PREVIEWS

It's Round 9 in the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition and it's crunch time in the race for the Premiership.

With only three games to play, there are still six teams in contention to finish the rebooted regular season on top making every match a potential premiership decider.

The week's action gets underway on Friday night with Blacktown City FC hosting competition leaders Sydney United 58.

A triple header will take place on Saturday starting with Marconi Stallions at home against Manly United FC.

Saturday will also feature Sydney Olympic up against North Shore Mariners and Mt Druitt taking on Sydney FC.

Western Sydney Wanderers will travel to take on Wollonong Wolves this Sunday before Rockdale will go head to head with APIA

Leichhardt in the final match of the round.

Blacktown City FC v Sydney United 58 FC, 7.30 pm Friday at Lily Homes Stadium.

Blacktown City will be out to prove they have turned a corner with victory against league leaders Sydney United 58 on Friday.

It has been a horror campaign for City who linger in second last place, but last week's win against Manly has given hope they have rediscovered their magic touch.

In that match it was a pair of first half goals courtesy of captain Matt Lewis and striker Suleyman Bangura which was the difference as Blacktown made the most of their fast start to the match.

It will take a similar recipe if City are to pull off an upset this week, with early goals from the attack of Leroy Jennings, Hassan Jalloh and

Charles Mendy needed to shake the usually unflappable United 58 defence.

United 58 come into this game in impressive form winning their last four matches to fly to the top of the table.

Striker Patrick Antelmi has proven unstoppable with six goals in only four games.

However, it is United 58's dynamic midfield of Yianni Perkatis, Matt Sim and Glen Trifiro which has been the real powerhouse behind the club's recent success.

The trio's combination to set up Antelmi last week in the 2-1 win against Marconi is the perfect example of how easy they can dismantle a well organised defence.

United 58 will go in to this match as overwhelming favourites, but don't write off Blacktown as they will be determined to put a spanner in the works of their rival's premiership aspirations.

Marconi Stallions v Manly United FC, 4 pm Saturday at Marconi Stadium

A bounce back win will be on the agenda for Marconi Stallions when they host Manly United at Marconi Stadium on Saturday.

The Stallions went down 2-1 to rivals Sydney United 58 last week which put a big dent in their chase for the premiership.

However, The Peter Tsekenis coached side are only five points behind the ladder leaders and will believe they can win all of their remaining games to snatch an unlikely title triumph.

This game will be all about how fast Marconi can take advantage of a young Manly defence with attackers Anthony Frangie, Marko Jesic and Mitch Mallia key to their success.

Nathan Millgate has been a solid performer in the backline for Marconi in recent weeks and will provide a stable platform for the team to build off.

Their opponents are a Manly United team which has struggled for consistency as demonstrated in last week's 2-1 defeat against a struggling Blacktown City outfit.

The boys from the Northern Beaches have shown they are capable of bringing it against the league's best but are equally capable of conceding important goals at the worst possible occasion.

Captain Brendan Cholakian has for many years been one of the most dynamic midfield players in the competition and his recent form has only reinforced that.

He will need to lead from the front if Manly are to cause an upset along with young gun attacker Marley Peterson.

Marconi will be favourites for this clash but their own lapses in concentration this season could open the door for Manly if they are not careful.

Sydney Olympic v North Shore Mariners, 7 pm Saturday at Lambert Park

Nothing less than three points will be considered an acceptable result when Sydney Olympic host bottom side North Shore Mariners on Saturday night.

After leading the competition going into last round, Olympic now sits in third spot after a 1-0 defeat against Wollongong Wolves.

The pressure is on coach Ante Juric and his Olympic team to make a statement this round with a big win.

This match is a chance for the attacking trio of

Fabio Ferreira, Charles Lokolingoy and Adam Parkhouse to shine.

Standing in their way is a Mariners side which has shown marked improvement as the season has progressed, but still linger at the foot of the table.

The form of Mitchell Smith has been a bright spot this campaign for the Mariners and they will rely on him to add to his goal tally this round.

This match could be a one sided affair but if the Mariners dig in and frustrate Olympic early they could be in with a shot of pulling off one of the upsets of the season.

Mt Druitt Town Rangers v Sydney FC, 7 pm Saturday at Popondetta Park

Mt Druitt Town Rangers will be out to end Sydney FC's finals hopes when the two sides face off this Saturday night at Popondetta Park.

The Rangers are coming off a 1-0 loss to APIA Leichhardt but a return home should be the perfect remedy as they push for a bounce back win.

Club Captain Carlos Saliadarre has been a rock for Mt Druitt in between the posts this season and the club captain will be up for another big game this week.

The possible return of John Roberts, who missed out last week, could be the difference maker for the Rangers with his dynamic play up front likely to test the inexperienced Sydney FC defence.

The Young Sky Blues have hit a few hurdles in recent matches which has seen them drop from first down to sixth on the ladder.

They remain only five points off top spot and will be pushing hard for at least a maiden finals berth.

The combination of Patrick Wood and Antonio Saracino at the top of the attack will be key if Sydney are to take all three points.

Mt Druitt has proven a tough side to beat this season and Sydney FC will need to rediscover their early season magic if they are to take all three points from this contents.

Wollongong Wolves v Western Sydney Wanderers, 2.30 pm Sunday at Albert Butler Memorial Park

Wollongong Wolves will be out to keep their premiership defence on track with a win against Western Sydney Wanderers on Sunday.

The Wolves knocked off last week's ladder leaders Sydney Olympic in a hard fought 1-0 victory to keep their title hopes alive and will be determined to keep the winning run going starting with the clash against the Wanderers.

Takeru Okada has quickly become a key cog in the Wolves side with his ability to both score and assist proving invaluable.

His service to strikers Josh Bingham and Thomas James will be imperative in this match and all of Wollongong's remaining games – James in particular will be hungry to open his goalscoring account after missing from the spot against Olympic last weekend.

Defender Nick Littler should return to the side this week after serving his suspension following his red card in Round 7.

They face off this week against an exciting Western Sydney team which has shown they

are more than capable of causing an upset.

Ali Auglah scored a brace last week in a 2-1 win against North Shore Mariners and he will be one to watch this week.

Rory Jordan is another player who has earned plenty of plaudits this season and offers the Wanderers a dynamic option in attack while Dean Pelekanos has been a warrior in midfield winning aerial battles and challenges keeping his team competitive.

Wollongong is arguably the toughest road trip in the competition and the Wolves have had an incredible home record because of this.

Western Sydney have shown they don't give up and it could be this fighting spirit which helps them snatch an unlikely victory.

Rockdale Ilinden v APIA Leichhardt, 3 pm Sunday at Ilinden Sports Centre

Rockdale Ilinden will be determined to put their horror record against APIA Leichhardt to bed when the two sides go head to head at Ilinden Sports Centre on Sunday.

APIA has been a bogey team for Rockdale for the past few seasons, but with a possible premiership on the line the Steven Zoric coached side will be more driven than ever to take all three points.

Rockdale are second on the ladder, only one point behind league leaders Sydney United 58.

Tomoki Wada will be key to victory in this match, with the Japanese import becoming arguably the most important player in Rockdale's line up.

The dynamic midfielder has shown the full gamut of skills in the centre of the park as well as incredible game IQ as demonstrated with his

sensational goal last round as he chipped the keeper from 45 yards out after some brilliant quick thinking.

The strike force of Amaury Gauthier, Alec Urosevski and Nikola Taneski have also been in fine form as have the defensive unit of Michael Neill and Daniel Petkovski.

Looking to stop them will be an APIA side which should be full of confidence after a narrow victory last week.

It has been a difficult season for the reigning champions and with finals all but out of the picture, APIA will be focused on ending their season on a high note.

Chris Payne was a tough customer for the Rangers defence last week and will be looking to test Rockdale's backline.

He broke the deadlock last Friday and will be hoping to extend his goalscoring run.

The club is hoping to see more of its experienced stars return with Themba Muata-Marlow looking at getting back to the pitch after an injury layoff.

APIA will use their stunning winning record against Rockdale to give themselves a mental edge but they will need more than that if they are to snatch victory on Sunday.

Sydney United 58 has jumped into top spot of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition as Round 8 came to a close on Sunday.

With only three weeks left in the regular season, the battle for Premiership honours is set to go down to the wire.

United 58 claimed a massive victory against rivals Marconi to move ahead in the title race.

Rockdale Ilinden's big win against Sydney FC has them only a point behind, while Sydney Olympic's loss meant they drop to third, two points behind the leaders.

It was a big week for APIA Leichhardt and Blacktown City who both claimed vital victories after a long winless run.

APIA Leichhardt 1 (Payne 85') – Mt Druitt Town Rangers 0 at Lambert Park

A Chris Payne penalty has helped APIA Leichhardt to their first win in a month defeating Mt Druitt Town Rangers 1-0 at Lambert Park on Friday.

It was a much-needed victory and a sure confidence booster for APIA who have struggled during the rebooted season.

The visitors made a fast start to the match and were inches away from taking an early lead when a long-range effort cannoned off the upright in the sixth minute.

APIA forced two big saves from Rangers keeper Carlos Saliadarré midway through the half as both teams traded chances without capitalising.

The match remained deadlocked at 0-0 during the half-time interval, but it looked destined to change with APIA making a strong case after the restart.

Some desperate defending from Mt Druitt denied a brilliant APIA chance in the 64th minute, but it all came unstuck for the visitors eight minutes from time when Payne won his side a penalty.

The veteran marksman fired into the back of the net from the spot to secure all three points and the win.

Manly United 1 (Cholakian 24') – Blacktown City 2 (Lewis 19', Bangura 28') at Cromer Park

A brilliant attacking performance in the first half has helped Blacktown City to their first win of the rebooted season as they defeated Manly United 2-1 at Cromer Park on Friday.

It was Blacktown's first win in eight weeks with the three points moving them off the bottom of the ladder.

The visitors made a rapid start to the match and had Manly on the back foot early.

Blacktown was rewarded for their early endeavour winning a penalty in the 17th minute.

City's Lewis had his spot-kick saved by a sensational

diving effort from Manly shot-stopper Dylan Mitchell. Still, unfortunately for the home side, the ball bounced straight back to the Blacktown skipper who fired into the net with his second effort.

Manly hit back almost immediately courtesy of a powerful, driven free-kick from captain Brendan Cholakian which deflected off a defender and into the back of the net to make it 1-1.

The action was end to end, and in the 29th minute, Blacktown took the lead once again.

Suleyman Bangura swooped on an errant backpass from Manly's defence on the edge of the penalty area before firing into the back of the net with a composed shot past the outstretched arms of keeper Mitchell.

Bangura went inches away from scoring another on the cusp of half-time when a long-range shot sailed narrowly wide.

Blacktown continued to have the ascendancy in the second half with Adam Berry hitting the crossbar from a sublime curling free-kick after 62 minutes.

Scott Balderson had a late chance to snag an equaliser for the home side, but it was expertly saved as City clung on to end their winless streak.

Western Sydney Wanderers (Auglah 46', 60') v North Shore Mariners (Smith 26') at Valentine Sports Park

A second-half brace from the highly talented Ali Auglah has helped Western Sydney Wanderers to a 2-1 come from behind victory against North Shore Mariners at Valentine Sports Park on Saturday.

The 18-year-old striker fired moments after the restart to score an equaliser before securing the win with a composed penalty.

It was the Mariners who had started the stronger of the two sides and took a 1-0 lead after 26 minutes when Mitchell Smith made the most of an enterprising run from Charles William to score from 10 yards out.

North Shore would hold onto their lead until the half-time interval before Western Sydney found an equaliser on seconds after the restart.

Auglah tapped past the keeper to finish a rapid Wanderers counter-attack which went from one end to the other in less than 10 seconds.

Only 15 minutes later the Wanderers would take the lead when Auglah fired from the penalty spot after Chris Lindsey was taken down inside the edge of the box.

The Mariners pushed for an equaliser, but it wasn't to be with the Wanderers clinging on for the win and all three competition points.

Wollongong Wolves (Okada 19') 1 – Sydney Olympic 0 at Albert Butler Memorial Park

Wollongong Wolves have injected life into their Premiership hopes edging competition leaders Sydney Olympic at Albert Butler Memorial Park on Sunday.

A Takeru Okada goal midway through the first half was the difference with the Wolves now within three points of top spot after the win.

Wollongong took control of the contest from the opening whistle and appeared a side on a mission as they took the game to their premiership rivals.

In the 19th minute, the home side was rewarded for their dominance when Okada fired past the keeper after dribbling past three Olympic defenders to give Wollongong a 1-0 lead.

It should've been 2-0 in the 38th minute when the Wolves won a penalty after the referee ruled a handball in the box against Olympic defender Thomas Whiteside.

However, Thomas James spurned the chance, firing his penalty kick wide with Wollongong taking a 1-0 lead into half-time.

Sydney Olympic bounced back in the second half and found their mojo in attack to put pressure on the Wolves defence.

However, the visitors failed to make the most of their opportunities in front of goal spurning chance after chance.

It would prove to be a deciding factor in the game with Olympic unable to find an equaliser as Wollongong clung on to claim a win and a vital three competition points.

Sydney United 58 (Antelmi 65', Sim 68') 2 – Marconi Stallions (Jesic 23') 1 at Sydney United Sports Centre

Sydney United 58 has shot to the top of the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition with a 2-1 win against local rivals Marconi Stallions.

A second-half flurry from United 58 was the turning point with the home side scoring two goals in three minutes to fight back from 1-0 down.

United 58 were unlucky not to take the lead inside the first 20 minutes when Patrick Antelmi fired into the side netting after going around.

However, it was Marconi who took the lead in the 23rd minute thanks to a textbook set-piece.

Marko Jesic headed home from close range after being set up from a lofted header from Nathan Millgate.

Both sides were creating chances but lacked the finishing touch to capitalise on their opportunities.

Marconi would hold their lead into the half time break,

but United 58 was far from a beaten team after the first 45 minutes.

It took only 15 minutes into the second stanza for the home side to hit back with Antelmi completing a sublime passing move.

A brilliant ball from Yianni Perkatis found Glen Trifiro on the edge of the penalty area who then set up Antelmi to tap in with a cutting pass to the back post which dissected the Marconi defence.

Moments later United 58 took the lead thanks to more brilliance from Perkatis.

The midfielder delivered a well-weighted lofted ball over the backline which fell perfectly for Matt Sim to fire past the goalkeeper and make it 2-1 for the home side.

It set up a tense finish to the match, but United 58 were able to cling on and take a vital three competition points which catapulted them to top of the competition ladder.

Rockdale Ilinden (Neill 45', Gauthier 52, Uroevski 80', Wada 82') 4 v Sydney FC 0 at Ilinden Sports Centre

A dominant Rockdale Ilinden has boosted their Premiership hopes with a 4-0 win against Sydney FC at Ilinden Sports.

A Michael Neill goal on the cusp of half-time had Rockdale in the driver's seat after the first 45 minutes, but it was their three goals in the second stanza which secured the result.

It was a tight contest from the opening whistle with both teams unable to capitalise on their chances.

With the match headed for a scoreless stalemate at the half, Rockdale claimed a surprise goal as Micheal Neill fired in from the left edge of the penalty area after a brilliant run off the win.

Rockdale's momentum carried on after the restart, and it took less than ten minutes for the home side to double their lead.

Amaury Gauthier delivered a clinical finish from close range to tap home from 6 yards out after a driven cross into the box.

Rockdale made it 3-0 with ten minutes left on the clock when the club's 'local baker' star frontman Alec Uroevski fired into the back of the net after Tomoki Wada stole the ball from the Sydney FC defence.

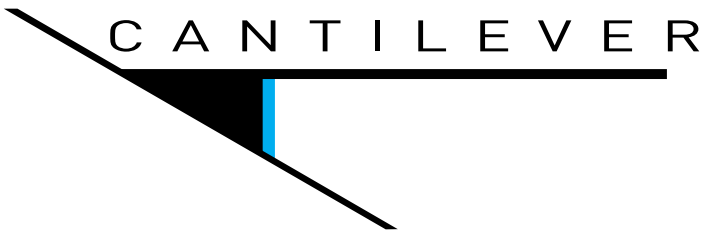

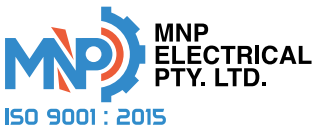
