CLUB WELCOME

Marconi Stallions FC will be looking to make it two wins in a row when they host Northbridge Bulls FC at the 'Palace' tonight.

Regarded as the "Benchmark team" at the start of the season, the Stallions scored their first win since March 27th last weekend.

Back then they beat the then high-flying Sydney United (top of the table currently) 2-0.

This time they won 2-0 against third placed Rockdale llinden FC ending an eight-game sequence of six draws and two losses.

Initially, the game was a "carbon copy" of when the two teams met back in Round One (March 13) the Stallions led 2-0 that day and had to settle for a 3 all draw (one of NINE draws so far for the club).

For the first time since beating Sydney United FC, the Stallions put a complete performance together and the result against the well placed Rockdale llinden was well deserved.

Coach Peter Tsekenis conceded "things have not gone to plan so far this season. The win will spark confidence in the team, and we now need to go on with it and keep winning."

The "architect" of the win over Rockdale Ilinden was Chris Hatfield, the former Victorian NPL player is starting to have an impact since his return from injury.

The versatile Hatfield who plays anywhere across the front line is currently playing in the centre forward spot and is making a difference.

He was injured early on after arriving from Melbourne and has returned off the bench in recent weeks – he is now in the starting side and making an impact.

Hatfield scored the crucial equalizer against Sutherland Sharks (Round 13) and followed up with a "brace" last weekend against Rockdale llinden.

Tsekenis believes he has become a key man – "he has added the difference that has been eluding us."

"He has added a different dimension, he has provided the spark up front we have been missing. He is making the difference in our team."

The addition of Hatfield to the Stallions front line makes them a real threat to the Bulls.

Captain Marko Jesic (7 goals) Anthony Frangie, Mitch Mallia and now Hatfield all with 3 goals each provides firepower for the Stallions. If both sides are to be thereabouts as final contenders a win is a must, a draw will not help the cause of either team.

Currently, the Stallions are ninth on 15 points, one point ahead of the Bulls on 14 points. Manly United is fifth on 20 points. Behind Manly United comes Wollongong, Apia and Sydney Olympic then the Stallions.

The Stallions are an enigma - both wins so far have been against top of the table Sydney United (2-0) and third placed Rockdale Ilinden (2-0). The NINE draws have severely impacted on the Stallions season.

The Bulls come into this Round 15 match via a 2 all draw with Sydney FC and they needed a late equalizer courtesy of Jake Jovanovski to share the points.

The Bulls have some real talent including captain Rory Jordan (4 goals) and former Marconi Stallions Lachlan Sepping (3 goals) and Yianni Nicolaou, both will cause the locals plenty of headaches.

Lachlan Sepping scored a wonderful goal when the teams last met in the 3 all draw.

Bulls Coach Mile Sterjovski is pleased with how his players keep fighting and applying pressure in their matches. "Hopefully, we will be rewarded" he added

The Bulls have players already experiencing life in the A League and on their day will prove a real handful to any opposition team. Jordan, Bal Juach, Jake Halloran and Sepping will keep the Stallions keeper Nenad Vekic busy.

The Stallions are "backing up" after their Wednesday night Round 7 FFA Cup match against 2nd placed Blacktown City.

In a first for the Marconi Stallions FC the Women's NPL 2 team will play their Round 10 match as the "curtain raiser "against Nepean FC.

Rockdale Ilinden 0 – Marconi Stallions 2 at Rockdale Ilinden Sports Centre

A Chris Hatfield brace has helped Marconi Stallions breakthrough for their second win of the season as they claimed a 2-0 victory against Rockdale Ilinden at Rockdale Ilinden Sports Centre on Saturday.

Goals on either side of the break from Hatfield was the difference as the Stallions ended a nine-game winless run dating back nine weeks to round five.

Rockdale fell behind in the 12th minute as Hatfield tapped home from a Giorgio Speranza cross before the pacy striker secured the victory in the 65th minute when he finished a slick counterattack.

The result means Rockdale fall further behind in their premiership defence and have now won only once in their past five league matches.

Northbridge Bulls 2 – Sydney FC 2 at Sydney United Sports Centre

A Jake Jovanovski header deep into injury time has helped Northbridge Bulls snatch a dramatic 2-2 draw against Sydney FC at Sydney United Sports Centre on Saturday.

Jovanovski's 94th minute headed goal denied the Young Sky Blues their first win since round 3 as the Bulls fought back from behind twice to snatch a vital competition point.

Sydney FC took a 1-0 lead into the break thanks to a Clayton Taylor strike but Northbridge hit back after the interval through Lachlan Sepping to level the score.

With only six minutes left on the clock, Corey Hollman put Sydney in front and on the cusp of an incredible victory.

However, it wasn't to be for the Young Sky Blues as Jovanovski found the back of the net in the dying seconds to secure an incredible late equaliser for Northbridge.

MASON MAKING A DIFFERENCE

At just 21 years of age, Mason Ingram is already making a difference in people's lives.

Currently, he is employed as a Teacher's Assistant at York Public School (South Penrith) and also in the Support Unit as a Disability Support Worker.

"I want my role to be seen as a positive in someone's life to help get the best possible outcome for them."

"I just feel I would like to make difference in someone's life that maybe has some obstacles along the way."

"I get so much out of being a support person and role model."

He is actively implementing his School's Motto – Pride in Achievement.

With his "two pronged" position, the school role involves assisting in the classroom and playground with children with varying levels of autism. With his Disability Support Work, he helps with lifestyle skills and developing physical fitness.

Mason has been working at York Public School for three years. He has been providing support for Daniel for four years during which time they have formed a special bond and friendship. This connection came about through the National Disability Insurance Scheme which enabled Daniel to employ Mason.

Mason's day is made when he sees Daniel or others achieve things with his help and support.

The sometimes-difficult roles do have their "downsides". Sometimes when they do not want to co-operate, it can be very demanding.

The "downtime" for Mason away from the School and Support Unit as a Disability Support Worker, is playing football in the National Premier League with





the Marconi Stallions FC.

Head Coach Peter Tsekenis can see how Mason's qualities as a person suit his employee roles.

"He is quiet, patient and resilient, all the attributes needed for his challenging but obviously, rewarding role."

Speaking of rewarding, his coach believes the number five will be rewarded for his patience on the field. "He is pushing to cement a starting spot in our very strong squad."

"He is a great kid who continues to grow as a footballer. He is easy to coach and has improved out of sight."

For Mason, the balance between work and play is just right.

"My work hours are suitable to fit around training schedules and match days. This is important so that I can give one hundred percent to both careers."

The mature well-balanced defender on the field is always looking for improvement and it is the same in the classroom -trying to make a difference.

What is his secret to making a difference?

"You need patience, kindness and empathy."
