MATCH PREVIEW

v Northbridge Bulls

Northbridge Bulls venture to WIN Stadium for today's 2021 Round 5 fixture in the competition against the Wollongong Wolves, with this promising to be a curious contest. Northbridge has scored one goal in a previous encounter (when they had an alternate name) while the Wolves have scored four in the same time period.

THE OPPOSITION TODAY - NORTHBRIDGE BULLS

Coach Mile Sterjovski has added former Marconi player Lachlan Sepping and former Wolves' striker Bul Juach to his squad together with Theph Theph and Giovanni Panuccio from Sydney Olympic. Rory Jordan, who played with Western Sydney Wanderers in the 2020 truncated season and was equal top scorer for his club, has joined also. As a player, coach Sterjovski began his first class playing career by turning out for the Wolves in two substitute appearances for the club in the 1995/96 NSL season.

The Northbridge Bulls were formerly known as North Shore Mariners and Northbridge FC, entered the Football NSW State League third tier in 2011 and in 2013 won the Division One Premiership, but ultimately were defeated in the Grand Final, losing to Balmain FC in extra time. The club finished 2019 season on top of the Mens 2 standings in both the league and the club championship thereby sealing promotion to Mens 1.

In the 2020 Rebooted eleven game season, Northbridge concluded the season on ten points in ninth position from achieving two victories and four draws. Mitchell Smith was the top scorer with four goals, joining four others on the score sheet. Three nil games eventuated and the best result sequence was two draws in Rounds 5 and 6 and the converse was three defeats in Rounds 2-4. The best result was 3-1 and 1-6 was the least impressive in Round 10 and 3 versus Marconi and Sydney FC respectively.

In Mens 2 for the last three seasons prior to 2020, North Shore has finished in 5th, 3rd and 1st positions, certainly an upward trajectory. Now in Mens 1, the club will need to maintain and lift the standards and will no doubt be capable of implementing this.

THE MATCH - UP

At this stage of the 2021 competition, the top scorers for each team are Taylor McDonald, Darcy

Madden, Lachlan Scott and Hamish Lamberton with one apiece for the Wolves, while Rory Jordan has tallied two goals for the Bulls.

Both teams have achieved one victory at this early stage of the competition and both teams had last weekend off due to the 'big wet' with a number of Mens 1 games being postponed as a consequence.

The ladder position for each club is seventh (Wolves) and eleventh (Northbridge). Both teams have accumulated four goals each in the three games played.

Sydney FC, defeated Northbridge, in the previous round, three goals to two, while the Wolves accounted for Mt. Druitt Town Rangers 3-0.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

Emmanuel Peters (NSM) is a goal scorer who has converted a fair tally of opportunities and has previously achieved against the Wolves. He positions himself adroitly within scoring range of the goal, has a strong shot and possesses speed.

Right-sided wing/back defender Taylor McDonald scored the club's first goal of the season displaying his tenacity and skill to convert from a Darcy Madden high ball. In games, McDonald chimes in with attacking forays and defends stoutly and safely and as measure of standing represented the NSW state team versus Queensland late in 2020. He is an integral member of the Wolves and will be up and down the right corridor as he goes about his duties.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

In the Round 4 2020 Reboot season, North Shore Mariners played the Wolves at Albert Butler Memorial Park, Kemblawarra. The line-ups were as follows: Wolves - Hayden Durose (GK), Harry Callahan, Nick Littler, Guy Knight, James Stojcevski Capt., Takeru Okada, Lachlan Scott, Marcus Beattie, Harrison Taranto, Chris Price and Taylor McDonald. Josh Bingham, Bul Juach, and Ethan Kambisios replaced Callahan, Knight, and Taranto. Mariners - Ryan Wood (GK), Chris Lindsay, Charles Williams, Emmanuel Peters, Jesse Piriz, Daniel Dias, Jack Musgrave, Eddie Caspers, Zac Sfiligoi, Jack Loughlin, Nelson Pyl and Mitchell Smith. Tristen Van Rhoon, Lawrence Frederick and Edward Lee replaced Dias, Caspers and Lee.

Scott scored the first goal five minutes in. A headed

on ball from a Guy Knight throw reached Scott and he converted by striking the ball in at the near post. Smith had a chance that Littler intercepted and Beattie had his shot blocked. Two minutes past the half hour, Scott eluded a player on the right side before putting an across the goal pass. Okada sprinted in the hit the ball home high into the goal. As the match progressed, Durose was there to repel Smith and Williams. After the half time break, the second of Stojcevski's corner kicks was headed down in a crowded area. The ball bounced and Littler was at the far post to convert. At three goals down, the North Shore team was not to be denied. Substitute Frederick picked up a headed out Littler ball, and set sail for the goal. Durose came to narrow the angle but Frederick lifted ball upwards. With the assistance of the breeze, the ball dipped into the goal. Kambisios blocked Sfiligoi as he shaped to score. In time added on, Scott brought up his brace. An Okada ball was headed on with Scott gaining possession. He subsequently scored with a powerful right-footed drive. Coach Wilkshire – 'what we can be is still more ruthless in front of goal... We worked on things and I was happy to see that today. ..The boys put in a good performance'. Littler – 'It was a good bounce back from last week. .. We controlled most of the game and deserved to win.' Price - 'we did play to our strengths.... It was a scrappy goal to concede but a win is a win.'

SELECTED TOP SCORERS FOR NORTHBRIDGE - MITCHELL SMITH and TOM BENTHAM

With eighteen goals to his credit in 2019, Smith was his team's top scorer with a goal per game ratio of 0.69. He also scored in the Elimination Final. Jesse Piriz had played a long pass over the opponents, Mounties Wanderers' defensive line before Smith gained possession. He shielded the ball from two defenders before scoring his nineteenth goal by directing a low shot past the custodian on twenty-eight minutes. Smith, in addition, was the club top

scorer in the previous season (2017) with a sixteen goal achievement.

English striker Bentham was the top scorer in 2014 and played two seasons with the club. In 2015, he scored six goals from six appearances, a goal per game ratio of 1.0

TWO SELECTED TOP SCORERS FOR WOLVES - THOMAS JAMES and SASHO PETROVSKI

James scored a season high twenty-two goals to become the club and competition top scorer in 2019 with a goal per game ratio of 1.0. He beat Sasho Petrovski's previous record season haul of twenty-one goals. He was a multi scorer in a single match on five occasions with a treble in Round 2, and four braces in Rounds 4, 7, 13 and 15. His initial goal in Round 1 was achieved at Butler Oval. Positioned at the far post he slotted home Takeru Okada's left field cross with a defender in attendance. His final season goal was from the penalty spot. Harry Callahan had taken possession of a Brendan Griffin pass on the edge of the penalty area. He turned and moved inside only to be impeded by a Marconi defender. James directed the ensuing spot kick with power and precision to the left side of the goal. The striker added four more in the 2019 FFA NPL Finals.

Striker Petrovski, the all time Wolves top scorer in all competitions, scored his twenty-one goal tally to top the count and set the record in the 2000/01 NSL season. His goal per game record for this season was 0.75. His multi game strikes numbered five, three hat tricks in Rounds 21, 24 and 30 and two braces in Rounds 16 and 19. His initial strike was against Parramatta Power in Round 6. He stole in between two defenders to head in Scott Chipperfield's in swinging cross from the left side. His final goal of the season was in Round 30. Petrovski scored the sixth of his teams goals versus Adelaide City after the good lead up play with a well-placed effort with seven minutes of the match remaining. He went on to score three more goals in the successful finals campaign.

CAPTAINS OF YOUR SHIP - PART 3

This article is the latest instalment of players who have had the honour of 'Captain' being bestowed beside their names on the team sheet and in addition have been at the forefront in leading their team onto the field of play.

BRENDAN GRIFFIN

It was the final match of the 2019 season in Round 22 and stalwart midfielder who determinedly fought his way back from an early season injury. With Marconi being the opposition, Griffin led from the front as he always plays and the team accomplished a victory and a clean sheet.

Griffin commented in my post match interview - 'Definitely was a proud moment. It was an honour given the season I've had...Leading them out today in a massive game, we wanted to finish right and as Luke said, winners don't lose.'

GUY KNIGHT

The left sided influential player was stand in captain in the away match to Edensor Park in Round 5 of the Rebooted League against Sydney United 58 and saw out the season including the FFA NPL finals matches with the captain's armband when the incumbent sustained a season defining injury. He was an inspiring captain with his consistent performances.

NICK LITTLER

Central defender Littler captained his side in the 2020 Round 3 match against new team North Shore Mariners, in the game that was expunged from the records due the corona virus. However, he deserved his elevation as he has displayed leadership as a senior player.

TAYLOR McDONALD

In two cup matches of 2019 against Coledale Waves and Pittwater RSL, McDonald lead the team to success through his dynamic deeds and encouragement.

JIM PRESTON

Against Adelaide City in the Round 25 of season 1982, goalkeeper Jim Preston was given the captain's armband as the usual captain Chris Dunleavy was unavailable to play but coached the

team never the less. The inaugural season shot stopper was the winning captain in this fixture with a 2-1 score line being the result.

LACHLAN SCOTT

Striker Scott began the 2021 season as captain and he leads the team with enthusiasm through his on field endeavours. He has shown his willingness to get things done in games as an example to all.

JAMES STOJCEVSKI

Influential midfielder was named team captain for the beginning of the 2020 season and before the competition hiatus due to the corona virus, Stojcevski was captain In Round 1 Sydney Olympic fixture before suffering an injury in this match and had to be replaced. He resumed the captaincy in the Rebooted league and lead the team up and including Round 5 until injury curtailed his season. He has shown composure on the field in most instances and leads through action.

STRENGTH TO ENDURE

A player who has shown 'strength to endure' played four seasons in his first stint at the Wollongong Wolves (under Wollongong Community FC and South Coast Wolves names at the time) and returned to the club to play in the historic winning team of 2019. In that year, the team annexed the FFA National Premier League Championship after indeed winning the NSW NPL Premiership after never being headed in all of the twenty-two rounds. This performer is a central defender who began as a left wing/back, and who achieves his share of goals, is very adept in heading away attacks, is strong in the tackle to win most of these duels, intercepts perceptively and his passing range is wide in distance and with precision. He is calm under pressure and works diligently with those around him and is on hand to shut down opposition offensive moves. As a measure of his standing, he made the NPL NSW 'Team Of The Week' twice in 2019, with his sterling performances and this defender, in the truncated 2020 campaign, played his sixth and final season in first grade at the club.

Nick Littler began his second stint at the club in the 2018 late season match-up with the A League club, Central Coast Mariners on 5th October at WIN Stadium and he certainly made his presence felt. He was solid at the back and floated in an early cross to cause the Mariners some consternation. He had previously played with the Mariners Youth Team in season 2011/12 and 2012/13. It was a successful sojourn at that as the team won the Championship in 2011/12 and concluded the season as runners-up in the league in his second season there. Along the way, Littler got onto the score sheet on a couple of occasions, with a twenty-first minute goal against at AIS at Pluim Park being one such time. He also scored against the same club in Round 13 scoring his team's fourth goal, an eighty-second minute strike.

Littler made his Wollongong debut in 2009 making his first grade debut in Round 19 versus Manly United at Macedonia Park on 12th September as a seventeen year old by coach Glen Fontana. He played one other match in this 2009 season coming off the bench in Round 22 in the 6-5 loss to APIA Leichhardt (then Sydney Tigers) and played until 2012. He was promoted to first grade after

playing in the Wolves' youth set-up from Under 11s onwards. He was captain of the Wolves Under 18s side, which won the Championship.

In 2010 he had eight starting appearances from Round 12 and two from the bench. In the Round 15 match with Sydney United 58, Littler was to the fore as he attempted to keep the Sydney United attackers at bay. He dispossessed the striker who had scored earlier, to deny him a likely brace, subdued another attack with a well-timed intervention from the attacking midfielder and again cleared out of defence after he thwarted an offensive manoeuvre. Following the match, he stated - 'It was a good match for me. I'm not the fastest guy. It was pretty tough.'

In 2011, his two goals eventuated in Rounds 20 and 22 versus Manly United and Sutherland Sharks. In all, this season he made fifteen starting league appearances. Following the Sharks match, he stated in my post match interview, 'It was very satisfying, getting the win, a goal and a clean sheet.' For his forty-five minute achievement, he headed in a Stepjan Paric corner kick, meeting the ball at the far post directing past the diving custodian. In the earlier match, on seventy-six minutes, Littler ran onto a Sean Robertson pass, scuttling through the defence. When in close firing distance he let fly, but the Sharks' custodian kept out the ball. However, it was not under his control and the rebound was propelled again by Littler, this time into the goal. He was not going to miss a second time. The assistant's flag was subsequently lifted, which placed the score in jeopardy for a time, though the referee ultimately signaled the goal. This did not go down well with the Manly coach and he was finally asked to leave his box following words with the referee.

At the end of the 2011 season Wollongong was against A-League club, Newcastle Jets at Memorial Park, Corrimal on 31st August. The defender was instrumental in assisting his team to achieve a clean sheet as they played out a 0-0 score.

A tally of twenty starting appearances was achieved in 2012 with one cup and finals game extra. Littler scored one goal and this was in Round 3 versus Rockdale City Suns at Crehan Park, Cringila. In the seventy-third minute, he let go with a powerful

left footed drive from twenty-five metres out that zoomed into the Suns' goal.

His final game at the Illawarra club for his first stint was a semi final match-up with Blacktown City with a 1.30 kick off on Saturday 8th September. During the proceedings, he chanced a long distance shot that unfortunately travelled wide, much to his chagrin.

As the seasons moved on, Littler was making his mark and progressed as a player with the likes of Jacob Timpano, Michael Robinson and Sasho Petrovski in his team as examples.

Littler moved north to Seymour Shaw Pak at Miranda for the 2013 season. At the Sutherland Sharks, he went on to ply his trade for a total of six seasons. While there, he more firmly established himself as a Premier League player with distinction, being a consummate defender and an attacker of commendable standard with his all round play. He scored a total of nine goals in the league with six of these coming in the 2016 season. He finished second on the goal achievers' list for his club in this season. He attained a brace in the seventeenth and forty-second minutes of the Round 2 Blacktown City encounter. Despite his team scoring three goals, alas Blacktown hit four. Another of his six goals for this season, was against the Wolves in Round 19, after he stole in at the far post to head home, ten minutes after interval.

There were two seasons when he did not feature on the score sheet, those being 2013 and 2017 but his defensive play rarely waned. However, Littler's initial score for Sutherland was in 2014 in the Round 7 Manly United match. On forty-eight minutes, he was on hand to score the first of the three goals for his team. His final goal for the Sharks was in 2018 and from twenty games was in Round 22, scoring his team's second, on seventy-three minutes in the victory over Blacktown City. Littler's defensive partners at the Sharks included Perry Moustakas and Jacob Tratt.

Littler was selected in the 2016 'Team Of The Year' after being nominated six times in that season's 'Team of The Week' after his consistently impressive performances. He was also recognized in the 'Team Of The Week' in 2011 (x4), 2012 (x3), 2013 (n/a) 2014 (x1), 2017 (x1) and 2018 (x2)



After returning to the Wolves for the 2019-2020 seasons, he achieved his greatest team success to add to his earlier accolades. He played twenty-one league games, with one cup outing, two appearances in the NPL NSW finals and three appearances in the FFA NPL Finals, together with three League goals and another in the FFA NPL finals.

Following his team's 4-0 APIA Leichardt result in Round 13, Littler stated post match - 'It was close to one of our best of the year, especially in the second half. And to score four goals against the team that was coming second. It's up to us to keep going. If we take the same mindset into each game, we will come out on top.' Never a truer word spoken as it turned out.

After putting his former team to the sword by four goals in Round 19, Littler stated - 'It was great (the win) and it is always nice. They gave us a tough match in the first round and it was good to come out and show what we have... In the first minute they had us under the pump and were playing some really good football as well...it was one of those games and we came out on top fortunately... We definitely took our chances and the one from TJ

was really good. They had a couple of chances and Justin made some good saves and it always nice to get a clean sheet.... Hopefully we can keep it going.' During the match, Littler intervened to deny the Shark's Spanish striker as well as shutting down other Sharks' attacking forays.

Littler scored the fastest goal of the season in the seventeenth minute strike in the Round 21 Rockdale City Suns encounter. With Taylor McDonald, Ben Tosi and Thomas James were all involved prior to Littler striking with a strong right-footed effort into the goal for his team's first of two. He was selected in 'Team Of The Week' after his performance in this fixture.

The central defender was a stalwart at the back and his partnership with Nikola Djordjevic flourished to the point that they were practically impregnable as indeed the team only shipped seventeen goals during the twenty-two rounds at a rate of 0.77 per game. He stated following the APIA Leichhardt game in Round 13 – 'I think our combination is getting stronger. It kind of shows that when he was missing, we lost.'

Littler has very influential in the 2019 team of stars and the combinations that he was involved in assisted the team to success.

His goal versus Canberra Olympic in the Semi-Final Littler had chested down a James Stojcevski free kick. The ball ran loose and Lachlan Scott scooted after it as it ran across the goal face. Scott retrieved possession then slotted the ball back to Littler and he had an easy task of converting.

Subsequent to the FFA NPL Semi Final 2 match with Perth being the opposition, Littler stated after proceedings, - 'I think in the second half they dominated us and they put a lot of pressure on us. Credit to the defence and all the boys, we held up shop...we kept pressing and pressing and eventually we got the second.' (goal).

In the 2020 season, Littler started as he finished off in 2019 earning the plaudits in the first round clash with Sydney Olympic at Belmore Sports Ground. However, that match was expunged from the records as Covid 19 pandemic hit, cancelling most activities. However, a rebooted season of eleven games began on August 2nd and Littler concluded playing nine of these games. After the team had defeated North Shore Mariners 4-1 in Round 4 after losing to Marconi the previous week, Littler stated



post match - 'It was a big bounce back from last week. I thought we controlled most of the game and deserved to win. It is always nice to get on the score sheet but I would have preferred a clean sheet...They made us work for everything and it wasn't going to be easy in these kind of conditions, but it was most deserved.' For his goal James Stojcevski's corner kick drifted in with the defence unable to extricate the ball from the crowded area. The ball was headed down, with Littler appearing at the far post to thread the ball into the goal.

For the Wolves, the central defender played seventy-eight league games, two cup and seven finals appearances for a combined total of eighty-seven appearances for the club. (Plus two more in the two 2020 expunged games are taken into account.)

Nick Littler has certainly shown 'strength to endure' to perform at this NPL level. He has since moved on to Bulli FC in Illawarra Premier League. He had made a great contribution to the Wolves.

AGE IS NO BARRIER

Age is no barrier to achievement and the following five players have set the benchmark for the oldest players to score for the Wollongong Wolves. Three had attained the age of thirty-seven years and two were a year younger. These are the players and the circumstances behinds their goals.

This striker is the oldest player to score for the Wollongong Wolves. At thirty-seven years and one hundred and eighty one days on the 2nd Sept 2012, in his second stint with the Wolves, he scored against Sutherland Sharks in the final round of the 2012 NSW NPL season at John Crehan Park. He took on defender to his right to elude him and set forth for the goal. He spied the custodian's position and subsequently curled the ball inside the post for the team's second goal in sixty seconds. 'It was quite pleasing. (To score). A good result and a good way to finish at home.'

At Seymour Shaw Park in Miranda, a Scottish born striker with A-League credentials was thirty-seven years and one hundred and six days in the Semi-Final of the Tiger Turf Cup. The match was played on the 10th June 2007 and the goal was scored in the fourteenth minute against Dandaloo. Steve Hayes tested the goalkeeper with a stinging shot with the custodian keeping the ball out but he could not hold. Consequently the ball ran free with the striker making the most of his opportunity to ram it home for his team to lead by two at this stage of the match.

In 1985 on the 7th July, this striker was thirty-seven years and eighty-three days and he scored in Round 18 versus Marconi Stallions at Wollongong Showground. His sterling effort was the first goal of the match, coming thirty-five minutes in. He curled his corner kick into the goal, beating the custodian and stunning the opposition.

This player scored against Blacktown City on the 27th May 2018 one minute after the hour mark. He was thirty-six years and two hundred and thirty-five days. This defender took the free kick outside the box. His first effort rebounded off the defensive wall. As luck would have it, the ball returned. This time he hit it sweetly to beat the custodian at the near post to score the equaliser.

Sutherland Sharks provided the opposition when this player scored in time added on to win the game. He was thirty-six years and one hundred and thirty-three days in Round 15 in 2018. 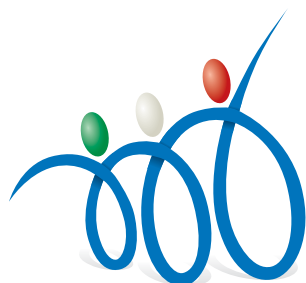
