydney United 58.

Former Australian Youth international John Roberts found his shooting boots claiming a brace in the win which was Franco Cosentino's first since taking over as Mt Druitt coach.

While he would've been unhappy with conceding three goals, the Rangers boss would've been over the moon with how his side's attack came together.

The Wanderers will also come into the contest full of confidence after a brilliant fightback against Marconi to snag a 1-1 draw last round.

Western Sydney dominated the second half of the match and was unlucky to have come away with more than the draw.

Rory Jordan is in sublime form for the Young Wanderers and will be a player to watch in this contest.

Wanderers A-League regular Tass Mourdoukoutas made his first appearance last week, and his presence in the backline is sure to give the rest of the team a significant boost while look to see the crafty skills of Kostas Grozos on offer alongside defensive unit Dean Pelekanos.

Expect plenty of goals in this one.

Sydney Olympic v Rockdale Ilinden, 3 pm Sunday at Lambert Park

A shock loss last week will have Sydney Olympic driven towards a bounce-back performance when they take on Rockdale Ilinden at Lambert Park on Sunday.

The top spot will be on the line as two of the competition's most in-form sides go head to head.

Olympic suffered a 3-2 loss to Manly United in Round 4, their first defeat of the season.

Despite the loss, it was a strong showing from Adam Parkhouse who scored both of Olympic's goals.

They will hope to return to winning ways against a Rockdale side which are close to the peak of their powers.

The return of Alec Urosevski should strike fear into opposition teams with Rockdale's already prolific attack adding on of the most dangerous and consistent attacking threats of the past five NPL seasons.

Urosevski proved match-winner last week against Blacktown with a sublime finish and will be the man Sydney Olympic will need to shut down.

This game has the potential to be a blockbuster and is one not to miss between two traditional rivals.

Sydney United 58 v Wollongong Wolves, 3 pm Sunday at Sydney United Sports Centre

Sydney United 58 will be hoping to win their way back into the top five when they host Wollongong Wolves on Sunday.

A shock loss to Mt Druitt in Round 4 ended United 58's winning streak, but they will be determined to get back on track this week.

Devante Clut and Matthew Bilic were stand out performers last round despite defeat with the silky dribbling duo's ability to unlock a defence a valuable commodity for the Zeljko Kalac coached side.

How Clut can connect with strikers Michael Ruhs, Adrian Vranic and veteran frontman Mirjan Pavlovic could play a significant role in the outcome of the match.

Their opponents Wollongong are flying high at the top end of the table with three wins from four matches.

A dominant 4-1 win against North Shore Mariners last week helped the Wolves jump into second spot.

Lachlan Scott nabbed a brace in the win, and the former A-League striker will be determined to keep his starting spot ahead of the returning Thomas James.

week in a 1-0 win against APIA Leichhardt.

Coach Jimmy van Weeren will be all smiles with how his young team have approached the rebooted season and will be pushing them to keep it going over the remaining rounds to nab a historic finals berth.

Goalkeeper Levi Kaye has gone from strength to strength in recent weeks none more so than in the win against APIA.

Kaye made numerous vital stops to keep his side in the contest and hold on for the narrow win.

Looking to get the ball past Kaye will be a Manly United side which rediscovered their scoring touch in a big way during Round 4.

After failing to find the back of the net in their first three games, Manly scored three to notch a 3-2 win against Sydney Olympic in what was Paul Dee's final match in charge of the Northern Beaches based outfit.

He will be desperate to keep the goals flowing and will be looking outside the side's usual stars with young guns Jordan Devries and James Georgaklis showing they may be the key to the clubs scoring woes - while it was a welcome match for Brendan Cholakian last week who broke his goal scoring drought scoring from the spot.

Both teams like to move the ball around at pace, so be prepared for a fast-paced contest that is sure to have fans of both sides on the edge of their seats.

Another weekend of National Premier Leagues NSW Action is in the books and it is Rockdale Ilinden back on top at the end of Round 4.

The Steven Zoric coached side remain the only undefeated team in the competition with three wins and a draw from their opening matches of the reboot season.

It was also a big round for Manly United who sent off departing coach Paul Dee in style with a great result against Sydney Olympic.

Mt Druitt collected their first win of the campaign and on Sunday Wollongong scored four in a comprehensive return to the winner's circle to wrap up a huge three days of fixtures.

APIA Leichhardt 0 – Sydney FC 1 (Saracino 26) at Lambert Park

A first-half Antonio Saracino goal has lifted Sydney FC to a narrow 1-0 win against APIA Leichhardt at Lambert Park on Friday.

It was a statement win from the Young Sky Blues who have proven they are contenders for the National Premier Leagues NSW Premiership with three wins from their first four matches.

It was end to end action from the opening whistle with both Sydney and APIA trading efforts of goal.

It took only 25 minutes for the visitors to take the lead when Saracino fired home from an acute angle after a careful build-up for his teammates.

Sydney keeper Levi Kaye made several key stops to deny a determined APIA attack in the early stages of the second stanza.

Michael Kouta went inches away from scoring for the home side when his curling free-kick hit the crossbar.

Chance after chance went wasted by APIA and with time-wasting away it just wasn't their night as Sydney FC clung on for victory.

It was a tough night at the office for the home side who had skipper Sean Symons, Themba Muata Marlow, Nick Stavroulakis, Corey Biczo and David D'Apuzzo all out with John Calleja hoping to get back some of his stars in the coming weeks.

Manly United 3 (Cholakian 26, Georgaklis 76', Devries 86') – Sydney Olympic 2 (Parkhouse 21', 74) at Cromer Park

Departing coach Paul Dee was given a winning

farewell by his Manly United side as they claimed a 3-2 win against Sydney Olympic at Cromer Park.

It was an emphatic return to form from Manly who scored their first goals of the season as they came from behind twice to secure victory.

Down 1-0 at the interval after Olympic's Adam Parkhouse snagged the opening goal after 21 minutes, Manly fought back after the restart and found an equaliser when Brendan Cholakian converted from the penalty spot.

Parkhouse was on hand to haunt his former side when he scored his second of the night in the 74th minute to give Olympic a 2-1 lead.

Manly responded immediately and equalised in style only 90 seconds later when James Georgaklis fired home a stunning volley from 25 yards out.

Momentum was on Manly's side and with only four minutes to play youngster Jordan Devries volleyed from the edge of the penalty area to claim a dramatic winner for his side.

Marconi Stallions 1 (Sepping 2') – Western Sydney Wanderers 1 (Jordan 60') at Marconi Stadium

A second-half strike from Rory Jordan has helped Western Sydney Wanderers snatch a 1-1 draw against Marconi Stallions at Marconi Stadium on Saturday.

It was a spirited fightback from the Wanderers who claimed a valuable point against tough opposition.

Peter Tsekenis' side made a lightning start to the match with young gun Lachlan Sepping giving the home side a 1-0 lead after only two minutes.

Despite conceding early, The Wanderers refused to roll over and responded with a pair of chances of their own.

Marconi went into the break with a 1-0 lead but Western Sydney took only 10 minutes after the restart to find an equaliser.

Jordan displayed his silky dribbling skills to score a brilliant goal for the Wanderers.

Mt Druitt Town Rangers roared back into form with a shock 4-3 win against Sydney United 58 at Popondetta Park on Saturday night.

It was Franco Cosentino's first win since taking over as Rangers boss and the club's maiden victory since the competition restart.

The home side was able to withstand the windy conditions to take a 1-0 lead into the break after John Roberts converted from the spot.

Sydney United made a rapid start to the second stanza with Devante Clut equalising in the 48th minute.

A quick-thinking Roberts gave Mt Druitt the lead again after 63 minutes when he headed home from close range before Jack Stewart made it 3-1 with a classy finish.

Matthew Bilic then gave United 58 a glimmer of hope notching up in the 70th minute but it was Mt Druitt's night and Michael Jeffrey wrapped up the points for the home side when he scored to make it 4-2.

Bilic claimed his second, and third of the year, in the dying stages to set up a nervous finish, but the Rangers did enough for a confidence-boosting three points.

Wollongong Wolves 4 (Scott 5' 92', Okada 33', Littler 52) – North Shore Mariners 1 (Frederick 79') at Albert Butler Memorial Park

It was a return to the winner's circle on Sunday for Wollongong Wolves who secured a comprehensive 4-1 victory against North Shore Mariners.

Two goals on each side of halftime lifted the Wolves to victory against a tricky Mariners outfit.

Gun striker Lachlan Scott opened the scoring only five minutes into the contest with Wollongong doubling their lead in the 33rd minute courtesy of a Takeru Okada finish.

The home side would take the 2-0 lead into the break and continued to control the match after the restart.

Okada was dangerous for Wollongong and created headaches for the Mariners defence.

Nicholas Littler headed home midway through the second stanza to make it 3-0 for Wollongong.

The introduction of Lawrence Frederick for North Shore gave the visitors a much-needed spark and he found himself on the scoresheet with 10 minutes left to play.

The Mariners should've had a second goal not long after but Hayden Durose in the Wolves goal did well to deny them.

With the final seconds ticking down, Scott snagged his brace with a composed finish to wrap up the three points for his side.

It was an important win for Wollongong who stay in the race for premiership only a point behind leaders Rockdale,

There was also good news for the hosts who should be getting ace marksman Thomas James back for next weekend's match after his stint with A-League finalists Perth Glory had come to an abrupt end.

Rockdale Ilinden 1 (Urosevski 73')- Blacktown City FC 0 at Ilinden Sports Centre

Rockdale Ilinden has reclaimed the top spot on the ladder after edging Blacktown City 1-0 at Ilinden Sports Centre on Sunday.

A clinical finish from Alec Urosevski was the difference as Ilinden stretched their undefeated streak to four games since the competition restart.

It was an even first half with both sides creating chances throughout the opening 45 minutes but neither could find the back of the net.

Rockdale had the best of the action after the resumption of play and caught the Blacktown defence napping in the 73rd minute when Urosevski was put into space behind the defence before he slipped the ball around the advancing keeper.

It was a big goal for the ace attacker who originally was set to take some time off from the rebooted season only to come back just after kick-off due to him missing the game.

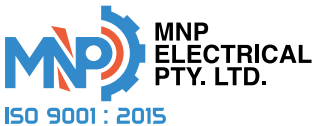
