There is no more time for excuses and no more second chances because It's finals time in the National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition.

The condensed finals schedule this season means there is even more pressure on remaining four sides Sydney United 58, Sydney Olympic, Wollongong Wolves and Rockdale City as they battle for a spot in the grand final and a shot at championship glory.

First placed Rockdale Ilinden FC will be gunning for the Premiership and Championship double on Saturday night when they host fourth-placed Sydney Olympic at Ilinden Sports Centre.

While on Sunday, second-placed Wollongong Wolves will host third-placed Sydney United 58 at Albert Butler Memorial Park.

Rockdale Ilinden FC v Sydney Olympic, 7pm Saturday at linden Sports Centre

Rockdale Ilinden's time for celebration is over and it is time to get back to business as the newly crowned premiers take on Sydney Olympic at Ilinden Sports Centre this Saturday.

The Steven Zoric coached side created history last week as they secured Rockdale's first Premiership in more than half a century with an exciting 2-1 win against North Shore Mariners to finish the season ahead of second-placed Wollongong on goal difference.

It has been an incredible campaign for Rockdale

who have finally delivered on their potential after years of falling short.

Zoric has managed to get the most out of his squad and found a consistency which has been lacking in previous seasons.

It is the midfield which has been Rockdale's powerhouse this year with Japanese playmaker Tomoki Wada the fulcrum.

Wada is a brilliant box-to-box midfielder who operates the middle of the pitch and is just as capable of scoring goal as he is creating them.

Mitchell Stamatellis has also provided muchneeded experience and composure

Defensively Rockdale has also made a massive jump forward this season with the tandem of Daniel Petkovski and Banri Kanaizumi helping their team finish the campaign with the best defensive record.

They will be tested in a big way on Saturday against the high profile Sydney Olympic attack of Charles Lokolingoy, Fabio Ferreira and Adam Parkhouse.

Olympic started the season well but have slowed in the lead up to the finals as was evident in their 1-1 draw against Mt Druitt in the final round.

The Ante Juric coached side have struggled to get the most out of their highly credentialed squad and will need to rediscover the formula to their early-season success.

Experienced NPL NSW Men's campaigners

like Jason Madonis, Thomas Whiteside and Christopher 'Hagi' Gligor will need to lead from the front in a season-defining match.

Olympic will look to attack early and the question will be if Rockdale is focused on the job at hand or are still celebrating their premiership win.

Alec Urosevski has had the pressure of being Rockdale's primary offensive weapon lifted off his shoulders this season and if he is used as a super-sub like he was last week could be the man to change the game while Amaury Gauthier has also been in lethal form and could pose a huge threat.

This match is very even on paper and with a grand final berth on the line, neither side is going to take it easy.

Wollongong Wolves may have narrowly missed out on securing back-to-back premiership, but it means they will be more determined than ever when they host Sydney United 58 for a spot in this season's grand final.

It is the second straight year these two sides have faced off at this stage of the competition with United 58 claiming a shock upset to secure a grand final berth in 2019.

Despite a dominant 5-2 win against Manly United in the final round, it wasn't enough for the Luke Wilkshire coached Wolves to end the season in first place after narrowly falling short on only goal difference.

It's a result which will surely fire-up the South Coast based side and of course Wilkshire going into this crunch clash.

Wollongong has been a model of consistency for most of the season and it is this which will play a major role if they're to qualify for the grand final.

Defenders Taylor McDonald and Nick Littler have been sound at the back all season for Wollongong setting a brilliant platform for the rest of the side to build from.

However, it is the Wolves attack which has been their biggest strength over the second half of the season.

Japenese playmaker Takeru Okada has been in scintillating form this campaign providing a playmaking outlet for the side as well as chipping in with a few goals of his own.

Marcus Beattie scored a hat-trick in Wollongong's final game of the regular season and will come into the finals series brimming with confidence.

Finally, the pairing of Thomas James and Josh Bingham at the top of the attack gives Wollongong two of the leagues best strikers and is sure to create plenty of headaches for the opposition.

That team will be a United 58 outfit who claimed a dominant 4-2 win against APIA in the final round.

The Anthony Crea coached side have already claimed a victory on the road against Wollongong this season and will be more than a handful to contain.

Boasting a midfield full of skilful scheming playmakers who can cut a defence to pieces with a few passes, United 58 are a side which can win a game in more ways than one.

The group of Glen Trifiro, Devante Clut, Mat Sim and Yianni Perkatis are tricky customers who are just as adept at playing through a solid defensive block as they are stinging their opponent on the counter.

Leading the charge upfront is prolific marksman Patrick Antelmi.

Much has been said about how Antelmi has lifted his game to a new game this season after a stint with A-League outfit Western United.

The former Blacktown City star has long been a talented attacking option, but this season he has evolved into a complete forward capable of scoring from any situation.

This game has the potential to be a shootout with both sides likely to flex their attacking firepower at every opportunity.

Expect this game to go down to the wire as both Wollongong and United 58 are capable of snaring a late goal or two.

There is set to be plenty of fireworks in this one and with a grand final place on the line expect nothing less.

ZORIC CONFIDENT HIS TROOPS WILL BE AT THE 'BIG DANCE'

"Uro has had a very difficult year due to COVID-19 affecting the family business and difficulty in balancing the business, family and football.

"Initially, Urosevski could not commit 100% due to the added load in working the business and having a young family but his passion for football, club and community ensured that he would again take part which he has been instrumental to the clubs success this season.

"As a coach, it's has been an honour to work with a player of his ability and drive to always, even with his achievements, in improving his game. He is a coach's delight.

"His presence in the dressing room and on the park is phenomenal."

Traditionally, matches against Rockdale always prove to be thrilling ones and Saturday evening's encounter is sure to be just that as the llinden Sports Centre will play host to a blockbuster affair.

"Rockdale is a strong team and Ilinden is always

a tough place to go. They've been consistent all season and won the Premiership for a reason.

Even though the win did not reward the Wolves with the Premiership thanks to Rockdale Ilinden also winning on the final day, Beattie was delighted with his three-goal haul that's put the striker in good stead for this Sunday's crucial do or die semi-final clash against rivals Sydney United 58 at Albert Butler Memorial Park.

"Yes of course I am very happy to firstly be contributing to the team's success and then obviously I absolutely love scoring goals so to get the hat-trick is always a very good feeling.



"With regards to the Premiership, we got so close with just the goal difference being the margin, so a little disappointing to not get there in the end, but I feel like that just gives us even more motivation to go out there and win the Grand Final now.

The year itself has proved to be a healthy challenge for the former A-Leaguer as after the season recommenced once again following the COVID lockdown, the club also saw a new coach at the helm in Anthony Crea due to Zeljko Kalac signing in Greece following Tony Popovic forming part of the coaching staff at Xanthi FC.

"It has just been positive to be able to get back out there and get some sort of a season in. "The thought of no football for the whole season would have been devastating for the football community and given the situation in other states, we are very lucky to have been able to play.

"Different teams have taken different approaches but for us just being able to play and enjoy our football again has been great.

"Having Ant (Anthony Crea) and a few others around behind the scenes has been great. Ant has been to the top of the game and seen it all, he knows how to get us ready for the big moments. We have been training for the finals since the end of last year so we are ready to go."

The title went down to the wire with Rockdale's superior goal difference the deciding factor as they narrowly edged a fast-finishing Wollongong Wolves to snare a historic first premiership in more than half a century.

Wins for Wollongong, Sydney United 58 and Sydney Olympic's draw in Round 11 wrapped up the top four setting up a blockbuster finals series which will get underway next week.

Sydney FC finished their season off with a win but it was a bittersweet result as United 58's victory against APIA meant the Young Sky Blues narrowly missed out on a maiden finals appearance.

Blacktown City made it four wins from four to end their campaign on a high note, while it was disappointment for 2019 grand final winners APIA who secured the wooden spoon after finishing the rebooted season in last place.

Rockdale will now take on Sydney Olympic while the Wollongong Wolves will face Sydney United 58 with the winners meeting in this year's 2020 NPL NSW Men's Grand Final.

Marconi Stallions 0 – Sydney FC 3 (Swibel 10', 38', Wood 90')

Sydney FC have finished their season in winning fashion after they cruised to a one-sided 3-0 victory against a listless Marconi Stallions at Marconi Stadium on Friday.

It was a bittersweet victory for the Young Sky Blues after Sydney United's big win in Friday's late match meant Jim van Weeran's side would narrowly miss out on a maiden finals berth finishing the season in fifth place.

Sydney made a fast start to the contest and were rewarded for their early endeavour when Jordi Swibel fired past the keeper after some

questionable defending from the home side.

The visitors made two big stops midway through the half to deny Marconi an equaliser.

In the 25th minute an Anthony Frangie volley was blocked on the line by some desperation defending, before Nathan Milgate's effort in the 27th minute hit the post before being cleared to safety.

Marconi's defensive frailties were punished again in the 38th minute when Swibel tapped home from close range after being left unmarked to send the visitors ahead 2-0 at the interval.

The Young Sky Blues came out of the break with increased energy and began to take over the contest creating several chances during the early exchanges of the half.

However, as all good goalscorers do, Wood found the back of the net in the final minute of the match to claim his 11th goal of the season and finish the league campaign as the competition's most prolific scorer.

Blacktown City 5 (Lewis 3', Jalloh 5', 15', 75', Collins 12') – Western Sydney Wanderers 2 (Constable 38', Auglah 79')

A four-goal salvo in the opening 15 minutes has helped Blacktown to a one-sided 5-2 win against local rivals Western Sydney Wanderers at Lily Homes Stadium on Friday.

Hassan Jalloh was the star of the show for Blacktown after he claimed a hat-trick in his side's most dominant performance of the season and their fourth win on the trot.

It was one-way traffic from the opening whistle with City Captain Matt Lewis giving the home side the lead with a well-hit volley from the

edge of the penalty area in the third minute of the match.

It began a tidal wave of goals with Jalloh netting twice in the fifth and 15th minute as well as a headed finish from Daniel Collins in the 12th minute.

The win temporarily moved United 58 into top spot, but it wasn't enough as wins for Wollongong and Rockdale on Sunday meant the Reds finished the season in third position.

Needing to win to keep their slim Premiership hopes alive, The Reds made a fast start to the match and took a 1-0 lead in the 15th minute courtesy of a clinical Matt Sim finish.

APIA marksman Chris Payne missed a golden opportunity in the 22nd minute firing wide of the post from only six yards out with only the keeper to beat.

Payne made up for his earlier error firing in from the penalty spot in the 28th minute to equalise after he was taken down in the box by a United 58 defender.
