

The National Premier Leagues NSW Men's Premiership goes on the line with round 11 this weekend set to be a blockbuster few days of state league action.

Rockdale Ilinden, Wollongong Wolves and Sydney Olympic and United 58 are in a four-way battle to finish the rebooted season on top and will leave no stone unturned in their mission to claim the title.

The battle for finals places are equally as tense. Only the top four qualify for the postseason in 2020 instead of the usual top five.

The final place in the finals will come down to a battle between Sydney United 58 and Sydney FC with both sides desperate not to miss out.

Individual honours will also go on the line with United 58's Patrick Antelmi (9) and Sydney FC's young gun Patrick Wood (9) in a race for the Golden Boot.

The round 11 action gets underway with a tripleheader on Friday night as APIA Leichhardt host Sydney United 58, Marconi is at home against Sydney FC, while Blacktown City take on Western Sydney Wanderers at Lily homes Stadium

Saturday will feature one match with Sydney Olympic heading west to Popondetta Park for a match against Mt Druitt Town Rangers.

Two matches will wrap up the round, the regular season and the premiership race with second-placed Wollongong Wolves facing off against Manly United, while first placed Rockdale hope to make history with a win against North Shore Mariners.

It will be one of the most exciting finishes to a National Premier Leagues NSW Men's season in recent history and not one to be missed.

APIA Leichhardt v Sydney United 58, 7 pm Friday at Lambert Park

Sydney United 58's slim Premiership title hopes will go down to the wire this Friday night as they travel to Lambert Park to take on APIA Leichhardt

It's a complicated scenario for United 58, who must win this match and hope the three teams above them on the ladder lose if they are to be crowned premiers.

While they are in with a shot of finishing the season on top, a loss against APIA could also see them crash out of the finals altogether.

This match has plenty riding on it for the boys from Edensor Park.

A dramatic draw against Rockdale last week would've been a heartbreaking result for the Anthony Crea coached side but they will be determined to bounce back in this match against the team they faced in last seasons Grand Final.

Sydney United 58 will go into the match as favourites but with so much pressure on them, the question is will they be able to deliver when they need to the most.

Marconi Stallions FC v Sydney FC, 7 pm Friday at Marconi Stadium

A historic maiden NPL NSW Men's finals berth is on the line for Sydney FC as they travel to Marconi Stadium on Friday to take on Marconi Stallions.

The Young Sky Blues need to win their match and hope Sydney United 58 lose if they are to qualify for the postseason for the first time.

They come up against a frustrated Marconi side who blew their hopes of a top-four finish last week when they were stunned 3-1 by a well drilled North Shore Mariners outfit.

Sydney also suffered defeat in round 10, going down 4-3 in a seven-goal thriller against Wollongong.

The young Sky Blues have impressed during the rebooted season and have exceeded the expectations of many with their free-scoring style.

Patrick Wood has been the side's breakout star and leads the golden boot race with ten goals. Expect to see Wood on the scoresheet again this week as he pushes for the scoring title.

Marconi pose a difficult challenge for Sydney and boast one of the best squads in the competition.

However, lapses in concentration have proved very costly for the Stallions

It will be interesting to see if coach Peter Tsekenis names a full-strength squad for this match now that his side is out of contention for the finals

Blacktown have found their groove in the last month and will be playing for a fourth straight win.

Mark Crittenden's side struggled for goals for most of the rebooted season but rediscovered the way to goal in a big way in the last few matches scoring 10 goals in their last three games.

Leroy Jennings return to form has been a big part of the form turnaround and he will again be the dangerman for the Seven Hills-based outfit.

They come up against a dogged Wanderers team which has pushed the leagues best teams all season but have struggled get the rewards their efforts have deserved.

The Patrick Zwaanswijk coached team will be out to finish their first season in the NSW top tier with a win.

Rory Jordan was a standout player this season, as was Kosta Grozos and Ali Auglah.

While finals are out of the equation for both teams expect this derby match to be a thrilling contest.

Mt Druitt Town Rangers v Sydney Olympic, 7 pm Saturday at Popondetta Park

Premiership success goes on the line for Sydney Olympic this Saturday when they travel to Popondetta Park to take on Mt Druitt Town Rangers.

Third-placed Sydney Olympic need to win this match and hope Wolves and Rockdale drop points if they are to lift the title.

The Ante Juric coached side claimed a narrow 1-0 win against Western Sydney Wanderers last week and will need to lift their game if they're to take home all three points in round 11.

Olympic's fearsome front three of Charles Lokolingoy, Adam Parkhouse and Fabio Ferreira will lead their side's charge with a big scoreline very much on the cards in this contest.

Looking to stop them is a Mt Druitt side who have had their moments this season with strong performances but have struggled at the back end of the season losing their last four games without scoring a goal during that stretch.

Coach Franco Cosentino will hope to inspire his troops to a big performance to end the season.

With so much on the line, Olympic will be giving everything to make sure they lift the premiership trophy.

However, the Rangers will be out to deliver one final performance an pull off one of the upsets of the season.

Rockdale Ilinden v North Shore Mariners, 3 pm Sunday at Ilinden Sports Centre

Rockdale Ilinden can claim a historic first ever NPL NSW Men's Premiership title this Sunday when they host North Shore Mariners at Ilinden Sports Centre.

All the Steve Zoric coached side need to do is match Wollongong's result with a draw or win

and the title is theirs.

It has been an incredible season for Rockdale which included a brilliant stretch at the start of the campaign where they went five games without conceding a goal.

The emergence of Tomoki Wada in the middle of the park has also been a major turning point for Rockdale with the Japanese import controlling the midfield and creating numerous chances.

In attack Alec Urosevski has for years been required to carry the responsibility of scoring for Rockdale, but in 2020 that hasn't been the case with Nikola Taneski and Amaury Gauthier providing plenty of support upfront.

Looking to stop them is a North Shore side which is flying high after a shock 3-1 upset of Marconi in round 10.

The Mariners have flashed moments of brilliance all season but last week they were able to piece it all together in their best performance of the campaign.

Captain Chris Lindsay has put in his claim as the best free-kick taker in the competition with two stunning set-piece goals in as many weeks, while Nelson Pyl's strike last week was a contender for goal of the season.

Rockdale will be favourites for this match and will leave nothing in the tank as they attempt to secure the premiership.

REVIEWS

The National Premier Leagues NSW Men's competition is set to go down to the wire after a thrilling week of Round 10 action setting up a three-way sprint to the title.

The penultimate week of the competition lived up to expectation delivering plenty of twists and turns.

Rockdale Ilinden clung onto top spot with 21 points ahead of the final matchday next week but have Wollongong Wolves and Sydney Olympic hot on their tail.

Sydney United 58's premiership hopes took a major tumble this week with a costly draw.

The week's other games also had plenty of surprises with huge wins for North Shore Mariners and Blacktown City.

With a top 4 finals series up for grabs round 11 looks huge but let's look at what unfolded in round 10.

Manly United 1 (Pandurevic 55') – Mt Druitt Town Rangers 0 at Cromer Park

A second-half strike from Dejan Pandurevic has helped Manly United snatch a narrow 1-0 win against Mt Druitt Town Rangers at Cromer Park.

The star winger's finish was the difference as the home side did just enough to claim all three points in a thrilling end to end contest.

Manly started the stronger of the two sides creating a handful of chances which were spoiled by the brilliant shot-stopping of Mt Druitt keeper Carlos Saliadarre.

Manly defender Sam Gallagher nearly broke the deadlock 10 minutes before the break but his header crashed off the woodwork with the game going into halftime locked scoreless.

It was much of the same after the restart as Manly went on the offensive.

Saliadarre pulled off a spectacular diving save to tip a Kieran Paull effort over the crossbar only moments into the second stanza.

In the 55th minute, Manly finally found their breakthrough when Pandurevic broke free of his defender on the right-wing before firing low into the bottom corner of the net.

Richie Cardozo had two chances to add to the score later in the match but the experienced frontman was unable to find the back of the net.

The boys from the Northern Beaches were not troubled in the dying stages of the match clinging on for victory and all three points.

Blacktown City 3 (Berry 56', 85', Jalloh 62') – APIA Leichhardt 0 at Lily's Football Stadium

A three-goal second half has helped Blacktown City cruise to a dominant 3-0 win against APIA Leichhardt at Lily's Football Stadium on Friday.

A brace from Adam Berry and a brilliant finish from Hassan Jalloh was the difference as Blacktown made it two wins on

the trot.

It was an even opening to the contest with APIA's Tynan Diaz testing the Blacktown keeper early.

Luke Turnbull was called into action at the other end midway through the first half to deny Rhett Desilva.

Neither side was able to make the most of the changes in the opening 45 minutes as the match remained scoreless at the break.

However, it didn't take long for Blacktown to open the scoring after the restart as Berry nailed a sublime free-kick which sailed over the wall and into the top corner to make it 1-0 in the 55th minute.

Blacktown had found their groove and were able to double their lead moments later when Jalloh rounded the keeper to net his side's second goal of the clash.

Berry wrapped up the result with a clinical finish from the left-hand side of the penalty area in the 86th minute to make it 3-0 and wrap up all three competition points.

Marconi Stallions 1 (Jesic 85') – North Shore Mariners 3 (Williams 40', Lindsay 68', Pyl 81') at Marconi Stadium.

North Shore Mariners have caused one of the boilovers of the season stunning Marconi Stallions 3-1 at Marconi Stadium on Friday.

The result has thrown the Stallion's finals hopes into disarray in what was a wild night at The Palace.

From the opening whistle, the Mariners were on the front foot testing Nenad Vekic in the Marconi goal.

The game was forced into an untimely hiatus midway through the first stanza with the floodlights going out and the match out on hold for more than 20 minutes.

The break recharged the Mariners who struck almost instantly after the match resumed courtesy of a slick finish from Charles Williams to give the visitors a 1-0 lead at the half-time break.

Mariners captain Chris Lindsay continued his push to be known as the leagues best free-kick taker when he scored with a delightful curling effort to make it 2-0 in the 68th minute.

North Shore wrapped up the win in audacious style 10 minutes from full-time when substitute Nelson Pyl chipped the keeper from 35 yards out only moments after coming on

Marko Jesic claimed a late goal for Marconi but it was too little too late for the home side as the visitors secured all three points.

Sydney Olympic 1 (Madonis 68') – Western Sydney Wanderers 0 at Lambert Park

Sydney Olympic has kept their premiership hopes alive with a narrow 1-0 win against Western Sydney Wanderers at Lambert Park on Saturday.

A second-half strike from captain Jason Madonis was enough for Olympic as they secured a vital three competition points.

It was the Wanderers who were on the ascendency early on with several early shots on goal testing the keeper.

The visitors were forced to clear off the line to deny Zach Mackenzie in the 25th minute.

Dean Pelakanos missed a brilliant chance to give Western Sydney the lead in the dying stages of the first half when he fired over the bar from only nine yards out.

It was the Wanderers on the attack again when the second half began, with Rory Jordan unable to beat the keeper in the 56th minute.

After absorbing pressure for most of the match, Olympic took their chance in the 68th minute with Madonis scoring from the edge of the penalty area to cap off a brilliant counter-attack.

Oliver Puflett had a chance to double Olympic's lead in the final minutes of the contest but fired wide.

It didn't matter in the end with the home side clinging on to take the win and remain in the premiership race going into the final round.

Sydney United 58 2 (Antelmi 33', 66') – Rockdale Ilinden 2 (Gauthier 68', Wada 88') at Sydney United Sports Centre

A thrilling second-half fightback has helped Rockdale snatch a dramatic 2-2 draw against fierce rivals Sydney United 58 at Sydney United Sports Centre on Sunday.

Tomoki Wada's 88th-minute penalty broke the hearts of United 58 fans and kept Rockdale on top of the table and in the hunt for a historic NPL NSW Men's Premiership going into the final round.

For United 58, the result all but kills their dreams of finishing the season on top.

The home side started the better of the two and took the lead 33 minutes in with superstar striker Patrick Antelmi converting from the penalty spot to give United 58 a 1-0 lead at the break.

Antelmi would be the dangerman again for the home side after the restart when he fired the Reds into a 2-0 lead in the 66th minute with his ninth goal of the campaign and second of the match.

However, the tide would turn only moments later with Amaury Gauthier making the most of a defensive mixup to halve the deficit with a cool finish from inside the box to make it 2-1.

Both sides were desperate for victory and fought hard for every possession heading into the final moments of the match.

With the game on a knife's edge, a boneheaded play from Sydney United's Anthony Tomelic cost his side greatly,

giving up a crucial penalty by pulling down Gauthier in the box when the striker had no chance of getting to the ball.

Wada stepped up and clinically fired past the keeper to make it 2-2, completing the comeback as they snatched a vital competition point to keep them in the Premiership

Sydney FC 3 (Wood 63', 93', Main 88') – Wollongong Wolves 4 (Bingham 4', 21', James 8', Okada 57') at llinden Sports Centre

Wollongong Wolves have held off a fast-finishing Sydney FC to triumph 4-3 in a seven-goal thriller at llinden Sports Centre on Sunday.

The Wolves took a four-goal lead but they were forced to fight for their competition points as determined Sydney FC fell narrowly short of pulling off a wild second-half comeback.

The win moves the Wolves onto equal points with competition leaders Rockdale ahead of the final round of the season setting up an incredible sprint to the premiership on the last day of the season.

Wollongong raced out of the gates and took a 1-0 lead after only four minutes with Josh Bingham tapping home after some brilliant lead-up work from Takeru Okada.

It was 2-0 only moments later with Thomas James towering above his defender to head into the top right corner of the net

Sydney FC's young defence were struggling and it only got worse with Bingham claiming his second to make it 3-0 in the 21st minute.

The start couldn't have been any better for the visitors and they were unlucky not to score again before the half-time break

It took Wollongong 10 minutes after the restart to find a fourth goal and wasn't it special.

Okada dribbling past two defenders and finishing with the outside of his weak foot after setting up the move with a skilful scorpion kick flick-on.

The result was seemingly decided, but Sydney FC had other ideas and hit back through prolific striker Patrick Wood in the 63rd minute to make it 4-1.

Sydney threw everything forward and snagged their second goal to make it 4-2 courtesy of Thomas Main with two minutes left on the clock.

When Wood found his second in added time to make it 4-3 it made for a nervy finish for the visitors.

However, time was against the home side with their valiant efforts not enough to secure a draw with Wollongong clinging on for victory.
