MATCH PREVIEW

v Rockdale Ilinden

Rockdale Ilinden, the 2020 Rebooted League Champions are the Wollongong Wolves' opponents in today's 2021 Round 12 fixture and this game should be an intriguing issue at Albert Butler Park. Rockdale and Wollongong have scored twenty-five and seventeen goals against each other at goal per game ratio of 1.56 and 1.13 respectively since 2013. In the initial meeting in 1987, the Wolves defeated Rockdale 3-2 with goals by Pat Brodnik, Jock Morlando Randall Easthorpe being the Wolves 'scorers with Paul Darlington and Pat Rodas being Rockdale's achievers in the Round 2 fixture. How many goals will be scored today?

THE OPPOSITION TODAY - ROCKDALE ILINDEN FC

Rockdale's coach, Steven Zoric has added to his squad in an attempt to duplicate the success of the previous year. Daniel Araujo has moved from Blacktown City, Bai Antoniou has returned to the club from Sydney Olympic together with Zac Sfiligoi from Northbridge Bulls and from Sutherland Sharks, lames Temelkovski.

Rockdale has won honours over the years with one being the 1984 NSW Premier League Division 1 Championship after accounting for Premiers Inter-Monaro 3-2 at Marconi Stadium. The team was captained by Bill Pilovski and coached by Ilija Talkacs. Rockdale came from behind to win this match with the three goals emanating in the twentyseventh, fifty-fifth and eighty-sixth minutes with Terry lones scoring two of these. Other teams members included Ken Slaveski, Robbie Yousef, Paul Degney and Darren Wilson. Rockdale had finished in the runners up position in the Premiership with thirtytwo points from fourteen wins and four draws, one point behind Inter-Monaro, scoring forty six goals and conceding twenty three with a goal difference of plus twenty-three.

Rockdale Ilinden in 2020 became Premiership winners when they outlasted the Wollongong Wolves to win on goal difference of one goal after eleven rounds. However, at the final hurdle to win the double, they succumbed in the Grand Final to Sydney United 58, 4-3 on penalties after concluding extra time 3-3, with the goal scorers being Michael Neill, Jaden Casella and Daniel Petkovski. Rockdale topped the table on twenty-four points with seven wins and three draws, scoring twenty goals and

conceding nine. The best result sequence with out loss was five games, achieved on two occasions, Rounds 1-5, draw, win, win, win and draw, and Rounds 7-11, win, win, win, draw and win. Amaury Gauthier was the top scorer with five goals with six other players joining the scorer's club. Only twice did the team neglect to score which was second to two other teams in the league with one solitary nil score. Rockdale equalled four other teams in this regard.

Rockdale has finished the last five seasons in 6th, 3rd, 5th 10th and 1st position. Semi-finals will surely be on the radar for Rockdale at least in 2021 following their great success in 2020 Reboot competition.

THE MATCH - UP

All up Rockdale numbers ten victories as against the Wolves' twelve with, only one draw. Rockdale's biggest win was 4-0, coming in this season's Round 1. Correspondingly, the Wolves 4-1 victory in 2011, being the club's biggest score.

Rockdale and Wollongong occupy second and seventh on the ladder with six and four wins respectively. Rockdale has scored twenty-two goals with Alec Urosevski being the top scorer with a ten goal tally. Lachlan Scott is the Wolves' top goal getter with four, with nine players joining in with the team scoring a total of sixteen goals. Rockdale has five scorers

In the previous round, Rockdale defeated Sydney FC and the Wolves defeated Sutherland Sharks 3-2. The scorers were Alec Urosevski with three, and Bai Antonoiu for Rockdale and Leroy Jennings with three for the Wolves.

The result sequence for last five rounds played is – WW - Win, Loss, Loss, Win and Win, RI - Win, Win, Draw, Draw and Win.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

Amaury Gauthier, in his second year at Rockdale is a midfielder who has creative flair to assist in his team's goal scoring exploits and has scored a quite a few himself.

Newcomer to the top side in the past few weeks is Wolves' Nav Darjani who has been in remarkable form to date. He has scored a goal, and showed

immense talent in his passing, match vision, his tackling and overall play. Watch and be impressed.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

In the 2017 season Round 10 fixture the Wolves played Rockdale at WIN Stadium. The Wolves were Justin Pasfield, Hayden Morton, Chris Price, Brendan Griffin, Michael Robinson, Darcy Madden, Joshua McDonald, Nick Montgomery, Patrick Antelmi, Peter Simonoski and Yuzo Tashiro. Nicolas Bernal and Brett Wilson replaced Simonoski and Tashiro respectively with Jacob Timpano as coach. The Suns line-up was Ante Covic, Daniel Petkovski, Trent McClenahan, Paul Reid, Blake Ricciutto, Alec Urosevski, Aleksander Canak, Harris Gaitatzis, Brayden Sorge, Patrick Savor, and Jordan Figon. Jonathan Grozdanovski Steven Hesketh subbed on for McClenahan and Savor respectively.

Both teams in tight affair tried to gain an advantage but all attempts were in vain until MacDonald made ground with the ball down the wing before crossing. Tashiro met the ball to direct, placing it to the left of Covic. Griffin tried to bring up number



two but Covic thwarted the enterprising chance. Rockdale through Urosevski and Figon tried to find a way through but the defence and Pasfield kept them in check. With nine minutes left in the match, Tashiro brought up his brace by heading in a MacDonald cross. Timpano –'I thought we dominated the match... We are a good side. We can beat the top sides as we did today.' Tashiro - 'We had good play today and I got the goals. Josh MacDonald is a good creative player. We have good moves.' Madden - 'They are second on table for good reason, but we were happy to beat them.'

TWO SELECTED TOP SCORERS FOR ROCKDALE ILINDEN - JASON NAIDOVSKI and JORDAN FIGON

Naidovski reached the club summit with his five goals in the 2011 NSW Premier League season with his first goal coming in the fifty-third minute of the Round 11 Parramatta fixture.

Striker Figon scored twelve goals to the top the goal count in 2017 after scoring his initial season goal in Round 1 in the seventy-sixth minute against Sydney FC.

TWO SELECTED TOP SCORERS FOR WOLLONGONG WOLVES - ILIJA PRENZOSKI and VAUGHN COVENY

Eleven goals was the total for the Golden Boot winner in 2008 and Prenzoski's goal per game ratio

was 0.38. His first strike was in Round 6 with the opposition being Sydney United 58, scored in the eighth minute and he added another later in the match to bring up his brace.

Coveny in the 1994/95 season scored twelve goals from twenty-four games to emerge the top scorer with a goal per game average of 0.5. Against Brunswick Juventus in Round 6, Coveny achieved in the seventh minute and this was the first goal of his brace for this encounter at Olympic Park, Melbourne.

TWO SELECTED REPRESENTATIVES OF BOTH CLUBS - HRISTIJAN TANOSKI and JORDAN LANDO.

Tanoski played for two seasons with Rockdale in 2015 and 2016 and his first year was selected in the 'Team Of The Week'. One goal of his four goals that he score for the club came against Blacktown City in Round 8 2016, when he tapped the ball home at the far post after a Dylan Macallister headed on ball. He again goaled in Round 11 following Macallister's execution of a deft back heel finding Tanoski, who proceeded to slot the ball home again at the Sydney Olympic far post. He did score against the Wolves in Round 12 2016, when in a goalmouth scramble, the midfielder got a touch to propel the ball home in the 45+ minute.


At the Wolves, Tanoski played in the 2017 season making eleven league appearances with one cup game. After the Round 13 win over Sydney Olympic, the effective wide player stated – 'we came out here with a plan. We knew what they were going to play like and credit to the boys we all stuck to it and at the end we got what we wanted... We are all here for the benefit of the team'. Alas, he was not able to increase his goal tally. He went on to subsequently play with Sutherland Sharks and Hakoah Sydney City East before playing in 2019 with Albion Park in the Illawarra Premier League.

Lando, a striker played one game for the Wolves in the 2004/05 NSW Premier League season, coming on as a substitute against Sydney Crescent Star in the Round 12 match in the sixty-seventh minute. He subsequently turned out for Rockdale City Suns in the Winter Super League competition of 2006. From Ilinden Park, he has played at Griffith in 2007, Albion Park White Eagles in 2008, and later in 2013 at Yoogali FC, 2014 at Cooma Tigers and 2018 at Gerringong Breakers in the Shoalhaven League.

ON TOP

These following Wollongong Wolves strikers have achieved the highest strike rates in league games to position themselves into the top ten of this category in the club's history with these individuals being 'on top' of all the standings with at least twenty games being played being a requisite. The following strikes rates will count down from one to eleven and incidentally each one of these players is a season Golden Boot winner. These high statistics were either achieved in the National Soccer League or the National Premier League NSW Mens 1 with the exception of one of these strikers who played in both competitions. The achievers concerned in alphabetical order were, Roy Cotton, Vaughan Coveny, Thomas James, Shane McGirr, Jordan Murray, Phil O'Connor, Sasho Petrovski, Mark Picciolini, Ilija Prenzoski, Peter Simonoski and Stuart Young. Four of these players were born in England and two favoured the left foot.

The highest strike rate was 0.9. It was the 2004/05 season that the high achiever Shane McGirr's eighteen goals from twenty matches being an impressive feat.

The runner's up position highest strike rate is 0.82 with Thomas James having attained this from twenty-four goals from twenty-nine games from 2019 to 2020. The former Englishman has set a very high standard and his 1.00 strike rate in the 2019 season, twenty two goals from twenty-two matches and a record that will, if at all, take some beating.

Scoring thirty goals from fifty-eight games in a three season stint from the 2010 to the 2012 season, Mark Picciolini 's 0.51 positioned him third in line.

Two strikers garnered 0.49 with those being Stuart Young and Phil O'Connor. Being both English born strikers and left footers, Young scored fifty-two goals from one hundred and six games from 1999/00 to 2002/03, and from 1982-1983, O'Connor struck twenty-six goals from his fifty-seven games.

0.44 was the next strike rate and two players achieved this. One scored goals in the two different league competitions for the club. He played eightyone games from 1998/99 to 2000/01 and forty-one games from 2011-2012 scoring forty goals in the N.S.L. and fourteen in the N.P.L.N.S.W. respectively. He has the best NSL strike rate of Wolves' players

0.493 and this player was Sasho Petrovski. From 2004 to 2015 Jordan Murray achieved fifteen goals from thirty-four games to earn this identical strike

Fourteen goals from thirty-four matches earned Ilija Prenzoski his strike rate of 0.41 from 2008 to 2009.

0.39 was cut off point for the top eleven and three players tied this result with those being Peter Simonoski, Roy Cotton and Vaughan Coveny from 2009 to 2017, 1981-1983 and 1993/94 to 1994/95 respectively. Simonoski scored forty- eight goals from one hundred and twenty-three games, Cotton twenty goals from fifty-seven games, and from thirty-eight games Coveny hit fifteen goals.

These strikers have all made a tremendous contribution in scoring 316 goals for the club from 678 games.

THREE CARD TRICK - Part One

A hat trick was accomplished in the Round 11 of the 2021 season and it is timely to acknowledge those players who have indeed achieved a 'three card trick' in a single league game. A total of sixteen Wollongong Wolves players have scored a trio of goals in either single NSW Premier League Mens 1 match, or in National Premier League encounter and it does not happen too often. The 'Three Card Trick' Part 1 of eight of these scorers and the circumstances behind these are the subject of this article with some achievers scoring more than one in their career at the club with one club being on the receiving end of a number of these hat tricks. Eight of these achievers

The latest hat trick achiever Leroy Jennings with the first of his three-goal haul was actually his initial one for his club. It was in the Sutherland Sharks encounter, that his twenty-seventh minute strike got the ball rolling and restored parity for his team. A free kick was awarded about thirty metres out from goal in the centre. Jennings took the kick, with his spectacular effort zooming into the right top corner of the goal. His next two strikes were rapid fire coming in a two minute period. Liam Wille had provided a short pass back to his position on the edge of the box. His powerful shot curled into the goal, high into the top right corner. For his hat trick, he slotted a pass to Lachlan Scott and his audacious back heel went directly to lennings on the run. His shot traversed between the right post and the Shark's custodian. Jennings -'I was lucky enough to score the goals. These things are worked at training. Sometimes you can get it guick (first club goal), sometimes it takes a while, though the second and third came pretty quick. I'm stoked and very happy.'

The player who has scored the most three card tricks is striker Sasho Petrovski who scored his initial one in the Round 10 Brandon Park match versus Morwell Falcons in the 1998/99 season. His first goal commenced when he took receipt of a Paul Reid pass, which allowed him to dash up the field to push the ball home in the twenty-second minute. His brace was chalked up when he took delivery of an Anthony Surjan ball to goal in the fifty-first minute. Scott Chipperfield's was involved prior to Petrovski adding his third, four minutes after the hour mark. Petrovski - 'It was a thrill and great pleasure to have the opportunity to be on the end of all the good work and good build up play the team did back

then. I knew this would be the start of many more to come.' (From my interview conducted at the Fraternity Club in 2012.)

Petrovski's second treble emanated in the Round 21 match in the 2000/01 season against Parramatta Power at WIN Stadium. A minute after play resumed following the break, the striker goaled and repeated the effort a minute later. His hat trick was accomplished in the sixty-ninth minute. A fortnight later at home he repeated the effort in the Newcastle United match in Round 23. On the hour, he completed his treble after earlier goals were scored in the forty-second and forty-eighth minutes. Petrovski – 'I still remember this game and I was feeling so good leading up to it.'

In the final match of the 2018 season, a striker has stepped up to post a flurry of three goals to culminate the season. Achieving this feat was none other than striker Peter Simonoski. Against Marconi Stallions at Marconi Stadium in Bossley Park, Simonoski, positioned at the far post headed in a Steve Hayes cross that was swung in from the right side of the field in the fifteenth minute. A chipped ball from Nick Montgomery allowed Simonoski to slot home sixty-two minutes later to bring up his brace. His treble emanated a further four minutes later, when a lifted Montgomery ball allowed Simonoski to run through and chip the ball over the custodian's head into the goal for his team to run out 3-0 winners, the team's most comprehensive victory of the 2018 season. Simonoski - 'It turned out well and I got a bit lucky. I was aiming for double figures at the start of the season. ..., It was a good way to finish.'

In the final round of 1987 striker Randall Easthorpe scored three versus Manly and followed suit in the South Melbourne encounter in the 1988 season. In his initial match of his first treble, he scored after just nineteen seconds after Robert Giraldi had threaded a pass to Rade Stefanovski. The winger in turn moved the ball onto Easthorpe and he did the rest. David Skeen located Stefanovski with a pass before moving it on to Easthorpe. A clinical shot brought up the desired outcome for his third.

In Round 12 in 1988 at Brandon Park, Easthorpe achieved his second treble on the 24th April. It was in the twenty-first minute that he beat the South

Melbourne custodian to score and he struck again in the second half six minutes in. His final of three was in the sixty-second minute.

Round 14 in the 1999/00 season saw striker Fsala Masi joining the hat trick hero clan. Parramatta Power was the opposition and the venue was Brandon Park. From defence, Alvin Ceccoli brought the ball forward on the left before providing a through ball on the halfway line to Scott Chipperfield. He eluded a defender to square the ball to Masi. He had a simple job to tap home after two minutes. Eight minutes later, Chipperfield's in swinging corner kick was headed on target by David Cervinski, unmarked at the far post. The ball was belted high off the line by a defender. However, Masi rose to head the dropping ball home. It was in the fifty-eighth minute that his hat trick was attained, Masi's first ever. Sasho Petrovski's powerful strike cannoned into the right post to rebound to where Masi was positioned. The Fijian striker converted his opportunity with aplomb.



Adam Casey scored his treble in the Round 3 away game versus Bankstown Lions. He scored with a header on fifty-three minutes and his brace was brought up seven minutes later. From outside the penalty area he spun around to produce a low effort that flew into the goal eluding the custodian. With time running out, he collected a long ball from out of his team's defence and placed his ensuing shot past the advancing keeper.

On 27th February 1999, a midfield player scored his trio of goals with Morwell Falcons being the opposition. It was in Round 22 of the 1998/99 season that Anthony Surjan posted his three card trick. Two goals were scored in a two minute period from the ninth minute. Scott Chipperfield on receipt of a Surjan pass returned it with a Surjan heading into the goal. From about twenty metres Surjan struck with a ferocious shot that torpedoes into the top left hand corner of the Morwell domain. On fiftyone minutes his hat trick was accomplished. With Esala Masi aiding, Surjan tucked the ball way with relative ease.

Macarthur Rams in the 2008 Round 15 fixture played at Crehan Park Cringila were the team that striker Ilija Prenzoski hit a treble against. The custodian subsequently kept out a header from Michael West with the ball ultimately running free. From close range, Prenzoski was in the right place at the right time to tap home. A timely intervention by Prenzoski gave him time and space to calmly place the ball into the goal on fifty-one minutes to bring up his brace. A defender lost his footing and the ball allowing Prenzoski to zip in to goal thirty-two minutes after his second.

These players, Sasho Petrovski, Leroy Jennings, Peter Simonoski, Randall Easthorpe, Esala Masi, Adam Casey, Anthony Surjan and Ilija Prenzoski, are the first of a total of fifteen illustrious players who have scored a 'three card trick'.

COMMON GROUND

The most 'common ground' score lines that exist between the Wolves and the eleven other NSW NPL Mens 1 clubs conjure up many different results. Here are those score lines and the goal achievers behind a few of these examples.

A number of these scores 1-1, and 2-1 follow the most common results in an English football study of results since 1888 through the end of the 2013/14 season. The 1-1 result happened in the case of the three of these Mens 1 clubs with a total of twenty-one appearances. In addition, some of the names in these ranks have further made a name for themselves as players for the National team, as coaches or as media pundits, or more to the point, a combination of all three. Also, a number of these opposition scorers played for the Wolves at some juncture, either before or after securing these particular goals. The percentage of these results compared to the number of over all league competition games is given.

APIA LEICHHARDT

There were nine occasions when the 1-1 result was attained between the Wolves and APIA. The most recent result was in 2018 when Peter Simonoski (WW) and Sean Symons (A) shared the spoils. Another such occasion was in the 1989 season fixture played at Brandon Park. Randall Easthorpe (WW), the Golden Boot winner for his club, and John Kosmina (A), a Socceroo striker of distinction, shone out. 16.6%

BLACKTOWN CITY

Two scores are tied with five occasions for each with 2-1 and 0-3 being the results in question. In 1984, Blacktown defeated the Wolves 2-1 in Round 26. Peter Kotamanidis goaled for the Wolves with Adam Sandy together with a former Wolves player in Phil O'Connor. In the 2004/05 season, Adam Kwasnik and Jason Connolly hit Blacktown's two goals with Shane McGirr replying for the Wolves. The initial 3-0 Blacktown victory was in 1985 saw Phil O'Connor scoring a brace with John McKie attaining the third. Round 12 in 2014 saw Blacktown's Travis Major (a scorer against the Wolves in the 2021 season), Ruiji Miyazawa and Danny Choi with the honours. 11.1%

MANLY UNITED

A draw of 1-1 was played five times with the initial result occurring in 2009 with Joey Schirripa (MU) and Samet Kaynak for Wollongong, which was the only draw that season. In Round 20 2018, Peter Simonoski (WW) and Brendan Cholakian (MU) were on the score sheet, with Yuzo Tashiro (WW) and Cholakian once more earlier in 2017 Round 3. 16.6%

MARCONI STALLIONS

The 1-1 draw was again the most common score and this time it happened seven times. In 1988, (a very good year for the Wolves), Frank Farina (M) and Jock Morlando (WW) goaled for their respective teams in Round 19, 1988. Martin Akers (WW) and Andy Harper (M) achieved the deeds in the 1993/94 Round 19 season fixture while in Round 10 2008, The Championship year, Ilija Prenzoski, (the club's Golden Boot winner) and Nahuel Arrarte took the cream. 9.5%

MT DRUITT TOWN RANGERS

With four different results this club is non applicable to the criteria.

NORTHBRIDGE BULLS (NORTH SHORE MARINERS)

There have been four different scores so the rationale is non-applicable.

ROCKDALE ILINDEN

1-0 and 0-1 came in equal with four occurrences each. The initial 1-0 emanated in Round 19, 2010 with Saso Trajcevski earning the plaudits. Nikola Taneski did likewise in Round 14, 2014. In 2018, in a Round 2 clash, the Wolves' Caoimhin 'Quivi' Fowler took his team to a 1-0 victory, and in 2013, Peter Simonoski did likewise. 16%

SYDNEY FC


