MATCH PREVIEW v Sydney United 58

Sydney United 58, runners up in the 2019 Waratah Cup, FFA Cup Round Of 32 achievers and 2020 NSW Mens 1 Champions, are in the Illawarra for the Round 18 clash with the Wollongong Wolves. This encounter should be a captivating concern at Albert Butler Park.

Since 2013, in the fourteen matches played between Sydney United 58 and Wollongong Wolves, each team has attained a tally of thirty and fourteen goals in matches against each other for a goal per game ratio of 2.14 and 1.0 respectively. The clubs first met in 1984 at Dapto Showground in Round 6. It was a 2-1 victory to the Wolves with the scorers being Ray Farrell, Peter Kotamanidis (WW) and Ken Boden (SU)

THE OPPOSITION TODAY - SYDNEY UNITED 58

Coach Tomi Vidovic has made some astute signings for the 2020 Championship winners including the re-signing of Chris Payne from APIA who was the Edensor Park club some years ago. As well, Andrea Agamemnonos who scored a top goal against the Wolves when he played for Sydney FC has joined together with Jacob Poscoliero, a former Central Coast Mariner and from Sierra Leone, Sallu Kamara.

Since being formed in 1957 many honours have been achieved by the club and one such attainment was the 2006 Premier League Championship. The fourth placed team played Blacktown City in the Grand Final after defeating Marconi 3-0 and Bankstown City Lions 6-5 on penalties after 1-1 aet in the Semi-Final and Preliminary Final respectively. In the Grand Final the team won 4-0 with striker Luka Glavas scoring all four goals in the tenth, twentyfifth, fiftieth and seventy-seventh minutes. Coached by Jean-Paul Marigny, together with Glavas, the team squad included Mathew Cox. Ante luric, Dean Culina, Mile Jedinak, Joe Vrkic (Capt/) Mitchell Thompson, Troy Halpin, Marko Filipovic, lim Bakis, Tallan Martin, Pablo Cardozo, Lisandro Berbis, Petar Markovic, Greg Owens and Robert Napoleane.

Sydney United 58 won the 2020 Grand Final after defeating Rockdale llinden 4-3 on penalties after the extra time score was locked up at 3-3. Glen Trifiro, Adrian Vranic and Jackson Khoury scored in the 120 minutes while Anthony Tomelic, Khoury, Jordan Roberts and Trifiro converted their penalties. In the league the team finished in third position on twentytwo points from seven wins and one draw. Twentysix goals were scored with twenty being conceded with a plus six goal difference. The Golden Boot winner was Patrick Antelmi with eight goals and eight other players contributed with goals, together with one own goal. Only once did the fail to score, which was the least number tallied and the seasons best to share with one other club, Wollongong Wolves. The best result sequence without loss was four, win, win, and win from Rounds 5-8. The biggest result was 4-1 in Round 11 over APIA with the least impressive result being 1-5 against Blacktown City in Round 9.

Sydney United 58 has completed the previous five seasons in 1st, 7th, 3rd, 4th and 3rd positions.

THE MATCH - UP

Since the first league meeting between the two clubs in 1984, the Wolves have won nineteen times compared with Sydney United 58's forty-two with only one 0-0 draw. Sydney United 58 lead in the number of attained goals leading one hundred and twenty-nine to seventy-seven.

The Wolves and Sydney United occupy seventh and second positions on the standings respectively with The Wolves having six wins to Sydney United's nine. Most number of goals in a single match was nine, with the Wolves winning 6-3 in 2012. Sydney United 's biggest win was 5-1 on three occasions in 1975, 2006 and 2014. Conversely, the Wolves biggest margin win was 4-0 in 2015.

The top scorers of each team at this stage of the competition are Patrick Antelmi on fourteen and Lachlan Scott and Leroy Jennings each on six.

The results from the previous round saw the Wolves being defeated by Marconi 10-0 and Sydney United drawing 1-1 with Northbridge Bulls

PLAYERS TO WATCH

Sydney United striker Patrick Antelmi has scored a fair tally of goals in season 2021 as in his many other seasons. He is a consistent goal achiever and will be out to cause damage to one of his former teams in this fixture. He is fast and produces a deadly shot.

The Wolves' Evan Ball, an eighteen year left sided defender, has come into the team in 2021 and has impressed as his experience has widened. He is strong in the tackle and his crossing and passing attack certainly hit the mark and assist the team.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

On 1st March 2001 in Round 25 Sydney United consisted of Brett Hughes, Elvis Orlic, Richard Plesa, Nahuel Arrarte, Tom Pondeljak, Tom Maric, Ante Deur, Atytec Genc, Commins Menapi, Francis Awaritefe and Shane Webb. Danny Burt, Kain Rastall and Goran Talevski replaced Maric, Genc and Awaritefe respectively. Wollongong was Dean Anastasidis, George Souris, Alvin Ceccoli, Matt Horsley, Paul Reid, Sasho Petrovski, Stuart Young, David Huxley, Ben Blake, Dino Mennillo and Robbie Middleby.

This match was a closely fought encounter with the Wolves scoring first at Edensor Park. Midfielder Huxley scored in the fiftieth minute and kept their advantage for twenty-six minutes until Talevski equalised. Despite opportunities, neither side could add to the score line with a point shared being the ultimate result.

TWO SELECTED TOP SCORERS FOR SYDNEY UNITED 58 - DAVID ZDRILIC and GRAHAM ARNOLD

In the 1996/97 NSL season striker Zdrilic was on top of the scorers' list with a total of twenty-one goals from thirty games, two ahead of the next in line. He scored four goals in a single game on two occasions versus Canberra Cosmos and Collingwood. His initial goal of the season was in the Round 1 Wollongong Wolves match when he scored after nine minutes. His goal per game ratio in this season was 0.7.

Arnold led the goal scorers' charge in 1984 with eleven goals from twenty-eight matches with a goal per game ratio of 0.39. His initial goal in this season was in Round 1, scored on sixteen minutes against Melita Eagles.



TWO SELECTED TOP SCORERS FOR WOLLONGONG WOLVES - SHANE MCGIRR and MATTHEW HORSLEY

McGirr signed for the Wolves from Port Kembla in the Illawarra Premier League and in the 2004/05 season he not only topped the club scoring but the league top scoring in addition with eighteen goals, five hit in his final match from sixteen appearances. His goal per game ratio was 1.12. His initial strike was in the Round 3 Central Coast United game in the fourth minute.

Wing/back or midfielder Horsley earned the top scorers' award when he achieved seven in the 1996/97 N.S.L. season. He played twenty-six games with a goal per game average of 0.26. His initial goal of the season was in Round 1 versus Sydney United scored in the seventh minute.

REPRESENTATIVE OF BOTH CLUBS - MILE STERJOVSKI and DEAN HEFFERNAN

Striker Sterjovski began his career at Wollongong Wolves making just two appearances as a replacement, for Bill Gjakovski and Lupcho Naumovski in the 1995/96 NSL season in Rounds 31 and 32. Following on, he landed at Sydney United for the 1997/98 season making a total of thirty-five starts in a two-season stint. He attained twenty goals in this time frame, with eighteen in his second season at the club. He went to play to play for Wollongong United, Parramatta Power, Lille FC, FC Basel, Hacetteppe in Turkey, Derby County, Perth Glory, Dalian Aerbin in China and Central Coast Mariners.

The defender Heffernan played one season with each club, in 2002 with the Wolves and at Sydney United 58 in 2003/04 with twenty and eighteen appearances respectively. He one scored at each club with his Wolves goal coming in the Round 17 Football Kingz clash on fifty-one minutes while his debut Sydney United 58 goal was in Round 25 versus Perth Glory, scored in the seventy-eight minute. Heffernan was a reliable defender, with good aerial ability and went to play at Central Coast Mariners in the A-League, and also Melbourne Heart, Perth Glory and Western Sydney Wanderers. Overseas stints with FC Nurnberg, Liaoning Whowin and Huddersfield Town were interspersed in between A League clubs.

Since a Waratah Cup was played in the previous week it is pertinent to take a look at the 'cup.' In the this competition the Wolves have played in the New South Wales run competition in many seasons and the ones since the 2004/05 season are in the sights with a number of facts that have been tabulated. The 'Cup' has also had a number of different names depending on sponsors including the Tiger Turf Cup, McDonalds Cup and Continental Tyres Cup in addition with other nomenclature as Waratah Cup and FFA Cup.

NUMBER OF GAMES PLAYED

Up until and including the Mount Druitt Town Rangers match in 2019, the team has run onto the field on forty-six occasions in cup games.

NUMBER OF DIFFERENT GOAL SCORERS

A total of forty-six different players have scored cup goals in the previous fourteen seasons.

MOST GOALS SCORED IN SINGLE GAME

Eleven was the total number of goals scored in a solitary match by the one team and it was 11-0 versus Coledale Waves in 2019. Another eleven goals were scored in 2015 with ten by the Wolves and one by Yagoona FC in their match up.

MOST INDIVIDUAL PLAYER GOALS SCORED IN A SINGLE MATCH

Five goals was the highest individual tally in one match and striker Stefan Dimoski accomplished this feat versus Coledale Waves in 2019. Second was Ricky Zucco with four against Hurstville Zagreb in 2014.

HAT TRICK

Two players have achieved hat tricks and these players were Bradley Welch and Peter Simonoski. Welch hit three versus Yagoona in 2015 and



Simonoski was to the fore against Spirit FC also in 2015.

BRACE

Thomas James scored a brace versus Pittwater RSL in 2019.

PLAYERS WHO SCORED MORE THAN ONE CUP GOAL.

The following players have accomplished two or more goals in the 'Cup', with these being in alphabetical order, Daniel Aliffi, Matthew Bailey, Tayfun Buyyukopru, Stefan Dimoski, Keiran Deane, Osagie Ederaro, Corey Gameiro, Adam Hughes, Thomas James, Bul Juach, Samet Kaynak, Cameron Littler, Shane McGirr, Darcy Madden, Jordan Murray, Tory Musumeci, Jordan Nikolovski, Stewart Petrie, Mark Picciolini, Michael Prentice Ilija Prenzoski, Chris Price, Peter Simonoski, Bradley Welch and Ricky Zucco.

LONGEST TIME PERIODS BETWEEN GOALS

Chris Price attained an eight-year time period between strikes with a goal in the 2007 Greenisland encounter and his succeeding one in 2014 against Manly United. Matthew Bailey had a six-year gap with his first goal in the 2008 Granville Rage game and in the 2014 versus Hurstville Zagreb.

WIN ON PENALTIES

In 2014, a 4-3 penalty shoot win eventuated against Sutherland and in the year prior a 5-3 win came at the expense of Manly United after it was 0-0 and 1-1 after regulation respectively.

DEFEAT BY PENALTIES

Following a 2-2 draw in 2008, the Wolves suffered a 4-5-penalty loss to Granville Rage for the team's solitary appearance in the competition that season.

AFTER EXTRA TIME

Three matches went into extra time and in the one hundred and twenty minutes total time a final score resulted. It was 2-2 between the Wolves and Parramatta FC in 2014 after ninety minutes concluded with a 5-3 end result. Dandaloo Fury in 2006 worked a 2-2 draw with the home team and

the final result was a victory to the Wolves with the addition of one more goal. It was 2-2 in 2011 until the Wolves struck on four minutes before the extra thirty minutes were up.

MOST CLUBS PLAYED

A number of clubs have featured as the opposition on multiple occasions. The highest number is four with Manly United and Parramatta FC being these clubs, with Spirit FC and Bankstown City Lions being second on the list with three appearances apiece.

CUP FINAL VICTORY

Played at Seymour Shaw Park on 8th July 2007, the Wolves defeated Manly United 3-2 with Daniel Aliffi (with a brace from the spot) and Osagie Ederaro scoring the goals to send the victorious Wolves team captained by Ben Blake back to Wollongong.

BIGGEST DEFEAT

4-1 was the worst defeat and Manly United inflicted that in 2014.

IPL CLUBS PLAYED

Three clubs from the Illawarra competition provided the opposition with those being Dandaloo Fury, Bulli, and Kemblawarra.

NSW PREMIER LEAGUE MENS 1 CLUBS PLAYED

Sydney Olympic, Bonnyrigg White Eagles, Sutherland Sharks, Parramatta FC, Bankstown City Lions and Mt. Druitt Town Rangers have provided the NSW Premier League Mens 1 opponents during the years.

FFA CUP ROUND OF 32

A two time feature in the this FFA Cup brought a huge crowd to the WIN Stadium in 2014 and 2016 with the opposition being A-League clubs Central Coast Mariners and Sydney FC with a 0-1 and 0-3 result respectively.

The 'Cup' has certainly been an interesting and compelling competition since the 2004/05 season and has thrown up interesting statistical information.

FEATURE STORY SO YOUNG

It does not matter how old a player is but the initial goal scored for any such member of a team is indeed a special occasion. The following seven players were 'so young' when they scored their first goal for the Wollongong Wolves in the National Soccer League or in the NSW Premier League with the youngest of these players and the circumstances of the attainments will be looked at. A number of these players went on to carve out a long standing playing career with definite achievements and one in the coaching realms in addition.

This striker was nineteen years and thirty-one days of age when he achieved his debut goal. Jordan Nikolovski achieved this in the Round 15 Sutherland Sharks at J.J. Kelly Park Coniston on 17th June 2018. Round the hour mark, a defensive Shark's clearance fell fortuitously to Nikolovski. He progressed forward and subsequently spied the opposition custodian off his line. When he was about thirty metres out from goal, he expertly produced a high lob that went over the head of the custodian to bounce into the goal. 'It was unbelievable... I wasn't sure what I would do.... I thought I would go for it.'

In 2021 a player making his third appearance In First Grade was aged nineteen years and twenty-six days when he goaled against Marconi in Round 10 at Ilinden Sports Centre, Rockdale. An opposition turnover allowed Lachlan Scott to take control of the ball before enacting a pass to Nav Darjani. He subsequently dragged the ball and turned before powering the ball into the goal.

At eighteen years and one hundred and eighty days, Danny Petkovic played two seasons with three starts



and three replacement roles in his first season in the 1989/90 season and two and one appearances in the subsequent season. His goal was his one and only his NSL career coming in the Round 26 Sunshine George Cross in 1990. He came on as a substitute in this final game of the season played at Brandon Park on Wednesday 26th April 1990. Petkovic score the final goal of four for his team.

This striker was eighteen years and one hundred and fifty-four days old when he scored versus Sydney City. In Round 3 1985 played at Wentworth Park, Pat Brodnik attained in the thirty-first minute. Pat Brodnik had seven seasons at the club amassing one hundred and thirty four appearances including one hundred and thirty four appearances including one hundred and two starts with thirty-six goals in total. His first goal was scored a minute after the half hour. The opposition, which stated that the ball was out of play earlier, hotly disputed it but the referee's decision stood. He went on to score six goals in a single match for a record equalling feat and was a member of the 1987 Premiership and Championship winning side and in 1988 with the Premiership winners.

Seventeen years and two hundred days was the age of this midfielder who had two stints at the Wolves in 1984 to 1985 and again in the 1991/92 season with six seasons at APIA Leichhardt in between. He achieved fifty-eight appearances over all with a total of nine goals. Alex Bundalo's initial one was in Round 2 versus Sydney City coming two minutes from the opening whistle.

This defender played a total of three stints for the club, in 2002, 2004/05 and 2012-2013 with a total of seventy three appearances in league cup and finals matches and being aged seventeen years and seventy days when he first goaled. He played in the A-League with Sydney FC and North Queensland Fury and Sydney United between his Wolves' career. Jacob Timpano's first goal eventuated in the Melbourne Knights encounter on the 14th March 2003. From a Shane Lyons cross, Timpano projected the ball with his head to beat the custodian in the nineteenth minute. 'It was great to score this first goal'. He became coach of the team with his team's highlights being qualification for the finals in 2015 and a FFA Cup Round Of 32 appearance in 2016

At sixteen years and two hundred days, a ten year veteran of the club with one hundred and fifteen league appearances with fifty as a replacement, this particular striker attained fifteen goals throughout his time from the 1990/91 season to the 1999/2000 season. It was against Heidelberg United in Round 17 on the 7th January 1991at Brandon Park, Sasho Dimoski scored in the ninetieth minute. A Mladin Kuc bolter had crashed against cross bar. The ball reached Dimoski and from ten metres out he let fly with a first timed shot. The ball rocketed into the goal for his team's third of the match.

It was Round 21 in 2009 that the two youngest players and strikers at that rattled up the initial goals versus Blacktown City at Macedonia Park, Berkeley on the 2nd August 2009. At sixteen years and one hundred and sixty two days in the sixty-ninth minute a through ball set Corey Gameiro on his way. With the goalkeeper advancing, Gameiro managed to elude him comfortably and calmly push the ball into the empty goal. Gameiro signed for a couple of A-League clubs but injuries hampered his career.

At sixteen years and forty-four days, the next goal came four minutes later in this Blacktown City fixture. Following a corner kick, which was subsequently chipped on to Peter Simonoski by Jamie McMaster, the striker projected the ball over the goal line. Simonoski is still playing in Mens 1 competition for Sydney United 58 after concluding his Wolves career at the conclusion of the 2018 season totalling one hundred and twenty-two league appearances with forty-eight league goals. 'It was a good cross that came in. I had a shot that went in and I was pleased with by debut'.

These players, Jordan Nikolovski, Nav Darjani, Danny Petkovic, Pat Brodnik, Alex Bundalo, Jacob Timpano, Sasho Dimoski, Corey Gameiro and Peter Simonoski were the 'so young' players to have put the ball into the net, to click the scoreboard over.

There have been quite a number of Wolves players who have gone down in the scoring record history as having scored a 'fast' goal in the very first minute of play, sometimes before many of the crowd had even taken their seats. Two of these players, both strikers and season top scorers to boot, have accomplished this feat on two occasions in the same season - Sasho Petrovski in 1999/2000 and Randall Easthorpe in 1987. Of the all these scorers, not all played as strikers and these initial feats are presented in reverse date order.

CHRIS PRICE

The captain of the side at the time, Price led by example when he struck home with his left foot. The ball had zoomed past the surprised Hakoah Sydney City East custodian in this home Round 1 match-up and the away team's first appearance in the Mens 1 NSW NPL. It was a pearl of a shot from Price from his position about twenty-five metres out from goal.

ILIJA PRENZOSKI

It was a Round 4 match with Sydney Olympic that Prenzoski, the ace goal getter, was presented with a scoring opportunity by the Olympic defence. He made no mistake with his effort in 2009.

SHANE McGIRR

The top striker of 2004/05 season in both the Premier League and for the Wolves, McGirr was quick off the blocks to goal in the final match of the this particular season. He struck before Sydney Crescent Star could compose themselves and from there, McGirr compounded Crescent Star's misery by scoring a further four goals.

SASHO PETROVSKI

Petrovski achieved two first minute goals in the 1999/00 NSL season with the first one emanating in Round 6. Scott Chipperfield had released a pass to him threading past Northern Spirit defenders. Petrovski with his close skills managed to dispatch the ball past the advancing custodian. His additional 'fast' score emanated versus Adelaide City as he took advantage of an Adelaide City defensive mistake to poke the ball home.

ALVIN CECCOLI

In Round 6, in the 1997/98 season, the left footed wingback Ceccoli gained the ball from an Anthony Surjan corner kick that caused consternation in the Marconi Stallions' defence. With the ball in his possession, he let fly with his effort zooming into the goal.

SONNY SEVIN

A one two pass with Lupcho Naumovski came following Sevin's exhilarating run leaving Marconi's defenders in his wake. After being set up by Naumovski, Sevin 's ensuing shot whizzed in to the goal beating the custodian with ease. This occurred in the 1996/97 season in Round 7.

RICHARD LLOYD

A total of six goals were scored in this Round 24 fixture in the 1995/96 season. Lloyd got the scoreboard to tick over initially against the opposition of Adelaide City with the match concluding in a draw.

VAUGHAN COVENY

A Golden Boot winner with the Wolves, Coveny was thirty metres out from the Heidelberg goal to take a free kick. His effort careered straight into the goal, leaving the custodian in its wake. Unfortunately Heidelberg recovered to win the Round 22 1994/95 season match.

RANDALL EASTHORPE

Versus Kuringai in Round 11 in 1987, a hurried break out was on and Easthorpe controlled a Robert Giraldi cross that was curled in. He seized this opportunity to hit home at the Wollongong Showground for this first minute strike. In Round 26 and the final round of the season, he duplicated the timing with involvement again by Giraldi. The fellow striker provided a pass to Rade Stefanovski, who in turn moved the ball to Easthorpe. PAT BRODNIK

A defensive mix-up aided Brodnik and he wasn't going to stand on ceremony before taking possession of an errant Sydney City pass in Round 22, 1986. He proceeded to notch up another goal that assisted his team to an ultimate 2-0 victory at season's end.

PHIL O'CONNOR

Straight from the kick off, O'Connor robbed an opposition Sydney City player in this Round 7 1983 fixture. He moved forward quickly before powering the ball into the back of the net.

ROY COTTON

Midfielder player Larry Gaffney had provided a deft pass to Cotton. The prolific scorer propelled the ball into the Preston net in Round 14 1982 to assist his team on its way for a victory.

These have been the 'fast' scoring goals, conjured up in the first minute of play and ones to shake up the opposition at a very early stage of an encounter.
