CLUB WELCOME

A "desperate" Marconi Stallions FC will need to "rise to the occasion" when they host "high flying" Blacktown City tonight.

Blacktown City are sitting in second place on 16 points, while the Stallions are 8th on 9 points. This is a "must win" game for the locals for them to stay in touch with the leading teams.

The Stallions were "out of sorts" against Mt Druitt Town Rangers last round and lost for only the second time this season (2-0). The Rangers are unbeaten in their last four starts and are one of the "in form" teams of the competition.

They beat Blacktown City in that unbeaten run.

The Stallions come in to this crucial encounter on the back of a 2-0 loss at home to the "in form" Mt Druitt Town Rangers. Blacktown City found their touch in the second half to beat "hapless" Sydney FC 3-0.

Coach Mark Crittenden has his Blacktown City team in "good touch". They kept a clean sheet and found the back of the net three times last start and he is a contented coach for now.

Marconi Stallions FC need results. How they get the three points at this stage is not important. The goals they were scoring in earlier matches seem to have "dried up". The Stallions have not scored in their last two NPL matches ,both at home.

Blacktown City are becoming a real threat. The 4-1 win over front runners Rockdale Ilinden FC

made everyone take notice. They "demolished" Wollongong Wolves 5-0 so goal scoring is becoming a habit.

Their only "blemish" recently was the 1 nil shock loss to the "giant killers" Mt Druitt Town Rangers FC.

Both teams have strike power. The Stallions rely on captain Marko Jesic (5 goals) and Mitch Mallia and Anthony Frangie (both with 2 goals) as the main poachers.

Blacktown City's powerful striker Travis Major is the "dangerman" for the Stallions defence. He too has 5 goals so far and is being well supported by skillful mid fielder Mario Shabow (4 goals to his name) and Suleyman Bangura who scored 1 of his 2 so far against Sydney FC.

Both teams are "backing up " after Round 5 FFA Cup games in mid-week.

Marconi Stallions FC had a real battle with fellow NPL rivals Sutherland Sharks.

The game went into extra time before a left foot strike from Martin Fernandez finally broke the "deadlock" to get the Stallions into the next round after overcoming a "gutsy" Sharks side 1-0.

Blacktown City had to overcome UTS FC (Northern Suburbs Football Association) in a real David and Goliath affair.

MATCH PREVIEW

Marconi Stallions will be out to stop an in-form Blacktown City this Saturday when the two sides face off at Marconi Stadium.

The Stallions come into this match on the back of a 2-0 loss last week against Mt Druitt Town Rangers and have not won a match in five weeks.

The Peter Tsekenis coached side have lacked a winning edge this season with six draws and only one win from their nine matches.

Goals are needed by the Stallions, who have only scored once in their past three games.

Attacking players Anthony Frangie, Mitch Mallia, Marko Jesic and Emmanuel Peters need to find their scoring touch if their team ends their run without a win.

They did receive some joy however midweek after defeating the Sutherland Sharks 1-0 after extra time thanks to a Martin Fernandez goal in Round 5 of the FFA Cup.

Looking to stop them is a red-hot Blacktown City team that has had far from any issues scoring goals.

A 3-0 victory against Sydney FC last week and a 5-0 win against Wollongong in round eight has helped City climb to second on the ladder and only two points behind competition leaders Rockdale.

Travis Major is in top form for Blacktown, scoring goals at will, while Mario Shabow and Suleyman Bangura have also been impressive in front of the goal.

Defensively Blacktown has also found their rhythm with two consecutive clean sheets, a great sign from shot-stopper Tristan Pendergrast, and defenders Daniel Collins and Grant Lynch.

Coach Mark Crittenden has gotten this team humming.

Matches between these two sides have had a bit of extra feeling in recent seasons, and this one will be no different.

Blacktown will go in as favourites but expect nothing less than a determined performance from Marconi as they set out to end their winless streak.



MARCONI MENTOR PROGRAM

To further unify Marconi Stallions FC from the bottom to the top an innovation has been introduced into the program in 2021. The aim is to have the top support the junior program and in return the junior program to support the senior.

The innovation is the Mentor Program.

Men's NPL 1 players are now spending spend half an hour per week with their allocated team- 2 players per team. (3 in some cases)

Younger NPL players with Boys SAP Program (Ages 9 to 12)

Senior NPL players with Boys Youth (Ages 13 to 16 years)

Players are meeting with their teams and are getting to know the players – they take an active part in the session – chatting with the players and building relationships with them. The purpose of the Program is for the senior players to help the younger ones develop their games, their character, ability to handle pressure and help them with any issues along the way. (Photos at training)

Players in the NPL are from varying occupational backgrounds – schoolteachers, physiotherapists, personal trainers, Auto Mechanics, a farmer – so many varying backgrounds to offer support and advice to the younger players. We also have a player Mason Ingram who works with disabled children.

In turn, the Boys SAP and Youth are getting to know the NPL players and take an interest in how the team is going.

The Mentors of the Programs attend training and make presentations when required. (photos)

Head Coach Peter Tsekenis is in full support of the Mentor Program.

"It is important that the whole club is engaged in the Football Program. The Mentor System does just this -there is no better way than to have the young players at the club look to the older more senior players for guidance and direction."

"With Mental Health becoming an increasingly prevalent issue it is now even more important that young players have the support they need, both within the family at home and also in this case their football family at Marconi."

The Mentors for the Boys SAP Program will be at the Stadium on Saturday night when the Marconi Stallions FC Boys SAP teams (Under 9 to 12) are presented to the crowd.
