# PREVIEWS

**It's round 8 of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition and with only four games remaining the Premiership race is set to go down to the wire.**

Sydney Olympic sits on top of the ladder going into this week's matches, their second-week holding first place, but have only a one-point advantage ahead of Sydney United 58.

Only three points separate first from sixth place setting up an incredible run towards the finals.

The action gets underway on Friday night with two matches as APIA Leichhardt host Mt Druitt and Manly United take on Blacktown City.

On Saturday night, competition newcomers Western Sydney Wanderers will face off against North Shore Mariners at Valentine Sports Park.

Finally three matches on Sunday will wrap up the round including Wollongong against Sydney Olympic, Sydney United 58's clash with Marconi

and finally Sydney FC going head to head with Rockdale.

## **APIA Leichhardt v Mt Druitt Town Rangers, 7 pm Friday at Lambert Park**

APIA Leichhardt will be determined to claim their first win in over a month when they host Mt Druitt Town Rangers on Friday.

A 4-2 loss to Sydney Olympic in Round 7 was the fourth game in a row without a victory for the reigning champions as they remain slumped only two points ahead of last place.

Despite the defeat last weekend, there was plenty of improvement in the performance from APIA.

After weeks of toil, veteran midfielder Franco Parisi was finally rewarded with a goal against

Olympic and coach John Calleja will be hoping it inspires him to bring another big performance against Mt Druitt.

APIA's young players look up to Parisi and his leadership could be imperative to get the team performing at their best despite their morale-sapping run of poor results.

The club is hoping they can welcome a couple of its injured experienced stars as they look towards bagging their second win of the competition.

Their opponents, Mt Druitt come into the game on the back of a 3-0 defeat at the hands of Marconi Stallions and will also be looking for a return to the winner's circle.

Jack Stewart has been in fine form this season and could be an influential player if the Rangers are to collect full points from the fixture.

Shot stopper Carlos Saliadarré is another key man for Mt Druitt and the experienced gloveman will need to be at his best to stop the likes of Sean Symons, Jeremy Cox and Chris Payne in the APIA attack.

This will be a tight match with no side standing out as favourites

APIA will be hoping the home ground advantage helps them to Victory, but if they're not careful the Rangers are more than capable of snatching an upset.

### **Manly United v Blacktown City, 7.30 pm Friday at Cromer Park**

A bounce-back win will be the only thing on the menu for Manly United when they host Blacktown City on Friday night.

Manly suffered a shock loss at the hands of North Shore Mariners last round and will be determined for nothing less than victory against competition

cellar dwellers Blacktown City.

Coach Adam Griffiths will be stressing the importance of a fast start and the pressure will be on his attackers Brendan Cholakian, Dejan Pandurevic and Marley Peterson to find an early breakthrough.

Their opponents Blacktown City come into this match after claiming their first points in over a month with a dramatic late draw against Sydney FC.

It's been a very difficult season for the Mark Crittenden coached team since the restart with Blacktown slumped at the bottom of the table

Attacker Leroy Jennings will be full of confidence after scoring a late equaliser last week and can hopefully provide the firepower his Blacktown side has been lacking so far this season.

Manly will be the favourites at home, however, Blacktown will be worthy opposition and will take any opportunity they can to snatch an upset – a club with a never say die attitude, expect club skipper Matt Lewis and co to give the young Manly United side a huge test as they look towards getting off the foot of the ladder.

### **Western Sydney Wanderers v North Shore Mariners, 7 pm Sunday at Valentine Sports Park**

The newcomers to the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition on Saturday as Western Sydney Wanderers host North Shore Mariners at Valentine Sports Park.

While finals football may be out of reach for both sides, there will be no taking it easy with the Wanderers and Mariners both determined to finish the season on a high.

Western Sydney were unlucky in a 4-2 defeat to United 58 last week, but will take plenty of

positives from the match including their brilliant start to the game which had their high profile opponents on the back foot.

Rory Jordan and Tass Mourdoukoutas both found the back of the net last week and will be again central to the Wanderers hopes against the Mariners.

The Mariners come into the match after a sensational 2-0 win against Manly in Round seven.

It stretched the Joe Haywood coached team's undefeated streak to three games with the Northbridge based side showing plenty of improvement from their early-season struggles playing some organised football that has made them one tough team to beat.

Wollongong Wolves will be determined to stay in the Premiership race with a win against Sydney Olympic at Albert Butler Memorial Park on Sunday.

Defeat last week to Rockdale meant the Wolves dropped to sixth on the ladder, four points behind Olympic at the top of the table.

Sunday's match will give the reigning premiers a chance to cut the deficit to only one point.

Wolves coach Luke Wilkshire will be buoyed by

returning striker Thomas James finding the net against Rockdale with the hope the English born marksman can rediscover his golden boot form for the run home.

They will be without defensive leader Nick Littler who was sent off in Round seven and serves his one-match suspension this week.

Standing in Wollongong's way is a Sydney Olympic team edging closer to the peak of their powers.

A free-scoring performance in a 4-2 win against APIA Leichhardt in Round seven showed what the Ante Juric team is capable of when they make the most of their chances.

Attacking stars Charles Lokolingoy and Adam Parkhouse both scored a brace against APIA and are in incredible touch heading into the final weeks of the regular season.

Without Littler, Wollongong will have an almighty task ahead of them if they are to stop Olympic's star-studded front three.

However, Wolves have plenty of big-name talent of their own and with the home ground advantage will be ready for a fight, but beware, Olympic have been on fire in 2020.

## **Sydney United 58 v Marconi Stallions, 3 pm Sunday at Sydney United Sports Centre**

A historic rivalry will be renewed on Sunday as Sydney United 58 takes on Marconi Stallions at Sydney United Sports Centre.

However, much more than just bragging rights will be on the line with both United 58 and the Stallions in a tight battle for the premiership with only four games remaining in the regular season.

United 58 have found their stride in recent weeks

and, after a 4-2 win against Western Sydney Wanderers last round, are only one point behind ladder leaders Sydney Olympic.

The incredible form of The Red's veteran stars is sure to scare opposition sides while Patrick Antelmi is scoring for fun since his return to the squad after his stint with A-League outfit Western United.

Sydney FC will be determined to keep their Premiership challenge alive when they take on Rockdale Ilinden on Sunday.

A loss and a draw in their last two matches have meant the one-time competition leading Young Sky Blues are now in fifth place, three points behind Sydney Olympic at the top of the table.

Sydney coach Jim van Weeran faces an almighty task to help his youthful side discover a second wind through the final four games of the campaign.

One player who will be central to Sydney FC is striker Patrick Wood.

Wood has been in incredible form this season scoring eight goals in seven matches this season as well as providing a handful of assists.

He will be up against the league's best defence with Rockdale only conceding four goals this season including an incredible run of five clean sheets.

Rockdale have been in brilliant form this season and showed what they are capable of in an impressive 3-1 win against Wollongong last weekend.

Japanese midfielder Tomoki Wada had his best game of the season scoring two goals including a sensational free-kick from the edge of the box.

## **Seven rounds of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition is in the books and It's Sydney Olympic who sit on top of the ladder with only four rounds remaining.**

Olympic's victory this week has helped them hold onto first place but only by a narrow margin with four teams within three points of their tally.

Sydney United's rise to the top continued and they are now only one point behind the ladder leaders.

North Shore Mariners claimed victory in the first North Sydney derby against Manly United, while Marconi were too strong for Mt Druitt.

### **Blacktown City 1 (Jennings 87) – Sydney FC 1 (Wood 25) at Lily Homes Stadium**

A stunning late strike from Leroy Jennings has helped Blacktown City snatch a 1-1 draw with Sydney FC at Lily Homes Stadium on Friday.

Jennings dramatic equaliser snapped City's four-game losing streak securing the Mark Crittenden coached side their first competition points since Round 2 of the rebooted season.

It was a gallant fightback from Blacktown who were on the back foot early after Sydney FC's star frontman Patrick Wood fired past the keeper for his eighth goal of the season.

Trailing 1-0 at the break, Blacktown fought back in the second half

Blacktown should've equalised in the 71st minute but a sensational diving effort from Young Sky Blues shot-stopper Levi Kaye denied Jennings's diving header.

Antonio Saracino fired over with an open net in front as Sydney FC spurned a brilliant opportunity to double their lead.

It would prove to be a costly mistake with Jennings unleashing a howitzer with his left foot only 9 minutes later from 30 yards out to snatch a point for Blacktown city.

Despite the result, Blacktown remain in last place on four points while Sydney FC remain inside the top four on 13 points.

### **Manly United 0 – North Shore Mariners 2 (Smith 2, Frederick 85) at Cromer Park**

North Shore Mariners have claimed North Sydney Derby Honours with a shock 2-0 win against Manly United at Cromer Park on Friday.

A goal inside the opening 90 seconds put the Mariners in the box seat before they iced the win in the dying minutes of the clash to secure all three competition points.

The Mariners had the perfect start to the match with

Mitch Smith giving his side a 1-0 lead with only 1 minute and 20 seconds after the opening whistle.

It was a great finish from Smith who into the top left corner after some brilliant interplay on the right flank.

Manly felt they should've been given a penalty in the 19th minute when Marley Peterson went to ground inside the penalty area, but the referee waved their appeals away.

North Shore would cling onto the advantage into the second half, but Manly would push their hold on the lead not long after the resumption.

Scott Balderson broke free of the backline after a well-hit long ball but his effort was denied by some desperation defence which deflected his shot into the arms of the keeper.

Manly threw everything forward late in search of an equaliser, but the plan backfired for the boys from the Northern Beaches who were left deflated with this result against their neighbours.

A miss-kick from last defender Sam Gallagher opened the door for the Mariners who snapped up the loose ball before setting up Lawrence Frederick to score the winner.

It was a frustrating defeat for Manly, their first under new coach Adam Griffiths, while for the Mariners they've stretched their undefeated run to three games.

### **Marconi Stallions 3 (Fernandez 17, Frangie 20, Millgate 29) – Mt Druitt Town Rangers 0 at Marconi Stadium.**

A first-half attacking masterclass has helped Marconi Stallions to a dominant 3-0 win against Mt Druitt Town Rangers at Marconi Stadium on Sunday.

Three strikes in the opening 45 minutes was enough for the Peter Tsekenis coached side as they ended Mt Druitt's winning run.

Marconi opened the scoring in style when midfield maestro Martin Fernandez fired an absolute thunderbolt into the top left corner from 30 yards out.

The young gun has been hitting the headlines during the reboot of the NPL NSW Men's season with potential A-League suitors flocking in catching a glimpse of one of this league's hottest prospects.

It set the tone for the match and within only three minutes the Stallions had doubled their lead.

After stunning run down the left-wing, Mitch Mallia fired in a cross into the box which was dispatched by Anthony Frangie into the back of the net with a sublime volley.

Defender Nathan Millgate made it three goals for Marconi within ten minutes when he headed home to make it 3-0 for the home side.

The lead allowed the Stallions to ease up in the second half and while Mt Druitt kept fighting, they were unable to break into the contest.

The victory boosted Marconi's premiership hopes as they moved in third spot.

**Sydney Olympic 4 (Lokolingoy 11, 17, Parkhouse 59, 76) – APIA Leichhardt 2 at Lambert Park (Parisi 23, Gibbs 93)**

Sydney Olympic has cemented their spot on the top of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's ladder with a 4-2 win against APIA Leichhardt Tigers at Lambert Park on Sunday.

A first-half brace from Charles Lokolingoy and a double from Adam Parkhouse after the break helped the Ante Juric coached side to victory and a vital three competition points.

It didn't take long for Sydney Olympic to take the upper hand against a struggling APIA outfit with Lokolingoy finding the back of the net 12 minutes in.

The Olympic marksman made the most of a chance opportunity to fire the home side into the lead with a clinical finish from only nine yards out.

It took only a few more minutes for the former Sydney FC frontman to claim a brace when he fired into the back of the net after a sensational marauding run from central defender Thomas Whiteside.

APIA's veteran star Franco Parisi gave his side hope when he rifled a shot into the back of the net in the 23rd.

Neither side would add to their tally before the break with Olympic leading 2-1 at the interval.

Olympic would stretch their lead midway through the second stanza when Adam Parkhouse fired one in with his left to make it 3-1.

The former Wellington Phoenix player saved his best for later when he unleashed a thunderous strike from 35 yards out which cannoned into the back of the net after 76 minutes to make it 4-1.

Mitchell Gibbs claimed a late consolation goal for APIA with the last kick of the game after he linked up with Josh and Sean Symons.

The result was APIA's fourth game without a win and leaves them in 11th place two points above bottom side Blacktown City.

**Sydney United 58 4 (Clut 23 Sim 66 Antelmi 71 Khoury 89) – Western Sydney Wanderers 2 (Jordan 10, Mourdoukoutas 25) at Sydney United Sports Centre**

The Wanderers took the game to United 58 from the

opening whistle and were rewarded with a Rory Jordan goal only ten minutes in.

The goal shook United 58 into action with Devante Clut firing in an equaliser with a brilliant finish from outside the box.

The Wanderers responded rapidly as A-League first-teamer Tass Mourdoukoutas tapped home from a few yards out to put the visitors back into the lead.

Western Sydney would hold their 2-1 lead into the break but they would face a fired-up United 58 side after the restart.

The home side were rewarded for their high tempo football as Matt Sim equalised with an impressive finish after beating two defenders.

Only five minutes later, United 58 were in the lead as Patrick Antelmi continued his sensational scoring run to make it 3-2 for the Anthony Crea coached team.

A Jackson Khoury goal in the final minute of the match wrapped up victory for United 58 moving them up to second on the ladder.

**Rockdale Ilinden 3 (Gauthier 7, Wada 59, 93) – Wollongong Wolves 1 (James 20) at Ilinden Sports Centre**

Rockdale Ilinden has returned to the winner's circle with an impressive 3-1 win against Wollongong Wolves at Ilinden Sports Centre on Sunday.

An inspired second-half showing from the Steven Zoric coached side helped secure the victory and all three competition points.

Rockdale made a fast start to the contest with Amaury Gauthier scoring only seven minutes into the match to give the home side a 1-0 lead.

It sparked a near-instant response from the Wolves with star striker Thomas James scoring his first goal of the season since returning from his short term move at Perth Glory to level the score at 1-1.

The game was locked in an end to end battle with both teams remaining deadlocked at the break.

In the 59th minute, the game was turned on its head when Nick Littler was shown red and sent off for a desperation tackle on Nikola Taneski who had broken free of the defence.

Tomoki Wada delivered a moment of brilliance from the ensuing free-kick as he found the back of the net from the edge of the penalty area to give Rockdale a 2-1 lead.

Despite having only 10-men, Wollongong refused to give in and pushed for an equaliser.

However, it was Rockdale's day and a second goal to Wada deep inside injury time wrapped up a 3-1 result.

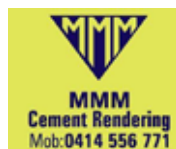

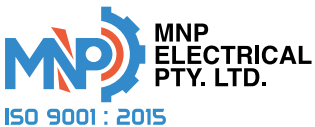
