MATCH PREVIEW

v Manly United

Manly United comes to WIN Stadium for today's match for the Round 2 fixture in the 2021 NPLNSW Mens 1 with this match promising to be a riveting rejoinder. In matches since 2015, the seashiders have scored thirteen goals against the Wollongong Wolves at a goal per game average of 1.18 while the converse team ratio was 1.81 from twenty goals.

THE OPPOSITION TODAY – MANLY UNITED FC

New recruits to the club by coach Adam Griffiths include former Sydney FC Youth player Benjamin Koop together with Jesse Piriz from Northbridge, Japanese player Seiya Kambayashi from Bulli FC and Alen Aganovic from Blacktown City.

One of the honours won for the Manly United club was the NSW First Division premiership winner in 1999. The team won fourteen of their twenty-two league games with three draws and five losses, scoring sixty-three goals and conceding twenty-one with a goal difference have plus forty-two. Forty-five points were amassed and that was six ahead of the second placed team. The win /loss ratio was 0.86.

In the 2020 Reboot season due to the Corona virus, Manly concluded the eleven game competition in eighth position on twelve points, from three wins and three draws. Fourteen goals were scored with eighteen being conceded. The best result sequence without loss was two games Rounds 1-2, draw and draw. The worst result sequence was two losses in

Rounds 7-8. The most impressive winning score was 5-2 against APIA in Round 6 with 2-5 being the converse, against the Wollongong Wolves in Round 11.

Manly United has in the last five seasons finished in 3rd, 4th, 8th, 9th and 8th positions.

THE MATCH-UP

Manly occupies 7th position on the points table on one point from one draw while the Wolves sits in 12th position on nil points. As the Wolves neglected to score in Round 1, Manly's only scorer has been Seiya Kambayashi.

In Round 1 the Wolves went down by four without reply to Rockdale Ilinden and Manly United had a 1-1 draw with Mount Druitt Town Rangers.

The Wolves uncharacteristically shipped four goals in Round 1 and will want to ensure that lightning does not strike twice. Manly will throw down the gauntlet and will be slight favourites.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

In 2006 in Round 15, Manly comprised of Luke Femia, Richie Williams (Capt.), Daniel Lock, Nikolai Topor-Stanley, Anthony Martin, Andrew Mailer, Scott Thomas, Ashley Ryan, Joey Schirripa, Michael Williams and James Monie. Bradley Groves, Roberto



Hamad and Robbie Cattanach replaced Mailer, Schirripa and M. Williams. The Wolves were Nathan Denham, Chris Rigopoulos, Ian Waldon, Andrew Mumford, Vedran Jaganjac, Dustin Wells, Dean Kerr, Chris Price, Ballamodou Conde (Capt.) Wayne Gibson, and Steve Hayes. Adam Casey and David Polidoro replaced Jaganjac and Gibson. The coaches were Phil Moss and John Turner respectively.

Manly scored first in the fourth minute through Monie with a flicked header going past Denham with another following in the twenty-fifth minute with a penalty kick being converted by Richie Williams after Jaganjac had been adjudged to have handled the ball. Monie struck again in the thirty-eight minute and the home team duly had a three-goal advantage at half time. With two Wolves being red carded, Mumford, the central defender and the impressive influential Hayes, the team was against it. Manly added one more with Schirripa being the scorer. Casey came on to score a consolation goal for the Wolves in the eighty-third minute but Monie brought up his hat trick four minutes later. Manly had produced a big win and this was the Wolves second biggest defeat of the season.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

Wolves Lachlan Scott, showed in the previous two seasons that his good touch and eye for goal will again entertain and provide dividends for his team.

Manly's defender Keiren Paull is an experienced defender with a penchant for overlapping down the sidelines and has stood out for his club on many occasions.

TWO SELECTED TOP SCORERS FOR MANLY UNITED - JAMES MONIE and ADAM FOTI

Monie, a striker, top scored with ten goals in the 2006 season with one being against Wolves in Round 6 coming in the sixty-eighth minute.

Five goals was the tally for Foti in 2012 with his first emanating in the sixteenth minute versus APIA Leichhardt Tigers in Round 5.

SELECTED TOP SCORERS FOR WOLLONGONG WOLVES - NICOLAS BERNAL and PHIL O'CONNOR

It was in the 2016 season that Argentinean Bernal top scored with a eighteen game tally for nine goals with his first of the season emanating in the Round 1 Hakoah Sydney City East clash at WIN Stadium on eighty-one minutes. His goal per game ratio was 0.5.

Englishman O'Connor achieved a high tally of sixteen goals in 1982 for a goal per game ratio of 0.55 from twenty-nine games. It was in the twenty-fifth minute of the Round 2 Sydney City encounter at Wollongong Showground that he brought up his first for this season.

SELECTED REPRESENTATIVE OF BOTH CLUBS - SAMUEL JACOB

Midfielder Jacob turned out for Manly United in the 2009 and 2011 season in the NSW competition and with the Wolves in 2012 and 2014 with two goals, one in each season. Both his goals were against the same club, Sydney United 58. His first goal occurred in the 2012 Round 15 clash scoring in the tenth minute. He rocketed home the ball from outside the penalty area. Earlier he played against Blacktown Spartans in Round 5. 'I unfortunately picked up a few knocks but my role in the team is to put myself about.' He scored in the 2014 Round 6 Sydney United 58 match tapping home in the fifteenth minute. He played eighteen League games in 2012 and two in 2014.

FEATURE STORY

STANDING ON THE TOP

'Standing on the top' are three players from the Wolves who are the only ones who have pulled off the highest goal count for the league competition in which they have performed, with this being a tremendous achievement to say the least. The goal hauls in question numbered twenty-one, eighteen and twenty-two with these feats occurring in the 2000/01, 2004/05 and 2019 seasons.

Besides having the scoring of goals in common, what other characteristics and similarities and differences are between these eminent strikers, Sasho Petrovski, Shane McGirr and Thomas James?

All of the aforementioned players scored multiple goals in a single match. Petrovski garnered the most hat tricks with a total of two in Rounds 21 and 24, while James was to the fore with one, in Round 2, the earliest of these strikes. While McGirr did not score a hat trick, he did in fact attain a quintuple of goals in Round 22. James achieved the most braces, five in all, Rounds 4,7,9,13 and 15. Petrovski scored three, Rounds 16, 19 and 30 while McGirr accomplished two, in Rounds 17 and 19. A common link between the brace scoring was that in most cases, a two or three round interval eventuated between these achievements.

Another commonality was each player scored in the final round of the league with the goals from Petrovski and James were each scored in the second half of the match, with three of McGirr's five also being hit in the second stanza. The team's final scored goals of the seasons all were completed in the last ten minutes of the each match, by James, Petrovski and McGirr, occurring in the eighty-first, eighty-third and eighty-eighth minutes respectively.

Two of these strikers scored in Round 1 of the season with McGirr scoring in the eleventh minute against Central Coast United and James scoring in the thirty-fourth minute versus Manly United. Petrovski's initial strike occurred in Round 6, with this effort is the one difference to the others.

Scoring in the finals series saw two of these players also achieving. Petrovski scored in both legs of the Major Semi-Final (in the sixty-ninth and sixth minute in order of the legs) and again in the Grand Final (on fifty-sixth minutes). James scored one each in

Elimination and in the Semi-Final of the FFA NPL Cup (Forty- second minute penalty and twenty-ninth minute goals respectively) before adding a brace in the Grand Final (a fifty-second minute penalty and in the extra time on one hundred and sixteen minutes.) McGirr's team unfortunately did not qualify for the finals.

As strikers are apt to demonstrate, these all goaled with headers, together with their feet, both inside and outside the penalty area with one having more proclivity closer in. McGirr had quick reflexes, was nimble and scored many goals from close range or inside the area and could turn players in tight situations, a typical goal poacher, while James would run at players and surge forward, provide twists and turns with facile movement, while his many goals emanated from outside the area or on the fringe or at times a little closer. Petrovski scored from distance or from close vicinity with his slick ball control he could take players on. Each player possessed very strong shots at times, was quick off the blocks and had the requisite skills for any situation that was presented. In short, consummate strikers.

Having a gun partner up front who also scored regularly and provided assists is also a common thread as James had Lachlan Scott and Petrovski had Stuart Young, while McGirr had a number of partners in Michael Clare, Paul Harries, and Daniel Aliffi.

One difference is the fact that McGirr only played one season with the Wolves and James is into his second season and keeps on scoring, while Petrovski scored quite a number of goals in the other seasons he played. McGirr played part of one season with APIA and while he scored two goals against his former team in 2006 in Round 3, he did not emulate the Wolves number of goals by a fair margin. However, even though three goals was his tally in 2006, this was enough to garner a share in the top scorer going for his club.

Indeed Sasho Petrovski, Shane McGirr and Thomas James are 'standing on the top' echelon of Wollongong Wolves strikers with their high scoring exploits. Their names will perpetuate in the annals of the competition and club history.

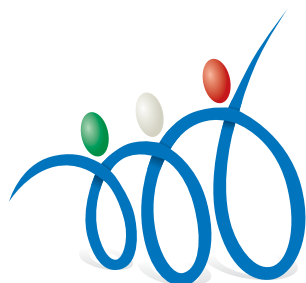
