Round 6 of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition has arrived, and we're now at the halfway point of the rebooted 2020 season.

Sydney FC is the surprise competition leaders after an incredible start to their campaign winning four of their first four matches including a 2-1 win against Manly United last week.

However, the chasing pack is hot on their tail with an undefeated Rockdale only one point behind in second place, while Sydney Olympic and Marconi Stallions sit in third and fourth two points behind the ladder leaders.

This week's matches get underway on Friday night at Cromer Park as Manly United host APIA Leichhardt.

Two matches have been scheduled for Saturday with Marconi Stallions taking on Sydney Olympic FC, while Mt Druitt Town Rangers go up against North Shore Mariners.

The round wraps up on Sunday with three matches scheduled including Wollongong Wolves at home against Blacktown City, Rockdale Ilinden against Western Sydney Wanderers and Sydney United 58 in a clash against Sydney FC.

Manly United v APIA Leichhardt FC, 7.30 pm Friday at Cromer Park

The finals hopes of Manly United and APIA Leichhardt go on the line on Friday night when the two sides go head to head at Cromer Park.

Both Manly and APIA sit two games outside the top five and will need a near-perfect run home if they are going to secure an unlikely finals berth.

With new coach Adam Griffiths at the helm, Manly will be looking to their young squad to find a way to secure the three points.

Luca Kmet found himself on the scoresheet last round, following the goalscoring heroics of up and coming stars James Georgaklis and Jordan Devries a week earlier.

If their young players can find their touch alongside veterans Scott Balderson and Brendan Cholakian, then the struggling APIA defence could be in for a difficult night.

APIA has been a shadow of themselves since the competition restart, and the side is in a precarious position after only five matches with only four points to their name.

Injuries and suspensions have wreaked havoc on the squad which as resulted in the club playing some up and coming youngsters with the likes of Nicholas Azzone and Camil Abouchaaya getting some senior game time.

Coach John Calleja will need his players to find something extra if they are any hope of resurrecting their campaign.

Chris Payne will be determined to find the back of the net while the experienced heads of maestro Franco Parisi, Adrian Ucchino and Sean Symons will need to spur the team back to winning ways.

With their finals hopes fading away, will it be Manly or APIA who find a much needed second wind when it matters most?

Marconi Stallions V Sydney Olympic, 4 pm Saturday at Marconi Stadium

Two of the league's most potent attacks will

square off on Saturday afternoon as Marconi Stallions host Sydney Olympic at Marconi Stadium.

Third-placed Olympic and fourth-placed Marconi have both won three of their first four games and are both on ten points.

The winner of this clash could potentially finish the round in top spot if other fixtures go their way.

Home side Marconi were big winners in Round 5 as they collected a 3-0 victory against rivals Blacktown City.

The Peter Tsekenis coached side scored three goals which all could be contenders for the best of the season including a sublime solo run from Martin Fernandez.

With Marko Jesic, Anthony Frangie and Mitch Mallia all in form, expect the Stallions to create

plenty of chances.

Olympic was held to a scoreless draw in a grinding contest against Rockdale last week.

Pacy winger Adam Parkhouse and veteran Wideman Fabio Ferreira were both unable to make the most of their chances against a suffocating Rockdale defence.

Thomas Whiteside was in good form against Rockdale and will be busy in the centre of defence this week.

Expect fireworks from this blockbuster clash which could be the best of the weekend's matches.

Mt Druitt Town Rangers v North Shore Mariners, 7 pm Saturday at Popondetta Park

They will be without Zac Sfiligoi who was sent off for a cynical challenge on Franco Parisi in the dying stages of their Round 5 contest.

Mt Druitt is full of confidence and playing at home, which makes them a tough team to beat. However, don't write off the Mariners who may be able to pull off an upset.

Wollongong Wolves FC v Blacktown City FC, 2.30 pm Sunday at Albert Butler Memorial Park

Wollongong Wolves will be out to make a quick

return to the winner's circle when they host Blacktown City at Albert Butler Memorial Park on Sunday.

The Wolves suffered a costly 3-1 defeat on the road against Sydney United 58 last week and lost rising star striker Bul Juach to a severe injury in the process.

Juach's injury will force a shake-up of the Wolves attack, but what better replacement to have than none other than 2019 Player of the Year and Golden Boot winner Thomas James who returns to the club following his tough short-term deal at the Perth Glory.

Blacktown is struggling all over the park during this rebooted season, and coach Mark Crittenden won't be happy with the poor discipline shown by his side.

City is in desperate need of a confidence-boosting win.

Last week Matt Lewis broke the club's appearance record, and it will be on the club captain to inspire his side to victory.

Wollongong will be favourites at home but don't expect Blacktown to take it easy.

Rockdale Ilinden v Western Sydney Wanderers, 3 pm Sunday at Ilinden Sports Centre

Undefeated Rockdale Ilinden will have the top spot in their sights when they host Western Sydney Wanderers at Ilinden Sports Centre on Sunday.

Only one point behind ladder leader Sydney

FC, Rockdale will be driven to keep the pressure on their Premiership title rivals.

Last week the Steve Zoric coached side battled out a scoreless draw against Sydney Olympic at Lambert Park clinging on in the dying stages to secure a point.

Incredibly, Rockdale's defence has yet to concede a goal since the competition restart with the partnership of Banri Kazizumi and Daniel Petkovski proving more reliable than ever.

The return of Micheal Neill and Alec Urosevski in recent weeks has only boosted Rockdale and given their long-suffering fans hope that this season could be their year.

Looking to end Rockdale's unbeaten run is a Western Sydney Wanderers side who have shown glimpses of brilliance since being promoted into the state league top-flight for this rebooted season.

Bolstered by the return of star striker Patrick Antelmi, whose brace led United 58 to a 3-1 win last week, the Zjelko Kalac coached side has quickly become a team to watch.

Another massive round of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition is in the books with Week 5 of the rebooted season delivering another weekend of thrilling matches.

Sydney FC leads the competition after five rounds after yet another impressive victory.

The Young Sky Blues have been the big story since the season restart with the Jim van Weeran coached outfit flying high with their fourth win of the campaign.

APIA Leichhardt and Blacktown City's struggles continued this weekend as both slumped to frustrating results yet again.

Rockdale Ilinden and Sydney Olympic both missed an opportunity to go top of the table while Marconi showed off their potent attack on Friday night.

With only six weeks to go the battle for finals football is heating up, and if this round's matches are anything to go by, it is sure to go down to the wire.

APIA Leichhardt 0 – North Shore Mariners 0 at Lambert Park

A second-half surge was not enough for APIA Leichhardt as they were held to a scoreless stalemate by a 10-man North Shore Mariners on Friday.

It was yet another frustrating result for the reigning champions who were unable to secure victory against lower-ranked opposition for yet another week.

It was the Mariners who had the best of the opening exchanges with Mitchell Smith's shot over the bar one of a handful of goal scoring chances for the visitors.

Ten minutes before the interval Franco Parisi spurned a brilliant opportunity when he fired a curling effort narrowly wide of the post from only nine yards out.

APIA picked up the pace after the break with Chris Payne and Sean Symons testing the keeping with long-range efforts.

Zac Sfiligoi was given his marching orders by the referee when he took down Parisi on the edge of the penalty area with the Mariners reduced to ten for the final 20 minutes.

Dom Nasrabadi had one final chance to snatch victory for the home side when he shot wide of an empty net during added time which he should have finished off.

The result means APIA finished the round lingering in ninth place on four points, while North Shore Mariners sit in last place on two points.

Blacktown City 0 – Marconi Stallions 3 (Frangie 11, Jesic 42, Fernandez 70) at Lily Homes Stadium

Marconi Stallions crashed Blacktown City's party as they

cruised to a dominant 3-0 win at Lily Homes Stadium on Friday night.

It was supposed to be a night of celebration for Blacktown captain Matt Lewis who broke the club appearance record in what was his 305th appearance for the Seven Hills-based outfit.

However, coach Peter Tsekis' men didn't get the memo easing to victory in a scintillating performance.

The Stallions unleashed an attacking onslaught from the opening whistle with Shaun Catlin forced to make two early saves to deny Anthony Frangie and Marco Jesic.

However, Marconi would soon take the lead with Frangie heading home from close range from a corner kick in the 11th minute.

Jesic would find the back of the net in style in the dying seconds of the first half as the former A-League striker volleyed off the turn to find the top corner.

It was one-way traffic in the second half from Marconi with Blacktown struggling to slow down their opponents.

The fans witnessed a moment of pure brilliance in the 70th minute as Martin Fernandez scored a sublime solo effort.

The mercurial midfielder dribbled past four defenders after picking the ball up on halfway before he sidefooted the ball across the keeper and into the net.

Lewis had a chance to score a consolation goal during his milestone match, but Nenad Vekic saved his penalty effort in the 75th minute as Marconi held on for the victory.

Sydney FC 2 (Saracino 44, Wood 53) – Manly United 1 (Kmet 85) at Cromer Park

A determined Sydney FC has claimed their fourth win in five weeks with a hard-fought 2-1 victory against Manly United at Cromer Park.

Goals either side of the half from Patrick Wood and Antonio Saracino were enough for the win as the Young Sky Blues held off a fast-finishing Manly outfit.

The Northern Beaches based side, under the tutelage of Former Socceroos defender Adam Griffiths in his first match as coach, started with intent with Sydney gloveman Levi Kaye forced to make diving saves to deny shots from Scott Balderson and James Georgaklis.

But it was Sydney FC who would make the breakthrough with Saracino tapping home after a brilliant run and past from Jaiden Kucharski.

They kept the pressure on after the break with Patrick Wood doubling the lead only seven minutes into the second stanza with a powerful shot from inside the

penalty area.

Manly was determined to fight their way back into the contest and managed to halve the deficit with five minutes left to play courtesy of a composed finish from Luca Kmet.

Griffiths side pushed hard for an equaliser, but it wasn't to be as Sydney FC held on for all three points.

Mt Druitt Town Rangers 3 (Stewart 19 , 93 , Monahan-Vaiika 69) v Western Sydney 1 (Constable 7)

A Jack Stewart brace has helped Mt Druitt Town Rangers claim local Constable rights with a 3-1 win against local rivals Western Sydney Wanderers at Popondetta Park on Saturday night.

It was the Rangers second consecutive win and an impressive return to form against an energetic Wanderers side.

Western Sydney made a fast start to the match with Lochlan Constable firing past Rangers shot-stopper Carlos Saliadarré only seven minutes into the game.

It took the home side 13 minutes to hit back when Stewart scored with a low curling effort from outside the penalty area.

Constable nearly had a double just before the break, but Saliadarré stopped his rasping drive from range.

The game deadlocked after the interval with both sides battling in midfield.

Rockdale Ilinden has held on to claim a point in a hard-fought 0-0 draw against Sydney Olympic at Lambert Park on Sunday.

It was Rockdale's fifth clean sheet in as many games as the Steven Zoric coached side kept their unbeaten start to the rebooted season alive against a talented Olympic outfit.

Neither side was giving much away in what was a battle of the league's powerhouse teams.

Rockdale defender Brayden Sorge had the best chance

of the first half when he forced a brilliant save from Olympic shot-stopper Nicholas Sorras.

Olympic hit back after the interval, and they pushed to be the first side to score against Rockdale since the competition restart.

Fresh from a maiden A-League stint with Western United, Antelmi was at his clinical best in his Sydney United return scoring twice to guide the Zjelko Kalac coached side to victory.

It was a brilliant bounce-back performance from United 58 who took the lead in the 33rd minute through Joshua Macdonald after a fast-paced opening to the match.

Antelmi claimed his first of the contest on the cusp of the half-time break to stretch Sydney United into a 2-0 break at the interval.

The striker had a taste for goals and doubled his tally in the 58th minute when he tapped home at the far post after breaking free of his marker.




